FOREWORD

I feel honoured to be asked to write the Foreword for this, the 8th Annual Bird Report of Hunter Bird Observers Club.

It brings back memories of my attempt, during the 1980's, to establish a list of all the bird species reported in the Hunter Region. At that time information was available to me from the lists compiled at Club outings and camps, from individual observations, from sightings reported in Newsletters and Journals of other NSW Bird Clubs, and from "Hunter Natural History", the journal of the former Newcastle Flora & Fauna Protection Society, our parent group.

The data was recorded by hand on a card system, an approach that appears quite clumsy by comparison with the electronic standards of the present day. And yet, over the subsequent years these records have proved their worth as a source of reference on many occasions. So in a sense, they could be regarded as the forerunner of the Annual Bird Reports.

Past records, as we all would agree, are invaluable in assessing the continuance or loss of certain species, and over time they tell the story of the changing environment in which we are living. And so it will be as future generations look back on the Annual Bird Reports of our club.

Some of the pioneer birdwatchers of the Hunter Region must have compiled priceless personal lists. Men such as Jim Gray, Albert Gwynne, Athol D'Ombrain, Lindsay Hyem, Pat Bourke contributed mightily to ornithological knowledge in the Hunter, but sadly, not all their observations were published, and with their demise these have been lost. All of which emphasises the importance of, and the need for, the continuance of Hunter Bird Observers Club's backing of these Annual Bird Reports.

This publication, as must be obvious to all, is a massive undertaking, and all members who submitted contributions deserve our thanks for their support. I applaud the work of the Records Appraisal Committee in its role of assessing reports of unusual sightings. A commendable, if onerous task, attempting to preserve the integrity of the contents, and so make this a reliable reference source for posterity.

Finally, all this information has to be collated and recorded with appropriate comments by the chief architect – Alan Stuart. Alan has been involved with all eight publications, and must be commended for his methodical approach and dedicated industry.

My congratulations to all concerned, and my best wishes for the continued success of the Club and this venture.

INTRODUCTION

In this Report, produced by Hunter Bird Observers Club Inc. (HBOC), we present a summary of the status of bird species within the Hunter Region of NSW during the year 2000. The information is based upon observation records which we have gathered from a variety of sources.

The 2000 Report describes the regional status of 376 bird species, including 334 species that were recorded during the year. There are 11 additions to the 1999 species list – Northern Giant-Petrel, Providence Petrel, Antarctic Prion, Fairy Prion, Black Petrel, Streaked Shearwater, Hutton's Shearwater, Wandering Albatross, Wilson's Storm-Petrel, Black-tailed Native-hen and Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater. Breeding records for 131 species are described, of the total of 214 species that have been confirmed to have bred within the Region in the past 10 years.

The information about seabirds in the 2000 Bird Report has been significantly bolstered by some pelagic surveys that were conducted by HBOC in the latter half of the year. The surveys, departing from Swansea and travelling >60km south-east, to the edge of the continental shelf and sometimes slightly beyond, were very fruitful. It has been decided to include the results of these surveys (which are planned to continue in future years) into these Reports – partly so that some significant ornithological records are not lost. Consequently, for this and the future Reports, we have modified the definition of the Hunter Region to reflect an extension of the boundaries of the area over which records apply. The Hunter Region is defined now as:

- The area managed by local government authorities for Newcastle, Lake Macquarie, Maitland, Cessnock, Muswellbrook, Merriwa, Singleton, Scone, Murrurundi, Dungog, Gloucester, Port Stephens, Greater Taree and Great Lakes, and
- The ocean to the east of that area, extending to the edge of the continental shelf.

The philosophies that we use when preparing Reports remain as were described in the 1996 Report:

- The overall list of species will include all species which, since 1987, are confirmed by HBOC to have been present in the Region. Records of rare species from before 1987 mostly would be difficult to confirm, due to the amount of time that has elapsed since the observation. At present, HBOC does not propose to review the earlier records.
- The status description for each species is to be subject to regular review, with the aim of ensuring that the description reflects the current situation. For any year, the main indication of the then-current Hunter Region birdlife will come from considering the status descriptions of the listed species.
- All records will be vetted and no record will be accepted for inclusion into the Reports unless HBOC is convinced of its validity. Information about the records appraisal scheme is presented below.

• Breeding status will be assigned to a species only if definite evidence to this effect has been provided. If there have been no breeding records for a species for 10 or more years, the breeding status will be reviewed.

To assist in vetting records, we have classified each species into one of three categories, as described below. The classification reflects, in part, the frequency of reporting.

- Category 1: all records for the species generally are accepted.
- Category 2: records usually are accepted, but supporting information may be required in the event of unusual numbers, location or season.
- Category 3: the species is considered to be of special interest in relation to the Region, and supporting information is required before any record can be accepted for inclusion into the Report.

A Records Appraisal Committee assigns these categories and decides whether each record can be accepted. In 2000, the RAC members were Sue Hamonet, Jeanette Stephenson, Ann Lindsey, Wilma Barden and Jim Imrie. More recently, Fred van Gessel, Terry Lindsey and Phil Hansbro have joined the RAC and have assisted in reviewing this Report.

The value of the Bird Report is overwhelmingly due to the small army of observers who submitted records of what they saw during the year. Whether the records were made as a one-off casual observation or as part of a regular and thorough survey program they all have been important in helping to continue to build the picture of birdlife in the Hunter Region. Thanks very much to all the contributors.

SYSTEMATIC LIST

INTRODUCTION

Bird species are listed in taxonomic order; the order and nomenclature follows that of Christidis and Boles in the 1994 RAOU publication *The Taxonomy and Species of Birds of Australia and its Territories* (ISBN 0815-2233).

Definitions of the terms used in status descriptions for the listed species in the Report are as follows:

Resident: Recorded in all months;

Migrant: Species that come to an area for a period and then depart;

Bird of passage: Species present in a suitable area for a relatively short period, and equally likely to be observed in any month of the year;

Common: Species that one can *expect* to find on all visits to suitable habitats;

Usual: Equally likely to be found in suitable habitats, but not on all visits;

Uncommon: Species that are recorded infrequently on visits to suitable habitats;

Local: Species recorded in only a few favoured localities;

Rare: Species recorded only a few times a year;

Accidental: Species recorded less than once per year, over a 10 year average.

For many of the species, a general statement about typical distribution and count size is provided as part of the Status description. In these cases, only notable exceptions to this overall description of Status are considered for inclusion into the main body of the Report.

Breeding status is also indicated for each species. For species with no confirmed breeding records for 10 or more years, the breeding status is described as **Past records**. Where a species is anticipated to breed in the Region but there are no confirmed records, the description **None recorded** has been used.

A considerable proportion of records received indicate abundance levels for the species observed by using the following categories: A = 1.5 birds present; B = 6.20 birds; C = 21.50 birds; D = 51.100 birds; E = 100+ birds. Commentaries in this Report are mostly based upon abundance levels reported in this way, although many observers report precise numbers (and we encourage this).

The format for the reported observations generally includes reference to an observer code and to a location (or a location abbreviation). The relevant grid number (e.g. F7) is also cited, except for the more common locations which are listed later in the Report. Observer codes and location abbreviations are also provided later in the Report.

A semi-quantitative measure of the number of observations of a species for the year is indicated by the progressive terms: **occasionally**; **moderately often**; **often**; **frequently**; **regularly**. Where there are fewer than 10-12 observations for the year, all of them are reported.

An ID number is provided with each listed species – this is a unique identifier that does not change even though the scientific and/or common name for the species

may do so. The ID number corresponds to that assigned to the species under the Australian Bird and Bat Banding Scheme.

BIRDS

Emu Dromaius novaehollandiae

ID No: 001 HBOC Category: 2 F Status: Local resident in W of Region.

C Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Region.

Birds were recorded twice in Goulburn River N.P. – five birds in cell D7 Sep 8 (STA) and three birds in cell C6 Oct 4 (SMJ).

Australian Brush-turkey Alectura lathami

ID No: 008 HBOĆ Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

Some birds were recorded at Tabbil Forest (M7) Feb 26 (HBOC), Wingham Brush Mar 18 (MVBW) and Sleepy Hollow Trail (N7) Apr 30 (MOA). Also, some birds were at BbR Aug 15 and had built a mound there (ROD).

Stubble Quail Coturnix pectoralis

ID No: 009 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Rare.

At least two birds were seen or heard daily at Fosterton Loop (M7) over Jan 2-16, and a single bird was also recorded there Sep 30 (JED).

Brown Quail Coturnix ypsilophora

ID No: 011 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded, mostly as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: 10 birds were recorded at Ash Island Feb 28 (BAR), 14 birds at Wyee Point Mar 17 & 26 (MDV), 15 birds at Howes Valley May 13 (NES) and 16 birds at Arrowfield May 22 (via ALP).

King Quail Coturnix chinensis

ID No: 012 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Rare, possibly overlooked

Four birds were recorded at Arrowfield Feb 23 and May 18, and two birds there Mar 28 (SAD). On May 18, one bird was taken by a Brown Falcon *Falco berigora*.

Magpie Goose Anseranas semipalmata

ID No: 199 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident. Often recorded at TWC and adjacent wetlands (especially NWR and Market Swamp) as counts of up to 50 birds.

Notable records: 52 birds were recorded at TWC Jul 9 (TAN) and 68 birds there Aug 6 (BAW). 1-5 birds were at Seaham Swamp N.R. Apr 10 (TAN) and in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (OCG), and 6-10 birds at Minmi Swamp (L10) early Mar (CCFOC/LIA) and Aug 8 (MAM) and Cundletown (R4) early Oct (LAM/MVBW). Birds were with chicks at TWC Jan 3 (GOD), Minmi Feb 12 (MOA) and Antennae Marsh (M10) Nov 7 (WMR).

Plumed Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna eytoni

ID No: 205 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Bird of passage.

32 birds were recorded at Pambalong N.R. Mar 19 (ROS), 44 birds at Rathluba Lagoon (L9) Apr 17 (ROS) and 80+ birds at Doughboy Hollow (J8) May 20 (ROS). Nine birds were at Lansdowne Road (R3) Nov 1 (MVBW), and 1-5 birds at TWC Feb 25 (WCR), Hannam Vale (R3) Apr 15 (MVBW), BbR during Sep/Oct (several records) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 26 (LIA).

Wandering Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna arcuata

ID No: 204 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident and bird of passage.

Around 50 birds were recorded at TWC Jan 3 (GOD) and Market Swamp Oct 28 (BIA). Lesser numbers, usually <10 birds, were often at TWC throughout Jan-Mar and Oct-Dec, while approx. 60 birds were there Apr 16 (TAN). 10-20 birds were recorded at nearby wetlands at Ash Island Mar 5 (CBOC), University of Newcastle Jun 18 (TAN) and Market Swamp Nov 8 (LIA). Eight birds were at Dungog Jan 6 (JED) and there were several records of 1-5 birds in the E of the Region. A pair was with two chicks at KI Feb 27 (BIA) and birds also were breeding at Antennae Marsh (M10) Nov (WMR).

Blue-billed Duck Oxyura australis

ID No: 216 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Accidental. Not recorded since 1989.

Musk Duck Biziura lobata

ID No: 217 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident.

1-5 birds were moderately often recorded in the E of the Region, including several times through the year at WWW. Seven birds were at Grahamstown Dam Apr 10 (TAN).

Freckled Duck Stictonetta naevosa

ID No: 214 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Rare (*Revised from: Accidental*).

At least five birds were recorded at a deep freshwater pond on KI over Feb 27 to Mar 10 (CBOC, NBL, BIA).

Black Swan Cygnus atratus

ID No: 203 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds at medium to large waters.

Notable records: 720 birds were recorded at Pambalong N.R. Jul 4 (LIA) and 100+ birds at lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK) and Belmont Lagoon Jul 18 (TAN). 51-100 birds were at Lenaghans Drive swamp (L10) Feb 12 (MOA), Tarro Jun 6 (HBOC), Swan Bay Oct 15 (HWS) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 28 (NIJ). There were a further ten records of 20+ birds, all from the E of the Region. Numerous breeding records were received, spanning May-Oct.

Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides

ID No: 207 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental.

Two birds were recorded at Tarro Sep 17 (GIK).

Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata

ID No: 202 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds at or near fresh to brackish waters.

Notable records: 50+ birds were at Testers Hollow (K9) Sep 11 (HBOC) and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC), and 21-50 birds were moderately often recorded. Several breeding records were received, for Feb and Sep/Oct and including a report of a pair with 23 young at Warners Bay (L10) Oct 10 (WMR).

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos

ID No: 948 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident.

1-5 birds were recorded at Tarro Jun 6 and WWW Jun 25 (both HBOC) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 31 (OCG), and also often at BbR (STA).

Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

ID No: 208 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds at small to large waters.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at Pambalong N.R. Dec 28 (NIJ), and 21-50 birds at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), Stockton Feb 1 (HBOC), Lenaghans Drive swamp (L10) Feb 12 (MOA), Stockrington Rd (L10) Feb 12 (MOA), Pambalong N.R. Feb 12, Mar 11 and Dec 10 (MOA, HLC, HBOC), Bolwarra Wetlands Feb 14 & 21 (BPS) and Tarro Jun 6 (HBOC). Birds had young at Congewai (J10) May 21, Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (all HBOC records), and at TWC during Oct (ROD, BIA).

Australasian Shoveler Anas rhynchotis

ID No: 212 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident and bird of passage. Occasionally recorded at medium to large fresh waters in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as 1-5 birds but with counts of up 10 birds not uncommon.

Notable records: 18 birds were recorded at KI Mar 10 (BAR), 13 birds at Pambalong N.R. Jun 13 (ROS) and 12 birds at TWC Feb 25 (WCR).

Grey Teal Anas gracilis

ID No: 211 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Often recorded at medium to large waters throughout the Region as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: 51-100 birds were recorded at Stockrington Rd (L10) and Lenaghans Drive swamp (L10) Feb 12 (MOA), SBS Feb 13 (HLC) and Ash Island Apr 16 and Oct 19 (GOD, MOA). 21-50 birds were at Bolwarra Wetlands Feb 21 (BPS), Congewai (J10) May 21 (HBOC), Arrowfield Aug 10 (ALP), Pambalong N.R. Oct 3 and Dec 16/17 (HBOC, MOA), Bulga Swamp (I9) Nov 16 (MOA) and Ash Island Dec 17 (MOA). Birds had young at Arrowfield May 10 (ALP) and Seaham Swamp N.R. Sep 24 (HBOC).

Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

ID No: 210HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Regularly recorded at medium to large fresh waters in E of the Region as countsof up to 50 birds.

Notable records: Many hundreds of birds were often recorded at Ash Island and a nearby deep freshwater pond during Feb-Apr and in Dec, with the peak count being of around 400 birds Dec 9 (several reports). 320 birds were also recorded at SBS Feb 13 (HLC). 51-100 birds were at TWC Jan 4 and May 15 (KEM, ROD), Stockton Feb 1 (HBOC), Lenaghans Drive swamp (L10) Feb 12 (MOA), Pambalong N.R. Oct 3 and Dec 10 (HBOC) and Ash Island Oct 14 (HWS). Birds had young at Toronto Wetland (L11) Oct 9 (HLC) and TWC Nov 23 (ROD).

Garganey Anas querquedula

ID No: 209 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental *(recorded in 1993).* No reports received for 2000.

