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FOREWORD

As I read through the draft for the 1996 Report I realise how much knowledge has been documented over the past four years. However, I am not surprised at the number of gaps which remain as there is often not enough time for us to spend in the field. We know very little, for instance, of the whereabouts and movement of quail and button-quail (quite different families, by the way) and albatrosses are barely recorded. Whilst I agree that tramping through long grass in summer may provide a few hazards, sitting on a headland and staring out to sea in winter can be very relaxing and you will surely be rewarded by the sight of at least one species of albatross.

We don't have a clear picture yet of the breeding habits of even common birds in the Hunter and all such information will be gratefully received along with other more general sightings.

And there are some species for which we have no documented breeding records at all. The Mallard used to raise chicks every year at Dora Creek and probably still does, but we need someone to confirm this in writing.

There are no documented breeding records for Swamp Harrier, Brown Bittern, Australian Hobby, Little Eagle, Scaly-breasted Lorikeet, Crimson Rosella, Sooty Owl, Australian Owlet-nightjar, Chestnut-rumped Heathwren, Mangrove Gerygone and several species of fruit pigeons.

Somebody must have seen something!

It would be helpful to be as specific as you can about the location of your sighting. Some places such as Goulburn River National Park cover a vast area and an indication of the actual place would better pinpoint the habitat required by the bird species in question.

I believe we, as a club, have reason to be very pleased with our Bird Reports and I look forward to your contribution to the 1997 Avian Story. Above all, enjoy your birdwatching.

INTRODUCTION

In this Report, produced by Hunter Bird Observers Club Inc (HBOC), we present a summary of the status of bird species within the Hunter Region of NSW in the 1996 calendar year. The information is based upon observation records which we have gathered from a variety of sources.

The 1996 Report describes the regional status of 355 bird species, including 311 species that were recorded during the year. There are 8 additions to the 1996 species list, and 3 species are newly confirmed to breed within the Region.

We define the Hunter Region as the area managed by local government authorities for Newcastle, Lake Macquarie, Maitland, Cessnock, Muswellbrook, Merriwa, Singleton, Scone, Murrurundi, Dungog, Gloucester, Port Stephens, Greater Taree and Great Lakes. This corresponds with the area described in the popular tourist maps of the Hunter. A map showing the Hunter Region is included with this Report.

Some of the philosophies which we use when preparing Reports include:

- The overall list of species will include all species which, since 1987, are confirmed by HBOC to have been present in the Region. Records of rare species from before 1987 mostly would be difficult to confirm, due to the amount of time that has elapsed since the observation. At present, HBOC does not propose to review the earlier records.
- The status description for each species is to be subject to regular review, with the aim of ensuring that the description reflects the current situation. For any year, the main indication of the then-current Hunter Region birdlife will come from considering the status descriptions of the listed species.
- All records will be vetted and no record will be accepted for inclusion into the Reports unless HBOC is convinced of its validity. Information about the records appraisal scheme is presented below.
- Breeding status will be assigned to a species only if definite evidence to this effect has been provided. If there have been no breeding records for a species for 10 or more years, the breeding status will be reviewed.

To assist us in vetting records, we have classified each species into one of three categories, as described below. The classification reflects, in part, the frequency of reporting.

Category all records for the species generally are

1: acceptable.

Category records usually are acceptable, but supporting 2: information may be required in the event of unusual numbers, location or season.

Category the species is considered to be of special interest 3: in relation to the Region, and supporting information is required before any record can be accepted for inclusion into the Report.

A Records Appraisal Committee assigns these categories and decides whether each record can be accepted. This Report owes much to the contributions of our Records Officer, Sue Hamonet, and the other RAC members - Ann Lindsey, Wilma Barden, Jeanette Stephenson, Jim Perry and David Geering.

Equally important is the contribution from those who have submitted records of their observations during the year. To the regulars and to the newcomers - many thanks, and keep up the good work.

SYSTEMATIC LIST

INTRODUCTION

Bird species are listed in taxonomic order; the order and nomenclature follows that of Christidis and Boles in the 1994 RAOU publication *The Taxonomy and Species of Birds of Australia and its Territories* (ISBN 0815-2233.

Definitions of the terms used in status descriptions in the Report are as follows:

Resident: Recorded in all months;

Migrant: Species that come to an area for a period and then depart;

Bird of passage: Species present in a suitable area for a relatively short period, and equally likely to be observed in any month of the year;

Common: Species that one can *expect* to find on all visits to suitable habitats;

Usual: Equally likely to be found in suitable habitats, but not on all visits;

Uncommon: Species that are recorded infrequently on visits to suitable habitats;

Local: Species recorded in only a few favoured localities;

Rare: Species recorded only a few times a year;

Accidental: Species recorded less than once per year, over a 10 year average.

Breeding status, where confirmed, is also described. For species with no confirmed breeding records for 10 or more years, or which are not always recorded each year in the Hunter Region, the breeding status is described as **Past records**. Where a species might be anticipated to breed in the Region, but there are no confirmed records, the description **None recorded** has been used. We expect that, with time, our knowledge of breeding status will grow.

The majority of records we receive include assignments of abundance levels for the species observed using the following categories: 1-5 birds present; 6-20 birds; 21-50 birds; 51-100 birds; 100+ birds. Commentaries in this Report are based mainly upon abundance levels reported in this way, although many observers report precise numbers (and we encourage this). The format for the observations reported generally includes reference to the relevant grid number (e.g. F7), and observer code and, sometimes, a location abbreviation. A key for this supporting detail is given later in the Report. A semi-quantitative measure of the number of observations of a species for the year is indicated by the progressive use of the terms: **occasionally**; **moderately often**; **often**; **frequently**; **regularly**. As a general rule, where there are fewer than 10-12 observations, all are reported.

BIRDS

Emu Dromaius novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 001 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare (may be recorded in W of the Region).

Four birds were at Murrumbo (D7) Aug 1 and a single bird was there Nov 1 (GED). Three birds were near White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Feb 17 (JUT) and a single bird was there Jun 22 (GED).

Australian Brush-turkey Alectura lathami

RAOU No: 008 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Birds were recorded in high numbers (10-20) at Barrington House in Aug-Sep (HBOC) and at Copeland S.F. (M4) Sep 28 (CBOC). Other records were from Crowdy Bay N.P. (S3) Jun 29/Jul 6 (CJB), East Maitland (L9) throughout Jul (GEB, PRK) and Hallidays Point (R5) Aug 17 (MVBW). The record from East Maitland is unusual – a single bird was utilising suburban backyard gardens. Mound building was in progress at Hallidays Point.

Stubble Quail Coturnix pectoralis

RAOU No: 009 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare (possibly overlooked).

Two birds were at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jul 12 (GED) and a single bird at Honeysuckle Creek Wollemi N.P. (D7) Oct 7 (STA).

Brown Quail Coturnix ypsilophora

RAOU No: 011 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were recorded at SWC Jan 28 (BAW), Harrington (S4) Jan 31 (OCG), KI Mar 2 (LAK) and Apr 19 (GED), BBNP (R6) Apr 19 (TUD), Main Creek (J6) Jun 6 (JUT), SBS Jun 30 and Oct 15 (HAS), Milbrodale (I9) Sep 20/21 (HBOC) and Belmont Swamp (L11) during Dec (LAK). The pair present at BBNP were with one young bird.

King Quail Coturnix chinensis

RAOU No: 012 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncertain.

Not recorded since 1994.

Magpie Goose Anseranas semipalmata

RAOU No: 199 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident.

50 or more birds were regularly present at SWC, with the peak count being 93 birds May 14 (ROD); also, 11 chicks were there (with four adults) Feb 5 (LIA). 7-10 birds were recorded at Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) during Sep (SJR, CBOC). Two birds were at Ash Island (M10) Jan 7 (STA).

Plumed Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna eytoni

RAOU No: 205 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Bird of passage.

Recorded at the regular location, Doughboy Hollow near Singleton (J8), on three occasions – 60 birds Jun 16 (JUT), 200 birds Jul 10 (NEG), 100 birds Sep 2 (BIA).

Wandering Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna arcuata

RAOU No: 204 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident and bird of passage.

All except one record was from SWC/NWR: 3-6 birds were occasionally recorded there over Jan-Mar and 10-20+ birds during Oct (ROD, TOM, LIA). A pair were with ducklings Mar 3 (NBL). Eight birds were at Tarro Swamp (M9) Oct 13 and some birds were nesting (WCR).

Blue-billed Duck Oxyura australis

RAOU No: 216 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

Status: Accidental.

Not recorded since 1989.

Musk Duck Biziura lobata

RAOU No: 217 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident

75 birds were at Grahamstown Dam (M9) May 14 (GED) and 6+ birds there Jul 13 (HBOC). All other reports were of 1-2 birds, where numbers were noted: at NWR Jan 9 (STA) and Jun 23 (HBOC), KI Jan 21 (HBOC), Colliery Dam (K10) Jun 2 (CBOC), Ellalong area (J10) Jun 30 (YAR), Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jul 10 (MOA), Grahamstown Dam Oct 27 (TOM) and Mungo Brush MLNP (P8) Oct 30 (STA).

Freckled Duck Stictonetta naevosa

RAOU No: 214 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental. Not recorded.

Black Swan Cygnus atratus

RAOU No: 203 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters. Most records were of <20 birds and only six reports were of 50+ birds. 100+ birds were at MLNP (P8) Apr 25 (YAR), Dora Creek/Stingaree Point (L11) Dec 8 (HBOC) and Ash Island (M10) Dec 10 (GED). There were breeding records in Jan, Jul, Sep, Oct and Dec.

Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides

RAOU No: 207 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental.

Not recorded.

Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata

RAOU No: 202 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at or near fresh to brackish waters; around 50% of reports were of 6+ birds. 60 birds were at a single farm dam south of Bunnan (F5) Apr 26 (STA) and 50+ birds were near Vacy (L8) May 4 (HBOC). There were breeding records in Mar, Apr, Aug, Sep, Oct.

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos

RAOU No: 948 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Local resident.

Some birds (<5) were at BbR May 7 (HBOC).

Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

RAOU No: 208 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at small to large waters. Almost 50% of reports were of 6+ birds, with all counts of 20+ birds being from the E of the Region. 300+ birds were at Teralba/SBS (L10) Jul 2 (HBOC) and 100+ at SWC Jun 23 (HBOC). Birds were with dependent young at SWC in Jan (STA/LIA) and were nesting at Bootawa (Q4) in Sep (MVBW).

Australasian Shoveler Anas rhynchotis

RAOU No: 212 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Local resident and bird of passage.

Often recorded at SWC – 1-5 birds were there Feb 10 (LIA), early Apr (BRG1), May 21 (ROD), Jul 10 (LIA) and Sep 5 (ROD), and 6-15 birds there Jun 3 & 23 (ROD, HBOC) and Jul 22 (LIA). Elsewhere, 1-5 birds were at Ash Island (M10) Jun 3 (HBOC), SBS Jun 30 (HAS) and Muddy Lake (L11) Sep 15 (TOM); 10 birds were at Teralba (L10) Jul 2 (HBOC), and 40 birds at Morpeth STP (L9) Aug 14 (LIA).

Grev Teal Anas gracilis

RAOU No: 211 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Widely and often recorded at small to large waters throughout the Region, mostly as groups of <20 birds but greater numbers were not uncommon. 50+ birds were at Teralba (L10) Jul 2 (HBOC) and 233 birds at Ash Island (M10) May 6 (GED). Birds were with dependent young at SWC/NWR during Jan and on Oct 7 (LIA, ROD) and at KI Jan 21 (HBOC).

Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

RAOU No: 210 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Widely and frequently recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region, often in large numbers. The most westerly report was from Tenambit (L9). 700+ birds were at Teralba (L10) Jul 2 (HBOC) and 200+ were at SBS (L10) Jun 30 (HAS). At Ash Island (M10), 400+ birds were recorded Jan 28 & Feb 21 while 685 were present May 6 (GED). Birds had dependent young at SWC/NWR Jan 9 and Oct 7 (STA, ROD).

Garganey Anas querquedula

RAOU No: 209 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental (recorded in 1993).

Not recorded.

Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus

RAOU No: 213 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Bird of passage.

Up to six birds were present at Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) over Jan-Feb, with one pair nesting and fledging two young (FON). 1-3 birds also were recorded there Mar 3 (TUD), Jun 16 (CBOC), Jul 17 (WCR) and Sep 29 (CBOC). Elsewhere, pairs were at Mandalong (K11) Apr 18 (TOM), SWC Jun 23 (HBOC) and WWW Nov 16 (TAH), and 19 birds were at Morpeth STP (L9) Aug 14 (LIA).

