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FOREWORD

I suppose reading Bird Reports is, like eating olives, an acquired taste unless started at a very early age. Since, in New South Wales, bird reports have existed only since the seventies, and in the Hunter since the nineties, most of us are still wondering and learning about the actual value of a bird report. In the NSW Bird Report for 1970, which is modestly described by the then editor, Alan Rogers, as a ... "preliminary report ... intended to act as a guide to contributors for a more comprehensive effort in 1971" it says about Gould's Petrel:

"552 different birds caught on Cabbage Tree Island between 5 and 12 Dec. It is now thought that the population may be of the order of 2000 birds – greatly exceeding previous estimates"

Twenty five years later in the Hunter Region Bird Report, part of the entry for the same species says:

"The 1994/95 breeding population was 150 pairs, of an estimated world population of around 1000 birds."

You can readily see why bird reports are important.

In the early days of compiling the NSW Bird Report – without the aid of computers, fax machines, the Internet, or the knowledge we now have – all records were accepted and little checking of unusual records was carried out. Long distance phone calls seemed to cost a fortune then. With the benefit of hindsight, some records from those pioneering days are perhaps a little dubious. Nowadays, there are committees to double-check distribution and difficult identification.

By sending in your records, you can contribute to the documentation of the avian population and distribution in the Hunter and the information may one day be used to protect and increase our remaining habitat. Birdwatching is meant to be fun; it is the protection of bird habitat that is a deadly serious game.

This year, there are twenty more "observer codes" than in last year's Report. Even if not published specifically, your information has been used to assess current avian status. Thank you for your continued support, and -I wonder what you are seeing this year.

INTRODUCTION

In this Report, produced by Hunter Bird Observers Club Inc (HBOC), we present a summary of the status of bird species within the Hunter Region of NSW in the 1995 calendar year. The information is based upon observation records which we have gathered from a variety of sources.

We define the Hunter Region as the area described in the popular tourist maps of the Hunter. That is, the Region comprises the local government areas of Newcastle, Lake Macquarie, Maitland, Cessnock, Muswellbrook, Merriwa, Singleton, Scone, Murrurundi, Dungog, Gloucester, Port Stephens, Greater Taree and Great Lakes. As in previous Reports, we have partitioned the Region into a grid of 153 10-minute cells (based upon lines of latitude and longitude) to assist readers to identify the approximate locations for the records which we report. We have assigned a unique alphanumeric indicator to each cell. A map showing the Hunter Region with a guide to cell identification is included at the back of this Report.

The 1995 Report describes the regional status of 347 bird species, including 311 species that were recorded during the year. There are 15 additions to the 1994 species list, and 7 species are newly confirmed to breed within the Region.

As we have noted in previous Reports, it is difficult to generalise any commentary on weather conditions for an area as large and diverse as the Hunter Region. However, 1995 was noteworthy for a very dry August – most if not all locations received no rainfall at all during the month.

Now that we have achieved the milestone of our third Report, it is perhaps appropriate to outline some of the philosophies which we are adopting for the Reports. They include the following:

- The overall list of species will include all species which, since 1987, are confirmed by HBOC to have been present in the Region. Although HBOC records pre-date 1987, the prior records have not yet been collated.
- The status description for each species is to be subject to regular review, with the aim of ensuring that the description reflects the current situation. For any year, the main indication of the then-current Hunter Region birdlife will come from considering the status descriptions of the listed species.
- All records will be vetted and no record will be accepted for inclusion into the Reports unless HBOC is convinced of its
 validity. Information about the records appraisal scheme is presented futher below.
- Breeding status will be assigned to a species only if definite evidence to this effect has been provided. If there have been no breeding records for a species for 10 or more years, the breeding status will be reviewed.

To assist in vetting records, we have classified each species into one of three categories, as described below. The classification reflects, in part, the frequency of reporting.

- Category 1: all records for the species generally are acceptable.
- Category 2: records usually are acceptable, but supporting information may be required in the event of unusual numbers, location or season.
- Category 3: the species is considered to be of special interest in relation to the Region, and supporting information is required before any record can be accepted for inclusion into the Report.

A Records Appraisal Committee assigns these categories and decides whether each record can be accepted. This Report owes much to the contributions of our Records Officer, Sue Hamonet, and the other members of the committee - Ann Lindsey, Wilma Barden, Jeannette Stephenson, Jim Perry and David Geering. Many thanks!

Equally as important is the contribution from those who have submitted records of their observations during the year. To the regulars and to the newcomers – thanks, and keep up the good work. To all readers, remember: your records are of little value if they only sit in your drawer at home – send them in and let them become building blocks of our knowledge and understanding of the birds of the Hunter Region.

SYSTEMATIC LIST

INTRODUCTION

Bird species are listed in taxonomic order; the order and nomenclature follows that of Christidis and Boles in the 1994 RAOU publication *The Taxonomy and Species of Birds of Australia and its Territories* (ISBN 0815-2233). This publication resulted in significant changes to the taxonomic order, and some changes to nomenclature, of Australian birds.

Definitions of the terms used in status descriptions for the listed species are as follows:

Resident: Recorded in all months;

Migrant: Species that come to an area for a period and then depart;

Bird of passage: Species present in a suitable area for a relatively short period, and equally likely to be observed in any

month of the year;

Common: Species that one can expect to find on all visits to suitable habitats;

Usual: Equally likely to be found in suitable habitats, but not on all visits;

Uncommon: Species that are recorded infrequently on visits to suitable habitats;

Local: Species recorded in only a few favoured localities;

Rare: Species recorded only a few times a year;

Accidental: Species recorded less than once per year, over a 10 year average.

Breeding status, where confirmed, is also described. For species with no confirmed breeding records for 10 or more years, or which are not always recorded each year in the Hunter Region, the breeding status is described as **Past records**. Where a species might be anticipated to breed in the Region, but there are no confirmed records, the description **None recorded** has been used. We hope that, in time, our knowledge of breeding status will grow.

The majority of records we receive include assignments of abundance levels for the species observed, using the following categories: A = 1-5 birds present; B = 6-20; C = 21-50; D = 51-100; E = 100+. Commentaries in this Report are based mainly upon abundance levels reported in this way. The format for the observations reported generally includes reference to the relevant grid number (e.g. F7), and observer code and, sometimes, a location abbreviation. A key for this supporting detail is given later in the Report. A semi-quantitative measure of the number of observations of a species for the year is indicated by the progressive use of the terms: occasionally; moderately often; often; frequently; regularly. As a general rule, where there are fewer than 10-12 observations, all of them are reported.

BIRDS

Emu Dromaius novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 001 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare (may be recorded in W of the Region)

Two birds were recorded at Murrumbo Gap (D7) Aug 11 (GED).

Australian Brush-turkey Alectura lathami

HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 008 Status: Resident Breeding: Yes

1-5 birds were recorded at Maxwells Camp (O2) Feb 2 (OCG), Hallidays Point (R5) Jul 22 (JUT), Harrington (S4) Oct 29 (HTH), Ferndale Park (M6) Dec 9/10 (CJB) and Blue Gum Creek (L10) Dec 30 (GRN), and 20+ birds at Barrington House (L5) Feb 19 (HBOC).

Stubble Quail Coturnix pectoralis RAOU No: 009 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare (possibly overlooked).

Five birds were recorded at Howes Valley (H10) May 7 (LIA), and a single male at Dawsons Hill (J6) May 11 (JUT). Some birds were also at Mount Vincent (L10) Oct 21 (GRN).

Brown Quail Coturnix ypsilophora

HBOC Category: 2 RAOU No: 011 Status: Resident Breeding: Yes

Groups of 1-5 birds were recorded at Wallabi Point (R5) Apr 6 (OCG), Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC), Minimbah (Q6) Jun 17 (MVBW), Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC), near Bulahdelah (P7) Oct 8 (BID), Woodville (L9) Nov 12 (NEM), Stockrington (L10) Nov 17 (GRN), Tomago (M9) Nov 19 (HBOC). 6-20 birds were at Main Creek (J6) Jun 10 (JUT), SBS Aug 13 (HAS), Upper Monkerai (M6) Oct 3/4 (GJC). Birds were also present, numbers not recorded, at Yarratt S.F. (Q3) Apr 22 (MVBW).

King Quail Coturnix chinensis

HBOC Category: 3 BAOU No: 012 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncertain

Not recorded.

Magpie Goose Anseranas semipalmata

HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident

Birds were recorded all year at SWC/NWR - mostly as 20-50 birds, but 70+ birds were recorded there Sep 23 (MOA). Birds were also recorded at Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) - 20+ were present Feb 19 (LIA) and four birds Nov 19 (STA).

Plumed Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna eytoni

Breeding: No RAOU No: 205 HBOC Category: 2

Status: Bird of passage

100+ birds were recorded near Singleton (J8) Jun 11 (WAR1), with 15 birds also there Jun 19 (JUT). Single birds were at Arrowfield (H7) Jan 10 (ALP) and BbR Jul 15 (LIP), two birds at Tarro (L9) Dec 11 (SMJ1), and four birds at Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jan 15 (YAR).

Wandering Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna arcuata

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident and bird of passage.