Pink-eared Duck *Malacorhynchus membranaceus*

ID No: 213 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Bird of passage.

1-5 birds were recorded at TWC Jan 4, Mar 4, Jul 9 & Oct 21 (KEM, MVBW, CCFOC, WAR), SBS Feb 13 (HLC), KI Mar 5 (CBOC) and Morpeth STP Nov 8 (BIA).

Hardhead Aythya australis

ID No: 215 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Usual resident. Widely and moderately often recorded at medium to large waters as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Bulga Swamp (I9) Nov 16 (MOA) and 80 birds at Market Swamp Oct 28 (BIA). 20-25 birds were recorded at TWC Sep 1 (ROD) and Burning Mountain N.R. (H4) Oct 23 (NEG),

Australasian Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae

ID No: 061 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded at small to large waters as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Tarro Jun 6 (HBOC). There were several breeding records spanning Jan and Sep-Dec.

Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus

ID No: 062 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Bird of passage.

Three birds were present at a deep freshwater pond on KI Mar 10 (BAR) and two birds were there Sep 16 (HWS). Single birds were at TWC Jan 30 (CBOC) and WWW Mar 6 (JED).

Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus

ID No: 060 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident.

Three records were received from WWW – 20 birds were there Feb 5 (NBL), 15 birds Mar 6 (JED) and two birds May 6 (TAN). Single birds were recorded at a deep freshwater pond on KI Mar 10 (BAR) and at Bootawa Dam (Q4) Mar 18 (MVBW).

Little Penguin Eudyptula minor

ID No: 005 HBOC Category: 1 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident.

Two birds were recorded at Nelson Bay (O9) mid Feb (LAK), and birds were heard calling in the Port Stephens area late Feb (VEE). Birds were nesting at Boondelbah Island Mar 23 (BAA). There were four records of injured birds treated by Native Animal Trust Fund, spanning Mar-May.

Southern Giant-Petrel Macronectes giganteus

ID No: 929 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain (*Revised from: Rare*).

Two birds were recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Aug 5 (HBOC), and a single immature bird was at Newcastle Baths Oct 2 (ROM).

Northern Giant-Petrel Macronectes halli

ID No: 937 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain *(New to list).*

A single bird was recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Aug 5 (HBOC).

Cape Petrel Daption capense

ID No: 080 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Winter migrant at >5km from shore (*Revised from: Accidental*).

26 birds were recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Aug 5, and single birds on two additional surveys of this area on Oct 8 and Nov 4 (HBOC records).

Tahiti PetrelPseudobulweria rostrata

ID No: 920 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain (*Revised from: Accidental*).

No confirmed records since 1997.

Great-winged Petrel Pterodroma macroptera

ID No: 075 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Bird of passage at and beyond the continental shelf (*Revised from: Uncertain*).

Single birds were recorded on pelagic surveys SE of Swansea on Aug 5 and Oct 8, and three birds on the Nov 4 survey (HBOC records).

Providence Petrel *Pterodroma solandri*

ID No: 971 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Winter bird of passage at and beyond the continental shelf *(New to list)*

19 birds were recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Aug 5, four birds on the Oct 8 survey and a single bird on the Nov 4 survey (HBOC records).

Gould's Petrel Pterodroma leucoptera

ID No: 078 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant at >5km from shore except nocturnally at its breeding grounds (*text modified*). A single bird was recorded 10km offshore from Newcastle Nov (BAR). The breeding success on Cabbage Tree Island for the 99/00 season was 57% - a very good result. Also, a pair nested on nearby Boondelbah Island. Once again, 100 near-fledged chicks were transferred to Boondelbah Island in March in an attempt to further establish this as a second breeding site. In late 2000, Gould's Petrel became the first bird in Australia to be downlisted because of conservation action – it is now classified as vulnerable instead of endangered *(information sourced from NSW NPWS information bulletin).*

Antarctic Prion Pachyptila desolata

ID No: 084 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain (New to list).

A single bird was recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Aug 5 (HBOC).

Fairy Prion Pachyptila turtur

ID No: 083 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Winter migrant at >10 km from shore *(New to list)*.

A single bird, that later died, was found at The Ruins BBNP Jun 13 (TUD). Eight birds were recorded during a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Aug 5 (HBOC).

Black Petrel Procellaria parkinsonia

ID No: 917 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Spring visitor at >10km from shore (*New to list*).

A single bird was recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Nov 4 (HBOC).

Streaked Shearwater Calonectris leucomelas

ID No: 853 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain *(New to list).*

A single bird was recorded, from land, offshore from Nobbys Head (M10) Mar 26 (LOM). Also see Supplementary Records.

Wedge-tailed Shearwater Puffinus pacificus

ID No: 069 HBOC Category: 1 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common summer migrant (Revised from: Summer migrant). Often recorded in flocks of >100 birds during Jan-Mar and Oct-Dec.

3000+ birds were recorded off Stockton Beach/Newcastle Beach Jan 30 (FRP) and around 1000 birds there Feb 26 (STA). A mixed flock with *P. tenuirostris* of 2000+ birds were off Merewether Beach Oct 31 (ANC). Several hundreds of birds were also recorded off Swansea Mar 1 (BAR) and on pelagic surveys SE of Swansea Oct 8 and Nov 4 (HBOC). Some additional reports were received of lesser numbers present offshore during Feb/mid-Apr.

Buller's Shearwater Puffinus bulleri

ID No: 975 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain (*Revised from: Accidental*)

A single bird was recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Oct 8 (HBOC).

Flesh-footed Shearwater Puffinus carneipes

ID No: 072 HBOC Category: 1 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncommon summer migrant at >1km from shore (*Revised from: Rare*).

Several birds were recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Oct 8 (HBOC).

Sooty Shearwater *Puffinus griseus*

ID No: 070 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncertain (*Revised from: Rare*).

Single birds were recorded at Newcastle Harbour Jan 11 (LAK) and during a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Oct 8 (HBOC).

Short-tailed Shearwater Puffinus tenuirostris

ID No: 071 HBOC Category: 1 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common spring/summer migrant (*Revised from: Summer migrant*). Often recorded in flocks of >100 birds during Sep-Nov.

A mixed flock with *P. pacificus* of 2000+ birds was recorded off Merewether Beach Oct 31 (ANC), and 100+ birds during pelagic surveys SE of Swansea Oct 8 and Nov 4 (HBOC). Dead birds were found on all coastal beaches in the Region during October, with the numbers estimated to total tens of thousands. Similar mortality levels were noted throughout eastern Australia at this time.

Fluttering Shearwater Puffinus gavia

ID No: 068 HBOC Category: 1 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No (amended) Status: Bird of passage (text modified).

600+ birds were recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Nov 4 (HBOC), and several hundreds of birds off Newcastle Baths Jan 22 (FRP) and off Caves Beach Jun 3 (LAK). 1-5 birds were also recorded off Swansea Mar 1 (BAR), and on pelagic surveys SE of Swansea Aug 5 and Oct 8 (HBOC).

Hutton's Shearwater Puffinus huttoni

ID No: 975 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain *(New to list).*

Single birds were recorded during pelagic surveys SE of Swansea Aug 5 and Nov 4, and two birds on the Oct 8 survey (HBOC records).

Wandering Albatross Diomedea exulans

ID No: 086 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncommon winter migrant at >5 km from shore. (*New to list*).

Birds were recorded on all three pelagic surveys SE of Swansea – seven birds Aug 5, a single bird Oct 8 and two birds Nov 4 (HBOC records).

Black-browed Albatross Diomedea melanophris

ID No: 088 HBOC Category: 1 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Common winter migrant (*Revised from: Uncertain*). Regularly recorded during Apr-Nov, including from land.

Birds were recorded on all three pelagic surveys SE of Swansea – 24 birds Aug 5, 8+ birds Oct 8 and 15 birds Nov 4 (HBOC records). Two birds were also recorded off Caves Beach Jun 3 (LAK).

Shy Albatross Diomedea cauta

ID No: 091 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Winter migrant at >5 km from shore. (*Revised from: Rare winter bird of passage about inshore waters*).

A single bird was recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Aug 5 (HBOC).

Yellow-nosed Albatross Diomedea chlororhynchos

ID No: 089 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Common winter migrant at >5 km from shore (*Revised from: Rare winter bird of passage about inshore waters*).

30 birds were recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Aug 5, and a single bird on the corresponding Nov 4 survey (HBOC records).

Wilson's Storm-Petrel Oceanites oceanicus

ID No: 063 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain *(New to list)*

17+ birds were recorded on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea Oct 8, and nine birds on the corresponding Nov 4 survey (HBOC records). Also see Supplementary Records.

White-faced Storm-Petrel Pelagodroma marina

ID No: 065 HBOC Category: 2 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncertain (*Revised from: Rare summer migrant*)

8+ birds were recorded on pelagic surveys SE of Swansea on Aug 5 and Oct 8 (HBOC records).

White-tailed Tropicbird Phaethon lepturus

ID No: 108 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental.

Not recorded since 1994.

Australasian Gannet Morus serrator

ID No: 104 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Bird of passage about inshore waters.

1-5 birds, where numbers were noted, were recorded off Broughton Island Feb 17 (LAK), Swansea Mar 1 (BAR), Nobbys Beach Mar 29 (ROS), Harrington May 4 and Dec 1/3 (MVBW, OCG), Caves Beach (L11) Jun 3 (LAK) and Crowdy Head (S4) Sep 9 (TBW), and during pelagic surveys SE of Swansea Aug 5, Oct 8 and Nov 4 (HBOC).

Darter Anhinga melanogaster

ID No: 101 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Often recorded at medium to large waters, mostly as counts of 1-2 birds but with records of up to 6 birds not uncommon.

Notable records: Birds were nesting at NWR May 29 and Market Swamp Nov 8 (LIA).

Little Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax melanoleucos

ID No: 100 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded at small to large waters, with counts of up to 20 birds often recorded at large waters.

Notable records: 300 birds were recorded at Hawks Nest Jan 5 (STP) and 100+ birds at lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK). 51-100 birds were at Ash Island Apr 16 (GOD), Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 28 (NIJ), and 21-50 birds at Swansea Apr 16 (STA) and Wyee Point Sep 5 (HBOC). Birds were nesting at Market Swamp Nov 8 (LIA).

Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax varius

ID No: 099 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual coastal resident. Often recorded near to the coast, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds and occasionally in greater numbers.

Notable records: 100+ birds were reported to be in the area around Forster early Jun (MVBW), and 21-50 birds were recorded at KINR Jan 22 (HWS), Wyee Point Sep 5 (HBOC) and around Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). There were 19 nests at NWR May 20 (LIA).

Little Black Cormorant Phalacrocorax sulcirostris

ID No: 097 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded at medium to large waters, as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 600 birds were recorded at Hawks Nest Jan 5 (STP), and 100+ birds at lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). 20+ birds were present at Wyee Point Sep 5 (HBOC). Approx 50 birds were on nests at Market Swamp Apr 8 (HLC), and birds were again nesting there Nov 8 (LIA).

Great Cormorant Phalacrocorax carbo

ID No: 096 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and often recorded at medium to large waters, mostly as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: Hundreds of birds were reported to be in the area around Forster early Jun (MVBW), and 20+ birds were at Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). An estimated 21 birds were on nests at NWR May 20 (LIA), and birds were also nest building at TWC mid-May (ROD).

Australian Pelican Pelecanus conspicillatus

ID No: 106 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters, mainly as counts of up to 20 birds but with greater numbers not uncommon at large waters.

Notable records: Around 300 birds were recorded at SBS Mar 16 (OCG), and 100-200 birds at lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK), SBS Feb 13 (HLC), Big Snake Island BBNP Mar 5 (TUD) and KINR Mar 19 and Oct 14 (HWS). 51-100 birds were at SBS Jan 20 (FRP), Ash Island Jan 22 (HWS), KINR Feb 19 and Sep 16 (HWS), Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (OCG), and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). There were 25 nests at Big Snake Island Mar 5.

White-faced Heron Egretta novaehollandiae

ID No: 188 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds except at some favoured habitats.

Notable records: High numbers were often recorded at Ash Island, with 51-100 birds there Jan 22, Apr 16 and Dec 17 (HVVS, GOD, MOA) and 21-50 birds on several other occasions. Elsewhere, 100+ birds were recorded in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (OCG), 50+ birds at lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK) and 21-50 birds at Hexham Swamp N.R. Jan 3 (LIA), KI Jul 15 (HVVS), Stockton Oct 1 (OCG) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 28 (NIJ). Birds had a nest with young at East Seaham (M8) Sep 24 (HBOC).

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

ID No: 185 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region, mostly as 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at TWC Jan 4 (KEM) and Ash Island Jan 22 (HWS), and 6-10 birds were present at John Browns Lagoon Mar 8 (HLC), Ash Island Nov/Dec (MOA, GOD) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds once again nested at TWC, with 4 nests there in the 99/00 season and 6 pairs beginning nesting Nov/Dec for the 00/01 season (MAM).

Eastern Reef Egret Egretta sacra

ID No: 191 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Rare.

Two birds were recorded at Broughton Island Feb 17 (LAK), and some birds (numbers not noted) were also present at Boondelbah Island Mar 23 (BAA).

White-necked Heron Ardea pacifica

ID No: 189 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Bird of passage.

1-2 birds were moderately often recorded in the central and W of the Region, while three birds were at Jerrys Plains Mar 29 (ALP). Records from the E of the Region were of single birds at TWC Jul 9 and Oct 7 (TAN, BAW), Redhead Aug 27 (GJC), Charlestown (M10) Oct (GOC), Ash Island Nov 5 (STA) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG).

Great Egret Ardea alba

ID No: 187 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Often recorded at medium to large waters in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as counts of 1-2 birds except when breeding.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK), and 21-50 birds at Ash Island Apr 16 and Dec 30 (GOD) and Hawks Nest Nov 19 (HBOC). 6-20 birds were at Ash Island Jan 22, Nov 23 and Dec 21 (MOA), Waitui Apr 15 (OCG), Singleton Apr 24 (ALP) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 10 (HBOC). Birds once again nested at TWC, with 40 nests there in the 99/00 season and 26 pairs beginning nesting Nov/Dec for the OO/O1 season (MAM).

Intermediate Egret Ardea intermedia

ID No: 186 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region, mostly as counts of 1-2 birds except when breeding.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Hands Lagoon (L9) Feb (TAH), Pambalong N.R. Feb 12 (MOA), Hawks Nest Nov 19 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds once again nested at TWC, with 40 nests there in the 99/00 season and 21 pairs beginning nesting Nov/Dec for the OO/O1 season (MAM).

Cattle Egret Ardea ibis

ID No: 977 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as counts of 10-50 birds except when breeding.

Notable records: 56 birds were recorded at WWW May 6 (TAN). Birds once again nested at both Seaham Swamp N.R. and TWC, with 383 nests at the former location in the 99/00 season and 430 pairs beginning nesting there again Nov/Dec, while the corresponding numbers at TWC were 400 nests for 99/00 and 276 pairs beginning nesting again Nov/Dec (MAM). At Seaham Swamp N.R. in 99/00 season, eggs and young were being taken by White-bellied Sea-Eagle *Haliaeetus leucogaster* (MAM).