Hardhead Aythya australis

RAOU No: 215 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded at SWC/NWR and at SBS, and occasionally at fresh waters elsewhere. 21-50 birds were at SWC Jun 23 (HBOC), SBS Jul 10 & 25 and Oct 15 (ROD, TOM, HAS) and Stockton/KI Nov 9 (HBOC), and 60 birds at Bolwarra (L9) Jul 17 (ROD). For a period of 1-2 weeks over late June - early July, 300-500 birds were at SBS (HAS, ROD) and around 1000 birds were in the overall Teralba area (L10, includes SBS) Jul 2 (HBOC).

Australasian Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 061 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at small to large waters, with all reports being of <20 birds. Five widespread breeding records were received – for Jan and Oct only.

Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus

RAOU No: 062 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

Status: Bird of passage.

At Grahamstown Dam (M9), 300 birds were recorded May 17 (GED) and 200+ birds Aug 22 (PRK). Some birds (<5) were also at SBS May 22 (OCG) and Ash Island (M10) Jun 3 (HBOC).

Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus

RAOU No: 060 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident.

In Nov, birds were often recorded at WWW, peaking Nov 19 with four pairs (TAH). A single bird was at Lake Liddell (I7) Sep 25 (TOM) and 20+ birds were at Glenbawn Dam (H5/I5) Oct 7 (FOC).

Little Penguin Eudyptula minor

RAOU No: 005 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident

A group of c 30 birds were swimming in Port Stephens during Sep (WAC). All other reports were of 1-3 birds, where numbers were noted – at Seal Rocks (R7) Jan 1/3 (PEJ), Shoal Bay (P9) Feb 2 (LAK), Stockton Breakwater (M10) Feb 4 (LIC), Nobbys Beach (M10) Apr 6 (LAK), Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 13/16 (BIA) and Coal Point (L11) Dec 26 (HAM). Injured birds were found at Newcastle Feb 29, Shoal Bay Mar 22 and Stockton May 13 - the latter bird died but the other two were successfully treated (NATF).

Southern Giant-Petrel Macronectes giganteus

RAOU No: 929 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare.

Not recorded since 1994.

Great-winged Petrel Pterodroma macroptera

RAOU No: 075 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Uncertain (New to list)

6+ birds were recorded off Port Stephens (Q9/R9) Mar 3 (PEJ).

Gould's Petrel Pterodroma leucoptera

RAOU No: 078 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local summer migrant.

Birds had nests with eggs at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 13/16 (BIA). An injured bird, which was successfully treated, was found at Nelson Bay (O9) Mar 23 (NATF).

Since 1992, there has been a 60% increase in the number of chicks hatching on Cabbage Tree Island (MVBW).

Wedge-tailed Shearwater Puffinus pacificus

RAOU No: 069 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Summer migrant.

Often recorded in groups of 10-100+ or as beach-washed dead birds, along the coast during Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec. 1000+ birds were off Newcastle/Stockton beaches (M10) Jan 15 & 21 (LIA, HBOC), and 500+ off Port Stephens (Q9/R9) Mar 3 (PEJ). Single beach-washed dead birds were found along Stockton beach Apr 30 (NATF) and May 6 (BOS). Two unusual inland records – of a bird found dead by a roadside at East Maitland (L9) May 3 following storms (PRK) and of an injured bird, taken into care, found at Singleton (J8) May 7 (NATF).

Buller's Shearwater Puffinus bulleri

RAOU No: 975 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental.

Not recorded.

Flesh-footed Shearwater Puffinus carneipes

RAOU No: 072 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare. (New to list)

100+ birds were recorded off Port Stephens (Q9/R9) Mar 3 (PEJ). Three birds were at Seal Rocks (R7) Jan 1/3 (PEJ) and a single bird at Newcastle Beach (M10) Jan 15 (LIA). Also, a dead bird was found at Merewether (M10) Aug 30 (NATF).

Sooty Shearwater Puffinus griseus

RAOU No: 070 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes

Status: Rare.

Some birds were recorded at Cabbage Tree Island (where birds are often found) during Dec 13/16 (BIA). Single dead birds were found along Nine Mile Beach (L11/M11) and Merewether/Burwood beaches (M10) during a survey Nov 10 (HBOC).

Short-tailed Shearwater Puffinus tenuirostris

RAOU No: 071 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Summer migrant.

Eight birds were recorded off Seal Rocks (R7) Jan 1/3 (PEJ), and 500+ birds offshore from Booti Booti N.P. (R6) Nov 24 (HBOC). A total of 11 dead birds were found along Merewether/ Burwood beaches (M10) and Nine Mile Beach (L11/M11) during a beach survey Nov 10 (HBOC). 14 injured birds were treated during the year – up until May 17 and from Oct 29 (NATF); seven of these cases were in May.

Fluttering Shearwater Puffinus gavia

RAOU No: 068 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Bird of passage about inshore waters.

Two birds were recorded off Port Stephens (Q9/R9) Mar 3 (PEJ), and a single dead bird was found along Nine Mile Beach (L11/M11) during a beach survey Nov 10 (HBOC).

Black-browed Albatross Diomedea melanophris

RAOU No: 088 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Uncertain (New to list).

A group of at least five birds were feeding behind a fishing boat off Nobbys Head, Newcastle (M10) Jul 18 (TUD).

Shy Albatross Diomedea cauta

RAOU No: 091 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare winter bird of passage about inshore waters.

Not recorded since 1992.

Yellow-nosed Albatross Diomedea chlororhynchos

RAOU No: 089 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare winter bird of passage about inshore waters.

Not recorded since 1994.

White-faced Storm-Petrel Fregetta grallaria

RAOU No: 065 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes

Status: Rare summer migrant.

A single bird was recorded off Port Stephens (Q9/R9) Mar 3 (PEJ).

White-tailed Tropicbird Phaethon lepturus

RAOU No: 108 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental (Revised from: Rare).

Not recorded since 1994.

Australasian Gannet Morus serrator

RAOU No: 104 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Bird of passage about inshore waters.

Low numbers of birds (<10, and usually <5) were moderately often recorded along the coast all year. 20+ birds were seen offshore from Crowdy Bay N.P. (S3) Jun 29/Jul 6 (CJB) and 50+ birds off Stockton beach (M10) Mar 5 (HBOC).

Darter Anhinga melanogaster

RAOU No: 101 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Occasionally recorded at medium to large fresh waters in E of Region, mostly as 1-2 birds. Numbers at NWR/SWC were sometimes greater – four birds were there Jun 23 (HBOC) and 6-7 birds Aug 20 and Oct 7 (ROD). Birds had nests at NWR/SWC in Jan, Jun and Aug (STA, HBOC, ROD).

Little Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax melanoleucos

RAOU No: 100 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at small to large waters, with all counts of 6+ birds being from the E of the Region. 21-50 birds were at NWR Jan 9 (STA), MLNP (P8) Apr 25 (YAR), South Swansea (L11) May 21 (MOA), Coon Island (L11) Jun 1 (MOA), SWC Oct 1 (HBOC) and Belmont Swamp (L11) during Dec (LAK), and 70 birds were recorded at Swansea South Jul 21 (HBOC). Birds were on nests and had nests with young at NWR, SWC and Toronto Swamp (L11) in Jan (STA, LIA, MOA, HWT), and again at SWC in Oct (ROD).

Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax varius

RAOU No: 099 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Usual coastal resident.

Moderately often recorded on the coast or at large waters near to the coast. Around 35% of reports were of 6-20 birds with the remainder being of 1-5 birds. Two inland records – a single bird at Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jan 6 (STA) and two birds at North Rothbury (K9) Jun 10 (CLT).

Little Black Cormorant Phalacrocorax sulcirostris

RAOU No: 097 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and frequently recorded at medium to large waters. Counts were generally lower than in 1995, with only around 10% of reports being of >20 birds. 100+ birds were at Green Point (L11) Sep 12 (ROD) and 50+ birds at NWR Jan 9 (STA) and around Newcastle foreshore (M10) Dec 4 (HBOC). In early Jan, birds were nesting at NWR (STA) and Toronto Swamp (MOA, HWT).

Great Cormorant Phalacrocorax carbo

RAOU No: 096 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and frequently recorded at medium to large waters. Fewer reports than for 1995 and with counts generally lower – around 80% of reports were of 1-5 birds. A total of 77 birds in four groups flew over Waratah (M10) within a short interval on Feb 9 (CLT); only two other reports were of >20 birds. Birds were nesting at NWR Jun 23 (HBOC) and also had nests with eggs there Aug 20 (ROD).

Australian Pelican Pelecanus conspicillatus

RAOU No: 106 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters; around 80% of reports were of <20 birds. 100+ birds were in Forster area (R6) Nov 24 (HBOC) and at Market Swamp (M10) Apr 29 (LIA). There were 50-60 nests at Pelican Island BBNP (R6) Jan 2 and 103 nests there Dec 16 (both TUD).

White-faced Heron Egretta novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 188 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded, mostly as 1-5 birds. Counts at Ash Island (M10) were regularly of 20-50 birds (GED, STA, OCG, HBOC) and with 83 birds present Jan 28 and 125 birds Jul 9 (both GED). 25-30+ birds were also recorded at Tarro swamp (M9) Jun 30 and Jul 2 (SJR) and Morpeth (L9) Jun 27 (PRK), and 72 birds were at Fullerton Cove (M10) Jun 23 (GED). Breeding records from New Lambton (M10) during late Aug-Sep (STA) and Hamilton (M10) Nov (IMK).

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

RAOU No: 185 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Occasionally recorded at medium to large waters in E of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds except when breeding. Six birds were at Ash Island (M10) Dec 31 (STA). Continuing the decline in breeding numbers locally, there were only five breeding pairs at SWC over 1995/96 (HWT) – in comparison, there were 57 pairs in 1987/88. Another two pairs bred at Toronto Swamp (L11) (HWT, MOA). Some birds were nest building again at SWC Oct 7 (ROD).

Eastern Reef Egret Egretta sacra

RAOU No: 191 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Rare.

Single birds were recorded at Seal Rocks (R7) early Jan (PEJ), Caves Beach (L11) Mar 21 (LAK) and Catherine Hill Bay (L11) Oct 27 (HAM), and two birds at Elizabeth Beach (R6) Nov 24 (STA).

White-necked Heron Ardea pacifica

RAOU No: 189 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Bird of passage.

1-2 birds were occasionally recorded near Jerrys Plains (H7) all year (ALP), and also at SWC May 11 and Jun 3 (ROD) and in the Paterson/Vacy area (L8) May 4 (HBOC). In comparison, in 1995 there were 18 reports for this species.

Great Egret Ardea alba

RAOU No: 187 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded at medium to large waters in the eastern and central parts of the Region. With two exceptions, all non-breeding reports were of 1-5 birds. 30 birds were in MLNP (cell P8) Apr 25 (YAR) and 20 birds at Tea Gardens (O8) Jun 8 (GED). Continuing the decline in breeding numbers locally, there were only 58 breeding pairs at SWC over 1995/96 (HWT) – in comparison, there were 198 pairs in 1987/88. A further 25 pairs bred at Toronto Swamp (L11) (HWT, MOA). Some birds were nest building again at SWC Oct 7/14 (ROD).

Intermediate Egret Ardea intermedia

RAOU No: 186 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were occasionally recorded at medium to large waters in E of Region. 6+ birds were at SWC Oct 1 B (HBOC). Continuing the decline in breeding numbers locally, there were only 20 breeding pairs at SWC over 1995/96 (HWT) – in comparison, there were 453 pairs in 1987/88. Some birds were nest building again at SWC Oct 7 (ROD).

Cattle Egret Ardea ibis

RAOU No: 977 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Moderately often recorded, with the most westerly reports being of 30-50+ birds near Jerrys Plains often during Aug-Sep (ALP). The majority of reports from elsewhere were of <20 birds. The breeding population continues to decline. At SWC, there were 221 breeding pairs over 95/96 compared to 1393 pairs in 87/88 (HWT), while at Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) there were 270 breeding pairs over the 95/96 season compared to 324 pairs in 94/95 and 700 pairs in 91/92 (HWT). At Toronto Swamp (L11) there were another 12 nests over the 95/96 season (previous breeding numbers at this site are not known).

Striated Heron Butorides striatus

RAOU No: 193 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Resident.

Occasionally recorded at estuaries and coastal lakes. Most reports were of single birds but two birds were at KI Mar 2 (LAK) and Coon Island (L11) Jun 1 (MOA), and three birds at Dora Creek (L11) Nov 3 (KBD). An immature bird was present at Belmont (L11) Sep 25 (LIA).

Nankeen Night Heron Nycticorax caledonicus

RAOU No: 192 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident and bird of passage.