The only records received were from SWC/NWR and the adjoining Market Swamp. Reports were mostly of 1-5 birds; 60+ birds were present Oct 29 (MOA) and 20+ birds Nov 7 (HBOC). Birds were with dependent young Mar 8 (BIA).

Blue-billed Duck Oxyura australis

RAOU No: 216 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

Status: Accidental. (Revised from: Rare)

Not recorded since 1989.

Musk Duck Biziura lobata

HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 217 Status: Local resident. Breeding: Yes

Occasionally but widely recorded at medium to large waters, mostly as 1-5 birds. Seven birds were at Lake Liddell (H7) Nov 24 (ALP) and six birds at Morpeth STP (L9) Jun 4 (YAR). Also, 6+ birds were recorded at Tomago (M9) Nov 19 (HBOC).

Freckled Duck Stictonetta naevosa

HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No RAOU No: 214

Status: Accidental

Single birds were recorded at Market Swamp (M10) Jan 22 (LIA/BAW) and Feb 6 (LIA/HAS), and two birds at Arrowfield Dec 11/13 (ALP).

Black Swan Cygnus atratus

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 203

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters. c 500 birds were at KI Mar 5 (LIA); five other reports were of 100+ birds. Six breeding records were received - in Jan, Feb, Aug and Dec.

Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides

HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No RAOU No: 207

Status: Accidental. (New to list)

A single male bird was recorded at Ash Island (M10) Dec 31 (NEM).

Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 202

Widely and regularly recorded at or near fresh to brackish waters. Over 50% of reports were of 6+ birds, and six reports were of 50+ birds. Birds were on nest at Broke (I9) Sep 24 (HBOC) and with dependent young at Brightwaters (L11) Sep 18 (LIA).

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos

RAOU No: 948 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Local resident

1-5 birds were recorded at MLNP (Q7) Jan 2/4 (BID), BbR Feb 7, Morpeth STP (L9) Mar 19, WWW Jun 6 and Coopernook S.F. (R3) Jun 9/12 (all HBOC reports). Birds were also present at BbR Oct 28 (LTP) - numbers were not noted.

Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

RAOU No: 208 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at small to large waters. Over 50% of all reports were of 6+ birds, and with 20+ birds frequently being recorded at medium to large waters. Around 10% of reports were of 50+ birds. Birds were with dependent young at SBS Jan 26 and Sep 5 (HAS, HBOC), Irrawang Swamp (M9) Nov 19 (STA) and SWC during Dec (LIA).

Australasian Shoveler Anas rhynchotis

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Local resident and bird of passage. (Revised from: Bird of passage)

Birds were frequently recorded at SWC/NWR, with 20+ present late Jun and during Jul (WMK, ROD) and lesser numbers at other times. 1-5 birds were also frequently seen at Gloucester (N5) (TUD). Elsewhere, 1-5 birds were recorded at Stockton STP (M10) Jan 22 and Mar 23 (LIA, CBOC), Glen Oak (M8) Feb 18 (LIA), Morpeth STP (L9) Jun 4 (YAR), Cayuga (O4) Jul 3 (OCG) and Ash Island (M10) Dec 31 (NEM). 6-20 birds were at Birmingham Gardens (M10) Feb 23 (GED), Wentworth Swamp (L9) Mar 19 (HBOC) and Ash Island (M10) Dec 30 (MOA), while a total of around 50 birds were recorded in the Morpeth/Seaham area (L9/M9) Feb 18 (LIA).

Grey Teal Anas gracilis

RAOU No: 211 Status: Usual resident (Revised from: Resident). HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Widely and frequently recorded at medium to large waters, including in the western part of the Region - reports were received for Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC) and NE of Cassilis (C4) Nov 12 (ALP). Reports were generally of fewer than 20 birds, but greater flocks were not uncommon. 80+ birds were recorded at Ash Island (M10) Dec 30 (MOA). Birds were with dependent young at Market Swamp (M10) Feb 6 and SWC during Dec (LIA).

Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 210

Status: Usual resident

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region. Around 50 birds were at Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jan 21 (LIA); otherwise, the most westerly records were from the Morpeth (L9) area. Over 35% of reports were of 20+ birds, and with 200+ birds recorded at Ash Island (M10) Dec 31 (NEM) and c 100 birds at Morpeth STP (L9) Jun 4 (YAR). Birds were with dependent young at Stockton STP (M10) Nov 11 and Irrawang Swamp (M9) Nov 19 (STA).

Breeding: No

Garganey Anas querquedula RAOU No: 209 Status: Accidental (recorded in 1993).

Not recorded.

Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus

RAOU No: 213 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Newly assigned)

Status: Bird of passage.

Two birds were recorded at Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jan 15 (YAR) and in the Morpeth/Seaham area (L9/M9) Feb 18 (LIA), and three birds at Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) Nov 19 (STA). A pair nested at the latter site in late Jan, raising three young through early Feb (HWT) - this appears to be the first confirmed breeding record for the Region.

Hardhead Aythya australis

RAOU No: 215 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

HBOC Category: 3

Status: Usual resident.

Birds were recorded regularly at SWC/NWR, Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) and Morpeth STP (L9), and occasionally elsewhere. Numbers were variable, with flocks of 30-50 birds not uncommon. c 200 birds were recorded at Bungwahl (Q7) Jan 13 (LIA) and 100+ at Eurunderee Lagoon MLNP (Q8) Jan 4 (TUD).

Australasian Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

RAOU No: 061 Status: Common resident

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters; around 50% of reports were of 1-5 birds. 50+ birds were at WWW Jun 6 (HBOC). Ten breeding reports were received - spanning Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec.

Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus

RAOU No: 062 Status: Bird of passage. Breeding: Past records

A group of 15 birds were at Morpeth STP (L9) Jun 4 (YAR), and 1-5 birds were at the swamps around Shortland (M10) Apr 15 & Jun 25 (MOA, HBOC) and in the Morpeth/Seaham area (L9/M9) Feb 18 (LIA).

Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus

HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 060 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident

Birds were at Grahamstown Dam (M9) Oct 29 (HTH), numbers not recorded.

Little Penguin Eudyptula minor

RAOU No: 005 Status: Local resident HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Birds were breeding at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) during Dec, with 220+ being present over Dec 4/8 (CAN/MOA). At nearby Port Stephens, 1-3 birds were present Jan 1/6, Feb 22 and Mar 11 (BID, HDD). Three distressed birds were rescued at Old Bar Beach (R4) in late Mar, following storms (MVBW), and a single bird was at Seal Rocks (R7) late Dec (PEJ).

Southern Giant-Petrel Macronectes giganteus

HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No RAOU No: 929 Status: Rare.

Not recorded.

Gould's Petrel Pterodroma leucoptera

RAOU No: 078 Status: Local summer migrant. HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes

The 1994/95 breeding population was 150 pairs, of an estimated world population of around 1000 birds. Most breeding burrows were at Cabbage Tree Island (P9), but a minor satellite colony was discovered at nearby Boondelbah Island. A 25% increase in breeding success has been achieved as a result of an intensive conservation program. (Information about the NSW National Parks & Wildlife program was supplied by CAN). In December, 350 pairs were nesting (CAN/MOA).

Wedge-tailed Shearwater Puffinus pacificus

RAOU No: 069 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Summer migrant

Flocks of 50-200+ birds, sometimes mixed with Short-tailed Shearwater *P. tenuirostris*, were recorded several times during Jan-Feb and Oct-Dec from beaches around Newcastle. 500+ birds were off Glenrock SRA (M10) Dec 10 (HBOC) and at Seal Rocks (R7) late Dec (PEJ), and 1000+ were at sea off Moon Island (M11) Oct 2 (MOA). Five birds were seen off Stockton Beach (M10) Apr 1 and 10-12 birds off Glenrock SRA Apr 29 (STA).

We were advised that birds breed regularly on offshore islands, such as Broughton Island and Cabbage Tree Island (MOA).

Buller's Shearwater Puffinus bulleri

Breeding: No HBOC Category: 3 RAOU No: 975

Status: Accidental. (New to list)

A single bird was recorded on Cabbage Tree Island (P9) in April, and another bird was banded there on Dec 18 (CAN). These were only the third and fourth records, respectively, for this species on the island, and the first ever banding of the species in Australia. To date, there has been only one other record in Australia of Buller's Shearwater on land - on Montague Island near Narooma.

Sooty Shearwater Puffinus griseus RAOU No: 070

HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes

10+ birds were at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 4/8 (MOA), and 3 dead birds were found washed ashore at Glenrock SRA (M10) Dec 10 (HBOC).

We were advised that birds breed regularly on offshore islands, such as Broughton Island and Cabbage Tree Island (MOA).

Short-tailed Shearwater Puffinus tenuirostris

Breeding: Yes HBOC Category: 2

Status: Summer migrant. (Revised from: Rare summer migrant)

Many dead birds found along beaches north from Port Stephens in late December (TUD). Single dead birds were also found at Glenrock SRA (M10) Dec 10 (HBOC) and Newcastle Beach (M10) Dec 17 (STA). A mixed flock, with P. pacificus, of 150 birds was seen off Stockton (M10) Dec 30 (BIA), and several birds were at Hallidays Point (R5) Mar 2 (MVBW). At least one bird was at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 15 (CBOC), and four birds were at Seal Rocks (R7) late Dec (PEJ). We were advised that birds breed regularly on offshore islands, such as Broughton Island and Cabbage Tree Island (MOA).

