# FOREWORD

Being an active member of a bird club provides an excellent opportunity to further social interaction and make long-term friends who have mutual interest. In such a social climate it can provide many hours of "pleasurable leisure time activity", and thus help to achieve one of the two aims of HBOC. Much more importantly, however, it provides the opportunity for a contribution to achieve the other HBOC aim "to encourage and further the study and conservation of Australian birds and their habitat". The production this Bird Report for 1997 is a most important component of achieving this aim, especially as it becomes a reference source on what species are using what habitat in what locations in the region, not easily obtained from any other source.

Unfortunately, far too little support is given by governments and funding agencies for effective long-term monitoring, which should be an essential component of the conservation decision-making process in Australia's situation of extreme drought-flood weather cycles and current climate of habitat destruction. There are far too few professional ornithologists to do all the work needed and universities and academics are generally not interested in or prepared to undertake long term monitoring work. HBOC can therefore make a major contribution to filling the gap and is to be congratulated on its efforts.

The observations which go to make up this report are in effect part of a long-term monitoring project on the conservation status of Hunter Valley birds. The cumulative knowledge gathered in successive Bird Reports over the years can make a major contribution to understanding the conservation status of species and the influence of habitat changes on this status. The fact that the observations have been made by amateur bird watchers and not by professional academics should not detract from the value of the work. If the members are given sound instructions in making valid observations, data gathering has been well designed and the publication of the material well vetted, the reports can be of immense importance as input to decision making on conservation measures and development applications. A few examples from this year's report give some indication of the potential importance of the work.

The report of one Australasian Bittern at the Wetlands Centre in September 1997, has particular significance. In my background research for the chapter on Australasia and Oceania in a new book being prepared by Wetland International's Heron Specialist Group entitled *The Conservation Status of Herons*, I found very little information on the bitterns – because of their cryptic habits their biology is almost entirely unknown. It is listed in *Threatened and Extinct Birds of Australia* (Garnett 1992) as "insufficiently known" (i.e. suspected as being endangered, rare or vulnerable, but more information is needed for determining its status), as rare and vulnerable in Schedule 12 of the New South Wales National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974, has been nominated under the Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act of Victoria because it has comprised only 1.6% of all bird observations there with only one breeding record since 1970 (personal communication from Martin O'Brien, Department of Natural Resources and the Environment), and as endangered in the Birdlife International publication *Birds to Watch 2: The World List of Threatened Birds* (Collar, Crosby and Stattersfield 1994). Its cumulative count over 3 years of observations from 360 wetlands by volunteers for the Birds Australia Murray Darling Waterbird Project was only 40, recorded from only 9 sites (personal communication from Michael Hutchison) and in my 17 years of work at the Shortland Wetlands Centre, I have seen it only once.

The Black Bittern reported at Buttaba July - September is likewise a very important record. It is also listed in Schedule 12 of the National Parks and Wildlife Act as vulnerable and rare and as a species of special concern in Garnett (1992).

The sighting of large numbers of Latham's Snipe at Cedar Hill Drive in December helps to identify this habitat as being a high conservation value. At some future date, this record may be of significant importance in the event of any possible threats to the location. The bird first became a protected species in NSW in 1976. It was originally classified as a game bird but surveys carried out in Victoria and Tasmania in the 1970s recorded only low numbers, indicating that hunting could not be sustained. Long term records accumulated by HBOC and reported in the Bird Report will help to decipher trends in the local population. It will be interesting to compare the counts with those of the 1985-86 survey organised by Wilma Barden in conjunction with the Tasmanian National Parks and Wildlife Service.

Of special interest to me was the entry on the Magpie Goose. At the time of first settlement, the species was widespread along the eastern coastal plain of Queensland, NSW and Victoria. The usual pressures of habitat destruction, hunting and poisoning caused them to disappear from the range, which retreated to the tropical north of the continent. One bird mysteriously appeared in the Hunter region in1978 and four eventually took up residence at Seaham in 1984. In January 1986, after the birds had disappeared from Seaham, four turned up at Shortland with a gosling in tow. The local birdos refused to believe the report of

the gosling until a photograph of the bird was produced! They disappeared from Shortland soon afterwards but four adults reappeared (presumably the same ones) at Seaham and nested there in 1987. In 1987-89, the newly established Shortland Wetlands Centre reintroduced the species by releasing captive-bred goslings from Victoria and from Darwin at the Centre. The birds nested at Shortland for the first time in 1992 and since then a viable local nesting population has been maintained.