Often recorded at SWC, in varying numbers peaking at 30 birds Sep 30 (LIA). Most reports from elsewhere were of <5 birds (and, mostly, of single birds) – at Toronto Swamp (L11) Jan 10 (MOA) and Mar 20 (TOM), KI/Stockton Jan 21 (HBOC), MLNP (P8) Apr 25 (YAR), Swansea South (L11) Jul 21 (HBOC), Dora Creek (L11) Nov 3 (KBD) and Belmont Swamp (L11) during Dec (LAK). Birds had dependent young at SWC during Jan (LIA) and a juvenile was there Sep 5 (ROD).

Little Bittern Ixobrychus minutus

RAOU No: 195 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare (probably overlooked).

Not recorded.

Black Bittern Ixobrychus flavicollis

RAOU No: 196 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Past records (1994) Status: Bare

No confirmed records.

Australasian Bittern Botaurus poiciloptilus

RAOU No: 197 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare.

A single bird was seen at NWR Jun 6 (IMK). Birds were also heard regularly at MLNP (cell Q7) during Mar (BIA) and at MLNP (cell P8) Oct 9 (BIA).

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus

RAOU No: 178 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Bird of passage.

31 birds were recorded at SWC May 5 (BOS), 6+ birds at Cundletown (R4) May 2 (OCG), 4 birds at Cedar Hill Drive (L10) Apr 14 (WCR), and a single bird at Irrawang swamp (M9) Jul 30 (PRK).

Australian White Ibis Threskiornis molucca

RAOU No: 179 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Frequently recorded in E of the Region, with the most westerly report being from the Paterson/Vacy area (L8) May 4 (HBOC). Around 30% of reports were of 20+ birds; 100-200 birds were in the Salt Ash/ Medowie area (N9) Jul 13 and at Tomago (M9) Aug 3 (both HBOC).

Straw-necked Ibis Threskiornis spinicollis

RAOU No: 180 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded in the eastern and central parts of the Region. Counts were variable, but generally were down slightly compared with 1995 and only around 30% of reports were of 20+ birds.

Royal Spoonbill Platalea regia

RAOU No: 181 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded in E of the Region – the most westerly report was from the Paterson/Vacy area (L8) May 4 (HBOC). Around 80% of reports were of 1-5 birds, and only one report was of 20+ birds – at KI Jan 21 (HBOC).

Yellow-billed Spoonbill Platalea flavipes

RAOU No: 182 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Bird of passage.

Two birds were recorded near Jerrys Plains (H7) Aug 2 (ALP).

Black-necked Stork Ephippiorhynchus asiaticus

RAOU No: 183 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records (1994)

Status: Bird of passage

A single bird was at Bulahdelah (P7) Feb 17 (OWS) and three birds in the same area Apr 25 (THF). Two birds also were recorded in MLNP (cell P8) Apr 25 (YAR). *The increased reporting rate of 1995 was not maintained.*

Osprey Pandion haliaetus

RAOU No: 241 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident.

1-2 birds were recorded at Tanilba Bay (N9) over Jun 20 - Jul 10 (CHS, FOC), Tillegerry Creek (O9) Aug 7 (GED), Tuncurry (R6) Aug 10 (BOD) and late Sep (TUD), Speers Point (L10) Sep 1 (WMR), Belmont South (L11) Sep 6 (CJB), Mungo Brush MLNP (P8) Oct 30 (STA) and Harrington (S4) Dec 29 (CBOC). The birds at Tanilba Bay and Tuncurry were at nest trees, but it is not confirmed that breeding was in progress.

Pacific Baza Aviceda subcristata

RAOU No: 234 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

1-2 birds were moderately often recorded in E of the Region. Pairs with a single young bird were present at both Carrington (O8) and Coral Ville (S3) during Apr (HBOC, MVBW). Three birds were also seen together at University of Newcastle (M10) Jan 9 (TOM).

Black-shouldered Kite Elanus axillaris

RAOU No: 232 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded in the central and eastern parts of the Region, mostly as 1-2 birds. A pair had a nest with young at Ash Island (M10) Jun 3 (HBOC).

Square-tailed Kite Lophoictinia isura

RAOU No: 230 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes (Newly confirmed)

Status: Rare. (revised from:Accidental)

A single bird was on a nest in Coopernook S.F. (R3) Oct 29 (JOI) – this is the first confirmed breeding record by HBOC for the Region.

Black Kite Milvus migrans

RAOU No: 229 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Rare.

A single bird was recorded near Scone (H5) Oct 26 (TOM).

Whistling Kite Haliastur sphenurus

RAOU No: 228 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and frequently recorded, with almost all reports being of 1-2 birds. Ten birds, mostly juveniles, were present at Dora Creek (L11) Nov 3 (KBD) and ten birds were also recorded at MLNP (cell P8) Apr 25 (YAR). Birds were nesting at Tahlee/Carrington (O8) Apr 21 (HBOC).

Brahminy Kite Haliastur indus

HBOC Category: 2 RAOU No: 227 Breeding: Past records

Status: Resident (in coastal north of Region), elsewhere accidental.

Single birds were recorded at Booti Booti N.P. (R6) Jun 29 (CBOC) and Nov 24 (HBOC), Boolaroo (L10) Aug 21 (TOM) and Elizabeth Beach (R6) Nov 24 (STA). Birds were also at Smiths Lake (R7) Sep 12 (OCG) – numbers not noted.

White-bellied Sea-Eagle Haliaeetus leucogaster

RAOU No: 226 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Single birds or pairs were frequently recorded at or near large waters, occasionally accompanied by a single juvenile during summer/autumn. A pair had a nest at Lake St Clair (J6/7) Sep 8 (ALP).

Spotted Harrier Circus assimilis

RAOU No: 218 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncommon resident.

Single birds were recorded at BBNP Mar 22 (TUD), Woodville (L9) Apr 6 (NEM), Elderslie (K8) Apr 14 (NBL/BIA), Raymond Terrace (M9) May 16 (GED), NW of Gungal (E6) May 26 (STA/PHP), Shortland (M10) Jul 10 (HAS), Hexham (M9) Oct (TAH) and near Jerrys Plains (H7) Nov 25 (ALP). The bird near Gungal was an immature.

Swamp Harrier Circus approximans

RAOU No: 219 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Usual resident.

Single birds were recorded at SWC Jan 1 (LIA) and May 15 (ROD), Bolwarra (L9) Jul 17 (ROD), Dora Creek (L11) Sep 15 (TOM), Raymond Terrace (M9) Sep 29 (CBOC), Hannam Vale (R3) Nov 3 (MVBW) and BBNP Nov 24 (HBOC), and an injured bird, which died, was found at Raymond Terrace Sep 3 (NATF). Three birds were at Hexham Swamp (L10) Apr 21 (HAS). Birds were also present at Smiths Lake (R7) Sep 12 (OCG) – numbers were not noted.

Brown Goshawk Accipiter fasciatus

RAOU No: 221 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Reconfirmed)

Status: Resident.

Widely and moderately often recorded, mostly as single birds. Birds had a nest with young at Ashtonfield (L9) Dec 8 (ROS). Possible pairs were recorded at Arrowfield (H7) Mar 29 (ALP) and Glenrock S.R.A. (M10) Oct 3 (TOM) - no evidence though of breeding at these sites.

Grey Goshawk Accipiter novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 220 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Resident.

Often recorded in E of the Region, and occasionally elsewhere. Most sightings were of single birds, where numbers were noted; two birds were together at Heatons Lookout Watagan Mountains (K10) Mar 17 (BOD) and Pilchers Mountain (M7) Aug 25 (HBOC). Three reports were of white phase birds.

Collared Sparrowhawk Accipiter cirrhocephalus

RAOU No: 222 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Resident.

Single birds were recorded at Shortland (M10) Feb 11 (LIA), Wingen (H4) Apr 8 (NEG), S of Bunnan (F5) Apr 26 (STA), South Swansea (L11) May 21 (MOA), KI Jul 28 (TOM), Green Wattle Creek (L9) Nov 16 and Dec 6 (NEM), and an injured bird, which died, was found at Hamilton (M10) Jun 7 (NATF).

Wedge-tailed Eagle Aquila audax

RAOU No: 224 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Widely and moderately often recorded, mostly as 1-2 birds but occasionally 3 or 4 birds were seen together.

Little Eagle Hieraaetus morphnoides

RAOU No: 225 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Resident.

Single birds were recorded at Boolaroo (L10) Mar 6 (TOM), Hexham (M9) May 8 (GED), South Swansea (L11) Jun 1 (MOA), Salt Ash/Medowie area (N9) Jul 13 (HBOC), Pilchers Mountain (M7) Aug 25 (HBOC), Warkworth (I8) Sep 4 (ALP) and near Jerrys Plains (H7) Oct 26 (ALP). The bird at South Swansea was of dark phase.

Brown Falcon Falco berigora

RAOU No: 239 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Resident.

Often recorded in the central and W parts of the Region, as single birds or pairs where numbers were noted. Reports from the E of the Region were less frequent, but not uncommon.

Australian Hobby Falco longipennis

RAOU No: 235 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Resident.

Occasionally but widely recorded, with most reports being of single birds. Two birds were perched together at Irrawang Swamp (M9) Jul 2 (PRK). A bird at Warkworth (I8) was observed to be hunting a White-throated Needletail *Hirundapus caudacutus* Feb 1 (ALP).

Black Falcon Falco subniger

RAOU No: 238 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare.

Single birds were recorded at Yarrawa (F7) Jul 21 & Aug 5 (GED). Also, reports of a single bird at a shallow freshwater pond on Kooragang Island on Feb 19 (NBL) and an injured bird at Adamstown (M10) Sep 11 which was successfully treated and released (NATF).

Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus

RAOU No: 237 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident.

One or two birds were occasionally, but widely, recorded. Birds were breeding in BBNP (R6) Jul 2 (TUD) and also a pair had two young at Dellhurst (J6) Nov 4 (JUT).

Nankeen Kestrel Falco cenchroides

RAOU No: 240 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Frequently recorded throughout the Region, mostly single birds or pairs (where numbers were noted) but sometimes with immatures also present. Eight breeding records were received – mostly from Aug-Dec but also an adult was with three immature birds at Toronto (L11) Feb 20 (TOM).

Buff-banded Rail Gallirallus philippensis

RAOU No: 046 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident (possibly overlooked).

Single birds were recorded at SWC Apr 23 (WCR) and Hannam Vale (R3) Nov 3 (MVBW), two birds at SWC Nov 15 (LIA), and three birds at Green Point (R6) Dec 26 (CBOC). Some birds were also present at Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Dec 13/16 (BIA).

Lewin's Rail Rallus pectoralis

RAOU No: 045 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Local resident (probably overlooked).

At Glenrock S.R.A. (M10), a single bird was recorded Aug 27 and then at least 7 birds were seen and/or heard Sep 2 and 5+ birds Sep 10 (all TOM records). Two birds were seen at Morisset (K11) Aug 6 (LIA) and a single bird there Aug 17 (YAR). A single bird was at Belmont Lagoon (L11) Sep 1 (YAR), and two birds were heard making contact calls there Sep 15 (LAK).

Baillon's Crake Porzana pusilla

RAOU No: 050 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Local resident (probably overlooked).

Not recorded.

Australian Spotted Crake Porzana fluminea

RAOU No: 049 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

Status: Local resident (probably overlooked).

A single juvenile bird was recorded at Tomago (M9) Apr 24 (WCR).

Spotless Crake Porzana tabuensis

RAOU No: 051 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes (1988)

Status: Local resident (probably overlooked).

Not recorded since 1994.

Purple Swamphen Porphyrio porphyrio

RAOU No: 058 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Frequently recorded in E of Region, and occasionally elsewhere. Reports were mostly of 1-5 birds except at large waters where higher numbers were often present. 20+ birds were frequently at SWC, with the count peaking at 75 birds May 21 (ROD). Birds had chicks at SWC and KI during Jan (LIA, HBOC) and were nesting again at SWC Oct 14 (ROD).

Dusky Moorhen Gallinula tenebrosa

RAOU No: 056 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded; reports were mostly of 1-5 birds except at medium to large waters where higher numbers were often present. 50+ birds were at SWC Oct 1 (HBOC). There were several, widespread reports of birds with chicks – during Jan, Oct and Nov – and birds were also on nests at SWC during early Oct (ROD).

Eurasian Coot Fulica atra

RAOU No: 059 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

30-60 birds were regularly present at SWC/NWR during May-Jun (ROD, HBOC), with lesser numbers also there during Sep-Oct (ROD). Occasionally recorded elsewhere, mostly in counts of <10; however, 50+ birds were present at Bolwarra (L9) Jul 17 (ROD).

Little Button-quail *Turnix velox*

RAOU No: 018 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental (New to list).

A single bird was recorded at Gloucester Tops (L5) Nov 16 (VEE). This record seems of considerable significance – as well as being a new species for the official Hunter Region list, the location is quite unusual for the species. The observation was meticulously reported and was very convincing.