Fluttering Shearwater Puffinus gavia

HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Bird of passage about inshore waters.

20+ birds were recorded at Seal Rocks (R7) late Dec (PEJ).

Shy Albatross Diomedea cauta

RAOU No: 091 HBOC Ca Status: Rare winter bird of passage about inshore waters. HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Not recorded since 1992.

Yellow-nosed Albatross Diomedea chlororhynchos

RAOU No: 089 HBOC Ca Status: Rare winter bird of passage about inshore waters. HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Not recorded.

White-faced Storm-Petrel Fregetta gralaria

HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes (newly confirmed)

Status: Rare summer migrant. (New to list)

Birds were not recorded during the year. However, advice was received (MOA) that breeding occurs each year on Storm Petrel Island (near Broughton Island, cell P8), with birds first arriving in late spring.

White-tailed Tropicbird Phaethon lepturus
RAOU No: 108 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare.

Not recorded.

Australasian Gannet Morus serrator

HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 104

Breeding: No Status: Bird of passage about inshore waters.

Groups of 1-5 birds were recorded at Harrington (S4) Mar 18 and Jun 10 (MVBW, HBOC), Wallabi Point (R5) Apr 6 (OCG), Mungo Brush MLNP (P8) Aug 12/13 (CJB) and Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 4/8 (MOA). Six birds were at BBNP (R6) Jan 8 (LIA), 10 birds off Glenrock SRA (M10) Apr 29 (STA) and 20+ at Seal Rocks (R7) late Dec (PEJ). Unrecorded numbers were at Hallidays Point (R5) Mar 2 (MVBW) and Yacaaba Head (P9) May 2 (HBOC).

Darter Anhinga melanogaster

RAOU No: 101 Status: Usual resident. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Records, mostly of single birds and always of <5 birds, were from SWC/NWR during Jan-Feb (several reports), Stockton (M10) Jan 22 (LIA), SBS Jan 26 (HAS), Booragul (L10) Apr 9 (KBD), Yarratt S.F. (Q3) Apr 22 (MVBW), Boolaroo (L10) during Jun (BRG), Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/ Oct 2 (HBOC), Lake Liddell (H7) Nov 24 (ALP) and Salisbury Gap (L6) Dec 2 (HBOC).

Little Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax melanoleucos
RAOU No: 100 HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 100 Status: Common resident. Breeding: Yes

Widely and regularly recorded at small to large waters. As in previous years, numbers generally were greater when close to the coast. 75 birds were at Swansea (L11) Feb 5 and 125 birds Mar 25 (YAR), and 100+ were present and nesting at Market Swamp/NWR Oct 29 (MOA) - there were 40 nests.

Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax varius

HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Usual coastal resident

Occasionally recorded on the coast or at large bodies of water near to the coast, and mostly as 1-5 birds. Four reports were of 21-50 birds, and 200 birds were at BBNP (R6) Jan 8 (LIA). A notable inland record was of a single bird seen several times at Rowleys River (O2) over Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC).

Little Black Cormorant Phalacrocorax sulcirostris

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters. Numbers were variable, and reports of 20+ birds were often received. Sometimes present in large numbers in the Swansea (L11) area - 100 birds Feb 5, 200 birds Dec 9 and 500 birds Mar 25 (all YAR reports). 80+ birds were at Market Swamp/NWR Oct 29, with 30 nests (MOA); birds were also nesting at this site Feb 4 (STA).

Great Cormorant Phalacrocorax carbo

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters. Reports from inland were generally of 1-5 birds, whereas nearcoastal reports were often of 20+ birds. 40+ pairs were breeding at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) through Apr-Nov (CAN/MOA), with c 100 breeding pairs present Jun 24 (GED). Birds also bred at NWR, with 38 pairs there Jul 26 (GED) and unrecorded numbers Jun 25 (HBOC).

Australian Pelican Pelecanus conspicillatus

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters; around 70% of reports were of <20 birds. 100+ birds were at Wallis Lake (Q6) Jan 8 and in the Morpeth/Seaham area (L9/M9) Feb 18 (LIA), and around Swansea (L11) Oct 2 (MOA), while 300+ were recorded at Market Swamp (M10) Feb 18 (GED). Birds had four nests, with 40 dependent young, at Pelican Island BBNP (Q6) May 28 (TUD).

White-faced Heron Egretta novaehollandiae
RAOU No: 188 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident

Widely and frequently recorded, mainly as reports of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were often present at Ash Island, with 50+ birds there Feb 6 (LIA). Also, 22 birds were at Morpeth Common (L9) Sep 10 (LIA). Birds were nest building at Throsby Creek (M10) Aug 27 and had a nest with young there Oct 7 (CLT). Birds were also on nest at Throsby Creek Jan 7 (CLT).

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

RAOU No: 185 HBOC Category: 1

Status: Resident

Occasionally recorded at medium to large waters in E of the Region. Most reports were of 1-5 birds, but 6+ birds were at WWW Jun 6 (HBOC). Some birds had nests with eggs and others were with dependent young at SWC Jan 15 (ROD).

Eastern Reef Egret Egretta sacra

HBOC Category: 2 RAOU No: 191 Breeding: Yes (Newly confirmed)

Status: Bare

Single birds were recorded at Merewether Baths (M10) Jul 12 (WMK) and Seal Rocks (R7) late Dec (PEJ). As usual, the birds were of dark phase. No breeding records were received specifically for this year, however, information was reported (MOA) that birds breed every year on Moon Island (near Swansea, K11).

White-necked Heron Ardea pacifica

Birds were on nests and with dependent young at SWC Jan 14/15 (STA, ROD) and also were nesting there during Dec (LIA).

Intermediate Egret Ardea intermedia

Status: Resident.

Occasionally recorded at medium to large waters in E of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds except where breeding. 6+ birds were at MLNP (Q7) Jan 2/4 (BID), Minmi (L10) Jan 15 (LIA) and SWC Oct 29 (HTH). A pair had a nest with young at Throsby Creek (M10) Jan 7 (CLT), and 20+ birds were breeding at SWC in Jan and again in Dec (ROD, LIA).

Cattle Egret Ardea ibis

Status: Resident.

Frequently recorded in E of Region – the most westerly record was of 20 birds at Gloucester Tops (L5) Oct 1 (YAR). Around 40% of reports were of 20+ birds and several were of 100+ birds. Breeding colonies of 200+ birds were at Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) and SWC – both colonies were active during Jan-Feb and again during Nov-Dec (many reports).

Striated Heron Butorides striatus

1-5 birds were recorded at KI/Stockton Jan 22, Oct 29 & Nov 11 (LIA, LTP, STA), Cockle Creek (L10) Jan 24 (KBD), Ash Island (M10) Feb 6 & Mar 5 (LIA, HBOC), Harrington (S4) Mar 18 & Jun 10 (MVBW, HBOC), Saltwater (R4/5) Apr 6 (MVBW), Wallabi Point (R5) Apr 6 (OCG), Lemon Tree Passage (O9) May 25 (STM) and Wangi Point/Myuna Bay (L11) Jul 4 (HBOC).

Nankeen Night Heron Nycticorax caledonicus

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Revised from: Has bred)

Status: Local resident and bird of passage.

Often recorded at SWC/NWR, in varying numbers up to 50 birds. Elsewhere, 1-5 birds were recorded at Swansea (L11) Jan 20 (YAR), Cockle Creek (L10) Jan 24 (KBD), Beresfield (L9) Feb 7 (BID), Forster Keys (R6) Apr 20 (MVBW), Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) Apr 23 (STA), Wangi Point/ Myuna Bay (L11) Jul 4 (HBOC), Allynbrook (L7) Oct 14 (HBOC), Paterson (L8) Oct 14 & Nov 4 (HBOC), Barnsley (L10) Nov 4 (GRN), Wallsend South (M10) Nov 17 (IMJ) and Woodville (L9) Dec 23 (NEM). Birds were with dependent young at SWC during Dec (LIA), and a juvenile was at MLNP Nov 4 (TUB/ROA3).

Little Bittern Ixobrychus minutus

RAOU No: 195 Status: Rare (probably overlooked). HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

A single bird was recorded at NWR Jan 18 (GED).

Black Bittern Ixobrychus flavicollis

RAOU No: 196 Status: Rare. HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Past records (1994)

Not recorded.

Australasian Bittern Botaurus poiciloptilus

HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

RAOU No: 197 Status: Rare. (New to list)

Single birds were recorded at Hexham N.R. (M9) Aug 22 (MAJ) and Gillieston (L9) Aug 23 (QET).

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus

Breeding: No HBOC Category: 1 BAOU No: 178

Status: Bird of passage.

Two birds were recorded at Birmingham Gardens (M10) Feb 23 (GED).