The cumulative data on the Magpie Goose in HBOC Bird Reports will help to document the population trends for the resurgence of the species in the Hunter. The birds obviously travel back and forth between Shortland and Seaham (I have a count of over 40 at Seaham on one occasion) and the reports at Woodberry and Cedar Hill Drive are evidence that the local flock is recolonising the Lower Hunter. The report at Wingen in September is of particular interest and leads to speculation as to whether the geese originated from Shortland or from flocks that have appeared on the north coast in recent years.

I commend the club for its initiative in producing the Bird Report and look forwards to seeing future issues. As the publication evolves in the years to come it will be important to collate and report on the trends emerging for the more important species.

# INTRODUCTION

In this Report, produced by Hunter Bird Observers Club Inc. (HBOC), we present a summary of the status of bird species within the Hunter Region of NSW in the 1997 calendar year. The information is based upon observation records which we have gathered from a variety of sources.

The 1997 Report describes the regional status of 360 bird species, including 312 species that were recorded during the year. There are five additions to the 1996 species list – Tahiti Petrel, Grass Owl, Sooty Tern, Grey Ternlet and Pilotbird. Breeding records for 113 species are described, of the total of 186 species that are confirmed to have bred within the Region in the past 10 years.

We define the Hunter Region as the area managed by local government authorities for Newcastle, Lake Macquarie, Maitland, Cessnock, Muswellbrook, Merriwa, Singleton, Scone, Murrurundi, Dungog, Gloucester, Port Stephens, Greater Taree and Great Lakes. This corresponds with the area described in the popular tourist maps of the Hunter. A map showing the Hunter Region is included with this Report.

The philosophies which we use when preparing Reports have been described in the 1996 Report. To assist in vetting records, we have classified each species into one of three categories, as described below. The classification reflects, in part, the frequency of reporting.

- Category 1: all records for the species generally are acceptable.
- Category 2: records usually are acceptable, but supporting information may be required in the event of unusual numbers, location or season.
- Category 3: the species is considered to be of special interest in relation to the Region, and supporting information is required before any record can be accepted for inclusion into the Report.

A Records Appraisal Committee assigns these categories and decides whether each record can be accepted. In 1997, the Committee members were Sue Hamonet, Jeannette Stephenson, Ann Lindsey, Wilma Barden, Jim Perry and David Geering.

Basically normal weather patterns were experienced in the Region for most of the year, but conditions became drier in the latter half as a strong El Nino effect became established in the Pacific Ocean. A potentially more significant environmental condition occurred in late September and October, when large and widespread fires raged out of control in Malaysia and Indonesia. Many migratory species, especially wading birds, return to Australia at around that time each year.

This Report is only possible because of the dedication of a small army of observers who have submitted records of what they have seen during the year. Many thanks to them, and long may they continue!

# SYSTEMATIC LIST

## INTRODUCTION

Bird species are listed in taxonomic order; the order and nomenclature follows that of Christidis and Boles in the 1994 RAOU publication The Taxonomy and Species of Birds of Australia and its Territories (ISBN 0815-2233).

Definitions of the terms used in status descriptions for the listed species in the Report are as follows:

**Resident**: Recorded in all months:

**Migrant**: Species that come to an area for a period and then depart;

Bird of passage: Species present in a suitable area for a relatively short period, and equally likely to be observed in any month of the year;

**Common**: Species that one can *expect* to find on all visits to suitable habitats;

**Usual**: Equally likely to be found in suitable habitats, but not on all visits;

**Uncommon**: Species that are recorded infrequently on visits to suitable habitats;

Local: Species recorded in only a few favoured localities;

Rare: Species recorded only a few times a year;

Accidental: Species recorded less than once per year, over a 10 year average.

Breeding status, where confirmed, is also described. For species with no confirmed breeding records for 10 or more years, or which are not always recorded each year in the Hunter Region, the breeding status is described as Past records. Where a species might be anticipated to breed in the Region, but there are no confirmed records, the description None recorded has been used. We expect that, with time, our knowledge of breeding status will grow.

The majority of records we receive include assignments of abundance levels for the species observed, using the following categories: A = 1-5 birds present; B = 6-20 birds; C = 21-50 birds; D = 51-100 birds; E = 100+ birds. Commentaries in this Report are based mainly upon abundance levels reported in this way, although many observers report precise numbers (and we encourage this).

The format for the reported observations generally includes reference to an observer code and to a location (sometimes, a location abbreviation is used instead). The relevant grid number (e.g. F7) is also cited, except for some of the more common locations for which, instead, the grid numbers are listed later in the Report. Observer codes and location abbreviations are also detailed later in the Report.

A semi-quantitative measure of the number of observations of a species for the year is indicated by the progressive use of the terms: occasionally; moderately often; often; frequently; regularly. Where there are fewer than 10-12 observations, all of them are reported.