Striated Heron Butorides striatus

ID No: 193 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded at estuaries and coastal lakes, mostly as single birds and sometimes as pairs.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (OCG).

Nankeen Night Heron Nycticorax caledonicus

ID No: 192 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident and bird of passage.

1-5 birds were occasionally recorded near wetlands in the E of the Region. 25 birds were recorded at Belmont Swamp Jan (LAK) and 60 birds flew over Pambalong N.R. Jan 26 (STP). Up to 20 birds, including some juveniles, were often recorded at TWC while eight birds were at Ash Island Nov 23 (MOA). A single bird was present at Wingen Jan 22 (NEG).

Little Bittern Ixobrychus minutus

ID No: 195 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Rare (probably overlooked).

Not recorded since 1995.

Black Bittern Ixobrychus flavicollis

ID No: 196 HBOC Category: 3 Status: Rare. Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Single birds were recorded at Rathmines (L11) Feb 13 (HLC), KI Mar 9 (BAR) and Paterson River (K6) Oct 10 (ROS). A pair was present at a second Paterson River location (6 km distant) Oct 16 (ROS).

Australasian Bittern Botaurus poiciloptilus

ID No: 197 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Local resident *(Revised from: Rare).*

Single birds were recorded at Tomago (M9) Jan 31 (ROM) and Newcastle University wetlands (M10) Dec 6 (TAH), and an injured bird was treated by Native Animal Trust Fund Aug 18.

Glossy Ibis *Plegadis falcinellus*

ID No: 178 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Bird of passage.

Birds were recorded at Pambalong N.R. over Mar, with the count peaking at nine birds late Mar (ROS, HLC) and eight birds again were there Aug 2 (ROS). 15 birds were at nearby Lenaghans Drive Minmi May 21 (ROM) and three birds were at TWC Mar 4 (CCFOC).

Australian White Ibis Threskiornis molucca

ID No: 179 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records (*Revised*) Status: Usual resident. Regularly recorded in the E of the Region, mostly as <20 birds but with counts of up to 50 birds not uncommon.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK), Pambalong N.R. Mar 11 (HLC), Wyee Point Sep 5 (HBOC) and Ash Island Dec 21 (MOA). Mid-year, a major ibis roosting site (involving both *T. molucca* and *T. spinicollis*) established at TWC.

Straw-necked Ibis Threskiornis spinicollis

ID No: 180HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: NoStatus: Usual resident.Often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as <20 birds but</td>with counts of up to 100 birds not uncommon.

Notable records: 100-150+ birds were recorded at Jerrys Plains Mar 26 and Apr 5 (ALP), Arrowfield May 16 (ALP), WWW Jun 25 (HBOC) and Ash Island Jul 15 (ROD). A major roost site at TWC with *T. molucca* formed in the middle of the year.

Royal Spoonbill Platalea regia

ID No: 181 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the E of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: High numbers were recorded at Pambalong N.R. over Mar, with the count peaking at 104 birds Mar 6 (ROS). 60 birds were also present at Seaham Swamp N.R. Mar 5 (NEM), and 21-50 birds at Pambalong N.R. Jan 9 (FRP), Hands Lagoon (L9) Feb (TAH), lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds were on nest at Hawks Nest Nov 19 (HBOC) and feeding an immature at Seaham Swamp N.R. Apr 10 (TAN).

Yellow-billed Spoonbill Platalea flavipes

ID No: 182 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Bird of passage.

1-3 birds were moderately often recorded throughout the Region all year. 4-6 birds were often present at Jerrys Plains over Feb/Apr (ALP), while five birds were at Bulga Swamp (I9) Nov 16 (MOA) and four birds at Singleton Apr 27 (ALP) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 30 (ROD). An unusually high count of 27 birds was recorded at Cundletown (R4) Jan 20 (MVBW).

Black-necked Stork Ephippiorhynchus asiaticus

ID No: 183 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Bird of passage.

Two adults and a juvenile bird were recorded at Ash Island Jan 22 (HWS) and 1-2 birds often there over Jan-Mar and Oct-Nov (many reports). Two adults and a juvenile bird were also recorded at Harrington Jan 11 (CBOC), and 1-2 birds at Bulahdelah (P7) Jun 15 (TUD), Ash Island Jun 17 (BAA), TWC Nov (WCR), Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG), Hexham Swamp N.R. Dec 7/12 (MAM), Black Hill (L10) Dec 14 (WCR) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 16/17 (MOA).

Osprey Pandion haliaetus

ID No: 241 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded at estuaries and coastal lakes, more frequently in the NE part of the Region, and mostly as counts of 1-2 birds unless with young/juveniles.

Notable records: Four pairs were present around Harrington Dec 10/11 (VEE). A pair had a nest with young at Cundletown (R4) Oct 5 (MVBW).

Pacific Baza Aviceda subcristata

ID No: 234 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncommon resident. Occasionally recorded as 1-2 birds in the E and central parts of the Region.

Notable records: Two adults and a juvenile bird were recorded at Wyee Point Feb 1 (MDV), and three birds were also at Carey Bay (L11) Jun 24 (GOP).

Black-shouldered Kite Elanus axillaris

ID No: 232 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of 1-2 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Square-tailed Kite Lophoictinia isura

ID No: 230 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident in the NE of the Region, rare elsewhere.

1-2 birds were moderately often recorded at Cundletown (R4) and the pair had a nest with a single young there Oct 21 (MVBW). A single bird was also recorded at Ellalong Jun 18 (MEJ).

Black Kite Milvus migrans

ID No: 229 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncommon visitor to W of the Region, elsewhere rare (*Revised from: Rare*).

Single birds were recorded at Carey Bay (L11) Jan 1 (BAA), Wingen Mar 13 (NEG), Ellalong Jun 22 (HSE), Booral (N7) Jul 11 (MOJ), Muswellbrook (H6) Jul 24 (NEG) and Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG). Two birds were at Aberdeen (H5) May 31 (NEG).

Whistling Kite Haliastur sphenurus

ID No: 228 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded, mostly as counts of 1-2 birds. *Notable records:* 6+ birds were recorded at Bombah Point MLNP (P8) Apr 28 (TAN) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds were nesting at Old Bar (R4) Jun 17 (MVBW), Ash Island Jul 15 (ROD), Tea Gardens (O8) Aug 4 (TUD) and Harrington Sep 7/10 (MVBW), and also had dependent young at Ash Island Nov 30 (MOA). A bird was eating a Rock Dove *Columba livia* at TWC Apr 16 (TAN).

Brahminy Kite Haliastur indus

ID No: 227 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Resident (in coastal north of Region), elsewhere accidental.

Single birds, where numbers were noted, were recorded at Cundletown (R4) Feb 19 (MVBW), Taylors Beach (O9) Mar 12 (JED), Tea Gardens (O8) Apr 19 (TUD), Salt Ash Jun 28 (ANC), Hawks Nest Jun 29 (ROM), Taree (Q4) Jun 30 (CDB), Harrington Oct 18 and Dec 1/3 (MVBW, OCG) and Hallidays Point (R5) Nov 20 (MVBW).

White-bellied Sea-Eagle Haliaeetus leucogaster

ID No: 226 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded at or near large waters, mostly as single birds or pairs and occasionally also with a juvenile.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG), five birds at Wangi Wangi (L11) Apr 6 (ROS) and four birds at Bombah Point MLNP (P8) Apr 29 (TAN). Birds were nesting at Dudley (M10) Apr 30 (BAA) and Quorrobolong Jul 29 (CCFOC) and nest building at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG), and also were feeding an immature bird at Dawsons River (R4) mid Oct (MVBW). Birds were taking eggs and young of Cattle Egret *Ardea ibis* at Seaham Swamp N.R. during 99/00 breeding season (MAM).

Spotted Harrier Circus assimilis

ID No: 218 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncommon resident.

Single birds were occasionally recorded throughout the Region during Jan-May and Oct-Nov. Two birds were recorded Bayswater Colliery May 12 and single birds there Aug 3 & 16 (NEG).

Swamp Harrier Circus approximans

ID No: 219 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded at or near medium to large waters in the E of the Region, mostly as single birds and occasionally as pairs.

Notable records: Three birds were recorded at Hexham Swamp N.R. Jan 3 (LIA), TWC Jan 4 and Jul 9 (KEM, TAN) and Ash Island Dec 21 (MOA).

Brown Goshawk Accipiter fasciatus

ID No: 221 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded, mostly as single birds.

Notable records: Pairs were recorded at Wingen Apr 18 (NEG) and Bulga Sep 10 (VEE). A pair nested at TWC commencing late Nov and raised two young there during Dec (several reports).

Grey Goshawk Accipiter novaehollandiae

ID No: 220 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the E of the Region, mostly as single, grey phase birds. *Notable records:* There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Collared Sparrowhawk Accipiter cirrhocephalus

ID No: 222 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded in the E and central parts of the Region, usually as single birds. *Notable records:* An adult and a juvenile bird were recorded at Bulga May 21 (VEE)

and two birds were also at Bolwarra Jul 28 (TAH).

Wedge-tailed Eagle Aquila audax

ID No: 224 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region, mostly as 1-2 birds.

Notable records: Five birds were recorded at Wingen Aug 4 (NEG) and three birds at Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (HBOC), Dunns Creek (L8) Aug 20 (HBOC) and Bulga Sep 10 (VEE). An unusual coastal record was of a single bird at KI mid Mar (KIG). Birds were nesting at Maudville (N5) Apr 20 (MOA).

Little Eagle Hieraaetus morphnoides

ID No: 225 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes (*Revised*) Status: Resident.

Single birds were recorded at Tomalpin S.F. (K9) Jan 29 (HBOC), Wyee Point Feb 2 (MDV), Awabakal N.R. Apr 20 (GJC), Market Swamp Jun 6 (LAK), Bulga Sep 10 (VEE) and Singleton Oct 2 (ALP). Pairs were present at Bayswater Colliery Feb 3 (NEG), Jerrys Plains Mar 29 (ALP), WWW May 28 (TAH) and Wyee Point Jul/Aug (MDV). A pair nested at Bayswater Colliery during Oct/Nov and had a single dependent young there Dec 2 (NEG) – *this is the first confirmed breeding record for the Region for at least 15 years.*

Brown Falcon Falco berigora

ID No: 239 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region, as counts of 1-2 birds, and less frequently in the E of the Region.

Notable records: A bird took a King Quail *Coturnix chinensis* at Arrowfield May 18 (SAD).

Australian Hobby Falco longipennis

ID No: 235 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded, usually as single birds.

Notable records: Three birds were recorded at Bayswater Colliery Mar 16 (NEG), and pairs at Ash Island Feb 28 (RAP) and Testers Hollow (K9) Sep 11 (HBOC). The birds at Ash Island were displaying, and a pair had a nest with young at Dungog Jan 12 (JED).

Black Falcon Falco subniger

ID No: 238 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Rare.

Two birds were recorded at Bayswater Colliery Sep 28 and single birds there Mar 13 & 15. Single birds were also at Muswellbrook May 12 and near Scone Jul 6 (all are NEG records).

Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus

ID No: 237 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Occasionally but widely recorded, mostly as single birds and occasionally as pairs.

Notable records: Birds had a nest with eggs at Bennetts Head (R6) Aug 11; on Oct 20 there were three chicks flying and all had left the nest by Oct 30 (MVBW).

Nankeen Kestrel Falco cenchroides

ID No: 240 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Widely and frequently recorded, usually as single birds or pairs.

Notable records: Five birds were recorded at Kars Springs (F4) Sep 18 (NEG), four birds at Ash Island Apr 17 (TAN) and three birds at Ridgelands Road (F5) Sep 18 (NEG). A pair had dependent young at Yarrandi (G5) Jan 26 (NEG), and another pair had three fledged young at Arrowfield Aug 15 (ALP).

Buff-banded Rail Gallirallus philippensis

ID No: 046 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncommon resident.

There was a substantial increase in the reporting rate. Single birds were moderately often recorded in the E of the Region over Jan-Apr and Aug-Dec, while two birds were at Warabrook (M10) Nov 19 (STA) and Ellalong Dec 19 (MEJ), and three birds at TWC Mar 6 (ROM). A pair was with three chicks at Swansea Dec 21 (ADJ), and another pair was nesting at Boondelbah Island Mar 23 (BAA).

Lewin's Rail Rallus pectoralis

ID No: 045 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Local resident *(probably overlooked).* No reports received for 2000.

Baillon's Crake Porzana pusilla

ID No: 050 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Local resident *(probably overlooked).*

Two birds were recorded at Tarro Sep 17 (GIK) and a single bird at Ash Island Oct 19 (MOA).

Australian Spotted Crake Porzana fluminea

ID No: 049 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Local resident *(probably overlooked)*.

Single birds were recorded at Ash Island Feb 5 (NBL), and TWC Mar 6 (ROM).

Spotless Crake Porzana tabuensis

ID No: 051HBOC Category: 2Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Local resident (probably overlooked).

Single birds were recorded at Belmont Swamp Feb 20 (LAK), Ash Island Mar 4 (ROM), KI Oct 23 (LAT) and Morpeth STP Nov 8 (BIA), and a pair was at Old Bar (R4) Sep 12 (MVBW). The bird at Belmont Swamp was a juvenile.

Purple Swamphen Porphyrio porphyrio

ID No: 058 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded at medium to large waters, in counts of up to 20 birds at medium waters and up to 50 birds at large waters.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at Tarro Jun 6 and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2, and 21-50 birds at Congewai (J10) May 21 and Pambalong N.R. Dec 10 (all HBOC records).

Dusky Moorhen Gallinula tenebrosa

ID No: 056 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded, in counts of up to 20 birds at small to medium waters and up to 50 birds at medium to large waters.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), and around 50 birds were there Apr 16 (TAN). Birds had young at Stockrington Rd (L10) Feb 12 (MOA), Pambalong N.R. Mar 11 (HLC), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and TWC Nov 23 (ROD).

Black-tailed Native-hen Gallinula ventralis

ID No: 055 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Not recorded Status: Accidental *(New to list).*

A single bird was first recorded at Pambalong N.R. Dec 28 (RAP), and thereafter by many observers for the remainder of the month.

Eurasian Coot Fulica atra

ID No: 059HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Widely and often recorded at medium to large waters as counts of up to 50 birds.Notable records:200+ birds were recorded at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), and 64 birdswere there Jul 9 (TAN).Birds were nesting at TWC Oct 7 (ROD).

Red-backed Button-quail Turnix maculosa

ID No: 013 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental *(recorded in 1999).* No reports received for 2000.

Little Button-quail Turnix velox

ID No: 018 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental *(recorded in 1996).*

No reports received for 2000.

Painted Button-quail Turnix varia

ID No: 014 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncommon resident.

Four birds were recorded at Cox's Gap (D7) Apr 16 (GED), three birds at Bulga Sep 10 (VEE) and two birds near Jerrys Plains Jun 29 (TAH). Single birds were also at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC) and Aberdare S.F. Jun 24 (MOA). At least one bird was at Martins Creek (L8) Aug 5 (BAA). A pair had a nest with eggs at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG).

Latham's Snipe Gallinago hardwickii

ID No: 168 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Usual summer migrant. Often recorded as counts of up to 10 birds at medium to large wetlands in the E of the Region, from to Jan to mid-Mar and from late Aug onwards.