Australian White Ibis Threskiornis molucca
RAOLI No: 179 HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 179 Status: Usual resident. Breeding:Yes

Widely and frequently recorded in E of Region – the most westerly records were from Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jan 15 & 21 (YAR, LIA). Around 30% of reports were of 20+ birds. 100+ birds were at Minmi (L10) Jan 15 (LIA) and Lemon Tree

Passage (O9) May 25 (STM). c 500 birds were at SWC Apr 15 (ROD) and also 200 birds were there during Dec (LIA).

Past breeding records at SWC and Dora Creek in 1988 were advised (MOA).

Straw-necked Ibis Threskiornis spinicollis

Widely and often recorded; 45% of reports were of 20+ birds, and nine reports were of 100+ birds. Large flocks (of up to 300 birds) were regularly at Tarro (L9) during Jan-Feb (BRE), and c 500 birds were at Minmi (L10) Jan 15 (LIA).

Royal Spoonbill Platalea regia

Widely and frequently recorded in E of Region - the most westerly records were from Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jan 15 & 21 (YAR, LIA). Around 75% of reports were of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were at Pelican (L11) Jun 24 (GJC) and 53 birds at Tarro Swamp (M9) Apr 6 (SMJ1).

Yellow-billed Spoonbill Platalea flavipes

Status: Bird of passage

Single birds were recorded at Birmingham Gardens (M10) Feb 23 (GED), Morpeth STP (L9) Jun 4 (YAR), Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) Nov 19 (STA) and Lake Liddell (H7) Nov 24 (ALP). Four birds were at Pelican (L11) Jun 24 (GJC), and <5 birds were at WWW Jun 6 (HBOC).

Black-necked Stork Ephippiorhynchus asiaticus

Status: Bird of passage.

Recorded on 15 occasions in E of Region throughout the year, all reports were of single birds. Numbers were reported to be increasing in the Port Stephens/Forster area (TUD) – a similar trend may well be occurring for the overall Region.

(S3) May 4 (MVBW), Boomerang Beach (R7) May 23 and Pelican Island BBNP (Q6) May 28 (TUD), Tilligerry Creek (N9) Aug 8 (GED), Old Bar (R4) Oct 5 (MVBW), and frequently at Harrington (S4) and in MLNP. 5 birds were at Harrington Feb 1 (OCG), and a pair had a nest with 1 young there Dec 2 (MVBW). A pair with 1 juvenile were also at Saltwater (R4/5) Apr 6 (MVBW).

Pacific Baza Aviceda subcristata

Status: Uncommon resident (Revised from: Local resident).

1-2 birds were occasionally recorded in E of Region. Three adult birds were at Callaghan (M10) Jan 20 (MPM) and four birds at Bonnells Bay (L10) Feb 21 (HDD). Birds were nesting at Hannam Vale (R3) Nov 18 (MVBW) and seen carrying food at BbR Feb 7 (HBOC).

Black-shouldered Kite Elanus axillaris

One or two birds, occasionally three, were often recorded in E of Region. The most westerly records were from Singleton (J8) and Mt Thorley (J8) – regularly seen at both locations (ALP).

Brahminy Kite Haliastur indus

1-2 birds, where numbers were noted, were recorded at Harrington (S4) Feb 1 & Jun 10 (OCG, HBOC), Crowdy Bay N.P. (S3) May 4 (MVBW), Hexham bridge (M9) May 13 (WCR), BBNP (R6) Jul 5 & 31 (TUD), Old Bar (R4) Oct 5 (MVBW) and Forster (R6) Oct 7/8 (BID).

White-bellied Sea-Eagle Haliaeetus leucogaster

Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

1-2 birds, where numbers were noted, were frequently recorded at or near large waters. A pair nested at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) during Sep, however, the nest became blown out and the single young bird died (CAN/MOA).

Spotted Harrier Circus assimilis

Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncommon resident (Revised from: Local resident)

Single birds were recorded at West Mayfield (M10) Jan 1 (GED), NWR Jan 9 & 11 (WCR, FOC), Mount Thorley (I8) May 16 (ALP), Hinton (L9) Aug 4 & Oct 9 (NEM) and Jerrys Plains (H7) Nov 14 (ALP). Two birds were at Woodville (L9) area Jan 6 (NEM).

Swamp Harrier Circus approximans

Single birds, where numbers were noted, were recorded at Ash Island (M10) Feb 6 (LIA), Morpeth/ Seaham area (L9/M9) Feb 18 & Jun 4 (LIA, YAR), Harrington (S4) Mar 18, Jun 10 & Dec 2 (MVBW, HBOC), Old Bar (R4) Oct 5 (MVBW), Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 4/8 & 15 (MOA, CBOC), Beresfield (L9) Dec 12 (SMJ1), and regularly at SWC.

Brown Goshawk Accipiter fasciatus

Grev Goshawk Accipiter novaehollandiae

Wedge-tailed Eagle *Aquila audax* RAOU No: 224

Status: Usual resident.

One or two birds, occasionally up to four, were recorded moderately often in the central and W of Region. Birds were on nest at Yallambie (I11) Aug 27 (OCG).

Little Eagle Hieraaetus morphnoides

Single birds were seen at Arrowfield (H7) Jan 10 & 23 (ALP), Medowie (M9) Feb 18 (YAR), Cardiff (L10) Mar 3 (STJ), Redhead (M11) Apr 2 (GJC), Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC), Yarratt S.F. (Q3) Apr 22 (MVBW), Singleton (J8) Jun 18 (ALP), Awabakal N.R. (M10/11) Jun 27 (GJC), and Stockton (M10) Nov 11 (STA).

Brown Falcon Falco berigora

Occasionally but widely recorded; all reports were of single birds. A bird at Wingham Park (Q4) was observed to be eating a Willie Wagtail Rhipidura leucophrys Nov 22 (MVBW).

Single birds were recorded at Blandford (H3) Oct 28 (HTH) and Bureen (G7) Dec 11 (GED).

One or two birds were occasionally recorded. Four birds and two young were at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 4/8 (MOA). A bird at BbR May 21 was carrying a possum (ORB).

Buff-banded Rail Gallirallus philippensis

Purple Swamphen Porphyrio porphyrio

Frequently recorded, especially in E of region. Around 20% of reports were of 21-50 birds. Birds had chicks at SWC during Dec (LIA).

Dusky Moorhen *Gallinula tenebrosa* RAOU No: 056 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded – where numbers were noted, 55% of reports were of 6+ birds. Regularly present at SWC/NWR in high numbers (21-100) and were breeding there Sep 2/3 and during Nov-Dec (several reports). Birds had dependent young at Tocal (L9) Nov 4 (HBOC) and also were nesting at Hannam Vale (R3) Nov 18 (MVBW).

Eurasian Coot Fulica atra

Widely and frequently recorded, with around 40% of reports being of 20+ birds. 100+ birds were at SBS Jan 26 (HAS) and Lake Liddell (H7) Nov 24 (ALP), and c 500 at Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jan 15 (YAR). Some birds at SBS Jan 26 had dependent young.

Painted Button-quail Turnix varia

Status: Uncommon resident. (Revised from: Rare, possibly overlooked)

Single birds were recorded at MLNP (Q7) Jan 19 (TUD), Bootawa (Q4) early Jun (MVBW) and Mount Sugarloaf (L11) Nov 11 & 17 (YAR), two birds at Martins Creek (L8) Sep 9 (HBOC), Woodville (L9) Oct 21 and Green Wattle Creek (L9) Oct 28 (NEM) and Watagan S.F. (K11) Nov 3 (LIA). Four birds were at Putty (G10) Sep 3 (BIA).

Latham's Snipe Gallinago hardwickii

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Usual summer migrant.

Last recorded at Market Swamp (M10) Feb 6 (LIA), and at Woodville (L9) Mar 17 (NEM); however, two birds were at Mulbring (K10) Apr 15 (NEM). First recorded returns were Sep 6, when two birds were at Irrawang Swamp (M9) (PRK) and one bird at SWC (BIA). Greatest numbers recorded were 20 birds at Market Swamp Dec 30 (BIA).

Black-tailed Godwit Limosa limosa

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No RAOU No: 152

Status: Summer migrant.

Frequently recorded in the KI/Fullerton Cove area (M10), with c 300 birds present during Jan-Feb and 40 birds still remaining Apr 4 (GED). Four birds had returned Sep 10 (QUT) and five birds were recorded there Oct 14 (YAR). Other records were of 1-5 birds at Ash Island (M10) Jan 4 & 11 (GED) and Swan Bay (N9) Mar 9, and 6+ birds at Harrington (S4) Feb 1 (OCG).

Bar-tailed Godwit Limosa Iapponica

Often recorded around coastal mudflats, with numbers of 21-50 not uncommon. Generally absent from mid-April, but small numbers were recorded at Tea Gardens (O8) May 2 (HBOC), Lemon Tree Passage (O9) May 25 (STM) and Harrington (S4) Jun 10 (HBOC). Around 200 birds still remained there Apr 4 (GED).

Whimbrel Numenius phaeopus

Regularly recorded in the KI/Fullerton Cove area (M10), and occasionally at other coastal mudflats. Greatest numbers at KI/Fullerton Cove were c 500 birds Jan 22 (LIA); counts of 200+ birds were common over Jan-Feb and numbers of 100+ persisted until at least Apr 4 and 13 birds over-wintered (GED). Elsewhere, records were mostly of 1-5 birds, including at Tahlee (O8) Aug 14 (OCG). 20+ birds were at Harrington (S4) Feb 1 (OCG).