An ID number is provided with each listed species. This ID number, formerly called the RAOU number, is a unique identifier that does not change even though the scientific and/or common name for the species may do so. The ID number corresponds to that assigned to the species under the Australian Bird and Bat Banding Scheme.

# BIRDS

Emu Dromaius novaehollandiae

HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: None recorded ID No: 001 Status: Uncommon bird of passage in W of the Region (Revised from: Rare).

Single birds were recorded at Murrumbo (D7) Jun 6, Jul 11 & 20 (GED). Also, a single bird was at Barrington House (L5) Feb 23 (HBOC) – this is an unusual rainforest location and how the bird came to be there is not known.

20+ birds were recorded at Barrington House (L5) Feb 23 (HBOC). All other reports were of <5 birds, where numbers were noted – at Allyn River Forest Park (K5) Feb 22 (HAS), Mount Coricudgy (E9) Mar 17/22 (GED), Wingham Brush Apr 19 and Sep 8 (MVBW, KEM), Sharpes Creek/Gloucester Tops (M5/L5) Oct 3/6 (HBOC), Olney S.F. (K10) Nov 13 and Nov 23/24 (TOM). Active mounds were found at Barrington House Feb 23 and Minmi (L10) Aug 22 (TOM).

Regularly recorded at SWC and nearby wetlands, with numbers peaking at 85 birds at SWC in July (many reports). Often also at Seaham Swamp N.R., with 11 birds there Feb 4 and 24 birds Dec 26 (HBOC, KEM). Elsewhere, 7 birds were at Woodberry (L9) Dec 4 (SJR) and 8 birds at Cedar Hill Drive (L10) Dec 8 (TOM). An unusual inland record was of a			

group of 4 birds flying over Wingen Sep 7 (NEG). A pair were with 8 young at SWC Dec 5 (HWT).

#### Plumed Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna eytoni

At the regular location, Doughboy Hollow near Singleton, 90 birds were present May 25, 200 birds Jun 10, and 150 birds Aug 1 (NEG, TOM).

#### Wandering Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna arcuata

ID No: 204 HBOC Category: 1 Status: Local resident and bird of passage.

1-3 birds were recorded at SWC in late Oct (KEM, ROD), and eight birds at the nearby NWR Nov 27 (TOM). Reporting rates, and counts, were much reduced from previous years.

#### Blue-billed Duck Oxyura australis

#### Musk Duck Biziura lobata

There were three records from Grahamstown Dam (M9) - a usual location: a single bird was present there Aug 29 (KEM), four birds Oct 26 (LIA), and 10+ birds Nov 29 (STA). Elsewhere, two birds were at Lake Boolambayte MLNP (P7) Apr 27 (KEM) and one bird at Nabiac (Q5) Dec 28 (CBOC).

#### Freckled Duck Stictonetta naevosa

### Black Swan Cygnus atratus

ID No: 203 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters, with most reports being of <20 birds. 200-300 birds were at Lower Myall River (P8) Jan 1 (KEM), Lake Boolambayte MLNP (P7) Apr 27 (KEM) and Coon Island Swansea Sep 26 (ROD). There were breeding records for 8 months of the year - the exceptions being Feb, Apr, May and Dec.

Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides HBOC Category: 3 ID No: 207

Breeding: No

Not recorded since 1995.

Status: Accidental.

#### Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata HBOC Category: 1

ID No: 202 Status: Common resident.

Widely and frequently recorded at or near fresh to brackish waters. Only around 35% of reports were of >6 birds - this is a slight decrease compared with previous years. 20+ birds were at Swansea Mar 4 (HBOC), SWC/NWR Jun 22 (HLC), Bulga Sep 6 (LIA) and Cedar Hill Drive (L10) Dec 20 (HBOC). Several breeding records were received, spanning the period Aug-Nov.

#### Mallard Anas platyrhynchos

A single bird was recorded at Telarah Lagoon Maitland (L9) Aug 28 (MPM).

## Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

ID No: 208 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes Status: Common resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at small to large waters. 100+ birds were at Lower Myall River (P8) Apr 25 (KEM) and SWC Jul 3 (HBOC), and 50+ birds at KI/Stockton Mar 1 (LIA) and Bolwarra (L9) Sep 10 (ROD).