Notable records: 66 birds were recorded at Pambalong N.R. Dec 10 (HBOC) – although still a substantial number, this is the lowest count in 4 years of surveying by HBOC at Pambalong. Eleven birds were recorded at Seaham Swamp N.R. Nov 5 (DUP). The most westerly record was of two birds at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG).

Black-tailed Godwit Limosa limosa

ID No: 152 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Summer migrant.

In monthly surveys of the Hunter estuary, birds were recorded every month except May (see Table). Some birds were also present at Harrington Sep 6/11 – numbers were not noted (MVBW).

Bar-tailed Godwit Limosa lapponica

ID No: 153 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Common summer migrant. Moderately often recorded at coastal/estuarine mudflats over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec, in counts of up to 20 birds, and with many young birds remaining over winter.

Notable records: Birds were regularly recorded in the Hunter estuary during monthly surveys, and at Swan Bay in surveys conducted in the latter part of the year (see Table). 120 birds were also recorded at Swan Bay Jul 22 (LIA) and then counts of <20 birds in the following 2 months (TAN). Elsewhere, "summer" counts of around 100 birds were recorded at Harrington Sep 30 and Dec 1/3 (STA, OCG) and LTP Mar 26 (KEM). "Winter" records from other than the Hunter estuary/Swan Bay were of 35 birds at Swansea Apr 16 (STA) and four birds there Jul 16 (HLC), and <20 birds at Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (OCG).

Whimbrel Numenius phaeopus

ID No: 150 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Usual summer migrant. Occasionally recorded at coastal/estuarine mudflats during Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Birds were recorded in the Hunter estuary every month except August, with numbers varying considerably each month (see Table). Six birds were at Swan Bay Jul 22 (LIA) and birds were also there during some high tide surveys later in the year. At least six birds were also at Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG).

Eastern Curlew Numenius madagascariensis

ID No: 149 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Common summer migrant. Moderately often recorded at coastal/estuarine mudflats – as counts of up to 20 birds during Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec, and as counts of 1-5 birds during May-Aug.

Notable records: Birds were regularly recorded in the Hunter estuary during monthly surveys, and in surveys at Swan Bay over the latter half of the year (see Table). 80 birds were also present at Swan Bay Jul 22 (LIA) and nine birds Aug 12 (TAN). Elsewhere, 21-50 birds were recorded at Bushy Island (N9) Jan 13 (HLC), Karuah (M8) Jan 27 (STP), lower Myall River (P8) Feb 12 (LAK) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG).

Common Greenshank Tringa nebularia

Wood Sandpiper Tringa glareola

Terek Sandpiper Xenus cinereus

Birds were absent from the Hunter estuary after Mar, not being recorded again until Aug 3 when two birds were present (BIA). The peak count (see Table) from monthly surveys in the latter part of the year was 330 birds (HWS) but an estimated 400 birds were at Stockton Sandspit Dec 30 (GOD).

Broad-billed Sandpiper Limicola falcinellus

A single male bird was recorded at Pambalong N.R Dec 26 (LIA). The wetland had dried considerably, which aided viewing, and the bird was observed regularly by very many visitors for the remainder of the month (many reports - including of a female bird also being present on some occasions).

Comb-crested Jacana Irediparra gallinacea

1-5 birds were recorded at Mandalong Swamp (K11) Jan 5 and Nov 18 (ROS, VEE), John Browns Lagoon Mar 8 & 20 and May 25 (HLC, BAA, FRP), Hillville Dam (Q4) Mar 18 and Nov 27/28 (MVBW, OCG), Hannam Vale (R3) Apr 15 (MVBW), East Maitland Apr 19 (ROS), Louth Park Maitland May 20 (BAA), Lenaghans Drive Minmi (L10) Jun 5 (ROM), Tarro Recreational Reserve Jun 6 (HBOC), Johns River (S3) Oct 21 (MVBW) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG).

Bush Stone-curlew Burhinus grallarius

A single bird was recorded at Swan Bay Oct 14 (OCG).

Beach Stone-curlew Esacus neglectus

ID No: 175 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncertain

Two birds were recorded at Harrington Jun 16 & Jul 15 (MVBW), and a pair had a nest there Feb 20 (FOC).

Pied Oystercatcher Haematopus longirostris

1-5 birds were often recorded throughout the year. 6-10 birds were at KI Feb 22 (HBOC), Little Gibber (Hawks Nest) Apr 18 (MJK), Stockton Sandspit Sep 17 (LIA), Swan Bay Oct 14 (OCG) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). High numbers were present sometimes in the area of MLNP between Lemon Tree and Little Gibber – 14 birds Jan 1, 22 birds Jan 20 and 11 birds Apr 21 (TUD). Birds were nesting at Stockton Beach Nov 11 and were also reported to be breeding at Forster Aug 13 (BAA).

Sooty Oystercatcher *Haematopus fuliginosus*

Three birds were recorded at Dudley (M10) Jan 31 (GOC), and 1-2 birds, where numbers were noted, were at Little Gibber (Hawks Nest) Jan 29/30 (MJK), Broughton Island Feb 17 (LAK), Newcastle Baths Feb 26 (STA), Nobbys Beach Mar 19 (CBOC) and Harrington Sep 6/11 and Dec 1/3 (MVBW, OCG). Birds were nesting at Boondelbah Island Mar 23 (BAA).

Black-winged Stilt Himantopus himantopus

ID No: 146 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: Counts in the Hunter estuary during monthly surveys were high in the early part of the year but numbers thereafter declined (see Table). Only 16 birds were recorded during the Apr 8 survey but 200 birds were at Ash Island Apr 17 (TAN). Birds began returning to the estuary in December, with numbers increasing all month and 100 birds being recorded at Ash Island Dec 30 (GOD). Elsewhere, 21-50 birds were recorded at Lenaghans Drive swamp (L10) Feb 12 (MOA), SBS Feb 13 (HLC) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 16/17 (MOA).

Banded Stilt Cladorhynchus leucocephalus

A single adult bird was recorded at Swan Bay Sep 16 and Oct 15 (HWS) and the bird remained present until at least Oct 29 when last recorded (OCG). An adult bird was subsequently recorded at KINR during surveys on Nov 11 and Dec 9 (HWS).

Red-necked Avocet Recurvirostra novaehollandiae

Counts in the Hunter estuary were considerably lower than for 1999, with the peak count being of only 104 birds and with birds often absent (see Table). There were no records from elsewhere.

Pacific Golden Plover Pluvialis fulva

88 birds were recorded Jan 22 in a regular monthly survey of the Hunter estuary but the counts were low or zero in other months (see Table). Thus: around 200 birds were at Stockton Sandspit Jan 3 and 50 birds there Dec 30 (GOD), while at Ash Island 40-50 birds were present late Feb (BAR, LAT), 30+ birds Mar 10 (BAR), one bird Sep 29 (BAS), four birds Oct 19 (MOA) and 20-30 birds often from late Nov to mid Dec (MOA, RSU). Elsewhere: around ten birds were at Harrington Sep 30 (STA) and 30+ birds early Dec (OCG, VEE); six birds were at Green Point Forster Mar 5 (MVBW) and at Stockton Beach Aug 13 & 19 (BAA); and one bird was at Swan Bay Oct 15 (HWS).

Red-capped Plover Charadrius ruficapillus

Moderately often recorded along the coast, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds. *Notable records:* 30 birds were recorded at Stockton Beach Jun 30 and 15 birds there Aug 19 (HLC, BAA). In regular monthly surveys of the Hunter estuary, birds were recorded only in the latter half of the year (see Table) and there were no other records for the Hunter estuary in the first half of the year. Birds had nests with eggs at Swan Bay Oct 15 (HWS) and Ash Island Nov 23 (MOA), and had chicks at Harrington Jan 14 (CBOC), Fern Bay Oct 15 (MVBW) and Swan Bay Nov 11 (HWS).

Birds had a nest with eggs at Mulbring Sep 15 (BAA) and there were three nests at Heaton Rd Watagans Oct 15 (NEM).

Red-kneed Dotterel *Erythrogonys cinctus*

Notable records: Approx. 50 birds were present at Wangi Wangi (L11) Apr 6 (ROS) and 28 birds at Ellalong Jul 31 (MEJ). Up to ten birds showing white in tail were recorded at Booral (N7) Mar 22 (BIS) and Gloucester (N5) May (THG). Birds had dependent young at Laguna Feb 12/13 (RDB).

Gang-gang Cockatoo Callocephalon fimbriatum

ID No: 268 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

15 birds were recorded at Laguna Oct 13/15 (RDB) and 12 birds at Ellalong Oct 23 (MEJ). 1-5 birds were moderately often recorded in the central parts of the Region. A pair had dependent young at Laguna Mar 17/19 (RDB).

Galah Cacatua roseicapilla

ID No: 273 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, as counts of up to 10 birds in the E of the Region and up to 20 birds further inland.

Notable records: 100-150+ birds were recorded at Singleton Feb 22 and Arrowfield Apr 12 and May 10 (ALP). 40 birds were at Belmont Swamp Sep (LAK) and 20+ birds at Redhead Aug 4 (GJC). Birds were on nest at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE) and Dry Creek Parkville (H4) Oct 25 (NEG). A hybrid with Little Corella *Cacatua sanguinea* was at Seaham Swamp N.R. Sep 24 (HBOC).

Long-billed Corella Cacatua tenuirostris

Approx 100 birds were recorded at Yarrandi (G5) Jan 26 (NEG) and 34 birds at LTP Apr 10 (KEM). 17 birds were at Islington (M10) Aug 7 (ROM) and six birds at Aberglasslyn (L9) Nov 12 (G0D). Three birds were at Cessnock May 27 (ROM) and Bolwarra Aug 7 (ROS). Some birds were also at Woodville (L9) Apr 8 (NEM).

Little Corella Cacatua sanguinea

Approx. 150 birds were recorded at Toronto (L11) during Apr (HLJ) and 120+ birds at Jerrys Plains Jan 25 (ALP). 20+ birds were at Seaham Swamp N.R. Sep 24 (HBOC) and 6+ birds at Kars Springs (F4) Sep 18 (NEG). A group of eight birds are now resident in Forster (TUD). Two birds were recorded at Denman May 10 (GED) and a single bird at Redhead Jan 22 (GJC). Also note above the presence of a hybrid with Galah *Cacatua roseicapilla*.

Sulphur-crested Cockatoo Cacatua galerita

ID No: 269 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 200+ birds were recorded at Jerrys Plains Jan 11 and 50+ birds there Mar 6 (ALP). 250+ birds were at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 and 100+ birds there Sep 29/0ct 2 (HBOC, HSE). 150+ birds were also at Arrowfield (H7) Apr 12 (ALP). Birds were breeding at Ridgelands Road (F5) Sep 18 (BAA).

Cockatiel Nymphicus hollandicus

ID No: 274 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncertain.

No reports received for 2000.

Rainbow Lorikeet Trichoglossus haematodus

ID No: 254 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the E of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds. *Notable records:* 20+ birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and at Swan Bay Oct 14 (OCG).

Scaly-breasted Lorikeet Trichoglossus chlorolepidotus

ID No: 256 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded near to the coast, mostly as counts of up to 20 birds. *Notable records:* 50+ birds were recorded in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (DCG) and 20+ birds at Bombah Point MLNP (P8) Apr 29 (TAN).

Musk Lorikeet Glossopsitta concinna

ID No: 258 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Bird of passage.

6-20 birds were recorded at Singleton Apr 29 (ALP), Cams Wharf (L11) Jun 11 (MOA), Ellalong Jun 27 (TAH), Kars Springs (F4) Sep 18 (NEG) and Merriwa (E5) Nov 16 (MOA). 1-5 birds were at Owens Hill Gap (G5) Jan 26 (NEG), Ellalong Jun 10 & 16 (LIA, TAN) and Ridgelands Road (F5) Sep 18 (NEG). A mixed flock with Little Lorikeet *Glossopsitta pusilla* were at Aberdare S.F. Jul 9 (ROM).

Little Lorikeet Glossopsitta pusilla

ID No: 260 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded, mostly as counts of <10 birds but with greater numbers being not uncommon.

Notable records: 200+ birds were recorded at Bulga Apr 16 and 100+ birds there May 21 (VEE). 21-50 birds were at Swansea South Jun 11 (MOA), Aberdare S.F. Jun 25 (HBOC), Singleton Army Range (J8) Jul 26 (HSE) and Quorrobolong Aug 4 (MOA).

Australian King-Parrot Alisterus scapularis

ID No: 281HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Widely and frequently recorded in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as
counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6-20 birds were recorded at Warkworth (I8) Mar 14 (ALP), Wingen Apr 18 (NEG), Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC), Kars Springs (F4) and Ridgelands Road (F5) Sep 18 (NEG), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Dry Creek Parkville (H4) Oct 25 (NEG). 20+ birds were at Waitui Apr 15 (OCG).

Red-winged Parrot Aprosmictus erythropterus

ID No: 280 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental.

No reports received for 2000.

Crimson Rosella Platycercus elegans

ID No: 282HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Moderately often recorded in the central and E parts of the Region as counts of up
to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC).

Eastern Rosella Platycercus eximius

ID No: 288 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (HBOC), Waitui Apr 15 (OCG), Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (OCG), Wingen Apr 18 (NEG), Widden Valley (E7/E8) Apr 22 (TAH), Brimbin N.R. (R4) May 20 (OCG), Bulga Jul 23 (HBOC), Kars Springs (F4) Sep 18 (NEG), Bootawa (Q4) Nov 27/28 (OCG) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds were inspecting hollows at Burning Mountain N.R. (H4) Oct 23 (NEG).

Swift Parrot Lathamus discolor

ID No: 309 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Rare.

Large numbers of birds were recorded at Ellalong from an initial 40 birds May 31 (MEJ) through until Jul 29 (many records). The peak count at Ellalong was of 90 birds Jun 19 (KES). Birds were also recorded often at nearby locations of Aberdare S.F. during Jun/Jul (peak count of 15+ birds), Pelton (J10) late Jul (peak count of 20 birds), Quorrobolong Aug 4/19 (peak count of at least 30 birds). Other important locations were Martins Creek (L8) Jul 23 - Aug 27 (peak count of 20 birds - NEM) and Morpeth Jun 1 (30 birds - FON). Some birds (<5) were also present at Bulga Apr 16 (VEE), Swansea South Jun 11 (MOA), North Arm Cove (O8) Jul 15 and Sep 12/22 (HID) and Whitebridge (M10) Aug 27 (GOC).

Undoubtedly some of the above records were of the same birds but it is generally considered that at least 100 birds were present in Hunter region during Jun. The birds were mostly utilising Spotted Gum *Eucalyptus maculata*, which is new behavioural information (KES).

Red-rumped Parrot *Psephotus haematonotus*

Turquoise Parrot Neophema pulchella

Five birds were recorded at Howes Valley Apr 2 (CBOC) and single birds at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC) and White Box Camp Dec 29 (STA).

Oriental CuckooCuculus saturatusID No: 336HBOC Category: 3Regional Breeding Status: NoStatus: Accidental.Regional Breeding Status: No

No reports received for 2000.