Painted Button-quail Turnix varia

RAOU No: 014 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records (Amended)

Status: Uncommon resident.

A group of three birds were at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jun 22 and two birds were also recorded there Aug 23 (GED). Pairs were also at Appletree Flat (H8) Aug 21 (PRK) and Watagan Mountains (K11) Sep 8 (HLC), and single birds at Martins Creek (L8) Mar 24 (NEM) and Bluegum Creek (L10) Sep 14 (TOM).

Latham's Snipe Gallinago hardwickii

RAOU No: 168 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Usual summer migrant.

Occasionally recorded near wetland areas in central and E of the Region, with all reports being of <10 birds. The most westerly record was from Pokolbin Lake (J9) where two birds were present Jan 6 (STA). Present until at least Mar 17, when last seen at Woodville (L9) (NEM). The first recorded return was Aug 11, when two birds were at Colliery Dam (L10) (NBL).

Black-tailed Godwit Limosa limosa

RAOU No: 152 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

300+ birds were regularly recorded around KI from Jan to mid-Apr, and in Dec, with the count peaking at 370 birds Feb 19 (GED). All birds had gone by May 5. On Sep 21, 27 birds had returned, and numbers gradually increased over the next two months (GED). The only record from elsewhere than KI was of a single bird at Swan Bay (N9) Oct 30 (STA).

Bar-tailed Godwit Limosa lapponica

RAOU No: 153 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Common summer migrant.

Over Jan-Apr and from mid-Sep, birds were regularly recorded around KI in large numbers (1000+), and moderately often at coastal mudflats elsewhere, in lesser numbers (usually, <20 birds). Peak count at KI was 3100 birds Dec 13 (GED); 230 birds were still present there May 5 (GED). 100+ birds were at Harrington (S4) Jan 31 (OCG) and 60 birds Oct 14 (MVBW). Three winter records – 19 birds at Coon Island (L11) Jun 1 (MOA) and Swan Bay (N9) Jun 8 (GED), and 21 birds at Lemon Tree Passage (O9) Aug 7 (GED).

Whimbrel Numenius phaeopus

RAOU No: 150 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Common summer migrant.

Birds were regularly recorded around KI until May 10 and from Sep 21, with the peak count being of 69 birds Feb 19 (GED). On Oct 18, however, 160 birds and 21 birds were at the nearby locations of Fullerton Cove and Fern Bay, respectively (GED). The only records from elsewhere were of single birds at Ash Island (M10) Jan 7 (STA) and Harrington (S4) Oct 14 (MVBW). There were no winter records.

Eastern Curlew Numenius madagascariensis

RAOU No: 149 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Common summer migrant.

Birds were regularly recorded around KI until May 10 and from Sep 22, with the peak count being of 600 birds Nov 2; more typical counts over this period were of 100-200 birds (GED). Occasionally recorded elsewhere, mostly as <20 birds , but 30+ were present at Swan Bay (N9) Oct 30 (STA). There were no winter records.

Marsh Sandpiper Tringa stagnatilis

RAOU No: 159 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

Birds were regularly recorded around KI until May 10 and from Sep 21, with the peak count being of 131 birds Feb 19 (GED); more typical counts over this period were of 20-70 birds (GED, CLT, HBOC) but 100 birds were also present Jan 16 (LIA). The only other records were of 1-10 birds occasionally at the nearby locations of Ash Island and Fern Bay (STA, TOM). There were no winter records.

Common Greenshank Tringa nebularia

RAOU No: 158 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Usual summer migrant.

100+ birds were regularly recorded around KI until Apr 18 and from Sep 20 (GED, NBL, HBOC), with the peak counts being of 350 birds Mar 6 and Dec 13 (GED). The only other records were of a single bird at Belmont Lagoon (L11) Sep 15 (LAK) and 6+ birds at Ash Island (M10) Jan 2 and Dec 31 (ALP, STA).

Wood Sandpiper Tringa glareola

RAOU No: 154 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare summer migrant. Not recorded since 1993.

Terek Sandpiper Xenus cinereus

RAOU No: 160 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

94 birds were present at KI Feb 19 and 70 birds Dec 13 (GED); at other times at KI, birds were recorded only in low numbers (<10 birds) (CLT, GED, ALP). Elsewhere, 10 birds were in MLNP (cell P8) Apr 25 (YAR) and 60 birds at Fern Bay (M10) Oct 18 (GED). There were no records between Apr 18 and Sep 21.

Common Sandpiper Actitis hypoleucos

RAOU No: 157 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

A single bird was recorded at Stockton (M10) Jan 21 (HBOC). Some birds (<5) were also there Mar 5 – the precise number was not noted (HBOC).

Grey-tailed Tattler Heteroscelus brevipes

RAOU No: 155 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

Occasionally recorded in the KI/Stockton area until mid-Apr (CLT, HBOC) – mostly as 6-20 birds, but 20+ birds were there Jan 21 (HBOC). Elsewhere, 4 birds were at Harrington (S4) Oct 14 (MVBW), 12 birds at both Lemon Tree Passage (O9) Aug 7 (GED) and Swansea (L11) Nov 10 (STA), and 20+ birds at Tahlee/Carrington (O8) Apr 21 (HBOC).

Ruddy Turnstone Arenaria interpres

RAOU No: 129 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Usual summer migrant.

40-50+ birds were regularly recorded feeding or roosting at locations near Newcastle Baths (M10) during Jan-Mar. Only 9 birds remained there by Apr 6 (LAK). There was one winter record – of a single bird at Coon Island (L11) Jun 1 (MOA). Otherwise, the first recorded return was when two birds in breeding plumage were at Newcastle Baths Sep 9 (MEJ2) – by Nov 28, 40 birds were again present there (POP). 1-2 birds were also regularly at KI during the migratory period, except in late Sep when the counts peaked at 12 birds (GED).

Asian Dowitcher Limnodromus semipalmatus

RAOU No: 939 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental (recorded in 1985).

Not recorded.

Great Knot Calidris tenuirostris

RAOU No: 165 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

Birds were regularly recorded at Stockton Sandspit (M10) until Apr 19 and from Sep 22, with the peak counts being of 36 birds Mar 7 and 50 birds Oct 19 (GED). More typical counts were of 5-10 birds (GED, CLT, LIA). Elsewhere, three birds were recorded at Harrington (S4) Oct 14 (MVBW). An unusual winter record was of 12 birds at Stockton Sandspit Jun 3 (NBL).

Red Knot Calidris canutus

RAOU No: 164 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

All records were from around Stockton Sandspit (M10). Birds were regularly recorded there until May 9 and from Sep 20. In the first part of the year, up to 60 birds were sometimes present, although numbers were greatly variable (GED, CLT, LIA, NBL). 1500 birds were counted there Sep 20 and 2000 birds Sep 22, and counts remained high (200-400 birds) until at least Nov 3; by Dec 13, only 30 birds were present (GED). Some birds also were present in early June – a single bird (bearing a Japanese band) was recorded Jun 2 (NSW Wader Study Group per TOM), and 20 birds Jun 3 (NBL).

Sanderling Calidris alba

RAOU No: 166 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare.

Four birds were recorded at Harrington (S4) Dec 29 (VEE).

Red-necked Stint Calidris ruficollis

RAOU No: 162 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

Birds were regularly recorded around KI until May 11 and from Sep 20, with the peak counts being of 100 birds Mar 7 and 90 birds Oct 19 & Nov 2 (GED). Elsewhere, single birds were recorded at Harrington (S4) Oct 27 (TOM), Nine Mile Beach (L11/M11) Nov 10 and Forster (R6) Nov 24 (both HBOC), two birds at SBS Dec 3 (PEJ), 12 birds at Ash Island (M10) and 15 birds at Swansea (L11) – both records Jan 7 (STA).

Pectoral Sandpiper Calidris melanotos

RAOU No: 978 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare.

A single bird was recorded on a number of occasions through January at a shallow freshwater pond on KI, having first arrived there the previous month (see 1995 Report). The bird was present until at least Jan 30 (NBL). A single bird was again present there Nov 16, numbers increasing to five birds Nov 17 (YAR). A single bird was also recorded at SBS Dec 4 (HAS).

Sharp-tailed Sandpiper Calidris acuminata

RAOU No: 163 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Usual summer migrant.

Birds were regularly recorded around KI until Apr 20 and from Sep 20, with the peak counts being of 228 birds Apr 20 (GED) and 400 birds Dec 21 (YAR). Other records were of 20+ birds at Ash Island (M10) Jan 7 (STA), 6+ birds at SBS Dec 3 (PEJ), and an injured bird which was found at Tarro (M9) Apr 16 (NATF).

Curlew Sandpiper Calidris ferruginea

RAOU No: 161 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Common summer migrant.

Birds were regularly recorded around KI until May 9 and from Sep 20, with the peak counts being of 2600 birds Feb 19 and 1000 birds Dec 13 (GED). Most counts from KI were of at least several hundred birds except over Apr/May when only 40-60 birds were recorded. Only one report from elsewhere – 10+ birds at Swan Bay (N9) Oct 30 (STA).

Broad-billed Sandpiper Limicola falcinellus

RAOU No: 167 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare summer migrant.

Not recorded.

Ruff Philomachus pugnax

RAOU No: 934 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare summer migrant.

Two birds were recorded at SBS Dec 3 (PEJ).

Painted Snipe Rostratula benghalensis

RAOU No: 170 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Past records

Status: Accidental (probably overlooked).

A single bird was recorded at Ash Island (M10) Dec 10 (GED).

Comb-crested Jacana Irediparra gallinacea

RAOU No: 171 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident, more usual in N of Region.

Recorded several times at Colliery Dam (L10) – 10 birds Jun 2 (CBOC), 8+ birds Aug 11 and Sep 28 (CBOC, FOC) and 5 birds Sep 21 (NBL). Also, three birds were recorded at Coopernook (R3) Oct 29 (CBOC).

Bush Stone-curlew Burhinus grallarius

RAOU No: 174 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident

A bird was heard calling in the early morning at Tanilba Bay (N9) Oct 5, and a pair with two fledglings were present at Lemon Tree Passage (O9) Oct 18 & 21 (all are BLM records).

Beach Stone-curlew Esacus neglectus

RAOU No: 175 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental (revised from: Rare).

Not recorded since 1993.

Pied Oystercatcher Haematopus longirostris

RAOU No: 130 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

Moderately often recorded along the coast, mostly in groups of 1-5 birds. Two groups, of seven and four birds respectively, were seen along the beach at MLNP (P8) Jan 26 (TUD), and eleven birds were also recorded at Oyster Cove (N9) Oct 12 & 29 (BLM). Two immature birds were with one adult at Stockton Sandspit (M10) Jan 21 (HBOC).

Sooty Oystercatcher Haematopus fuliginosus

RAOU No: 131 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncommon resident.

Groups of 5-8 birds were often seen roosting at or near Newcastle Baths (M10). Elsewhere, 1-5 birds were recorded at Seal Rocks (R7) Jan 1/3 (PEJ), Crowdy Bay N.P. (S3) Jun 29/Jul 6 (CJB), Catherine Hill Bay (L11) Jul 4 (GWT), Oyster Cove (N9) Oct 4 (BLM), Cabbage Tree Island Dec 13/16 (BIA) and Harrington (S4) Oct 31 and Dec 29 (MVBW, CBOC),

Black-winged Stilt Himantopus himantopus

RAOU No: 146 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Moderately often recorded at medium to large waters in E of the Region. At favoured locations, such as KI and SBS, counts were often very high – 50-100+ birds. 300+ birds were at KI Apr 18 (GED), Woodberry swamp (M9) Jun 11 (PRK) and Tarro swamp (M9) Jun 30 (SJR). 10+ birds were on nests at KI late Jan (LIA, HBOC).

Banded Stilt Cladorhynchus leucocephalus

RAOU No: 147 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Accidental.

The two immature birds, first recorded at a shallow freshwater pond on KI in December 1995 (see 1995 Report), remained until least Feb 6 (NBL) and were seen by many observers. By Feb 27, they had departed (NBL).

Red-necked Avocet Recurvirostra novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 148 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Local resident.

Birds were regularly recorded around KI/Fullerton Cove, in varying numbers but always >20. 3000 birds were present May 30 (NBL), and counts of 500+ birds were quite frequent (GED, NBL, CLT, LIA). There were no records from elsewhere.

Pacific Golden Plover Pluvialis fulva

RAOU No: 8006 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

Most records were from KI – 42 birds Feb 21 & Mar 7, 23 birds Sep 22 (GED), 4 birds Oct 13 (STA), 50 birds Oct 19, 60 birds Nov 3 and 10 birds Dec 13 (GED). Elsewhere, 4 birds were at Harrington (S4) Oct 14 (MVBW), and 3 birds at Swan Bay (N9) Oct 30 (STA). No records from between Mar 7 and Sep 22.