### Australasian Shoveler Anas rhynchotis

ID No: 212 HBOC Category: 1 Status: Local resident and bird of passage

Up to four birds were frequently recorded at SWC, mainly in the latter half of the year, and five birds at Seaham Swamp N.R. Feb 23 (CBOC). Elsewhere, pairs were at Pokolbin Lake (J9) Apr 22 (LIA), Market Swamp Aug 9 (STA) and Ellalong Lagoon Aug 15 (MEJ1), and single birds at Bolwarra (L9) Sep 10 (ROD) and Cedar Hill Drive (L10) Dec 20 (HBOC). A pair were copulating at SWC Aug 27 (ROD) - this is not considered to be sufficient for a breeding record.

Breeding: None recorded

#### Grey Teal Anas gracilis

ID No: 211 HBOC Category: 1 Status: Usual resident.

Moderately often recorded in E and central parts of the Region, mostly as <20 birds. Counts at SWC were 20-50+ during Sep-Dec (KEM, LIA), and 20+ birds were at Seaham Swamp N.R. Feb 8 (HBOC) and Stockton STP Nov 9 (STA).

#### Chestnut Teal Anas castanea HBOC Category: 1

ID No: 210 Status: Usual resident.

Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region, not infrequently as 20+ birds. The most westerly report was from Colliery Dam, where 6+ birds were present Jul 20 (HBOC). At Ash Island, 600 birds were present Apr 1, 100+ birds Mar 1 (both HBOC), and 50+ birds Dec 27 (BID). Counts at SWC frequently exceeded 20 birds, and 100+ birds were there during Apr and on Dec 28 (both LIA), and 50+ birds Jul 3 (HBOC) and Oct 15 (KEM). Elsewhere, 50+ birds were at Stockton STP Mar 1 (LIA), Woodberry (L9) Mar 12 (BID) and Cockle Creek (L10) Nov 23 (CLT). Birds were reported to be with young in Apr, Aug and Nov.

### Garganey Anas querquedula

Not recorded.

#### Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes

Birds were recorded at two locations only. 2-3 birds were at Seaham Swamp N.R. over Feb 4/8 (HBOC), and 7-10 birds at SBS over Nov 7/8 (TOM, PEJ).

#### Hardhead Aythya australis

#### ID No: 215 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Past records Status: Usual resident.

Often recorded at SWC in the latter half of the year, and occasionally at other locations in the E of the Region. Counts were generally of <10 birds, but 87 birds were at Bolwarra (L9) Sep 10 (ROD), and up to 110 birds at NWR over late Oct / early Nov (ROD, STA).

#### Australasian Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae

ID No: 061 HBOC Category: 1 Breeding: Yes Status: Common resident.

Widely and often recorded at small to large fresh waters, mostly as <20 birds. 20+ birds were at Marmong Point (L10) May 6 (HBOC), Ellalong Lagoon Aug 15 (MEJ1) and Bolwarra (L9) Sep 10 (ROD), and occasionally at SWC (HBOC, LIA, KEM). Breeding records were received for Mar and Sep-Dec.

Breeding: Past records

#### Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus HBOC Category: 2

ID No: 062 Status: Bird of passage.

Around 200 birds were present at Grahamstown Dam (M9) Oct 26 (LIA). The only other records were of single birds at WWW Mar 8 (TAH) and SBS Nov 7 (TOM).

### Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus

HBOC Category: 1 ID No: 060 Breeding: Yes Status: Local resident

Three reports were from WWW in the first half of the year. 10 birds were present there Feb 15 (BID) and 12 birds May 5 (STJ) – the latter record included pairs with 4 and 1 dependent young, respectively. A bird with one dependent young was also present Mar 23 (TAH). Elsewhere, 10 birds were at Grahamstown Dam (M9) Oct 26 (LIA).

#### Little Penguin Eudyptula minor

ID No: 005 HBOC Category: 2 Breeding: Yes Status: Local resident.

Three birds were recorded at Nelson Bay (O9) Feb (LAK), a single bird at Swansea Mar 4 (HBOC), and five birds were at sea off Stockton Beach Nov 9 (STA). Some birds were nesting on Cabbage Tree Island Dec 11/14 (OCG).

#### Southern Giant-Petrel Macronectes giganteus

ID No: 929 HBOC Category: 3 Breeding: No Status: Rare Not recorded since 1994.

### Tahiti Petrel Pseudobulweria rostrata

A single bird was recorded approximately 40km E of Port Stephens (R9) Feb 25 (PEJ).

The 97/98 season on Cabbage Tree Island had 866 nest sites (for comparison, there were 816 nest sites in 96/97) of which 514 were active (316 in 96/97), and with 493 of the nests having a bird and egg (269 in 96/97). (N Carlile per G O'Connor).

### Wedge-tailed Shearwater Puffinus pacificus

ID No: 069 Status: Summer migrant.