Pallid Cuckoo Cuculus pallidus

ID No: 337 HBOC Category: 1 Status: Summer migrant Regional Breeding Status: Yes

One and occasionally two birds were moderately often recorded from mid-Sep onwards. The only records from the first part of the year were of a single bird at Tomalpin S.F. (K9) Jan 29 (HBOC), a bird heard at Balickera Apr 23 (HSE) and an injured bird at Fingal Bay Feb 5 that was treated by Native Animal Trust Fund.

Brush Cuckoo Cacomantis variolosus

Single birds, where numbers were recorded, were at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), Barrington House Feb 5 (ANC), Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Laguna Oct 13/15 (RDB), Wongalee (H8) Oct 22 (OCG), Milbrodale (I9) Oct 22 (HBOC), Wingen Oct 28 (NEG), Bootawa (Q4) Nov 27/28 (OCG) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 10 & 16/17 (HBOC, MOA). Three birds were at Laguna Nov 11/12 (RDB).

Fan-tailed Cuckoo Cacomantis flabelliformis

ID No: 338 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, mainly as <5 birds. *Notable records:* 6+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). A young bird was being fed by White-browed Scrubwren *Sericornis frontalis* at Green Wattle Creek (L8) Oct 15 (NEM).

Black-eared Cuckoo Chrysococcyx osculans

ID No: 341 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Accidental.

Two birds were recorded at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG).

Horsfield's Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx basalis

ID No: 342 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant, some birds are present all year.

Single birds were recorded at Tahlee/Carrington (O8) Jan 23 (HBOC), Belmont Swamp Jan (LAK), TWC Mar 5 (CCFOC), Bulga Sep 10 (VEE), Ash Island Sep 16 and Oct 14 (HWS), Cundletown (R4) Oct 5 (MVBW), White Box Camp Oct 27 (NEG), Wingen Oct 28 (NEG) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 10 (HBOC). Two birds were at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 28 (NIJ). The bird at Belmont Swamp was a juvenile, and one of the birds at Pambalong N.R. Dec 28 was carrying food.

Shining Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx lucidus

ID No: 344 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual summer migrant, some birds are present all year.

Widely and often recorded, mostly as single and occasionally two birds. 6+ birds were present at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). A bird was seen at a nest of Yellow Thornbill *Acanthiza nana* in the Apple Tree Flat record. Unusually, there were very few records for the period Apr – mid-Sep.

Little Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx minutillus

ID No: 345 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental *(recorded in 1992).*

No reports received for 2000.

Common Koel Eudynamys scolopacea

ID No: 347 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual summer migrant. Often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region over Jan-Mar and Oct-Dec as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: The first recorded arrival was at Toronto (L11) Aug 30 (NBL). There were three records of young birds being fed by Red Wattlebird *Anthochaera carunculata* – at Charlestown (M10) Jan (LPC), Forster Feb 8 (TUD), and Mallabula (09) Mar 19 (KEM). Another young bird at Mallabula was being fed by Little Wattlebird *Anthochaera chrysoptera* Mar 19 (KEM).

Channel-billed Cuckoo Scythrops novaehollandiae

ID No: 348 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common summer migrant. Often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: A young bird was being fed by Pied Currawong *Strepera graculina* at Rathmines (L11) Jan 1 (LIA), and a pair was copulating at Shortland (M10) Sep (BAW).

Pheasant Coucal Centropus phasianinus

ID No: 349HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Resident. Occasionally recorded in the E of the Region, usually as counts of 1-2 birds.Notable records:There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Powerful Owl Ninox strenua

ID No: 248 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident.

Single birds were recorded at Laguna Jan 8 (RDB), Glenrock SRA Jan 19 (WCR), Salamander Bay (O9) Jan 28 (ROM), Congewai (J1O) Apr 2O and May 21 (HLC, HBOC), NLH Apr 8/12 (LPC), Eleebana Apr 23 (BRE), Balickera Oct 2 (BAA) and Wallingat S.F. Dec 28 (ROM), and a pair at Kilaben Bay (L11) May (via MOA). 1-2 birds were often recorded at BbR over May-Nov and the pair nested there, unsuccessfully, for 3-4 weeks from around Jun 3 (many records).

Barking Owl Ninox connivens

ID No: 246 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Rare.

No reports received for 2000.

Southern Boobook Ninox novaeseelandiae

ID No: 242 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Occasionally but widely recorded as single birds or pairs.

Notable records: A pair was with 2 fledged young at Shortland (M10) Dec 12 (STA) and there was also a breeding record from Toronto (L11) Nov 17 (BAA).

Sooty Owl Tyto tenebricosa

ID No: 253 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Rare.

A single bird was recorded at Gloucester Tops late Apr (COL), and two birds at Boarding House Dam (Watagans N.P.) Sep 14 (LIA).

Masked Owl Tyto novaehollandiae

ID No: 250 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Rare.

Two birds were recorded at Wallingat S.F. Dec 28 (ROM) and a single bird at Medowie (N9) Dec 1 (CDB). Dead birds were found by the roadside at Fern Bay (M10) Nov (BAR) and at nearby Fullerton Cove Rd (M10) Dec 17 (CDB).

Barn Owl Tyto alba

ID No: 249 HBOC Category: 1 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Resident (*probably under-recorded*). (*Revised from: Uncommon resident*)

Single birds were occasionally but widely recorded throughout the Region. Two birds were recorded at Hannam Vale (R3) Feb 25 (MVBW), Arrowfield July 4 &14 (BAA, ALP) and Muswellbrook (H6) Aug 25 (NEG). There were 36 records of injured birds being treated by Native Animal Trust Fund.

Grass Owl Tyto capensis

ID No: 729 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncertain.

Not recorded since 1998.

Tawny Frogmouth Podargus strigoides

ID No: 313 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded, usually as single birds or pairs. *Notable records:* There were 12 separate breeding records, spanning late Sep to early Dec.

White-throated Nightjar Eurostopodus mystacalis

ID No: 330 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

Three birds were recorded at Balickera Oct 2 (BAA) and single birds at Craven S.F. (N5) Jan 19 (LIA) and Fosterton Loop Rd (M7) Apr 1 (TAH). Birds also were heard at Laguna Jan 22 and Feb 12/13 (RDB).

Spotted Nightjar *Eurostopodus argus*

ID No: 331 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No (Amended) Status: Accidental (recorded in 1989).

No reports received for 2000.

Australian Owlet-nightjar Aegotheles cristatus

ID No: 317 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

Birds were heard or sometimes seen at Copeland Common and Copeland S.F. Mar 19/20 (HBOC), Laguna Feb 12/13, Mar 4 and May 26/28 (RDB), Waitui Feb 29 and Oct 1 (MVBW, BAA), GRNP Big River Mar 27 (BAA), Apple Tree Flat Sep 29 (BAA) and Harrington Dec 10/11 (VEE). A pair had two dependent young at Oyster Cove Oct 10 (BLM).

White-throated Needletail Hirundapus caudacutus

ID No: 334 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Summer migrant. Moderately often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region over Jan-Mar and Oct-Dec as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 200+ birds were recorded at Cundletown (R4) Jan 10 (MVBW) and 50-60+ birds at Bayswater Colliery Mar 7/10 (NEG), Warkworth (I8) Mar 9 (ALP), Jerrys Plains Mar 14 (ALP) and Harrington Dec 10/11 (VEE). 21-50 birds were at New Lambton (M10) Feb 16 (JOF), Warkworth Feb 21, Mar 7 & 16 (ALP), Arrowfield Mar 7 (ALP) and Fullerton Cove (M10) Oct 31 (LIA).

Fork-tailed Swift Apus pacificus

ID No: 335 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

No reports received for 2000.

Azure Kingfisher Alcedo azurea

ID No: 319 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the E of the Region, mainly as single birds and occasionally as pairs.

Notable records: Birds were recorded to be breeding at both Brandy Hill (M9) and Balickera Nov 18 (BAA).

Laughing Kookaburra Dacelo novaeguineae

ID No: 322 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, mainly as <10 birds and usually as 1-5 birds. *Notable records:* 20+ birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds were nesting at Bangalay Reserve (L11) Jan 1 (WMR), Seaham Swamp N.R. Sep 24 (HBOC) and Belmont Nov 6 (DUP).

Forest Kingfisher Todiramphus macleayii

ID No: 324 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental (*recorded in 1998*).

No reports received for 2000.

Sacred Kingfisher Todiramphus sanctus

ID No: 326 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual summer migrant, some birds may be locally resident. Widely and regularly recorded over Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6-10 birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC), Minmi (L10) Oct 3 (HBOC), Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG) and Jesmond (M10) Dec 5 (HBOC). Birds had nests with young on Jan 26 at both Yarrandi (G5) (NEG) and Bombah Point MLNP (P8) (TUD), and further breeding records were from Balickera Oct 2 (BAA), Vacy (L8) Oct 5 (BAA), Smiths Lake (Q7/R7) Nov 24/25 (JAM) and Swan Bay Dec 9 (HVVS).

Rainbow Bee-eater Merops ornatus

ID No: 329 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Summer migrant. Occasionally but widely recorded over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec, mostly as counts of <10 birds.

Notable records: 50 birds were recorded at Wingen Mar 12 (NEG) and 40+ birds at Crowdy Bay N.P. (S3) Jan 20 (MVBW). Also, 15 birds were at Wyee Point Feb 10 (MDV).

Dollarbird *Eurystomus orientalis*

ID No: 318 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant. Widely and frequently recorded over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG), ten birds at New Lambton (M10) Dec 14 (STA) and Redhead Dec 21 & 24 (GJC), seven birds at Jesmond (M10) Dec 5 (HBOC) and six birds at Aberglasslyn (L9) Nov 12 (GOD). Birds were feeding fledged young at Forster Jan 14/15 (TUD) and were carrying food at Owens Hill Gap (G5) Jan 26 (NEG).

Noisy Pitta Pitta versicolor

ID No: 352 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncommon summer migrant (*Revised from: Rare*).

Single birds, where numbers were noted, were recorded at Avon River S.F. (M5) Jan 19 (LIA), Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (HBOC), Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Waitui Apr 15 (OCG), Harrington Sep 6/11 (MVBW), Woko N.P. (M3) Nov 2 (NEM) and Problem Creek (M6) Nov 27 (JED). Several birds were at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). The birds at Problem Creek and Copeland Common were juveniles.

Superb Lyrebird Menura novaehollandiae

ID No: 350 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the central part of the Region as counts of 1-2 birds. *Notable records:* Five birds were recorded at Laguna Jan 8, May 6/7 and May 26/28 (RDB). Three birds were at Sharpes Creek (M5) Mar 1 (BAR).

Rufous Scrub-bird Atrichornis rufescens

ID No: 355 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Local resident.

In late Jan, six birds were detected by sight or by call during a survey by Birds Australia at sites around Gloucester Tops and The Mountaineer (cells L5/M5) (EKP). Two were calling at Gloucester Tops Road Sep 4 (EKP), and single birds were also recorded in this general area Mar 5 and Sep 24/25 (BAR, FIM).

White-throated Treecreeper Cormobates leucophaeus

ID No: 558 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of <10 birds and predominantly as 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Birds were breeding at Balickera Oct 2 (BAA), and also were carrying food at Ridgelands Road (F5) Sep 18 (NEG).

Red-browed Treecreeper Climacteris erythrops

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG). Birds were nesting at GRNP Oct 27 and had dependent young at Battery Rocks (E6) Oct 11 (both BAA), and also were carrying food at Owens Hill Gap (G5) Jan 26 and Ridgelands Road (F5) Sep 18 (both NEG).

Superb Fairy-wren Malurus cyaneus

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and often as counts of 21-50 birds.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). There were several breeding records, spanning Jan and Sep-Dec.

Variegated Fairy-wren Malurus lamberti

Status: Usual resident. Regularly recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of up to 1-5 birds and frequently as up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Tahlee/Carrington (08) Jan 23 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds had dependent young at SBS Feb 13 (HLC) and were nesting at Wyee Point Nov 1, Balickera Nov 6 (both BAA) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG).

Red-backed Fairy-wren *Malurus melanocephalus*

ID No: 541 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Uncommon resident, in north of Region.

A male and a female bird were recorded at two separate locations around Harrington Dec 11/12 (VEE).

Southern Emu-wren Stipiturus malachurus

ID No: 526 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident, locally common.

6+ birds were recorded at Balickera Apr 23 (HSE) and Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (OCG). 1-5 birds were at Belmont Swamp Jan and Oct (LAK), Wyee Point Feb 13 (MDV), TWC Jun 25 and Nov (WCR, LIA), Macquarie Coal Prep Plant (L11) Jun 21 (BAA), Freemans Waterhole (K10) Aug 27 (HLC), Warakeila (L6) Oct 7 (NEM) and Woko N.P. (M3) Nov 2 (NEM). Birds were breeding at Balickera Nov 6 (BAA).

Spotted Pardalote *Pardalotus punctatus*

ID No: 565 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds but with counts of up to 20 birds being not uncommon.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Owens Hill Gap (G5) Jan 26 and Wingen Apr 18 and Sep 3 (all NEG records). There were several breeding records, spanning Jul-Sep.

Striated Pardalote Pardalotus striatus

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE), and 6-20 birds at Owens Hill Gap (G5) Jan 26, Wingen Sep 3 and Dry Creek Parkville (H4) Oct 25 (all NEG records) and Bootawa (Q4) Nov 27/28 (OCG). Birds were nest building at Martins Creek (L8) Aug 20 and were nesting at Milbrodale (I9) Oct 22 (both HBOC).

Pilotbird Pycnoptilus floccosus

ID No: 506 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncertain.

A bird was heard calling in the Mellong Ranges near Three Ways Wollemi N.P. (F10) Dec 2 (LIA) – this represents a range extension for this species.

Rockwarbler Origma solitaria

Eight birds were recorded at Laguna May 26/28 (RDB), and lesser numbers (mostly 1-2 birds) there many times during the year (RDB). 1-5 birds, where numbers were noted, were at Big River GRNP (C6) Mar 27 (BAA), Howes Valley Apr 2 (CBOC), Milbrodale (I9) Apr 20 and Oct 22 (MOA, HBOC), Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC), Stockyard Creek (I10) Aug 26 (BAA) and Condon Creek Putty (F10) Dec 2 (BAA).

Yellow-throated Scrubwren Sericornis citreogularis

ID No: 493 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

6+ birds were recorded at Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC) and 1-5 birds, where numbers were noted, were at Tabbil Forest (M7) Feb 26 (HBOC), Hillville Dam (Q4) Mar 18 (MVBW), Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (HBOC), Waitui Apr 15 and Sep 30/Oct 2 (OCG, HBOC), Gloucester Tops late Apr (COL) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds were nesting at Copeland Common.

White-browed Scrubwren Sericornis frontalis

ID No: 488 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, mainly as counts of 1-5 birds but with counts of up to 20 birds being not uncommon.

Notable records: There were several breeding records spanning Jan and Aug-Oct, and birds were feeding a young Fan-tailed Cuckoo *Cacomantis flabelliformis* at Green Wattle Creek (L8) Oct 15 (BAA).

Large-billed Scrubwren Sericornis magnirostris

6+ birds were recorded at Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Wollemi N.P. (I8) Apr 20 (MOA) and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). 1-5 birds, where numbers were noted, were at Tabbil Forest (M7) Feb 26 (HBOC), Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (HBOC), Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (OCG), Gloucester Tops late Apr (COL), Congewai (J10) May 21 (HBOC) and Harrington Sep 7/10 (MVBW).