Eastern Curlew *Numenius madagascariensis*RAOU No: 149 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Common summer migrant.

Frequently recorded around coastal mudflats. Reports were mostly of <20 birds, except at Harrington (S4), where 50+ birds were present Feb 1 (OCG), and in the KI/Fullerton Cove area (M10). Here, counts over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec were often of 100-500 birds, and with c 1000 birds recorded Oct 14 (GED, YAR). Birds were present until at least Apr 7, when three birds were recorded at Swansea (L11) (MOA). A single bird was at Throsby Creek (M10) Aug 19 (CLT); by Sep 10, 330 birds were at KI (QUT).

Marsh Sandpiper Tringa stagnatilis

Greatest numbers at KI were 433 birds Feb 6 (GED), and at Ash Island 160 birds Jan 17 (GED).

Common Sandpiper Actitis hypoleucos

Moderately often recorded along the coast, in groups of up to six birds. 12 birds were at Sand Island Forster (R6) Dec 14 (TUD). A nest with one egg was at Godwin Island Forster (R6) Oct 28 (TUD), and three immatures were at Sand Island Oct 28 (TUD).

Sooty Oystercatcher Haematopus fuliginosus

Seven birds were at Newcastle Baths (M10) Mar 6 (OCG).

Black-winged Stilt Himantopus himantopus

Birds were on nests at Market Swamp/NWR Oct 29 (MOA) and KI Dec 21 (LIA), and had dependent young at SBS Jan 26 (HAS).

Banded Stilt Cladorhynchus leucocephalus

Two immature birds were first recorded at a shallow freshwater pond on Kooragang Island on Dec 9 (GED), and thence by a considerable number of observers at the same location during the remainder of the year.

Pacific Golden Plover Pluvialis fulva

Red-capped Plover Charadrius ruficapillus

Double-banded Plover Charadrius bicinctus

Little Tern Sterna albifrons

59 nests were at Harrington over the summer of 94/95, with 35 nests active towards the end of the season. Only four fledglings survived the combined effects of bad weather and predation by Silver Gull Larus novaehollandiae (MVBW). Two nests (one with eggs, one with young) were at Yagon MLNP (R7) Jan 14 and 13 nests at Miles Island Forster (R6) during Dec (TUD).

Whiskered Tern Chlidonias hybridus

Two birds were recorded at Maxwells Camp (O2) Feb 2 (OCG), and two birds, one of which was injured and later died, were seen near Smiths Lake (R7) Aug 8 (reported to TUD). A single bird at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 4/8 (MOA).

Topknot Pigeon Lopholaimus antarcticus

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded RAOU No: 027

Status: Bird of passage

Occasionally recorded; there were 40% fewer records than in 1994. Most reports were of <20 birds, but 60 birds were at Kangaroo Mountain (I6) Jul 16 (JUT) and 50+ birds at BBNP Jul 21 (TUD).

Glossy Black-Cockatoo Calyptorhynchus lathami

Breeding: Past records HBOC Category: 1

Status: Uncommon resident (Revised from: Resident).

16 birds were recorded at Main Creek (J6) Jan 24 (JUT), and substantial (but uncounted) numbers were at Walleroo S.F. (M8) Nov 16 (PAR2/MOA). Elsewhere, 1-5 birds were recorded at Maxwells Camp (O2) Feb 2 (OCG), Barrington House (M7) Mar 9 (TUD), Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC), Commba Park Rd (Q6) Apr 21 (TUD) and Cape Hawke (R6) Jun 21 (MVBW). Birds were also present at Red Creek (D9) Oct 28/29 (FOC) – numbers were not noted.

Yellow-tailed Black-Cockatoo Calyptorhynchus funereus

RAOU No: 267 Status: Usual resident. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Widely and often recorded in central and E of Region; around 55% of reports were of 1-5 birds and the remainder were mostly of <20 birds. 24 birds were at NE of Cassilis (C4) Nov 12 (ALP), 25 birds at West Wallsend (L10) Dec 1 (LIA), and 56 birds at Fullerton Cove (M10) in Jan (GED).

Gang-gang Cockatoo Callocephalon fimbriatum

Breeding: Yes

RAOU No: 268 Status: Resident

1-5 birds were recorded at Howes Valley (H10) May 7 (LIA), Olney S.F. (K11) May 27 (MOA), Yallambie (I11) Aug 27 (OCG) and Goulburn River N.P. (D7) Oct 4 (JUT). 20+ birds were at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC); birds were also present at nearby Red Creek (D9) Oct 28/29 (FOC) – numbers were not noted.

Galah Cacatua roseicapilla

HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 273 Breeding: Past records

Status: Common resident.

Birds were widely and regularly recorded. Most reports were of <20 birds, however, counts of 21-50 birds were not uncommon, particularly in the central and W of the Region.

Long-billed Corella Cacatua tenuirostris

HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 272

Status: Local resident

Groups of 2-5 birds were frequently present at Brightwaters (L11) (L1A), and five birds were recorded at Woodville (L9) Oct 1 (NEM).

Little Corella Cacatua sanguinea

RAOU No: 271 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Resident. (Revised from: Local resident)

Occasionally but widely recorded in SE of Region. Birds were frequently seen at SWC, with 150+ present Jan 29 (ROD) and lesser numbers at other times. Only two records were from N of Port Stephens – single birds were at Wingham (Q4) Jan 4 and Hillville (Q4) Feb 18 (MVBW) – and, possibly, these birds were aviary escapees.

Sulphur-crested Cockatoo Cacatua galerita

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded; around 50% of reports were of 1-5 birds. 200+ birds were at Arrowfield (H7) Jan 18 (ALP) and 400+ at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC).

Cockatiel Nymphicus hollandicus

RAOU No: 274 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncertain. (New to list)

Two birds were recorded at Blandford (H3) and five birds at Willow Tree (G2) on Mar 17 (JUT) - at these locations, the birds are considered likely to be part of a wild population. A single bird - considered likely to be an escapee - was recorded at Singleton (J8) Dec 17 (ALP).

Rainbow Lorikeet Trichoglossus haematodus

RAOU No: 254 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Amended)

Status: Usual resident.

Occasionally recorded in E of Region; the most westerly record was from Barrington House (L5) Feb 19 (HBOC). 50+ birds were at Coopernook S.F. (R3) Jun 9/12 (HBOC), and 20+ birds at Tahlee (O8) Aug 14 (OCG) and frequently at Brightwaters (L11) (LIA). Numbers increased in Newcastle area in late October/early November (HBOC) – apparently coinciding with local flowering of ironbark trees.

Scaly-breasted Lorikeet Trichoglossus chlorolepidotus

Status: Usual resident.

Occasionally recorded in near-coastal areas throughout the Region. 50+ birds were regularly at Shoal Bay (O9) over Jan 1/6 (BID), and 100+ birds at Coopernook S.F. (R3) Jun 9/12 (HBOC). A notable inland record was of <5 birds at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC).

Musk Lorikeet Glossopsitta concinna

HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 3) Breeding: None recorded RAOU No: 258

Status: Bird of passage

There was a large influx of birds to the area W of Lake Macquarie during May-July (LIA, DUP), with several sightings at Coal Point (L11), Morriset (K11) and Brightwaters (L11) over this period. Numbers were variable, from 20+ and peaking at 100+ birds. Other records outside this location/period were of a single bird at Brightwaters during Mar (LIA), four birds at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC), and two birds at Bombah Point MLNP (P8) Jun 26 (TUD) and Toronto (L11) Nov 29 (DUP).

Little Lorikeet Glossopsitta pusilla

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 260

Status: Resident

1-5 birds were recorded at Swansea South (L11) Jul 11 (HAS) and Morisset Hospital (L11) Aug 5 (HBOC), and 6-20 birds at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17, Bobs Farm (O9) May 2, Buttai (L9) Jul 23, HRBG Aug 20, Broke (I9) Sep 24 (all HBOC records), and at BBNP (R6) May 22 (TUD) and Seal Rocks (R7) late Dec (PEJ). A group of 40-50 birds were in the Watagan S.F. (K11) Jan 26 (CBOC). Birds were also at MLNP (P8) May 2 (HBOC), Morisset (K11) Jul 22 (LIA) and Swansea Jul 25 (CJC), with numbers not recorded.

Australian King-Parrot Alisterus scapularis
HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

RAOU No: 281 Status: Usual resident.

Widely and frequently recorded; around 75% of reports were of 1-5 birds and the remainder, with one exception, were of 6-20 birds. 50+ birds were in the Charity Creek/Rocks Crossing area (P4/O3) Jun 10 (HBOC).

Crimson Rosella Platycercus elegans

RAOU No: 282 Status: Usual resident. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Widely and often recorded, with around 60% of reports being of 1-5 birds; 6-20 birds were frequently recorded at midaltitudes and higher. 20+ birds were at Maxwells Camp (O2) Feb 2 (OCG) and NE of Cassilis (C4) Nov 12 (ALP). A bird and an Eastern Rosella P. eximius were seen together regularly at Salamander Bay (O9) over Apr-Jun (RET), and possibly were paired.