Red-capped Plover Charadrius ruficapillus

RAOU No: 143 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Groups of 1-5 birds were recorded at Awabakal N.R. (M10/11) Mar 24 (TOM), Smiths Lake (R7) Sep 12 (OCG), Nine Mile Beach (L11/M11) Nov 10 and Forster (R6) Nov 24 (both HBOC), and occasionally at KI, Ash Island (M10) and Harrington (S4). 20+ birds were at Harrington Jan 31 (OCG), and c 50 birds at Ash Island Apr 20, Swan Bay (N9) Jun 8 and KI Jul 21 (all GED records).

Double-banded Plover Charadrius bicinctus

RAOU No: 140 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Local winter migrant.

13 birds were recorded at Coon Island (L11) Jun 1 (MOA) and 29 birds at Swan Bay (N9) Jun 8 (GED). A single bird was at KI Jul 21 (GED), and two birds were there Jul 28 (TOM).

Lesser Sand Plover Charadrius mongolus

RAOU No: 139 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

Up to 35 birds were present at KI over Feb-Mar (GED, LAK, LIA); by Apr 20 the count had decreased to 7 birds only (GED). No further reports from KI until Nov 9, when <5 birds were recorded there (HBOC); 13 birds were present Dec 13 (GED). The only record from elsewhere was of two birds at SBS Dec 3 (PEJ).

Black-fronted Dotterel Elseyornis melanops

RAOU No: 144 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes Status: Resident.

Groups of 1-5 birds were occasionally recorded at medium waters in the E of the Region. 6-20 birds were often recorded at Ash Island (M10) during Jan-Apr, and also at a freshwater lake at KI Jan 21 (HBOC), SBS May 22 (OCG), Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jul 10 (MOA) and Weston (K9) Oct 30 (OCG).

Red-kneed Dotterel Erythrogonys cinctus

Status: Bird of passage.

Two birds were at Market Swamp (M10) Jan 16 (LIA). At Ash Island (M10), 3 birds were present Apr 19 and 22 birds May 5 (both GED), and 6+ birds Jun 3 (HBOC).

Banded Lapwing Vanellus tricolor

RAOU No: 135 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes Status: Uncertain (previously considered as: Spring/early summer migrant.)

Not recorded since 1994.

Masked Lapwing Vanellus miles

RAOU No: 133 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded; where numbers were noted, around 70% of reports were of 1-5 birds. 60+ birds were feeding on ploughed ground at Morpeth (L9) Jul 17 (PRK) – all other reports were of <20 birds. Birds had nests with eggs at Crowdy Bay N.P. (S3) Jun 29/Jul 6 (CJB) and at two locations in BBNP Jul 29 (TUD), and had chicks at Shortland (M10) Sep 18 (LIA).

Pomarine Jaeger Stercorarius pomarinus

RAOU No: 945 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare. Not recorded. Arctic Jaeger Stercorarius parasiticus

RAOU No: 128 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Uncertain.

One or occasionally two birds were moderately often recorded at Newcastle Harbour (M10) over Jan-Apr (LAK, TUB), and single birds off Cabbage Tree Island (P9) Feb 3 (LAK) and Nine Mile Beach (M11) Sep 11 (CLT). At least 6 birds were off Port Stephens (cells Q9/R9) Mar 3 (PEJ).

Pacific Gull Larus pacificus

RAOU No: 126 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Rare.

Not recorded since 1994.

Silver Gull Larus novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 125 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded in coastal/near-coastal areas. Where numbers were noted, around 80% of reports were of >5 birds, and over 20% of reports were of 100+ birds. 1000+ birds were at Coon Island Swansea (L11) May 21 (MOA) and c 2000 birds at Ash Island (M10) Jan 28 (GED).

Gull-billed Tern Sterna nilotica

RAOU No: 111 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Resident (Revised from: Bird of passage).

20 birds were recorded at Stockton Sandspit (M10) Apr 5 (CLT) and 38 birds there Apr 7 (LAK). All other reports were of 1-5 birds – at KI/Stockton Jan 21 (HBOC), Mar 2, 23 & 24 (LAK, LIA, CLT) and Nov 9 (HBOC), and at Ash Island (M10) Jan 7 (STA) and Jun 3 (HBOC). The two birds at Stockton Sandspit Jan 21 were immatures.

Caspian Tern Sterna caspia

RAOU No: 112 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No

Status: Resident (Revised from: Bird of passage).

Moderately often recorded at estuarine locations and at other large saline or brackish waters, mostly as 1-5 birds. 7 birds were at KI big pond Apr 5 (CLT) and 6 birds at Coon Island (L11) Jun 1 (MOA). There were no records over the period Oct-Dec. Two immature birds were at Stockton Sandspit Jan 21 (HBOC).

Crested Tern Sterna bergii

RAOU No: 115 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and frequently recorded along coast; around 60% of reports were of 6+ birds including 20% being of 20+ birds. Birds were with dependent young at KI/Stockton Jan 21 (HBOC).

White-fronted Tern Sterna striata

RAOU No: 114 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Uncommon winter migrant. Not recorded since 1994.

Common Tern Sterna hirundo

RAOU No: 953 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: No

Status: Summer migrant.

Birds were moderately often recorded around Newcastle Harbour (M10) and nearby beaches over Jan-Mar and from Nov 10, with counts peaking at *c* 100 birds Jan 15 and Mar 23 (LIA) and 250+ birds Dec 4/5 (BID). Elsewhere, 50+ birds were at Harrington (S4) Jan 31 (OCG), 6+ birds at Myuna Bay (L11) Dec 8 (HBOC) and single birds at Swansea (L11) Jan 7 (STA) and Nine Mile Beach (L11) Nov 10 (HBOC).

Little Tern Sterna albifrons

RAOU No: 117 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Birds were occasionally recorded around Newcastle Harbour (M10) and nearby beaches over Jan-Mar and Nov-Dec, mostly as <20 birds. 20+ birds were at Stockton beach (M10) Mar 5 (HBOC). Some birds were also at Swansea (L11) Jan 7 (STA) and Myuna Bay (L11) Feb 6 (ROD). All other records were from N of the Region, especially at Harrington (S4) where 100+ birds were present Jan 31 (OCG) and late Dec (CBOC, NBL). Harrington breeding reports were: 4 adults in breeding plumage Oct 1; 30 adults in breeding plumage Oct 16; first nest with egg seen Oct 22; 2 nests & 3 eggs Oct 23; 1 nest destroyed by fox Oct 24 (all from PMTW); 200 pairs with 72 young Dec 27 (NBL). Other breeding reports were of a nest with 1 egg (later lost) at Miles Island (Q6) Dec 10 and 2 free-flying young & 1 runner at Little Gibber MLNP (P8) Dec 28 (TUD).

Whiskered Tern Chlidonias hybridus

RAOU No: 110 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: No.

Status: Bird of passage.

6+ birds were recorded at SBS Dec 3 (PEJ).

White-winged Black Tern Chlidonias leucopterus

RAOU No: 109 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

A group of adults and immatures (30+ birds in total) were recorded in Newcastle Harbour (M10) Mar 21 (LAK). Birds were also present Apr 6/7 near the harbour entrance, with some in breeding plumage (LAK).

Rock Dove Columba livia

RAOU No: 957 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Occasionally recorded, with all reports from E of the Region. 20+ birds were recorded at Belmont Lagoon (L11) Sep 15 (LAK) and Newcastle foreshore (M10) Dec 4 (HBOC). The reporting rate is not considered to reflect the true population.

White-headed Pigeon Columba leucomela

RAOU No: 028 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Usual resident.

Occasionally but widely recorded in E of the Region, with all records except one being of <5 birds. 50 birds were at Manning Point (S4) Sep 5 (MVBW).

Spotted Turtle-Dove Streptopelia chinensis

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded in E and central parts of the Region, with the greater majority of reports being of 1-5 birds. 11 birds were at Redhead (M11) Feb 27 (GJC). The most westerly records were from the Singleton (J8) area (ALP).

Brown Cuckoo-Dove Macropygia amboinensis

RAOU No: 029 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Occasionally recorded in E and central parts of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds. Seven birds were recorded at both Morisset (K11) Jun 22 (GED) and Copeland Tops (M4) Dec 22 (JUT).

Emerald Dove Chalcophaps indica

RAOU No: 033 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were recorded at Sandbar (R7) Sep 12 (MVBW), Smiths Lake (R7) Sep 12 (OCG), Main Creek (J6) Nov 3 (JUT), The Pines Watagan Mountains (J11) Nov 7 (OCG), Kangaroo Mountain (I6) Nov 21 (JUT), Newcastle Golf Course (M10) Dec 14 (CBOC) and Harrington (S4) Dec 29 (CBOC). Some birds were also at Woko N.P. (M3) Mar 16 (MVBW) and Telegherry Forest Park (M6) Jun 7/10 (WMR).

Common Bronzewing Phaps chalcoptera

RAOU No: 034 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Resident.

Most records were of 1-5 birds – at Wingen (H4) Jun 20, Sep 6 and Nov 30 (NEG), Broke (I9) Jul 25 (ALP), Belmont Lagoon (L11) Sep 15 (LAK), near Scone (H5) Sep 22 (TOM), Weston (K9) Oct 30 (OCG), Burning Mountain N.R. (H4) Oct 30 (NEG) and Redhead (M11) Dec 7 (GJC). Six birds were at Ellalong (J10) Feb 10 and 12 birds Apr 6 (MEJ1), and six birds were at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jun 8/10 (HBOC).

Brush Bronzewing Phaps elegans

RAOU No: 035 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare.

Single birds were recorded at BBNP (R6) Jan 9 (LIA) and Belmont Lagoon (L11) Jul 21 (HBOC).

Crested Pigeon Ocyphaps Iophotes

RAOU No: 043 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded; where numbers were noted, around 60% of reports were of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were at Strathcedar (Q3) Apr 20 (MVBW), Paterson/Vacy area (L8) May 4 (HBOC) and Crowdy Bay N.P. (S3) Jun 29/Jul 6 (CJB). Birds were nest building at Mayfield (M10) Mar 11 (CLT) and Wingen (H4) Nov 30 (NEG), had a nest with eggs at Woodville (L9) early Apr (NEM) – 1 egg hatched overnight of Apr 5/6 – and had nests with young at Wingen Sep 6 (NEG) and Buttaba (L11) Oct/Nov (WAR).

Diamond Dove Geopelia cuneata

RAOU No: 031 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Not recorded

Status: Rare.

No confirmed records.

Bar-shouldered Dove Geopelia humeralis

Often recorded in E and central parts of Region. Most reports were of 1-5 birds, but 6-10+ birds were at Seaham Swamp N.R. (M8) Jun 16 (CBOC), Tomago (M9) Aug 3 (HBOC) and in the Stockton/KI area Nov 9 (HBOC).

Wonga Pigeon Leucosarcia melanoleuca

Status: Usual resident.

Occasionally recorded in central and E of the Region. All reports were of 1-5 birds.

Wompoo Fruit-Dove Ptilinopus magnificus

Status: Local resident.

6+ birds were recorded at Copeland S.F. (M4) Sep 28 (CBOC) and 4 birds at nearby Copeland Tops Dec 22 (JUT), and 5+ birds were at Allyn River Forest Park (K5) Aug 11 (MAG). An injured bird, which was treated and released, was found at Tomago (M9) Jul 27 (NATF).

Superb Fruit-Dove Ptilinopus superbus

Status: Rare (New to list).

A road-killed bird was found near Pacific Palms (R7) Apr 19 (TUD).

Rose-crowned Fruit-Dove Ptilinopus regina

Status: Rare.
No confirmed records.

Topknot Pigeon Lopholaimus antarcticus

RAOU No: 027 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Bird of passage.

1-5 birds were recorded at Cundletown (R4) May 2 (OCG), Swansea South (L11) Jul 21 (HBOC) and Copeland S.F. (M4) Sep 28 (CBOC). Some birds were also at Hannam Vale (R3) Nov 3 (MVBW). An injured bird, which died, was found at Gresford (L7) Sep 22 (NATF).

Glossy Black-Cockatoo Calyptorhynchus lathami

Status: Uncommon resident.

Four birds were recorded at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jun 8/10 (HBOC), while two birds were seen at Heaton S.F. (L10) Jun 3 (FOC), Awaba (L10) late Aug (MCG), Howes Valley (H10) Oct 26 & Nov 10 (NBL) and Gloucester Tops (L5) Dec 28 (NBL).

Yellow-tailed Black-Cockatoo Calyptorhynchus funereus

Status: Usual resident.