Chestnut-rumped Heathwren Hylacola pyrrhopygia

ID No: 498 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncommon resident, possibly overlooked.

Some birds, numbers not noted, were at White Box Camp Mar 27 (MOA) and Killingworth (L10) Sep 7 (LIA).

Speckled Warbler Chthonicola sagittata

Often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds. *Notable records:* 100+ birds were recorded at Bulga Apr 16 (VEE). Birds had nests at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG), Wingen Oct 28 (NEG) and Giants Creek Road (F6) Oct 29 (BAA), and also were carrying food at Ridgelands Road (F5) Sep 18 (NEG).

Weebill Smicrornis brevirostris

Often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds. *Notable records:* 20+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 and Bulga Jul 23 (both HBOC). Birds had a nest with eggs at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG).

Brown Gerygone Gerygone mouki

ID No: 454HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of up 20 birds,
and with counts of 21-50 birds being not uncommon.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). Birds were nest building at East Seaham (M8) Sep 24 (HBOC) and nesting at Boondelbah Island Mar 23 and Balickera Oct 2 & Nov 6 (all BAA records), and were feeding fledged young at Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC).

Mangrove Gerygone Gerygone levigaster

ID No: 460 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Often recorded at mangrove areas as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Stockton Mar 5 (CBOC) and Ash Island Apr 16 (GOD).

Western Gerygone Gerygone fusca

ID No: 463 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Rare.

1-2 birds were recorded at Wingen Mar 9 (NEG), Bulga Jul 23 and Sep 10 (HBOC, VEE), Jerrys Plains Sep 10 (VEE), Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG) and Redmanvale (H8) Oct 29 (MOA).

White-throated Gerygone Gerygone olivacea

ID No: 453 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant. Widely and frequently recorded over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Winter records were of single birds at Medowie (N9) Jun 8 (CDB), Bobs Farm (O9) Jul 11 (CDB) and Bulga Jul 23 (HBOC). 6+ birds were at Vacy Apr 1 (TAH). Birds were nest building at Broke Oct 7 (BAA) and were nesting at East Seaham (M8) Sep 24 (HBOC), Yango Creek Road (I11) Sep 30 (BAA) and Smiths Lake (Q7/R7) Nov 24/25 (JAM).

Brown Thornbill Acanthiza pusilla

ID No: 475HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Common resident.Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (OCG), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds were nesting at Balickera Oct 2 & Nov 6 (BAA) and Dry Creek Parkville (H4) Oct 25 (NEG).

Buff-rumped Thornbill Acanthiza reguloides

ID No: 484 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Often recorded in the central and W parts of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds. *Notable records:* Birds had dependent young at Wingen Sep 3 and again were on nest there Oct 28 (NEG).

Yellow-rumped Thornbill Acanthiza chrysorrhoa

ID No: 486 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and often recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 and Bulga Jul 23 (both HBOC). Birds were nest building at Martins Creek (L8) Aug 20 (HBOC) and were nesting at Liddell (I7) Oct 26 (BAA).

Yellow Thornbill Acanthiza nana

ID No: 471 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), Brimbin N.R. (R4) May 20 (OCG), Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 and Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC, HSE), Bulga Jul 23 (HBOC) and Bootawa (Q4) Nov 27/28 (OCG). There were several breeding records spanning Jan and Sep-Nov, including a nest being raided by Shining Bronze-Cuckoo *Chrysococcyx lucidus* at Apple Tree Flat (HSE).

Striated Thornbill Acanthiza lineata

ID No: 470 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded as counts of up to 20 birds. *Notable records:* Birds had a nest with young at Warakeila (L6) Oct 7 (NEM).

Southern Whiteface Aphelocephala leucopsis

No reports received for 2000.

Red Wattlebird Anthochaera carunculata

Widely and often recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and mostly as 1-5 birds. *Notable records:* 50+ birds were recorded at Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens area (P8?) Apr 16 (OCG), and 22 birds at LTP Apr 10 (KEM). Birds were feeding a young Common Koel *Eudynamys scolopacea* at Forster Feb 8 (TUD) and Mallabula (O9) Mar 19 (KEM). There were also several breeding records spanning Sep-Dec.

Little Wattlebird Anthochaera chrysoptera

Regularly recorded near to the coast as counts of up to 20 birds. *Notable records:* 50+ birds were recorded at Harrington Dec 1/3 and Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (both OCG), and 20+ birds at Belmont Swamp May (LAK) and Harrington Sep 30 (STA). Birds were feeding a young Common Koel *Eudynamys scolopacea* at a nest at Mallabula (09) Mar 19 (KEM).

Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater Acanthagenys rufogularis

ID No: 640 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Accidental *(new to list).*

A single bird was recorded at Waratah Feb 8 (PRD).

Striped Honeyeater Plectorhyncha lanceolata

ID No: 585 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Ten birds were recorded at Bulga Apr 16 and 6+ birds there Jul 23 (VEE, HBOC). Birds were on nest at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG).

Noisy Friarbird *Philemon corniculatus*

ID No: 645 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and moderately often as counts of up to 50 birds.

Notable records: Birds were on nest at Jesmond (M10) Dec 5 (HBOC) and also were nest building at Laguna Sep 8/10 (RDB).

Little Friarbird *Philemon citreogularis*

ID No: 646 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Bird of passage.

Eight birds were recorded at Martindale (G7) Apr 22 and a single bird there Jun 29 (TAH). 6+ birds were at Wyee Point Sep 5 (HBOC) and a single bird near Bunnan (F5) Sep 18 (NEG).

Regent Honeyeater Xanthomyza phrygia

ID No: 603 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Bird of passage.

35 birds were recorded at Aberdare S.F. Jun 18 (KES) and lesser numbers there through until Jul 9 (several reports). 40+ birds were then recorded at Quorrobolong Jul 29 (MDV) and through most of Aug, with the count peaking at 63 birds Aug 5 (several reports). 13 birds were also present at Ellalong Sep 13 (LAT) and four birds at South Swansea May 20/21 (MOA). Two pairs had nests at Quorrobolong Aug 19 (MOA).

Blue-faced Honeyeater Entomyzon cyanotis

ID No: 641 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Occasionally but widely recorded as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6-8 birds were recorded at Tahlee/Carrington (O8) Jan 23 (HBOC), Bolwarra Feb and Oct 3 (TAH) and Bombah Point MLNP (P8) Apr 28 (TAN). Birds had a nest with young at Bombah Point Jan 26 and were again nesting there Apr 1 (TUD), and also had dependent young at Merriwa (E5) Nov 16 (MOA).

Bell Miner Manorina melanophrys

Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of 10-30 birds.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Flaggy Creek Whitebridge (M10) Apr 30 (GJC) and 51-100 birds at Telegherry Forest Park (M6) Jun 10 (TAN) and Glenrock SRA Nov 7 (HB0C). 21-50 birds were at Pambalong N.R. Feb 12 (M0A), Bangalay Reserve (L11) Mar 7 (HB0C), Wollemi N.P. (I8) Apr 20 (M0A), Congewai (J10) May 21 (HB0C), Glenrock SRA Jun 7 (TAN) and Swansea South Jun 11 (M0A).

Noisy Miner Manorina melanocephela

ID No: 634 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and moderately often as counts of 21-50 birds.

Notable records: There were several breeding records, spanning Jan and Sep-Oct.

Lewin's Honeyeater Meliphaga lewinii

ID No: 605 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Regularly recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of 1-5 birds, and often as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded in the Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens area Apr 16 (OCG), and 21-50 birds at Tabbil Forest (M7) Feb 26 (HBOC), Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Waitui Apr 15 and Sep 30/Oct 2 (OCG, HBOC) and Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC). Birds were breeding at Balickera Nov 6 (BAA).

Yellow-faced Honeyeater Lichenostomus chrysops

ID No: 614 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident, with influxes in autumn/winter. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 30 birds over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec, and as counts of up to 100 birds during Apr-Aug when southern birds are on migration passage.

Notable records: 600+ birds were recorded flying over at Woodberry (M9) Apr 30 (SJR). 100+ birds were at Wollemi N.P. (H8) Apr 20 (M0A), Congewai (J10) May 21 (HB0C), Swansea South Jun 11 (M0A) and Quorrobolong Aug 4 (M0A). 50+ birds were at Minmi (L10) Oct 3 (HB0C). Birds had a nest with eggs at Laguna Jan 8 and were again nesting there Sep 8/10 (RDB), and also were breeding at Balickera Nov 6 (BAA).

Singing Honeyeater Lichenostomus virescens

ID No: 608 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental *(recorded in 1993, 1997, 1998)*.

No reports received for 2000.

White-eared Honeyeater Lichenostomus leucotis

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Wingen Sep 3 (NEG).

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at Tomalpin S.F. (K9) Jan 29 (HBOC), Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC), Aberdare S.F. Jun 22 & 24 (MOA) and Jesmond (M10) Jul 23 (GIK). Birds had dependent young at Tomalpin S.F. Jan 29 and were feeding fledged young at Black Rock Road (L8) Sep 16 (BAA).

Fuscous Honeyeater *Lichenostomus fuscus*

ID No: 613 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at Singleton Army Range (J8) Jul 26 (HSE), Quorrobolong Aug 4 (MOA), Widden Valley (E7/E8) Aug 5 (TAH) and White Box Camp Oct 27 (NEG). An easterly record was of four birds at Swansea South Jul 27 (MOA).

White-plumed Honeyeater Lichenostomus penicillatus

ID No: 625 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: Easterly records were of single birds at TWC/Shortland Jan 4, Apr 10 and Jul 6 (KEM, LIA, LPC), and two birds at Cundletown (R4) Mar 30 (MVBW).

Black-chinned Honeyeater Melithreptus gularis

ID No: 580 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncommon resident in central/west of Region.

7+ birds were recorded at Aberdare S.F. Jun 24 (MOA) and there were several reports from this location over the following weeks, with the peak count being of 20 birds Jul 9 (ROM). Some birds were again present there Sep 23 (BAA). Two groups each of at least ten birds were at Green Wattle Creek (L8) Aug 12 (NEM). 1-5 birds, where numbers were noted, were also recorded at Broke Road (J9) Jun 10 (LIT), Quorrobolong Aug 4 (FOC), Martins Creek (L8) Aug 13 (NEM), Honeysuckle Creek (D7) Sep 10 (MOA) and Bootawa (Q4) Nov 27/28 (OCG).

Brown-headed Honeyeater *Melithreptus brevirostris*

ID No: 583 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes *(Revised)* Status: Resident, uncommon in E of Region. Widely and moderately often recorded in W and central parts of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: Birds were breeding at Balickera Oct 2 (BAA) – *this is the first breeding record for the Region since 1986.*

White-naped Honeyeater Melithreptus lunatus

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at Martindale (G7) Apr 22 (TAH). Outside of the peak migration period, 21-50 birds were at Quorrobolong Aug 4 (MOA) and Wyee Point Sep 5 (HBOC). Birds were at nesting at Martins Creek (L8) Sep 1 (BAA).

Brown Honeyeater Lichmera indistincta

20+ birds were recorded at Salt Ash May 8 (ROM) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). 1-5 birds were often present at TWC and also at Stockton Sep 16 and Oct 14 (HWS).

Painted Honeyeater Grantiella picta

Not recorded since 1993.

Crescent Honeyeater *Phylidonyris pyrrhoptera*

ID No: 630 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Local resident.

Single birds were recorded at Gloucester Tops Mar 1 and Sep 4 (BAR, EKP).

New Holland Honeyeater *Phylidonyris novaehollandiae*

ID No: 631 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes (amended) Status: Resident.

20+ birds were recorded at Awabakal N.R. Aug 1 (HBOC). 1-5 birds, where numbers were noted, were at Merewether (M10) Jan-Mar and Sep 6 (GOP), Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (OCG), Wyee Point Sep 5 (HBOC) and Harrington Sep 7/10 (MVBW).

White-cheeked Honeyeater Phylidonyris nigra

ID No: 632 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Regularly recorded in the E of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds, and with counts of up to 50 birds being not uncommon.

Notable records: Birds were feeding fledged young at Pipers Bay (R6) Oct 6 (TUD).

Tawny-crowned HoneyeaterPhylidonyris melanops

ID No: 593 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident.

1-5 birds were recorded at Awabakal N.R. Aug 1 (HBOC) and BBNP Dec 29 (ROM).

Eastern Spinebill Acanthorhynchus tenuirostris

ID No: 591 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC), and birds were breeding at HRBG Oct 8 (HBOC) and Balickera Nov 6 (BAA).

Scarlet Honeyeater Myzomela sanguinolenta

ID No: 586 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of 1-5 birds, and occasionally as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Tomalpin S.F. (K9) Jan 29 and Waitui Sep 30/ Oct 2 (both HBOC), and there was a large influx into both Forster and BBNP Sep 30 (TUD).

White-fronted Chat Epthianura albifrons

ID No: 448 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident.

Up to 25 birds were regularly recorded at both Ash Island and KI/Stockton all year, and 29 birds were at KI Apr 8 (HWS). Some birds (<5) were at Swan Bay Sep 16, Oct 15 and Dec 9 (HWS), and five birds were at Forster Mar 3 (MVBW).

Jacky Winter Microeca fascinans

ID No: 377HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Widely and often recorded as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 and Sep 29/Oct 2 (HBOC, HSE), Bulga Jul 23 (HBOC) and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). Birds were breeding at Balickera Nov 6 (BAA).

Scarlet Robin Petroica multicolor

ID No: 380 HBOC Category: 1 Status: Resident (and altitudinal migrant). Regional Breeding Status: No

Seven birds were recorded at Bulga Jul 23 (HBOC) and three male birds there Apr 16 (VEE). At least four birds were at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC), and single birds were recorded at Howes Valley Apr 2 (CBOC) and Blackalls Park (L11) Jul 22 (GRN).

Red-capped Robin Petroica goodenovii

ID No: 381 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncommon resident.

Up to nine birds were often recorded at Bulga (several reports). Two male birds were at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE), and also two birds were at Wingen Oct 28 (NEG).

Flame Robin Petroica phoenicea

ID No: 382 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Resident.

Three pairs were recorded at Gloucester Tops Oct 6 (NEM), and some birds (numbers not noted) were at Sharpes Creek (M5) Jan 16 (BEA).

Rose Robin Petroica rosea

ID No: 384 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Usual resident (and altitudinal migrant).

1-5 birds were moderately often recorded throughout the Region, with the majority of reports being from the period Apr-Jul. 6+ birds were at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (both HBOC).

Hooded Robin Melanodryas cucullata

ID No: 385 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident, in west of Region.

The reporting rate was much increased, and 1-5 birds were moderately often recorded all year. Eleven birds were recorded at Bulga Apr 16 (VEE). Birds had a nest with eggs at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG).

Pale-yellow Robin Tregellasia capito

ID No: 396 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Local resident.

Four birds were recorded at Barrington House Feb 5 (ANC), three birds at Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), and a single bird at Fosterton Loop (M7) Apr 1 (TAH). Some birds were also at Chichester Dam (M6) Feb 2/4 (MVBW) – numbers were not noted.

Eastern Yellow Robin Eopsaltria australis

ID No: 392 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds and occasionally as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). There were several breeding records, spanning Jan-Mar and Sep-Oct.

Logrunner Orthonyx temminckii

ID No: 434 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Local resident.