Eastern Rosella Platycercus eximius

RAOU No: 288 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 65% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were at Medowie (M9) Feb 18 (YAR), Wangi Point/Myuna Bay (L11) Jul 4 and Tocal (L9) Nov 4 (both HBOC). Birds had dependent young at Howes Valley (H10) and BbR Jan 21 (LIA, STA) and NLH Oct 31 (HIM). Note comments above concerning a possible pairing with Crimson Rosella P. elegans.

Swift Parrot Lathamus discolor

HBOC Category: 3 RAOU No: 309 Breeding: No

Status: Rare. (New to list)

A group of at least 10 birds were at Morisset (K11) Jul 10/17 (reported by several observers), and around 30 birds were at Tahlee (O8) Sep 9/10 (VGF).

Red-rumped Parrot Psephotus haematonotus

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Moderately often recorded, with around 80% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC) and Arrowfield (H7) Dec 29 (ALP). Birds were on nest at KI Dec 30 (MOA).

Turquoise Parrot Neophema pulchella

HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncommon resident (Revised from: Resident).

Six birds were recorded at Red Creek (D9) and a single bird at nearby Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC). A single female was at East Maitland (K9) Jan 27 (MPM), and a pair at Yengo N.P. (I11) Jun (LIA).

Oriental Cuckoo Cuculus saturatus

RAOU No: 336 Status: Accidental HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Not recorded.

Pallid Cuckoo Cuculus pallidus

RAOU No: 337 Status: Usual summer migrant. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Newly confirmed)

Occasionally recorded, always as <5 birds. No reports after March, until Aug 25 when first heard again at Cooranbong (K11) (BIA). By early Sep, there had been several records. A young bird was being fed by White-breasted Woodswallow Artamus leucorhynchus at Market Swamp (M10) Feb 6 (LIA/HAS) and another (host species not noted) at Tocal (L9) Nov 4, with two adult birds in the vicinity (HBOC). A juvenile bird was also at Market Swamp (M10) Feb 4 (STA).

Brush Cuckoo Cacomantis variolosus

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Summer migrant.

All records were of single birds, or birds were heard only. Several records during Nov – at Tocal (L9), Tomago (M9), Woodville area (L9) and Fords Rd (R3) (HBOC, MVBW, NEM). Birds were also recorded at Broadwater MLNP (P8) Jan 1 (TUD), Quorrobolong Creek (J10) Jan 19 (MOA), Turill S.F. (B5) Feb 4 (JUT), Barrington House (L5) Feb 19 (HBOC) and Webbers Creek (L8) Oct 29 (NEM).

Fan-tailed Cuckoo Cacomantis flabelliformis

Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 338 HBOC Category: 1

Status: Common resident

Widely and regularly recorded, mostly as 1-5 birds. 6+ birds were at Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC).

Black-eared Cuckoo Chrysococcyx osculans

RAOU No: 341 Status: Accidental HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

A bird was heard at Tocal (L9) Nov 4 (HBOC).

Horsfield's Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx basalis

Breeding: Yes HBOC Category: 1

Status: Summer migrant, some birds may be present all year

1-2 birds were seen or heard at Stockton (M10) Jan 22 (LIA), Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17, Morisset Hospital (L11) Aug 5, SBS Sep 5, Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2, Allynbrook (L7) Oct 14 (all were HBOC records), Redmanvale (H8) Oct 28 (MOA), Timor (I3) Nov 11 (JUT). Also recorded on several occasions in the Woodville (L9) area during Sep (NEM) and at SWC over Sep-Dec (several observers).

Shining Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx lucidus

RAOU No: 344 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Newly assigned) Status: Usual summer migrant, some birds are resident. (Revised: residential status previously uncertain)

Widely and moderately often recorded in the central and E of Region, as 1-5 birds. Around 50% of records were for the period May-Aug. A juvenile was at Belmont South (L11) Aug 5, being fed by two adult birds (CJB).

Little Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx minutillus

RAOU No: 345 Status: Accidental (recorded in 1992) HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Usual summer migrant.

Not recorded.

Common Koel Eudynamis scolopacea

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Widely and often recorded in central and E of Region; all reports were of 1-5 birds. A juvenile was at Singleton (J8) May 3 (ALP), but there were no other records after Apr 1 until recorded again in spring. First heard at Garden Suburb (M10) Sep 11 (PEJ), but apparently birds were not widespread until late Sep. A young bird was being fed by Red Wattlebird Anthochaera carunculata at Newcastle TAFE (M10) Feb 7 (MPM).

Channel-billed Cuckoo Scythrops novaehollandiae

Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 348 HBOC Category: 1

Widely and frequently recorded in the central and E of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds. Seven birds were flying together at SWC Dec 31 (BAW). No records after Feb, until Sep 2 when birds were in the Woodville (L9) area (NEM). Two chicks were at NLH Feb 3, being fed by Australian Raven Corvus coronoides (HIM).

Pheasant Coucal Centropus phasianinus RAOU No: 349 Status: Resident.

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Single birds were recorded at BBNP (R6) Jan 11 (LIA), NE of Karuah (O8) Jan 22 (BID), Oxley Island (R4) Feb 2 (MVBW), Garden Suburb (M10) Jun 1/3 (PEJ), Redhead (M11) Jul 20 (GJC), NLH Aug 9 & Sep 11 (ROA3, HIM), Gloucester Tops (L5) Oct 1 (YAR), SWC Nov 7 (HBOC) and Redhead (M11) Dec 24 (GJC), and two birds at One Mile Beach (R6) Dec 26 (CBOC).

Powerful Owl Ninox strenua

RAOU No: 248 Status: Local resident. HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 3) Breeding: Yes

Two birds were at BbR Jan 22 - one was eating a Dusky Moorhen Gallinula tenebrosa (LIP) - and two adults and a single young were at BbR Sep 23/24 (LIP). Birds also bred at BbR in 1994. A road-killed bird was found at Hallidays Point (R5) in Jul (JUT).

Barking Owl Ninox connivens

HBOC Category: 3 RAOU No: 246 Status: Rare. Breeding: Past records

At least one bird was heard at Rankin Park (M10) in Feb (STJ).

Southern Boobook Ninox novaeseelandiae

RAOU No: 242 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Birds were occasionally, but widely, recorded.

Sooty Owl *Tyto tenebricosa* RAOU No: 253

HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare. No confirmed records for the year.

Masked Owl Tyto novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 250 Status: Rare. HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes

The only confirmed record was of a single bird at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Mar (MOA). The breeding status is reconfirmed - see Supplementary Records.

Barn Owl Tyto alba RAOU No: 249 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Past records

Single birds were recorded near Bulahdelah (P7) Feb 12 and at Ash Island (M10) Feb 17 (both GED), and a dead bird was found in a gully at Dellhurst (J6) Apr 19 (JUT).

(B5) Feb 4 (JUT), Morisset (K11) Mar 16 (LIA), Jesmond (M10) Mar (BRG), Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC), NLH Oct 14 (BGB) and Seal Rocks (R7) late Dec (PEJ). A dead bird was found at Buttaba (L10) Jan 24 (WAR1). The birds at NLH were on nest.

White-throated Nightjar Eurostopodus mystacalis

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Birds were heard at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 and Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2 (both HBOC records). An adult with nest and one egg were at Old Gibber Track MLNP (Q7) Dec 23 (TUD).

Spotted Nightjar Eurostopodus argus

RAOU No: 331 Status: Accidental (recorded in 1989). HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Not recorded.

Australian Owlet-nightjar Aegotheles cristatus
RAOU No: 317 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Resident

Two birds were seen at Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC). Birds were also heard at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 and Dunns Creek (L8) Apr 23 (HBOC).

White-throated Needletail Hirundapus caudacutus

Breeding: No RAOU No: 334 **HBOC Category: 1**

Status: Summer migrant.

200+ birds were recorded at BBNP (R6) Jan 11 (LIA), and 150-200 birds at Singleton (J8) Jan 29 (ALP). Reports of 20-100+ birds were frequent over Jan-Feb and in Dec. All counts were of <20 birds in other months. Birds were present until at least Apr 14/17, when two birds were at Table Bay Creek (E9) (HBOC). First recorded return was Oct 28, when two birds were at Bulga (I8) (CBOC).

Fork-tailed Swift Apus pacificus

RAOU No: 335 HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 3) Status: Uncommon summer migrant (Revised from: Accidental summer migrant). Breeding: No

Around 30 birds were flying over Rathmines (L11) Jan 1 (WMR), and seven birds over NLH Apr 8 (WCR).

Azure Kingfisher Alcedo azurea

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

RAOU No: 319 Status: Resident

1-5 birds were recorded at Bungwahl MLNP (Q7) Jan 12 (TUD), Wallis Island (Q6) Jan 30 (TUD), Saltwater (R4/5) Apr 6 (MVBW), Wallabi Point (R5) Apr 6 (OCG), Tamboy MLNP Apr 11 (TUD), Yarratt S.F. (Q3) Apr 22 (MVBW), Harrington (S4) Jun 10 (HBOC), Cayuga (O4) Jul 3 (OCG), Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC), Johnsons Beach MLNP Oct 5 (NEM), Allynbrook (L7) Oct 14 (HBOC), SWC Nov 4 (YAR), Barnsley (L10) Nov 4 (GRN) and Timor (I3) Nov 11 (JUT).