Widely and often recorded in central and E of the Region, with around 60% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 15% of reports were of 20+ birds, with a flock of 30-40 being often recorded in the Raymond Terrace/Williamtown area (N9/M9) during Aug-Dec (SJR, GED). Birds were feeding young at Tahlee/Carrington (O8) Apr 21 (HBOC).

Gang-gang Cockatoo Callocephalon fimbriatum

Status: Resident.

Three birds were recorded at Howes Valley (H10) Sep 14 (LIA) and Milbrodale (I9) Sep 20/21 (HBOC), and four birds at Wishing Well Forest Park Watagan Mountains (K11) Aug 8 (HLC).

Galah Cacatua roseicapilla

RAOU No: 273 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Reconfirmed)

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 60% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 60 birds were at Ellalong (J10) Feb 19 and 50 birds there Nov 3 (MEJ1), and 20+ birds were at Wingen (H4) Jun 20 (NEG). All other reports were of <20 birds. A totally grey bird and a dark grey/brown bird were at Woodberry (L9) Jan 1 and Jan 5, respectively (MLR). Birds had dependent young at Wallsend (M10) during Nov (CLT).

Long-billed Corella Cacatua tenuirostris

Status: Local resident.

36 birds were recorded at Morisset (K11) Feb 20 (LIA), 22 birds at Brightwaters (L11) Mar 6 (LIA) and 20 at Swan Bay (N9) Aug 16 (PRK). Also, several birds were in a 200+ flock of all four local *Cacatua spp* feeding in a paddock at Belford (J8) Jul 30 (PRK). Two dependent young were in the flock at Brightwaters.

Little Corella Cacatua sanguinea

RAOU No: 271 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Resident.

Moderately often recorded, especially in SE of the Region where flocks of 50-100+ were often present. 200+ birds were at Edgeworth (L10) Mar 6 (OCG). Notably, some inland records also were received – 50-80 birds were at Arrowfield (H7) Feb 20 and <5 birds were near Jerrys Plains (H7) Aug 22 & Oct 2 (all ALP records), and some birds were in a mixed flock of *Cacatua spp* feeding in a paddock at Belford (J8) Jul 30 (PRK).

Sulphur-crested Cockatoo Cacatua galerita

Status: Common resident.

Widely and frequently recorded. Around 65% of reports were of 1-5 birds, but flocks of 20-100+ were not uncommon. Birds were nesting at Wingen (H4) Nov 30 (NEG).

Cockatiel Nymphicus hollandicus

Status: Uncertain.
Not recorded.

Rainbow Lorikeet Trichoglossus haematodus

RAOU No: 254 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded in E of the Region, usually in groups of <10 birds. However, 20-50 birds were often recorded at locations near both Port Stephens and Lake Macquarie. The most westerly record was of two birds at Clarencetown (M8) Dec 26 (KEM).

Scaly-breasted Lorikeet Trichoglossus chlorolepidotus

Status: Usual resident.

Moderately often recorded along the coastal fringe of the Region, with around 50% of reports being of 6-20 birds. 20+ birds were at Wyee Point (K12) Jun 18 & 22 (GED, CJC), Little Bay (O9) Jul 12 (MOA) and Smiths Lake (R7) Sep 12 (OCG).

Musk Lorikeet Glossopsitta concinna

Status: Bird of passage.

20+ birds were recorded at Cassilis (B5) Oct 23 (CBOC), and three birds at Wingen (H4) Sep 6 (NEG). Some birds (<5) were also at Wingen Jun 20 (NEG). Eight birds were at Little Bay (O9) Jul 12 (MOA).

Little Lorikeet Glossopsitta pusilla

Status: Resident.

Widely and moderately often recorded, with reports of 1-5 and 6-20 birds being about equal. 25 birds were at Morisset (K11) Mar 4 (LIA).

Australian King-Parrot Alisterus scapularis

Status: Usual resident.

Widely and often recorded, with around 70% of reports being of 1-5 birds. Large numbers were frequently at Ellalong (J10) during Mar-Apr, with the count peaking at 30 birds Mar 17 (MEJ1).

Red-winged Parrot Aprosmictus erythropterus

Status: Accidental (New to list)

A single bird was recorded at Turill (B5) Oct 7 (HAS).

Crimson Rosella Platycercus elegans

Widely and moderately often recorded, with around 65% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 30 birds were at Chichester Dam (M6) Sep 6 (SJR).

Eastern Rosella Platycercus eximius

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 65% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were in Paterson/Vacy area (L8) May 4 (HBOC) and at Wingen (H4) Sep 6 (NEG), and 50+ birds in Salt Ash/Medowie area (N9) Jul 13 (HBOC). Birds were nesting at Shortland (M10) Sep 30 (BIA), and 12-16 immatures were together at NLH Dec 23 (HIM).

Swift Parrot Lathamus discolor

RAOU No: 309 HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 3) Breeding: No

Status: Rare.

A single bird was at Wyee (K12) Jun 8/9 (CBOC, FOC).

Red-rumped Parrot Psephotus haematonotus

RAOU No: 295 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Widely and often recorded, with around 60% of reports being of 1-5 birds. Large numbers (20+ birds) were often present at Arrowfield (H7), with the count peaking at 50+ birds Jun 17 (ALP). 20+ birds were also at Bowmans Crossing (H7) Jan 6 (STA) and Buchanan (L9) Aug 2 (PRK). Birds were inspecting hollows for nesting sites at Singleton (J8) Jul 28 and Aug 3 (ALP).

Turquoise Parrot Neophema pulchella

RAOU No: 302 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncommon resident.

20+ birds were recorded at MLNP (Q7) Mar 23 (BIA). Two birds were at Murrumbo (D7) Aug 15 and four birds there Aug 21 (GED). Four birds were at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Aug 23 (GED) – birds were also heard there Jun 8/10 (HBOC).

Oriental Cuckoo Cuculus saturatus

RAOU No: 336 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No Status: Accidental.

Not recorded since 1994.

Pallid Cuckoo Cuculus pallidus

RAOU No: 337 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual summer migrant.

First recorded return was Aug 17 when a single bird was present at Green Wattle Creek (L9) Aug 17 (NEM). Birds began to be widespread from early Sep, and were moderately often recorded, as single birds or pairs, for the remainder of the year. There were no reports for the first part of the year.

Brush Cuckoo Cacomantis variolosus

Fan-tailed Cuckoo Cacomantis flabelliformis

Status: Common resident.

Widely and frequently recorded, always as <5 birds. Around 80% of reports were for the period May-Nov.

Black-eared Cuckoo Chrysococcyx osculans

Status: Accidental.

Not recorded.

Horsfield's Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx basalis

RAOU No: 342 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Summer migrant, some birds may be present all year.

Single birds were recorded at Wallaroo S.F. (N8) May 3 & 7 (BOS), Shortland (M10) Jul 16 (LIA), Awaba (L11) Jul 30 (TOM) and Tomago (M9) Sep 7 (LIA). A young bird was being fed by Superb Fairy-wren *Malurus cyaneus* at SWC in early/mid Jan (LIA).

Shining Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx lucidus

RAOU No: 344 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes Status: Usual summer migrant, some birds are present all year. *(Text revised)*

Widely and often recorded, as 1-2 birds where exact numbers were noted. 40% of records were for the period May-August. A young bird was being fed by Yellow Thornbill *Acanthiza nana* at SWC Oct 2 (WMR), and an adult bird was being fed by another adult at Tahlee (O8) Oct 30 (STA).

Little Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx minutillus

Status: Accidental (recorded in 1992).

Not recorded.

Common Koel Eudynamys scolopacea

RAOU No: 347 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual summer migrant.

Moderately often recorded, with most reports being from the central and E of the Region. The most westerly report was from Wingen (H4) Nov 30 (NEG). A bird was heard at New Lambton until Apr 4 (STA), and the first recorded return date was Sep 19, when a bird was at Kahibah (M10) (BAW). Widespread returns commenced on Sep 27. A young bird was being fed by Red Wattlebird *Anthochaera carunculata* at Warners Bay (L10) Feb 2 (WMR).

Channel-billed Cuckoo Scythrops novaehollandiae

Status: Common summer migrant.

Moderately often recorded in the central and E of the Region. Birds were present until at least Feb 26, when heard for the last time at Wallsend (M10) (CLT). First recorded return was Sep 4, when a single bird was at Toronto (L11) (TOM). Arrival dates elsewhere in the Region mostly spanned the following three weeks.

Pheasant Coucal Centropus phasianinus

Status: Resident.

Single birds or pairs were recorded at Garden Suburb (M10) Jan 4 (PEJ), Barrington Reserve (N4) Jan 26/28 (STA), Belmont Lagoon (L11) Mar (LAK), Tanilba Bay (N9) Oct 4 (BLM), Forster (R6) Nov 27 (WMK), Awabakal N.R. (M10/11) Dec 1 (GJC) and at Redhead (M11) Jan 10, Dec 7 & 22 (GJC). Some birds were also at Harrington (S4) Jan 31 (OCG) and Awabakal N.R. Oct 10 (GJC). Injured birds were found at Redhead Jan 16 and Bobs Farm (O9) Oct 15 (NATF).

Powerful Owl Ninox strenua

RAOU No: 248 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Local resident.

Single birds were recorded at Glendale (L10) Jan 9 (PET), Buttai (L9) Feb 27 & Mar 5 (PET), The Basin Watagan Mountains (J11) Mar 16 (BOD), Dudley (M10) Jun 16 (FOC), Allworth (N8) Jul 31 (PET), and BbR Nov 23 (LIP), and birds were heard at Korsmans MLNP (P7) May 2 (TUD) and Hallidays Point (R5) Jun 4 (PET). An injured bird was found at Swansea (L11) Aug 12 (NATF).

Barking Owl Ninox connivens

RAOU No: 246 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: Past records

Status: Rare.

Not recorded – but see Supplementary Records.

Southern Boobook Ninox novaeseelandiae

RAOU No: 242 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Very few reports were received – birds were at Toronto (L11) Jan 15 & Apr 4 (TOM), Singleton (J8) Jan 28 (ALP), Buttaba (L11) Mar 21 (TOM), Green Wattle Creek (L9) Apr 10 (NEM), Pilchers Mountain (M7) Aug 25 (HBOC), and near Scone (H5) Sep 25 (TOM). 14 injured birds were treated during the year (NATF).

Sooty Owl Tyto tenebricosa

RAOU No: 253 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare.

A single bird was recorded at Sharpes Creek Gloucester Tops (M5) Nov 15 (NBL).

Masked Owl Tyto novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 250 HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 3) Breeding: Yes

Status: Rare.

The only record which could be confirmed was of a single bird was recorded at Wingham (Q4) Sep 22 (BEM).

Barn Owl Tyto alba

RAOU No: 249 HBOC Category: 2 (Revised from: 3) Breeding: Past records

Status: Uncommon resident, probably under-recorded). (Revised from: Rare)

A single bird was regularly seen and heard at Dellhurst (J6) over April/ early May, often calling at dusk (JUT). Single birds were also at Rutherford (L9) Apr 10 (SMJ), Nesca Park Newcastle (M10) Apr 28 (MEJ2), Fullerton Cove (M10) May 24 (GED), Arrowfield (H7) Jul 16 (ALP), WWW Aug (TAH) and Sandgate (M10) Nov 6 (BID). 13 injured birds were treated during the year – 10 of these were in Sep (NATF). The Nesca Park sighting was in daytime, and the bird was being mobbed.

Tawny Frogmouth Podargus strigoides

Status: Resident.

Only occasionally recorded formally, but 90 injured birds were treated during the year (NATF). Birds were on nest at University of Newcastle (M10) Sep 11 (MPM) and had dependent young at Dellhurst (J6) Nov 3 (JUT) and Rankin Park (M10) Nov 13 (STJ). The nest at the University was also used in 1995.

White-throated Nightjar Eurostopodus mystacalis

Status: Resident.

An injured bird, which was treated and released, was found near Mount Sugarloaf (L10) Feb 4 (NATF).

Spotted Nightjar *Eurostopodus argus*

Status: Accidental (recorded in 1989).

Not recorded.

Australian Owlet-nightjar Aegotheles cristatus

RAOU No: 317 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Resident

Single birds were recorded at Toronto (L11) Apr 4 (TOM), Dawsons Hill (J6) Jul 10 (JUT) and Wingen (H4) Oct 26 (NEG), and an injured bird was found at Singleton (J8) Jul 24 and successfully treated (NATF). The bird at Dawsons Hill was sunning itself in daytime.

White-throated Needletail Hirundapus caudacutus

Status: Summer migrant.

Birds were occasionally recorded over Jan-Feb and Nov-Dec, mostly in small groups but sometimes in greater numbers. 40+ birds were at Warkworth (I8) Jan 10 (ALP) and Jewells (M11) Nov 13 (LAK) and 80 birds at Ellalong (J10) Dec 2 (MEJ1). Three birds were at Belmont Lagoon (L11) in Mar (LAK).