1-5 birds were recorded at Watagans Mountains Jan 30 (NBL), Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Hannam Vale (R3) Apr 15 (MVBW), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC), Barrington House Oct 29 (ANC) and East Watagans Nov 8 (BIA).

Grey-crowned Babbler *Pomatostomus temporalis*

ID No: 443 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were occasionally recorded in the central and W of the Region, and 6-20 birds were at Balickera Apr 23 (HSE), Bulga Jul 23 and Sep 10 (HBOC, VEE), Singleton Army Range (J8) Jul 26 (HSE) and Redmanvale (H8) Oct 29 (MOA). Birds were nest building at Rutherford (L9) May 10 (TAH) and were carrying food at Wingen Sep 3 (NEG).

White-browed Babbler Pomatostomus superciliosus

ID No: 445 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Local resident.

Eleven birds were recorded at White Box Camp May 21 (ROM).

Eastern Whipbird *Psophodes olivaceus*

ID No: 421 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC), and birds were nesting at Wyee Point Nov 1 and Pinny Beach (L11) Sep 21 (BAA).

Spotted Quail-thrush *Cinclosoma punctatum*

ID No: 436HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Resident.

Three birds were recorded at Mount Sugarloaf (L10) Jul 20 (GIK), Putty (G10) Jul 28 (FOC) and Laguna Nov 25/26 (RDB). Two birds were at Pokolbin S.F. (J9) Sep 3 (TAN) and Kars Springs (F4) Sep 18 (NEG), and a single bird at Watagans S.F. Sep 15 (NEM).

Varied Sittella Daphoenositta chrysoptera

ID No: 549 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Crested Shrike-tit Falcunculus frontatus

ID No: 416 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of 1-2 birds.

Notable records: Three birds were at Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC) and Telegherry Forest Park (M6) Jun 10 (TAN). Birds were copulating at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG).

Crested Bellbird Oreoica gutturalis

ID No: 419 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental (recorded in 1987).

No reports received for 2000.

Olive Whistler *Pachycephala olivacea*

ID No: 405 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Resident, of highland areas.

Five birds were recorded at Gloucester Tops Oct 1 (ROM), and some birds were also at Sharpes Creek (M5) Jan 16 (BEA) and the Mountaineer Trail (L5/M5) Nov 26 (BAA).

Golden Whistler Pachycephala pectoralis

ID No: 398 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 10 birds and mostly as <5 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds were nesting at Balickera Nov 6 (BAA), and were feeding fledged young at Copeland S.F. Mar 20 and Milbrodale (I9) Oct 22 (both HBOC).

Rufous Whistler Pachycephala rufiventris

ID No: 401 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common summer migrant and local resident. Widely and regularly recorded over Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec as counts of up to 20 birds but mostly as 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Kars Springs (F4) Sep 18 (NEG). A late record was of a pair at WWW May 6 (TAN). Birds were on nest at Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG), and were also breeding at Balickera Nov 6 (BAA).

Little Shrike-thrush Colluricincla megarhyncha

ID No: 413 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncertain

No reports received for 2000.

Grey Shrike-thrush Colluricincla harmonica

ID No: 408 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG), and 6+ birds at Singleton Army Range (J8) Jul 26 (HSE) and Wingen Sep 3 (NEG). Birds were nesting at Chatham (Q4) Oct (MVBW).

Black-faced Monarch Monarcha melanopsis

ID No: 373 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual summer migrant. Moderately often recorded over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and 6+ birds at Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). Late records were of single birds at Shortland (M10) Apr 1 (LIA), Newcastle University Apr 3 (TAH) and Belmont Swamp Apr 11 (LAK). Birds were breeding at Balickera Nov 6 (BAA).

Spectacled Monarch Monarcha trivirgatus

ID No: 375 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

1-2 birds were recorded at Craven S.F. (N5) Jan 19 (LIA), Tabbil Forest (M7) Feb 26 (HBOC), Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC), Minmi (L10) Oct 3 (HBOC), Moto (R4) Oct 15 (MVBW), Renwick S.F. (07) Nov 22 (NEM). 1-2 birds were also at Harrington Jan 20 and through Sep (MVBW, STA), while four birds were there Dec 10/11 (VEE).

Leaden Flycatcher Myiagra rubecula

ID No: 365 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant. Moderately often recorded over Jan-Mar and from mid-Sep onwards, as counts of up to 5 birds.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE). A late record was of a bird heard at Congewai (J1O) May 21 (HBOC). Birds were breeding at Balickera Nov 6 and had dependent young at Johnsons Hill MLNP (P7) Dec 20 (both BAA).

Satin Flycatcher Myiagra cyanoleuca

ID No: 366 HBOC Category: 3 (*Revised*) Regional Breeding Status: Yes (*Amended*) Status: Rare.

The reporting rate for this species was high compared to other years and often from locations considered to be unusual – in particular, from near-coastal habitats outside of the time of migration passage. Since differentiation from *M. inquieta* can be difficult, the Records Appraisal Committee has decided that supporting information will be necessary for all reports of this species.

Restless Flycatcher *Myiagra inquieta*

ID No: 369 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Resident.

1-2 birds were moderately often recorded throughout the Region all year.

Magpie-lark Grallina cyanoleuca

ID No: 415 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 60+ birds were recorded at Williamtown (N9) Feb 27 (ROM) and a similar high count at Morpeth Jun 22 (FON). 20+ birds were at Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG) and Pambalong N.R. Dec 16/17 (MOA). There were several breeding records, spanning Jan and Oct-Nov.

Rufous Fantail *Rhipidura rufifrons*

ID No: 362 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual summer migrant. Moderately often recorded in the E of the Region from Jan until mid-Apr and from late Sep onwards, as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Bangalay Reserve (L11) Mar 7 and Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (both HBOC). A late record was of a single bird at Stockton (an unusual location) Apr 23 (TAN) – this bird may have been on passage.

Grey Fantail *Rhipidura fuliginosa*

ID No: 361 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at Bangalay Reserve (L11) Mar 7 (HBOC), Fosterton Loop (M7) Apr 1 (TAH), Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens Apr 16 (OCG), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG). There were several breeding records, spanning Jan and Oct-Nov.

Willie Wagtail Rhipidura leucophrys

ID No: 364 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of 1-5 birds and occasionally as up to 10 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Pambalong N.R. Dec 28 (NIJ). Birds had dependent young at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), Pambalong N.R. Dec 10 (HBOC) and Moorland (R3) Oct 21 (TUD).

Spangled Drongo Dicrurus bracteatus

ID No: 673 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Winter migrant and bird of passage. Moderately often recorded in the E of the Region over Apr-Oct as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Single birds were recorded at Harrington Jan 14 (CBOC), Hamilton (M1O) Feb 2 (ADJ), TWC Mar 4 (CCFOC), and at Belmont Swamp from Jan 28 onwards (LAK).

6+ birds were at Belmont Swamp May (LAK), Swansea Aug 4 (ROS) and Black Neds Bay (L11) Aug 5 (ANC).

Black-faced Cuckoo-shrike Coracina novaehollandiae

ID No: 424 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds but mostly as 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (OCG). Birds were nesting at Ash Island Oct 28 (BIA) and had dependent young at Bolwarra Dec (TAH).

Barred Cuckoo-shrike Coracina lineata

ID No: 428 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncertain

A single bird was recorded at Harrington Jan 14 (VEE).

White-bellied Cuckoo-shrike Coracina papuensis

ID No: 425 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncommon resident.

1-2 birds were recorded at Bulga Apr 16 (VEE), Quorrobolong Aug 4/5 (MOA) and Harrington Dec 10/11 (VEE). Some birds (numbers were not noted) were also at Harrington Sep 6/11 (MVBW), Testers Hollow (L9) Sep 11 (BAA) and Green Wattle Creek (L8) Aug 12 and Oct 15 (NEM).

Cicadabird Coracina tenuirostris

ID No: 429 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Summer migrant. Moderately often recorded in the central and E parts of the Region from Jan to mid-Mar and from mid-Sep onwards, as counts of 1-2 birds.

Notable records: Up to six birds were present at Harrington during early Dec (OCG, VEE), and three birds were at Laguna Nov 11/12 (RDB).

Ground Cuckoo-shrike Coracina maxima

ID No: 423 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental.

A single bird was recorded near Sandy Hollow (F7) Nov 2 (BRG).

White-winged Triller Lalage sueurii

ID No: 430 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant.

Eight birds were recorded at Bolwarra Oct 15 (TAH) and 6+ birds at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). 1-5 birds were moderately often recorded throughout the Region during Sep-Dec. Birds were nesting at Hexham Swamp N.R. Jan 3 (LIA) and Bolwarra Oct (TAH), and had dependent young at Bolwarra Dec (TAH).

Varied Triller Lalage leucomela

ID No: 431 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Local resident.

Single birds were recorded at Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (HBOC) and Harrington Sep 30 and Oct 2 (STA, NEM). Two birds were at Harrington Dec 10/11 (VEE).

Olive-backed Oriole Oriolus sagittatus

ID No: 671HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Widely and often recorded as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 20 birds were recorded at Tuncurry (R6) Nov 2 (THR), and 6+ birds at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 and Milbrodale (I9) Oct 22 (both HBOC). There were several breeding records over Oct-Nov.

Figbird Sphecotheres viridis

ID No: 432 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the E of the Region, especially at locations near to the coast, as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (OCG) and 20-30+ birds at Islington (M10) Jul 5 (CLT), Mayfield (M10) Jul 6 (CLT) and Tuncurry (R6) Nov 2 (THR). There were ten nests at two locations in BBNP late Dec (TUD).

White-breasted Woodswallow Artamus leucorynchus

ID No: 543 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common summer migrant *(Revised from: Summer migrant)*. Frequently recorded at or near medium to large fresh waters in the E of the Region over Jan-Apr and from mid-Aug onwards as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 21-30+ birds were recorded at TWC Jan 4 (KEM) and Pambalong N.R. Mar 11 (HLC). Birds were nest building at Seaham Swamp N.R. Sep 24 (HBOC) and were on nests at SBS Nov 22 (HLC), Pambalong N.R. Dec 10 (HBOC) and Ash Island Dec 13 (MOA).

Masked Woodswallow Artamus personatus

ID No: 544 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Rare irruptive visitor *(Revised from: Uncommon summer migrant).* Not recorded since 1995.

White-browed Woodswallow Artamus superciliosus

ID No: 545 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Rare irruptive visitor (*Revised from: Uncommon summer migrant*). Not recorded since 1996.

Dusky Woodswallow Artamus cyanopterus

ID No: 547 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant, and some birds are present all year *(Revised from: Uncertain)*. Occasionally but widely recorded as counts of 1-10 birds, mainly over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Bulga May 21 (VEE). 6+ birds were present at Wingen Apr 18 (NEG), and there were winter records of two birds at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC) and some birds (numbers not noted) at Johnsons Hill MLNP (P7) Aug 6 (NEM). Birds had dependent young at Tomalpin S.F. (K9) Jan 29 (HBOC) and were nesting at Sandy Hollow (F7) and Jerrys Plains Oct 28 (HLC).

Little Woodswallow Artamus minor

ID No: 548 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Accidental *(recorded in 1987).*

No reports received for 2000.

Grey Butcherbird *Cracticus torquatus*

ID No: 702 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Birds were nesting at Pipers Bay (R6) Oct 6 (TUD) and Milbrodale (I9) Oct 22 (HBOC), and were feeding fledged young at Pambalong N.R. Dec 10 (HBOC).

Pied Butcherbird Cracticus nigrogularis

ID No: 700HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Widely and often recorded as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6+ birds were recorded at Kars Springs (F4) Sep 18 (NEG) and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). A bird was on nest at Seaham Swamp N.R. Sep 24 (HBOC).

Australian Magpie Gymnorhina tibicen

ID No: 705 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and occasionally as 21-50 birds especially during Mar-Aug.

Notable records: 50 + birds were recorded in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (OCG), and 32 birds at Dungog Mar 20 (JED). There were many breeding records, spanning Jan and Sep-Nov.

Pied Currawong Strepera graculina

ID No: 694 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident (and altitudinal migrant). Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC), 60+ birds at East Maitland Apr 10 (ROS), 50 birds at Telegherry Forest Park (M6) Jun 10 (TAN) and 47 birds at Singleton Sep 7 (ALP). Birds were on nest at Milbrodale (I9) Oct 22 (HBOC) and Battery Rocks Oct 27 (MOA), and were feeding a young Channel-billed Cuckoo *Scythrops novaehollandiae* at Rathmines (L11) Jan 1 (LIA).

Grey Currawong Strepera versicolor

ID No: 697 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncertain.

Not recorded since 1997.

Paradise Riflebird Ptiloris paradiseus

ID No: 686 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncommon resident (*Revised from: Rare*).

Single birds (where numbers were noted) were recorded at Sharpes Creek (M5) Jan 16 (BEA), Main Creek (M8) Mar 12 (RUR via JED), Copeland Tops Mar 17 (BAA), Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Gloucester Tops late Apr (COL), Main Creek May 13 (LIN), Mountaineer Trail (L5/M5) Nov 26 (BAA), and Problem Creek (M6) Nov 27 (JED), and at five different sites in Barrington Tops N.P. Nov 25 (BAA).

Australian Raven Corvus coronoides

ID No: 930 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds and occasionally as counts of up to 50 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Forest Raven Corvus tasmanicus

ID No: 868 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Local resident.

Single birds were recorded at Bombah Point MLNP (P8) Apr 30 (TAN) and Mungo Brush MLNP (P8) May 25 (CDB).

Little Raven Corvus mellori

ID No: 954 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Local resident.

An estimated 20 birds were recorded near Scone (H5) Jun 29 (NEG).

Torresian Crow Corvus orru

ID No: 692 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

50+ birds were recorded in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (OCG) and 20+ birds at Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). 6-20 birds were at Waitui Apr 15 (OCG), Brimbin N.R. (R4) May 20 (OCG), Harrington Sep 30 (STA) and Bootawa (Q4) Nov 27/28 (OCG). 1-5 birds at Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (HBOC), LTP Apr 4 (KEM), Seaham (M8) Apr 24 (VEE) and Gloucester Tops late Apr (COL).

White-winged Chough Corcorax melanorhamphos

ID No: 693 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the central and W parts of the Region, and occasionally in the E, mostly as counts of 6-20 birds.

Notable records: 80 birds were recorded near Jerrys Plains May 14 (TAH), and 21-50 birds at Singleton Mar 18 (JED), Seaham (M8) Apr 24 (VEE), Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC), Singleton Army Range (J8) Jul 26 (HSE). Birds were on nest at Milbrodale (I9) Oct 22 (HBOC) and had a nest with young at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE).

Green Catbird Ailuroedus crassirostris

ID No: 676 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

1-2 birds, where numbers were noted, were recorded at Chichester Dam (M6) Feb 2/4 (MVBW), Tabbil Forest (M7) Feb 26 (HBOC), Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (HBOC), Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Congewai (J10) May 21 (HBOC), Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC) and Harrington Dec 1/3 (OCG).

Regent Bowerbird Sericulus chrysocephalus

ID No: 684 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were occasionally recorded in the E and central parts of the Region. 6+ birds were at Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC) and Saltwater (R4) Mar 2 (MVBW).