Laughing Kookaburra Dacelo novaeguineae

RAOU No: 322 Status: Common resident. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 85% of reports being of 1-5 birds. Birds were nesting at Old Bar (R4) Oct 5 (MVBW), Awabakal N.R. (M11) Oct 12 (GJC) and Tomago (M9) Nov 19 (HBOC). A bird was seen to eat a recently fledged Eastern Spinebill Acanthorhynchus tenuirostris at NLH Jan 29 (LIP).

Sacred Kingfisher Todiramphus sanctus

RAOU No: 326 HBOC Category: 1 Status: Usual summer migrant, some birds may be locally resident HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Widely and frequently recorded, mostly as 1-5 birds. Present until at least Apr 17, when birds were recorded at Table Bay Creek (E9) and Red Creek (D9) (HBOC). One winter record – of two birds at Stockton (M10) Aug 5 (CLT). First recorded return was Sep 23, when a single bird was at Buttaba (L11) (WAR1); within one week birds were widespread. Birds were nesting at Tomago (M9) Nov 19 (HBOC) and were feeding dependent young at NWR Feb 4 (STA), BbR Feb 7 and Wentworth Swamp (L9) Mar 19 (both HBOC).

Rainbow Bee-eater Merops ornatus

Occasionally recorded, mostly as 1-5 birds. Present until at least Apr 14/17, when three birds were recorded at Table Bay Creek (E9) (HBOC). First recorded return was Sep 29, when birds were heard at Rowleys River (O2) (HBOC). Birds were nest building at Paterson (L8) and inspecting hollows at nearby Allynbrook (L7) Oct 14 (HBOC).

Dollarbird Eurystomus orientalis

Widely and frequently recorded. Birds were present until at least Mar 21, when recorded at Singleton (J8) (ALP). First recorded return was Sep 22, when a single bird was at Buttaba (L11) (WAR1). More widespread returns did not commence until early Oct.

Noisy Pitta Pitta versicolor RAOU No: 352 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded Status: Rare.

A single bird was recorded at Lemon Tree Watagan S.F. (K11) Dec 3 (FOC).

Superb Lyrebird Menura novaehollandiae

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records RAOU No: 350

Status: Common resident

Widely and moderately often recorded in suitable habitat. 6+ birds were at Maxwells Camp (O2) Feb 2 (OCG).

Rufous Scrub-bird Atrichornis rufescens

RAOU No: 355 Status: Local resident. HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 3) Breeding: None recorded

Birds were occasionally seen in Gloucester Tops Beech Forest (L5) and also heard at two locations along Gloucester Tops Road (L5) in late Oct (ROA1). A bird was also heard at Gloucester Tops Oct 1 (YAR).

White-throated Treecreeper Cormobates leucophaeus

Widely and regularly recorded; around 85% of reports were of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 and Coopernook S.F. (R3) Jun 9/12 (HBOC), and birds had dependent young at Allyn River S.F. (K5) Nov 27 (ALP).

Red-browed Treecreeper Climacteris erythrops

RAOU No: 560 HBOC Categ Status: Uncommon resident. (Revised from: Local resident) HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 1) Breeding: Yes

Two birds were recorded at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC), three birds at Heaton Lookout Watagan S.F. (K10) Nov 24 (YAR), and six birds at Gloucester Tops (L5) Oct 1 (YAR).

Brown Treecreeper Climacteris picumnus

RAOU No: 555 Status: Usual resident. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Occasionally recorded in central and W of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds. 6+ birds were at both Table Bay Creek (E9) and Red Creek (D9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC), and at Timor (I3) Nov 11 (JUT).

Superb Fairy-wren Malurus cyaneus

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 70% of reports being of 6+ birds and including 15% being of 20+ birds. 51-100 birds were at SBS Jan 26 & Aug 13 (HAS), Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 and Allynbrook (L7) Oct 14 (HBOC). Birds were nest building at Mungo Brush MLNP (P8) Aug 12/13 (CJB), and had dependent young at Howes Valley (H10) Sep 24 and Paterson (L8) Oct 14 (HBOC).

Variegated Fairy-wren Malurus lamberti

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 536

Status: Usual resident.

Frequently recorded in central and E of Region, with most reports being of <20 birds and 60% being of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were at HRBG Aug 20 (HBOC) and Medowie S.F. (N9) Apr 30 (YAR), and birds were nest building at Shoal Bay (O9) over Jan 1/6 (BID) and Tomago (M9) Nov 19 (HBOC).

Red-backed Fairy-wren Malurus melanocephalus

Breeding: Past records

RAOU No: 541 HBOC Category: 1 Status: Uncommon resident, in north of Region (Revised from: Resident, etc).

At Howes Valley (H10), a regular location, 1-2 birds were recorded Jan 15 (SCC) and Sep 11-22 (RHN), and 20+ birds Mar 26 (FOC). Low numbers (highest count was 8 birds) were also recorded several times in the Widden Valley – around Table Bay Creek (E9) and Red Creek (D9) – Apr 14/17, Oct 14/15 and Oct 29 (HBOC, FOC). White-naped Honeyeater Melithreptus lunatus

Rufous Fantail Rhipidura rufifrons

Birds were nest building at Vacy (L8) Sep 9 (HBOC) and Blue Gum Creek (L10) Dec 30 (GRN), and had dependent young at Salisbury Gap (L6) Dec 2 (HBOC).

Willie Wagtail Rhipidura leucophrys

Spangled Drongo Dicrurus bracteatus

1-2 birds were sometimes recorded in E of Region – the reporting rate was about 50% of that for 1994. Ground Cuckoo-shrike Coracina maxima

Masked Woodswallow Artamus personatus

Satin Bowerbird Ptilonorhynchus violaceus

Birds were sometimes present in large numbers at Howes Valley (H10) – 20+ were there Sep 24 (HBOC) and 50+ birds Apr 9 & May 7 (LIA, HBOC). 50+ birds were also at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 and Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2 (both HBOC). Some birds were on nests at Table Bay Creek.

Plum-headed Finch Neochmia modesta

RAOU No: 661 Status: Rare. (New to list) HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

A group of seven birds were at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 15/16 (HBOC).

Red-browed Finch Neochmia temporalis

HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 662

Status: Common resident (Revised from: Usual resident)

Widely and regularly recorded. Around 75% of reports were of 6+ birds including 25% being of 20+ birds. 50+ birds were recorded at SBS Jan 26 (HAS), and 100+ birds at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC), Dora Creek (L11) Aug 30 (LIA) and Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC). Birds were nest building at Barnsley (L10) Nov 4 (GRN).

Breeding: Yes

Diamond Firetail Stagonopleura guttata

Breeding: Yes HBOC Category: 1

Status: Resident (Revised from: Local resident).

Groups of 1-5 birds were recorded at Howes Valley (H10) Apr 9 & 30 (LIA, CBOC), Red Creek (D9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC) and Timor (I3) Nov 11 (JUT), and 6+ birds at Howes Valley May 7 (LIA). At Table Bay Creek (E9) over Apr 14/17, 20+ birds were present; some had nests with eggs and others had dependent young (HBOC).

Nutmeg Mannikin Lonchura punctulata

HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

Status: Accidental (Revised from: Rare).

Not recorded since 1991.

Chestnut-breasted Mannikin Lonchura castaneothorax RAOU No: 657 HBOC Category: 1

Breeding: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident (Revised from: Local resident).

20+ birds were recorded at Dora Creek (L11) Mar 5 (LIA) and Gloucester (N5) Aug 5 (TUD), and 6-20 birds at Fullerton Cove (M10) Jan 22 & Feb 25 (LIA, GED), SBS Jan 26 (HAS), NWR Feb 4 (STA), WWW Jun 6 B (HBOC) and Gloucester Jun 10 (CLT). Some birds (<5, or else not counted) were also at Tomago (M9) Jan 3 (GED), Oxley Island (R4) Jan 6 & Feb 2 (MVBW) and KI Apr 1 (STA). Birds at SBS had dependent young.

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis

RAOU No: 996 Status: Local resident HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

1-5 birds were recorded at SBS Jan 26 (HAS), Ash Island (M10) Mar 5 & Aug 20 (HBOC, STA) and Windale (L11) Jul 22 (CLT), and 6+ birds at Market Swamp (M10) Feb 6 (LIA) and Ash Island Sep 29 (MOA).

Mistletoebird Dicaeum hirundinaceum

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

RAOU No: 564 Status: Usual resident (Revised from: Resident).

Widely and often recorded, mostly as 1-5 birds. 6+ birds were at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 and Dunns Creek (L8) Apr 23 (both HBOC records).

White-backed Swallow Cheramoeca leucosternus

RAOU No: 358 Status: Bird of passage HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 1) Breeding: Past records

Not recorded.