Counts were generally higher in the lower Hunter Valley, and included 20+ birds at Belmont Swamp (M11) during Nov (LAK) and at SWC Dec 28 (LIA), 60 birds at New Lambton (M10) Jan 21 (CLT) and 100+ birds at Woodberry (L9) Mar 10 (SJR). Birds were on nests at SWC Nov 12 (KEM).

## BIRDS OF OPEN-FOREST COMMUNITIES OF WESTERN LAKE MACQUARIE

Mike Todd is a consultant ornithologist working with Lake Macquarie City Council to develop a biodiversity profile of the Council's area of responsibility. Mike is also a postgraduate student in the Biology Department at the University of Newcastle.

While there have been 303 bird species recorded within the Lake Macquarie catchment area, only a fraction of these are present at any one point, at any one time. It is these birds that are present at a particular site that make up the local bird community. A community is usually made up of bird species that differ in their foraging ecology and preferred habitat within the site. These birds can be divided into what are called foraging guilds. A foraging guild consists of birds that forage in a similar way to each other.


Open-forest is the most common forest type in the Lake Macquarie catchment and so possesses a variety of different bird communities depending on the density and type of understorey as well as the dominant tree types that make up the forest canopy. Three open-forest communities are particularly common in the catchment area:

- *Stringybark* forest dominated by eucalypts with stringy bark. Red Bloodwood and the Rusty Gum are common associates.
- Scribbly Gum forest dominated by eucalypts with a smooth bark called Scribbly Gums. Often the
  only large tree present at sites.
- *Ironbark* forest dominated by eucalypts with coarse, flaky bark called ironbarks. Spotted Gum and Grey Gums are common associates.

Ironbark forests typically possess a greater bird species diversity than the other two communities. The number of species, and the number of individuals within each species can be converted into an index. This index is called a diversity index and it allows sites to be compared with one another. There are a number of different indices but a commonly used one is the Shannon-Wiener diversity index. Its advantage is that it takes into account both how many species are present at a site (species richness) and the overall abundance of birds at a site. Within the Lake Macquarie catchment, ironbark forests have a greater bird species diversity than the other two, that is statistically significant (ANOVA, p=0.005). Why is this so?

We can begin an explanation of this by looking at why scribbly gum communities tend to have a lower bird species diversity than the others. The smooth bark of scribbly gums doesn't provide as many notches and crevices for insects as ironbark and stringybark eucalypts do. Also the canopy of scribbly gum communities tends to be more open than the other communities. This is caused by two factors. The trees

themselves have less small branches and leaves than other eucalypts and they also tend to be further spaced apart. Overall this makes for less foraging habitat for many birds. The birds from the barkforaging guild (treecreepers and the Varied Sittella) are disadvantaged by the smooth bark. Birds that forage in the canopy (pardalotes and warblers) are disadvantaged by the sparse foliage. However, scribbly gum communities often have an understorey that is blessed with more flowering shrubs such as *Banksia* and *Lambertia*, plants which provide foraging habitat for nectarivorous birds such as the Eastern Spinebill and the White-cheeked Honeyeater. Honeyeaters that feed on insects as much as nectar like the Brown-headed Honeyeater are less attracted to the abundant nectar, however, at times scribbly gum communities can possess many more honeyeaters than the other sites and at all times nectarivorous species make up a greater proportion of the total birds at a site (Figure 1). Another way in which the scribbly gum communities differ is in the higher proportion of aerial insectivores such as swallows, swifts and martins in the total population at a site in comparison to other communities.

In contrast to the scribbly gum communities the ironbark communities often have a slightly more open understorey. While this excludes some species such as the Southern Emu-wren and the Chestnut-rumped Heath-wren, it can favour other species such as the Brown Treecreeper. The most diverse site located to date, was an ironbark forest, which possessed on average eight more species than the other sites and more than 25 more individual birds per hour survey. While it lacked some of the dense understorey dwellers such as those mentioned above it contained other species that were not found at the other sites such as the Black-chinned Honeyeater, Fuscous Honeyeater, Yellow-tufted Honeyeater, Brown Treecreeper and greater numbers of almost all other species. Ironbark communities on the whole contain a greater representation of birds from slightly more inland areas than do stringybark and scribbly gum communities.

Despite the greater species diversity of ironbark communities, the importance of other open-forest communities should not be forgotten. Scribbly gum communities exist where soil and climatic conditions make them favourable and thus are the most able to provide bird habitat in those areas. While the habitat they provide may not be able to support as many birds as other communities the environment that it

provides is the favoured habitat of many other bird species. It is the variation between one area and another that allows different bird communities to develop and it is this that makes birdwatching such a rewarding and varied occupation.