Fork-tailed Swift Apus pacificus

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

Not recorded.

Azure Kingfisher Alcedo azurea

RAOU No: 319 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (1988)

Status: Resident

Single birds were recorded at Toronto Swamp (L11) Jan 10 (MOA), SWC May 9 (WCR), Belmont Lagoon (L11) Jul 21 (HBOC), Weston (K9) Oct 30 (OCG) and Ellalong Lagoon (J10) Dec 28 (MEJ1), and two birds were in MLNP (P8) Apr 25 (YAR).

Laughing Kookaburra Dacelo novaeguineae

RAOU No: 322 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 85% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were in the Salt Ash/Medowie area (N9) Jul 13 (HBOC) and at Smiths Lake (R7) Sep 12 (OCG). Birds were nesting at Fassifern (L10) Aug 24 (EAS/DUP), had dependent young at Toronto Swamp (L11) Jan 10 (MOA), and were carrying food at Wingen (H4) Nov 30 (NEG).

Sacred Kingfisher Todiramphus sanctus

RAOU No: 326 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual summer migrant, some birds may be locally resident.

Widely and frequently recorded, always as <5 birds. Few records after early Mar, until the first recorded return near Scone (H5) Sep 25 (TOM). However, winter records were of birds at Stockton (M10) Apr 5 and May 11 (CLT, LIA), Coon Island (L11) Jun 1 (MOA), Tahlee/ Carrington (O8) Jun 8 (GED), MLNP (P8) Jun 8/10 (CJB) and Dora Creek (L11) Jun 12 (TOM). Birds had dependent young at both SWC and Broadwater MLNP (P8) in Jan (LIA, TUD).

Rainbow Bee-eater Merops ornatus

Status: Summer migrant.

1-5 birds were recorded at Bowmans Crossing (H7) Jan 6 and Oct 8 (STA, ALP), Harrington (S4) Jan 31 (OCG), Wollombi/Bucketty area (I10/11) Feb 4 (YAR), BBNP (R6) Sep 19 (TUD), White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Oct 4 (HAS), Warakeila (L6) Oct 19 (NEM), Stanhope Creek (K8) Oct 20 (HBOC) and Ashtonfield (L9) Dec 8 (ROS), and 6+ birds at Milbrodale (I9) regularly over Sep 20/22 (HBOC).

Dollarbird Eurystomus orientalis

Status: Summer migrant.

Widely and frequently recorded. Only around 5% of reports were of >5 birds, and with 20+ birds at Eccleston (K6) Feb 3 (HBOC). Birds were present until at least Mar 2, when last recorded at Singleton (J8) (ALP). The first recorded return was Sep 29, when a single bird was at Arcadia Vale (L11) (KEB). Within one week, birds were widespread. Birds were on nests at Carey Bay (L11) Nov 13 (HLC), Wingen (H4) Nov 30 (NEG) and Clarencetown (M8) Dec 26 (KEM), and were carrying food at Vacy (L8) Jan 6 (HBOC).

Noisy Pitta Pitta versicolor

Status: Rare.

One or more birds were at Gap Creek Watagan S.F. (K11) Apr 27/28 (BIA), Copeland Common (N4) Oct 5 and Dec 28 (NBL) and Copeland Tops (M4) Nov 16 and Dec 22 (NBL, JUT).

Superb Lyrebird Menura novaehollandiae

Status: Common resident.

Birds were seen or heard at Cobark Park (L4) Jan 27 (STA), Dingo Tops Bulga S.F. (O2) Feb 1 (MVBW/OCG), Telegherry Forest Park (M6) Feb 25 and Jun 7/10 (HBOC, WMR), The Mountaineer (M5) Feb 25 (HBOC), Gloucester Tops (L5) Mar 17 (YAR), Awabakal N.R. (M10/11) Mar 25 (TOM), Mount Vincent (L10) May 22 (OCG), Dunns Creek (L8) Jun 1 (HBOC), Mount Vincent (L10) Aug 26 and Sep 14 (OCG, TOM) and Kundibakh (P4) Oct 19 (MVBW).

Rufous Scrub-bird Atrichornis rufescens

Status: Local resident.

Two birds were recorded at Gloucester Tops (L5) Sep 28 (CBOC).

White-throated Treecreeper Cormobates leucophaeus

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 80% of reports being of 1-5 birds and all being of <20 birds. Most reports of 6+ birds were from Jun-Jul.

Red-browed Treecreeper Climacteris erythrops

Status: Uncommon resident.

Two birds were recorded on three occasions – at Gloucester Tops (L5) Mar 17 (YAR) and Nov 16 (CBOC), and Dilgry Circle Barrington Tops (L4) early Sep (TAT).

Brown Treecreeper Climacteris picumnus

Spotted Pardalote Pardalotus punctatus

Striated Pardalote Pardalotus striatus

Speckled Warbler Chthonicola sagittata

Weebill Smicrornis brevirostris

Occasionally recorded in central and W of Region, with most reports being of <20 birds. 20+ birds were at Milbrodale (I9) Sep 20/21 and 50+ birds at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jun 8/10 (both HBOC).

Brown Gerygone Gerygone mouki

RAOU No: 454 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded in central and E of Region, with reports of 1-5 and 6-20 birds being about equal. 20+ birds were at Telegherry Forest Park (M6) Feb 25 and Dunns Creek (L8) Jun 1 (both HBOC) and Trevor S.F. (M6) Nov 2 (LIA). Birds were feeding fledged young at Coopernook S.F. (R3) Feb 17 (MVBW).

Mangrove Gerygone Gerygone levigaster

Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were recorded at Tahlee/Carrington (O8) Apr 21 (HBOC), Fern Bay (M10) Oct 27 (TOM), Swansea (L11) Nov 10 (STA), Ash Island (M10) Dec 31 (STA), and on many occasions in the KI/Stockton area. 6+ birds were at Ash Island Jan 7 (STA). Although birds were carrying food at Stockton Jan 21 (HBOC), this is considered insufficient evidence for a breeding record.

Western Gerygone Gerygone fusca

Yellow Thornbill Acanthiza nana

Widely and regularly recorded, with reports of 1-5 and 6-20 birds being about equal. 20+ birds were at Ash Island (M10) Jan 7 and Dec 31 (STA) and at Tomago (M9) Aug 3 (HBOC). Birds were feeding a young Shining Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx lucidus at SWC Oct 2 (WMR).

Striated Thornbill Acanthiza lineata

Status: Usual resident.

Widely and often recorded; around 45% of reports were of 6-20 birds. 20+ birds were at Pilchers Mountain (M7) Aug 25 (HBOC).

Southern Whiteface Aphelocephala leucopsis

Status: Uncommon resident. Not recorded since 1994.

Red Wattlebird Anthochaera carunculata

Status: Resident.

Widely and often recorded, with 75% of reports being of 1-5 birds. 20+ birds were in the Salt Ash/Medowie area (N9) Jul 13 (HBOC) and at Smiths Lake (R7) Sep 12 (OCG). Birds had nests with young at Wingen (H4) Sep 6 (NEG) and The Ruins BBNP (R6) Sep 25 (TUD), were on nest in the Forster/Tuncurry area Dec 7/8 (ALP), and were carrying food at Wingen Nov 30 (NEG). Birds were feeding a young Common Koel Eudynamis scolopacea at Warners Bay (L10) Feb 2 (WMR).

Little Wattlebird Anthochaera chrysoptera

Birds were nest building at Belmont Lagoon (L11) Jul 21 (HBOC), had a nest with eggs at Tomago (M9) Sep 7 (LIA) and were with chicks at Bonnells Bay (L11) Sep 10 (LIA).

Striped Honeyeater Plectorhyncha lanceolata

Widely and moderately often recorded, always as 1-5 birds or the birds were heard only.

Noisy Friarbird Philemon corniculatus

Widely and regularly recorded. Around 50% of reports were of 6-20 birds, and much larger groups were not uncommon. 100+ birds were recorded at Belmont Lagoon (L11) Apr 14 (LAK) and in the Salt Ash/Medowie area (N9) Jul 13 (HBOC). Birds were carrying food at Burning Mountain N.R. (H4) Oct 30 (NEG) and had nests with young at Arrowfield (H7) Oct 31 and Nov 15 (ALP) - these were different nests.

Little Friarbird Philemon citreogularis

A single bird was recorded at MLNP (P8) Oct 30 (KEM).

Regent Honeyeater Xanthomyza phrygia

A pair were with two fledged young at Mungo Brush MLNP (P8) Oct 30 (STA), and five immature birds were amongst the party present at Ellalong.

Bell Miner Manorina melanophrys

Status: Resident (revised from: Local resident).

Moderately often recorded in central and E of Region; around 50% of reports were of 6-20 birds and a further 20% were of 20+ birds. Birds were feeding fledged young at Glenrock SRA (M10) Apr 2 (HBOC) – this is the first confirmed breeding record for over ten years.

Noisy Miner Manorina melanocephela

Lewin's Honeyeater Meliphaga lewinii

Yellow-faced Honeyeater Lichenostomus chrysops

Status: Common resident, influxes in autumn/winter.

Widely and regularly recorded. All counts of 20+ birds were from the period Apr-Oct, while all counts of 50+ birds were in Apr-Aug. 100+ birds were at South Swansea (L11) May 21 (MOA), Coon Island (L11) Jun 1 (MOA) and Tomago (M9) Aug 3 (HBOC), while many hundreds were at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jun 8/10 (HBOC). 2000+ birds, in flocks of 100-300, were moving in a south-easterly direction at Redhead (M11) on Apr 26, and a further 1000+ birds passed through on the following day (GJC). Birds were feeding young at Stanhope Creek (K8) Oct 20 (HBOC) and were on nest at Wingen (H4) Nov 30 (NEG).

Singing Honeyeater Lichenostomus virescens

Yellow-tufted Honeyeater Lichenostomus melanops

Regularly recorded at Green Wattle Creek (L9) – peaking at 21 birds Aug 17 and with typical counts being of 8-13 birds (NEM). 1-5 birds were NW of Gungal (E6) May 26 (STA/PHP) and at Woodville (L9) Jun 19 (HBOC) and Bluegum Creek (L10) Sep 14 (TOM). 20+ birds were at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jun 8/10 (HBOC), and also 6+ birds there Oct 4 (HAS).

White-plumed Honeyeater Lichenostomus penicillatus

Status: Usual resident in central/west of Region, uncommon elsewhere.

Moderately often recorded in central and W of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds. Frequently present at Arrowfield (H7), and an adult was seen feeding a single fledged young there Sep 18 (ALP).

Black-chinned Honeyeater Melithreptus gularis

HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Amended) RAOU No: 580

Status: Uncommon resident in central/west of Region. (Revised: previously considered to be a bird of passage)

Three birds were recorded at White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jun 8/10 (HBOC) while two birds were there Jul 12 (GED) and in an area slightly north (cell C5) Jul 25 (FOC). Two birds also were in the Wollombi/Bucketty area (I10/11) Feb 4 (YAR), and a single bird at Ravensworth S.F. (I7) Apr 23 (TOM).

Brown-headed Honeyeater Melithreptus brevirostris

Brown Honeyeater Lichmera indistincta

Birds were regularly recorded at SWC and around Swansea (L11), and occasionally but widely from elsewhere close to the coast. 6 birds were at Coon Island Swansea Jun 1 (MOA); all other reports were of <5 birds. Birds were nest building at Mayfield (M10) during Nov (CLT).

Painted Honeyeater Grantiella picta

Tawny-crowned Honeyeater Phylidonyris melanops

Scarlet Honeyeater Myzomela sanguinolenta

Moderately often recorded in E of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds. The most westerly records were from Martins Creek (L8) Feb 3 and Milbrodale (I9) Sep 20/22 (both HBOC). 6-20 birds were at Cams Wharf (L11) May 21 and Jun 1 (MOA, CCF), South Swansea (L11) May 21 (MOA) and Morisset (K11) Jun 29 (CCF).

White-fronted Chat Epthianura albifrons

Red-capped Robin Petroica goodenovii

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 75% of reports being of 6+ birds including 25% being of 20+ birds. 50 birds were at SWC Sep 5 (ROD) and 100+ birds at Dunns Creek (L8) Jun 1 (HBOC). Birds were displaying at Woko N.P. (M3) Mar 16 (MVBW) and were nest building at Wingen (H4) Nov 30 (NEG).

Diamond Firetail Stagonopleura guttata

RAOU No: 652 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Resident.

Occasionally recorded in central and W of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds. 10 birds were at Battery Rocks (E6) Apr 26 (STA) and 8+ birds at Bulga (I8) Sep 8 (CBOC), while separate groups of 12 and 3 birds were recorded along Flags Road NW of Gungal (E6) May 26 (STA/PHP).