Welcome Swallow Hirundo neoxena

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 357

Widely and regularly recorded, with over 80% of reports being of >5 birds and 40% being of >20 birds. Six records were of 100+ birds, including c 500 birds at Morpeth STP (L9) Jun 4 (YAR). Birds were nest building at Forster (R6) Oct 7/8 (BID), on nests at SWC Sep 23 & Nov 7 (MOA, HBOC) and were with dependent young at Paterson (L8) Oct 14 (HBOC) and Salisbury Gap (L6) Dec 2 (HBOC).

Tree Martin Hirundo nigricans

RAOU No: 359 Status: Resident. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Occasionally but widely recorded; reports of 1-5 and 6-20 birds were about equal. 20+ birds were present at Rowleys River (O2) Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC).

Fairy Martin Hirundo ariel

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Summer migrant: some birds appear to be resident

Approximately 10 birds overwintered at SWC (GED, ROD) and also 6+ birds were at Coopernook S.F. (R3) Jun 9/12 (HBOC). For the migrating population, the earliest recorded arrival date was Aug 16, when a flock was seen at Teralba (L10) (BIA). Counts of 20+ birds were frequent at SWC, SBS and Ash Island (M10) and were also recorded at Fullerton Cove (M10) Jan 22 (LIA), Yallambie (I11) Aug 27 (OCG), Jerrys Plains (H7) Oct 28 (MOA) and Arrowfield (H7) Dec 29 (ALP). Birds were nesting at Ash Island Sep 29 (MOA), and had nests with eggs and with dependent young at Jerrys Plains Oct 28.

Red-whiskered Bulbul Pycnonotus jocosus

RAOU No: 990 Status: Local resident HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Birds were recorded several times in the Swansea/Black Neds Bay (L11) area (MOA, CJC, OCG) with 6+ present Apr 4 (HBOC). Two birds were also present at Dora Creek (L11) Jan 20 (LIA). A single bird was seen at Forster (R6) Nov 19 – this appears to be the first record by HBOC from N of Newcastle.

Clamorous Reed-Warbler Acrocephalus stentoreus

Breeding: Yes RAOU No: 524 HBOC Category: 1

Status: Usual summer migrant; some birds are resident.

Occasionally but widely recorded. Some birds were at SWC over Jun-Jul (ROD, HBOC) but there were no winter records from elsewhere. 20+ birds were at WWW Feb 5 (STA) and SWC/NWR Sep 23 (MOA).

Tawny Grassbird Megalurus timoriensis

HBOC Category: 1 (Revised from: 2) Breeding: Past records BAOU No: 523

20+ birds were recorded at SWC during Dec (LIA), with 1-5 birds there Oct 29 & Nov 7 (LTP, HBOC) and also at Ash Island (M10) Mar 5 (HBOC), and One Mile Beach (R6) Dec 26 (CBOC).

Little Grassbird Megalurus gramineus

HBOC Category: 1 RAOU No: 522 Breeding: Past records

Occasionally but widely recorded, mostly as 1-5 birds or as heard only. 6+ birds were at SWC during Dec (LIA).

Rufous Songlark Cinclorhamphus mathewsi

RAOU No: 509 Status: Rare (possibly under-recorded). HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

Three birds were recorded at Old Bar (R4) Oct 5 (MVBW) and two birds at Warners Bay (L10) Oct 11 (HAS).

Brown Songlark Cinclorhamphus cruralis

HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 3) Breeding: Yes (Amended)

Status: Bird of passage. (Revised from: Rare)

Single birds were recorded at Yarrawa (F7) Dec 22 and Bureen (G7) Dec 22 & 26 (all GED records), and a group of c 10 birds at Yallambie (I11) Aug 27 (OCG). A pair were with one dependent young at Upper Bowmans Creek (I6) Jan 11 (JUT).

Golden-headed Cisticola Cisticola exilis

RAOU No: 525 Status: Usual resident. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Amended)

Moderately often recorded, with around 80% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 50+ birds were at SWC during Dec and c 100 birds at Dora Creek (L11) Jul 12 (LIA). Birds were breeding at SWC Jan 13 and in Dec (ALP, LIA).

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Silvereye Zosterops lateralis RAOU No: 574 Status: Common resident and winter migrant.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 75% of reports being of >5 birds including 25% being of >20 birds. Of the latter, 40% of the reports were from Apr with a further 25% from the period Jun-Jul. 100+ birds were at SWC during Dec (LIA); birds had dependent young there Jan 13 (ALP).

Both Zoothera species (Z. lunulata, Z. heinei) are likely to be found within the Hunter Region, according to some authorities. However, field differentiation, except when calling, is difficult. Observers are encouraged to make a specific report, but a precise identification is rarely possible. Confirmed reports of either Zoothera species are described below; where there is doubt as to identification, the observation is reported separately.

Bassian Thrush Zoothera lunulata

RAOU No: 779 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncertain. At least one bird was heard daily over Jul/Aug at NLH (HIM). Russet-tailed Thrush Zoothera heinei

HBOC Category: 3 RAOU No: 780 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncertain

Not recorded.

Unidentified Thrush Sightings

Reports were received of single birds at Barrington House (L5) Feb 19 (HBOC), Allyn River (K5) Mar 26 (LIA) and Nabiac (Q5) Apr 7 (CBOC), and three birds at both Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC) and Gloucester Tops (L5) Jul 19 (MVBW).

Common Blackbird Turdus merula

HBOC Category: 2 RAOU No: 991 Status: Rare. Breeding: None recorded

Three birds were at Table Bay Creek (E9) Apr 14/17 (HBOC).

Common Starling Sturnus vulgaris

RAOU No: 999 Status: Common resident. HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Widely and regularly recorded. Around 85% of reports were of >5 birds, including 55% being of >20 birds. Six widespread records were of 100+ birds. Birds had nests with young at Jerrys Plains (H7) Oct 28 (MOA) and Stockton (M10) Nov 11 (STA).

Common Myna Acridotheres tristis

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

RAOU No: 998 Status: Usual resident.

Widely and frequently recorded, with around 60% of reports being of 6+ birds. Over 15% of reports were of 20+ birds, and 100+ birds were in the SWC/Market Swamp area Apr 15 (MOA). Birds were on nest at SWC Jan 13 (ALP) and also breeding there during Dec and at Brightwaters (L11) (LIA).

ESCAPEES

The species listed below were recorded in the Hunter Region during the year, but are considered to be aviary escapees rather than part of a self-sustaining wild population:

Australian Ringneck Barnardius zonarius

RAOU No: 294

Two reports of birds of the Port Lincoln form (race barnardi) were received - two birds were at Boat Harbour (O9) Oct 2 (HAM) and two birds at Broke (J9) Oct 24 (PRK). A single bird of the Twenty Eight Parrot form (race semitorquatus) was recorded at Broke (I9) Dec 27 (ALP).

UNCONFIRMED RECORDS

The following records could not be accepted by HBOC's Records Appraisal Committee for inclusion into the main body of the Report because of insufficient description being available at the time of printing. The records are presented here for completeness; future Hunter Region Annual Bird Reports will advise of any which subsequently are accepted.

Square-tailed Kite Lophoictinia isura

A single bird was reported at Woodberry (M9) Aug 14 (this location is close to where a confirmed observation of this species occurred on Apr 11). Also, a pair were reported to be nesting at Kiwarrak State Forest (Q4).

Grey Falcon Falco hypoleucos

Single birds were reported in the Seaham/Clarencetown area (M8) Feb 6 and Feb 13.

Sanderling Calidris alba

HBOC Category: 3 RAOU No: 166

Report of a single bird at Stockton Bridge (M10) Nov 23.

Grey Ternlet Procelsterna cerulea RAOU No: 982 HBOC Category: 3

A single bird off Booti Booti National Park (R6) Feb 21, after heavy storms. This report is being considered by the NSW Ornithological Records Appraisal Committee.

Black-eared Cuckoo Chrysococcyx osculans

Report of a single bird at Bobs Farm (O9) Jan 20.

Sooty Owl *Tyto tenebricosa* RAOU No: 253

HBOC Category: 3

A single bird was reported in the Olney State Forest (J11) Apr 4.

Masked Owl Tyto novaehollandiae

HBOC Category: 3

Single birds were reported at Yengo N.P. (I11) Jun 5 and in cell I7 Dec 24.

Barred Cuckoo-shrike Coracina lineata

HBOC Category: 3

Report of two birds at Harrington (S4) Nov 18.

Masked Woodswallow Artamus personatus RAOU No: 544 HBOC Category: 3

Six birds were reported at Awabakal N.R. (M10/11) Apr 1.

DEFINITION OF THE HUNTER REGION

A map on the following page, developed by Peter McLauchlan of HBOC, illustrates the boundaries for the Hunter Region, with the grid lines indicating latitude and longitude in 10 minute divisions. The cells created by the grid pattern have been assigned a unique alpha-numeric identifier; this alpha-numeric system has been used in the main body of the Report to indicate the approximate locations for the reported observations. The use of the grid/alpha-numeric system can be illustrated by way of examples — for instance:

- The town of Taree is located at approximately 31°55'S, 152°28'E this places it in cell Q4
- The town of Muswellbrook is located at approximately 32°17'S, 150°54'E this places it in cell H6