Nutmeg Mannikin Lonchura punctulata

RAOU No: 983 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

Status: Accidental.

Not recorded since 1991.

Chestnut-breasted Mannikin Lonchura castaneothorax

RAOU No: 657 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

A flock of 25 birds was recorded at KI Jul 21 & 28 (GED, TOM), and 6-20 birds at Harrington (S4) Jan 31 (OCG), Shortland (M10) early Oct (HIM) and Whitebridge (M10) Aug 12 (GED). 1-5 birds were recorded at KI Jan 21 (HBOC), SWC Feb 5 (LIA) and Ash Island (M10) Jun 3 (HBOC).

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis

RAOU No: 996 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Reconfirmed)

Status: Local resident.

A flock of 30 birds was recorded at KI Jul 21 & 28 (GED, TOM), 6 birds at Port Waratah (M10) during Jun (CLT) and 5 birds at Bolwarra (L9) Jul 17 (ROD). Birds had dependent young at Mayfield (M10) during Nov (CLT).

Mistletoebird Dicaeum hirundinaceum

RAOU No: 564 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Widely and often recorded, mostly as 1-5 birds. 6+ birds were at Swansea South (L11) May 30 (HAS), White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Jun 8/10 (HBOC), Wingen (H4) Sep 6 (NEG) and Milbrodale (I9) Sep 21/23 (HBOC). Some birds at Wingen were nest building, and also birds were on nest at Ashtonfield (L9) Dec 8 (ROS).

White-backed Swallow Cheramoeca leucosternus

RAOU No: 358 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Past records

Status: Bird of passage.

12 birds were recorded at Denman (G7) Jul 12 (GED), and 1-5 birds at Kerrabee (D7) Aug 22 and White Box Camp GRNP (C6) Aug 23 (both GED), near Scone (H5) Sep 22 (TOM), and at Hunter River near Arrowfield (H7) Oct 8/9 (ALP).

Welcome Swallow Hirundo neoxena

RAOU No: 357 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded; around 65% of reports were of 6+ birds including 20% being of 20+ birds. 100-200+ were at SBS Jun 30 and Jul 10 (HAS, ROD). Birds nested at SWC over Aug-Sep (ROD) and had dependent young at Mayfield (M10) during Nov (CLT). Groups of 10-15 passed through, flying south, every 15-20 minutes at Murdering Gully (M10) Sep 15 (STA).

Tree Martin Hirundo nigricans

RAOU No: 359 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (newly confirmed)

Status: Resident.

100+ birds were recorded at both Hexham Swamp N.R. (L/M10) Jan 16 (LIA) and Lake St Clair (J6/7) Sep 8 (ALP). 6+ birds were at Barrington Reserve (N4) Jan 26/28 (STA), Trevor S.F. (M6) Nov 2 (LIA) and Clarencetown (M8) Dec 26 (KEM), and 1-5 birds at Ash Island (M10) Jan 7 (STA) and Battery Rocks (E6) Oct 4 (HAS). Also an injured bird, which died, was found at Vacy (L8) Oct 12 (NATF). Many juveniles were at Hexham Swamp N.R., birds were copulating and also inspecting hollows at Lake St Clair, and two birds were on nests at Clarencetown. These reports, especially the last one, are the first confirmation of breeding status for this species in the Hunter Region.

Fairy Martin Hirundo ariel

RAOU No: 360 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Summer migrant; some birds appear to be resident.

Moderately often recorded in E and central parts of the Region, in varying numbers up to 30+ birds. Only two records from between Feb 10 and Aug 7 – of <5 birds at SBS (L10) Jun 30 (HAS) and SWC Jul 10 (LIA). By Aug 18, ten birds were at SWC and one pair had a nest with eggs (ROD). 13 nests were there on Oct 10 (LIA).

Red-whiskered Bulbul Pycnonotus jocosus

RAOU No: 990 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Local resident.

A single bird was recorded at Forster (R6) Jan 21 (TUD), and two birds at Belmont Lagoon (L11) during both Apr and Dec (LAK).

Clamorous Reed-Warbler Acrocephalus stentoreus

RAOU No: 524 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual summer migrant; some birds are resident.

Moderately often recorded in E and central parts of Region, mostly as 1-5 birds. Birds were sometimes recorded at SWC/NWR over May-Aug (HBOC, ROD) and also at Belmont Lagoon (L11) Jul 21 (HBOC). Birds were carrying food at Federal Park swamp (M10) Nov 30 (CLT).

Tawny Grassbird Megalurus timoriensis

RAOU No: 523 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes (Reconfirmed)

Status: Local resident.

1-5 birds were recorded at Ash Island (M10) Jan 7 (STA), NWR Jan 9 (STA), KI Jan 21 (HBOC), SWC Jun 6 & 23, Aug 20 and Oct 21 (TOM, HBOC, ROD), Belmont Lagoon (L11) Sep 15 (LAK), Raymond Terrace (M9) Sep 29 (CBOC) and Booti Booti N.P. (R6) Nov 22 & 24 (TUD, HBOC). Some birds were also at Cabbage Tree Island Dec 13/16 – numbers not noted (BIA). Three pairs were nesting at Federal Park swamp (M10) Dec 21 – separation of about 50 m between each nest (CLT). Birds had been seen with dependent young at this site Nov 30 (CLT).

Little Grassbird Megalurus gramineus

RAOU No: 522 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records

Status: Resident.

Occasionally recorded at SWC (ROD, HBOC). 1-5 birds were also at Pokolbin Lake (J9) Jan 6 (STA), Ash Island (M10) Jan 7 and Dec 31 (STA), Toronto Swamp (L11) Jan 10 (MOA), KI Jan 21 (HBOC), WWW Nov 16 (TAH) and Belmont Swamp (L11) during Dec (LAK).

Rufous Songlark Cincloramphus mathewsi

RAOU No: 509 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes (newly confirmed)

Status: Summer migrant in central/west of Region. (Revised from: Rare)

Two birds were recorded at Glennies Creek (I7) Apr 12 (TOM), Broke (I9) Sep 8 (FOC) and Battery Rocks (E6) Oct 4 (HAS), and single birds at Bowmans Crossing (H7) Jan 6 (STA) and Bulga (I8) Sep 8 (CBOC). Three birds were at Wingen (H4) Nov 30, including one bird on a nest (NEG). This appears to be the first confirmed breeding record by HBOC.

Brown Songlark Cincloramphus cruralis

RAOU No: 508 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes

Status: Uncertain. (Revised from: Bird of passage)

Two birds were at Glennies Creek (I7) Apr 12 (TOM).

Golden-headed Cisticola Cisticola exilis

RAOU No: 525 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded in E of the Region; 75% of reports were of 1-5 birds and all were of <20 birds. Birds were nesting at Ellalong Lagoon (J10) Dec 28 (MEJ1).

Silvereye Zosterops lateralis

RAOU No: 574 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident and winter migrant.

Widely and regularly recorded, with around 30% of reports being of 20+ birds. No clear winter influx was apparent – the frequency of counts of 20+ birds was fairly constant throughout the year.

THRUSH SPECIES

Both Zoothera species (*Z. lunulata*, *Z. heinei*) are found within the Hunter Region. However, field differentiation, except when calling, is difficult. Observers are encouraged to make a specific report, but a precise identification is not always possible. Confirmed reports of either species are described below; where there is doubt as to identification, the observation is reported separately.

Bassian Thrush Zoothera lunulata

RAOU No: 779 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncertain.

Two birds were recorded at both Gloucester Tops (L5) Mar 17 (YAR) and Olney S.F. (J11) Apr 18 (TOM), and a single bird at MLNP (P8) Jun 8/10 (CJB).

Russet-tailed Thrush Zoothera heinei

RAOU No: 780 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Uncertain.

Two birds were recorded at Warakeila (L6) Jul 27 (NEM) and 6+ birds at Copeland S.F. (M4) Sep 29 (VEE).

Unidentified Thrush Sightings

Birds were recorded at Cobark Park (L4) Jan 27 (STA), Dingo Tops area (O2/3) Feb 1 (OCG), Telegherry Forest Park (M6) Jun 7/10 (WMR), Eccleston (K6) Jul 27 (HBOC) and Trevor S.F. (M6) Nov 2 (LIA).

Common Blackbird Turdus merula

RAOU No: 991 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded

Status: Rare.

Single birds were present at Wingen (H4) for one week in early Sep (NEG) and at Sand Bar (R7) Sep 12 (OCG).

Common Starling Sturnus vulgaris

RAOU No: 999 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded. Around 85% of reports were of >5 birds, with over 40% being of 20+ birds. Six widespread reports were of 100+ birds. Some birds were nest building at Wingen (H4) Sep 6 and others were on nest there Nov 30 (NEG); birds also had a nest with young at Stockton (M10) Oct 13 (STA).

Common Myna Acridotheres tristis

RAOU No: 998 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Status: Usual resident.

Widely and regularly recorded; around 60% of reports were of 1-5 birds. 100+ birds were at Ash Island (M10) Jun 3 and Salt Ash/Medowie (N9) Jul 13 (both HBOC). Numbers at Singleton are reported to be increasing. Some birds were nest building at Wingen Sep 6 and others were on nest there Nov 30 (NEG), and birds had dependent young at Mayfield (M10) during Nov (CLT).

UNCONFIRMED RECORDS

The records below could not be accepted by HBOC's Records Appraisal Committee for inclusion into the main body of the Report because of insufficient description being available at the time of printing. They are presented here for completeness; future Reports will advise of any which subsequently are accepted.

Cape Petrel Daption capense

RAOU No: 080 HBOC Category: 3

Single birds, which were treated but died, were reported to have been found at Anna Bay (O9) Oct 21 and Birubi Point (O9) Nov 24.

Gould's Petrel Pterodroma leucoptera

RAOU No: 078 HBOC Category: 3

A single bird was reported off Cabbage Tree Island in daytime Sep 8. (The island is the main breeding site for this species but daytime sightings are uncommon.)

Sooty Albatross Phoebetria fusca

RAOU No: 09t2 HBOC Category: 3

An injured bird was found at Fingal Bay (P9) Nov 3 - the bird was treated and released.

Wilson's Storm-Petrel Oceanites oceanicus

RAOU No: 063 HBOC Category: 3

A report of an injured bird found at north Stockton beach (O9) Jan 10 - the bird did not survive.

Black Bittern Ixobrychus flavicollis

RAOU No: 196 HBOC Category: 3

An injured bird was reported to have been found at Corlette (O9) Apr 13 and later died.

Square-tailed Kite Lophoictinia isura

RAOU No: 230 HBOC Category: 3

A single bird was reported to have been near Jerrys Plains (H7) Dec 8.

Black Falcon Falco subniger

RAOU No: 238 HBOC Category: 3

There were reports of single birds at a shallow freshwater pond on Kooragang Island on Feb 19 and at Lorn (L9) in May, and of an injured bird at Adamstown (M10) Sep 11 which was successfully treated and released.

Diamond Dove Geopelia cuneata

RAOU No: 031 HBOC Category: 3

A single bird was reported to be at Howes Valley (H10) Apr 28 – there also have been unconfirmed reports from this location in previous years. A single bird was reported from Ash Island (M10) Apr 19 – at this location, the bird possibly may have been an aviary escapee.

Rose-crowned Fruit-Dove Ptilinopus regina

RAOU No: 021 HBOC Category: 3

A dead bird was reported to have been found at Corlette (O9) May 29 and an injured bird, which later died, at Stockton (M10) Apr 26.

Masked Owl Tyto novaehollandiae

RAOU No: 250 HBOC Category: 3

Reports were of a single bird at Hallidays Point (R5) Jun 6 and of injured adult birds found at Glendale (L10) Feb 22, Stroud (N7) Jun 6 and Williamtown (N9) Oct 3.

Western Gerygone Gerygone fusca

RAOU No: 463 HBOC Category: 2

A single bird was reported to be near Dungog (M7) Nov 30.

Paradise Riflebird Ptiloris paradiseus

RAOU No: 686 HBOC Category: 3

A report of a single male bird at Barrington Tops N.P. (K4/L4) Nov 17.

ESCAPEES

The species listed below were recorded in the Hunter Region during the year, but are considered to be aviary escapees rather than part of a self-sustaining wild population:

Red-capped Parrot Purpureicephalus spurius

RAOU No: 290

Two birds were at Edgeworth (L10) Mar 10 (OCG).

Apostlebird Struthidea cineara

RAOU No: 675

A single bird was confirmed present in a backyard at Birmingham Gardens (M10) Feb 13 (BAW). The bird was reported to have been in the area for 8-10 days, and was feeding with flocks of Noisy Miner *Manorina melanocephela* and Spotted Turtle-Dove *Streptopelia chinensis*.