Satin Bowerbird *Ptilonorhynchus violaceus*

ID No: 679HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Widely and often recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC), Summer Hill (L8) Oct 1 (CLT) and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). Birds were breeding at Balickera Oct 2 (BAA).

Singing Bushlark Mirafra javanica

ID No: 648 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Rare.

Three birds were recorded 7km east of Wollar Oct 27 (NEG).

Skylark Alauda arvensis

ID No: 993 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Accidental (*Revised from: Rare*). Not recorded since 1996.

Richard's Pipit Anthus novaeseelandiae

ID No: 647HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Widely and moderately often recorded, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds.Notable records:Six birds were recorded at Redhead Jun 2 & 16 (GJC).

Yellow Wagtail Motacilla flava

ID No: 877 HBOC Category: 3 Status: Uncertain (revised from: Accidental). Regional Breeding Status: No

A single bird was recorded at Ash Island on Feb 9 (ROS). A bird was again there Feb 20 (LAT), and often thereafter until last recorded Apr 1. Occasionally a second, somewhat paler bird was also observed to be present. As with the 1998 occurrence of this species at Ash Island, much interest was generated locally and nationally. The birds were often elusive to observers, raising the possibility that visits may be more regular but that the birds are overlooked.

Black-backed Wagtail Motacilla lugens

ID No: 781HBOC Category: 3Regional Breeding Status: NoStatus: Accidental (recorded in 1998).No reports received for 2000.

House Sparrow Passer domesticus

ID No: 995 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Frequently recorded at or near populated areas as counts of up to 50 birds. *Notable records:* 50+ birds were recorded in the Harrington area Dec 1/3 (DCG).

Zebra Finch Taeniopygia guttata

ID No: 653 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident *(Revised from: Uncommon resident).* Moderately often recorded in the central and W of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds, and occasionally in the E of the Region as counts of up to 10 birds.

20+ birds were frequently recorded at Arrowfield, with counts often being of 40+ birds and peaking at 100+ birds May 10 (ALP). 70+ birds were at Denman May 10 (GED) and Apple Tree Flat Jun 10/12 (HBOC). 21-50 birds were recorded at KI Apr 23 and May 20 (TAN, HWS), Martindale (G7) Apr 22 and Jun 29 (TAH), Jerrys Plains Sep 10 (VEE) and Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE). 20+ pairs were on nests at Arrowfield during Jan (ALP), and birds were nest building at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE).

Double-barred Finch Taeniopygia bichenovii

ID No: 655 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE), and 50+ birds there Jun 10/12 and at Copeland Common Mar 19/20 (both HBOC). 21-50 birds were at Martindale (G7) Apr 22 (TAH), Wongalee (H8) Oct 22 (OCG) and Bootawa (Q4) Nov 27/28 (OCG). Birds were nest building at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE).

Plum-headed Finch Neochmia modesta

ID No: 661 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Rare.

Not recorded since 1996.

Red-browed Finch Neochmia temporalis

ID No: 662 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and moderately often as counts of up to 50 birds.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE), and 51-100 birds at Awabakal N.R. Jun 3 (GJC), WWW Jun 25 (HBOC) and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). Birds were nesting at Copeland Common Mar 19/20 and Jesmond (M10) Dec 5, and had dependent young at Tahlee/Carrington (08) Jan 23 (all HBOC). A bird was released after being

caught in a cobweb at Rathmines (L11) Jan 1 (HLC).

Diamond Firetail Stagonopleura guttata

ID No: 652 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were moderately often recorded in the W of the Region. 15 birds were at Yengo N.P. (H9) Jun (ROM), and nine birds (4 adults & 5 juveniles) at Bulga Sep 10 (VEE).

Nutmeg Mannikin Lonchura punctulata

ID No: 983 HBOC Category: 3 Status: Accidental *(last recorded in 1991)* Regional Breeding Status: Past records

No confirmed records.

Chestnut-breasted Mannikin Lonchura castaneothorax

ID No: 657 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncommon resident.

50+ birds were recorded at SBS Jun 3 (HSE). Flocks of up to ten birds were at TWC Jan 30 (CBOC), Balickera Apr 23 (HSE), Harrington May 4 (MVBW), KI May 20, Jun 17 and Oct 14 (HWS), Warabrook (M10) Jun 1 (HSE) and Tarro Swamp Sep 17 (GIK).

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis

ID No: 996 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Local resident.

An estimated 30 birds were recorded at Bolwarra Feb (TAH). 1-2 birds were at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), Martindale (G7) Apr 22 (TAH) and KI Oct 14 & 23 (HWS, LAT).

Mistletoebird Dicaeum hirundinaceum

ID No: 564HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Usual resident.Widely and frequently recorded as counts of 1-5 birds, and occasionally as countsof up to 20 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

White-backed Swallow Cheramoeca leucosternus

ID No: 358 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records Status: Bird of passage.

Four birds were recorded at Martindale (G7) Nov 17 and three birds there Oct 28 (TAH). Three birds were at Denman Apr 21 (STA), two birds at Howes Valley May 23 (NBL) and a single bird at Bulga May 30 (LIA).

Welcome Swallow Hirundo neoxena

ID No: 357 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and as counts of up to 50 birds near medium to large waters.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Hexham Swamp N.R. Jan 3 (LIA), Pambalong N.R. Mar 11 (HLC), KI Apr 23 and Sep 11 (TAN, HWS), TWC Jul 9 (TAN) and Ash Island Dec 9 (HWS), and there were ten records of 51-100 birds. Birds had nests with young at TWC Nov 23 (ROD) and The Ruins BBNP Oct 17 (TUD).

Tree Martin *Hirundo nigricans*

ID No: 359 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Occasionally but widely recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Woodberry (M9) Jan 6 (SJR), Bulga Apr 16 and Raymond Terrace (M9) Apr 24 (both VEE). 51-100 birds were at Bolwarra STP Feb (TAH), Bayswater Colliery Sep 8 and Upper Dartbrook Rd (H5) Sep 18 (both NEG), and 21-50 birds at Pambalong N.R. Mar 11 (HLC), Wingen Apr 18 (NEG) and Ash Island Oct 14 (HWS). Birds were on nest at Seaham Swamp N.R. Sep 24 (HBOC).

Fairy Martin Hirundo ariel

ID No: 360 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant; some birds appear to be resident. Frequently recorded at medium to large waters in the E and central parts of the Region from Jan to mid-Mar and from early Aug onwards, as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 110 birds were recorded at Hexham Swamp N.R. Jan 3 (LIA) and 90+ birds at Bootawa (Q4) Feb 12 (WIT). 21-50 birds were at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), Cattai Creek Bridge (R4) Sep 30 (STA), Ash Island Oct 14 (HWS), Fullerton Cove Oct 14 (HWS), Merriwa (E5) Nov 16 (MOA), Bulga Swamp (I9) Nov 16 (MOA). Winter records were of 1-5 birds at Congewai (J10) May 21 (HBOC), TWC Jul 9 (TAN), Swan Bay Jul 22 (LIA), and 11 birds at WWW May 6 (TAN). Birds were nesting at TWC Jan 4, Cattai Creek Bridge Sep 30, Yengo Creek Road (I10) Sep 30 and Battery Rocks Oct 4 (both BAA).

Red-whiskered Bulbul Pycnonotus jocosus

ID No: 990 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Local resident.

10+ birds were recorded at Swansea South Jun 11 (MOA) and a pair there Sep 21/22 (ADJ). Two birds were at Belmont Swamp Nov (LAK) and some birds there Dec 4 (BAA). Some birds were also at Bolwarra Wetlands Apr 10 (BPS).

Clamorous Reed-Warbler Acrocephalus stentoreus

ID No: 524 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual summer migrant; some birds are resident. Widely and often recorded near medium to large waters during Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: Birds had dependent young at TWC Jan 4 (KEM) and also were nesting at Harrington Sep 7/10 (MVBW).

Tawny Grassbird Megalurus timoriensis

ID No: 523 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded near medium to large waters in the E of the Region as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Some birds were nesting at Boondelbah Island Mar 23 (BAA).

Little Grassbird Megalurus gramineus

ID No: 522 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes (*Revised*) Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded near medium to large waters in the E of the Region as counts of 1-2 birds.

Notable records: Some birds were nesting at Boondelbah Island Mar 23 (BAA) – *this is the first confirmed breeding record for the Region for at least 15 years.*

Rufous Songlark Cincloramphus mathewsi

ID No: 509 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Summer migrant in central/west of Region.

Pairs were recorded at Bulga Sep 10 (VEE), Ridgelands Road (F5) Sep 18 (NEG), Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE) and Lake Liddell (H7) Oct 26 (NEG), and single birds at White Box Camp Oct 27 and Wingen Oct 28 (NEG).

Brown Songlark *Cincloramphus cruralis*

ID No: 508 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Uncertain. No reports received for 2000.

Golden-headed Cisticola Cisticola exilis

ID No: 525 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the E of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded on Broughton Island (P8) early Jan (HLC).

Silvereye Zosterops lateralis

ID No: 574HBOC Category: 1Regional Breeding Status: YesStatus: Common resident and winter migrant.Widely and regularly recorded all year as counts of up to 50birds, and as counts of up to 100 birds in the E of the Region during Apr – mid-May and mid-Jun – Jul.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Belmont Swamp May (LAK) and Salt Ash Jul 18 (ANC). 50+ birds were at Belmont Swamp Feb (LAK) and Waitui Sep 30/Oct 2 (HBOC). Birds had dependent young at Rathmines (L11) Feb 13 (HLC).

THRUSH SPECIES

Both *Zoothera* species occur in the Hunter Region, but field identification is difficult. In addition to the reports detailed below, three unidentified birds were recorded at Gloucester Tops Mar 1 (BAR) and a single unidentified bird at Main Creek (M8) Feb 6 (JED).

Bassian Thrush Zoothera lunulata

ID No: 779 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded Status: Uncertain.

1-2 birds were recorded at Chichester Dam (M6) Feb 2/4 (MVBW), Barrington House Feb 5 (ANC), Copeland S.F. Mar 20 (HBOC), Telegherry Forest Park (M6) Jun 10 (TAN), Gloucester Tops Oct 6 (NEM) and Jerusalem Creek (M6) Nov 27 (JED).

Russet-tailed Thrush Zoothera heinei

ID No: 780 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes *(Revised)* Status: Uncertain.

1-2 birds were recorded at Sharpes Creek (M5) Jan 16 (BEA), Barrington House Feb 5 (ANC), Gloucester Tops late Apr and Oct 6 (COL, NEM). One bird at Gloucester Tops Oct 6 was a dependent young – *this is the first confirmed breeding record for the Region.*

Common Blackbird Turdus merula

ID No: 991 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes *(Revised)* Status: Rare.

At least six birds were at Apple Tree Flat Sep 29/Oct 2 (HSE), Single birds were recorded at East Maitland Jul 12 (SMJ), TWC early Oct (BAW) and Wallsend (L10) Oct 17 (HAG). A pair had a nest with 2 young at Maitland Dec 1 (HOK/WCR) – this is the first confirmed breeding record for the Region.

Common Starling Sturnus vulgaris

ID No: 999 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded as counts of up to 100 birds.

Notable records: 200+ birds were recorded at Jerrys Plains Feb 28 (ALP), and 100-200 birds at Hexham Swamp N.R. Jan 3 and Jul 19 (LIA) and Belmont Swamp Feb (LAK) and often at Ash Island over Oct-Dec (HWS, MOA). Birds had nests with young at Ash Island Nov 30 and Pambalong N.R. Dec 16/17 (MOA).

Common Myna Acridotheres tristis

ID No: 998 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Widely and often recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and as counts of up to 50 birds in the E of the Region

Notable records: Around 20 birds were near Kerrabee (D7) Apr 16 (GED) – this is a far western record. Birds were nesting at Shoal Bay (P9) early Feb (LAK).

SUPPLEMENTARY RECORDS

The records below have been accepted by HBOC's Records Appraisal Committee:

Streaked Shearwater Calonectris leucomelas

ID No: 853

The March 2000 sighting is not the first record of this species for the Hunter Region. A bird, which later died, was found at Blacksmiths Beach Jan 24 1984. The skin is at the Australian Museum.

Wilson's Storm-Petrel Oceanites oceanicus

ID No: 063

A single bird was recorded off Hallidays Point (R5) Oct 8, 1999 (ALP). This was reported as an unconfirmed observation in the 1999 Bird Report.

Eastern Reef Egret Egretta sacra

ID No: 191

Single birds were recorded at Little Gibber MLNP (Q7) Jan 1998 and Dudley Beach (M10) Aug 1999 (ROM).

Glossy Black-Cockatoo Calyptorhynchus lathami

ID No: 265

A pair was nesting at Dingo Creek Wollemi N.P. Sep 1994 (ROM).

Little Friarbird *Philemon citreogularis*

ID No: 646 Birds were nesting at Ashtonfield (L9) in the summers of 1993-1995 (ROM).

UNCONFIRMED RECORDS

The records below could not be accepted by HBOC's Records Appraisal Committee for inclusion into the main body of the Report because of insufficient description being available at the time of printing. The records are presented here for completeness; future Reports will advise of any which subsequently are accepted.

Tahiti PetrelPseudobulweria rostrata

A single bird was reported from 10 km SE of Port Stephens Oct 18.

Fairy Prion Pachyptila turtur

ID No: 083

There were eight records, spanning Apr-Aug, of birds having been treated by Native Animal Trust Fund.

Wandering Albatross Diomedea exulans

ID No: 086 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No Status: Uncommon winter migrant at >5 km from shore. *(New to list).*

Birds found at Fingal Bay (P9) Mar 3 and Stockton Beach Jul 2 were reported to have been treated by Native Animal Trust Fund.

Pectoral Sandpiper Calidris melanotos

ID No: 978 A single bird was reported to be at Ash Island Feb 5.

Sooty Tern Sterna fuscata

ID No: 120

A bird found inland at Stroud (N7) was reported to have been treated by Native Animal Trust Fund Feb 8.

Superb Fruit-Dove *Ptilinopus superbus*

ID No: 023

A single bird was reported to be at Gloucester Tops late Apr.

Barking Owl Ninox connivens

ID No: 246

Single birds were reported to be at Raymond Terrace (M9) Jun 3 and Balickera Nov 6.

Forest Kingfisher Todiramphus macleayii

ID No: 324

Four pairs were reported to have been nesting near Simpsons Hill MLNP during Jan 1998.

Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater Acanthagenys rufogularis

ID No: 640

Two birds were reported to be at Giants Creek Road (F6) Apr 10 and Oct 20.

Satin Flycatcher Myiagra cyanoleuca

ID No: 366

1-2 birds were reported to be at Taylors Beach (09) Jan 13, Tabbil Forest (M7) Feb 26, Salt Ash Sep 23, Newcastle University Oct 3, Drayton Mine (H6) Oct 19, Belmont Swamp Oct 20, Fishers Hill Drive (L8) Nov 25, Bootawa (Q4) Nov 27/28, Jesmond (M10) Dec 5 and Wingham (Q4) Dec 8.

Nutmeg Mannikin Lonchura punctulata

ID No: 983

Some birds were reported to be at Chatham (Q4) during Aug.

CORRECTIONS AND CHANGES

In the 1999 Report, it was noted that the area named as Cedar Hill Drive swamp in previous Reports had been gazetted as the Pourmalong Nature Reserve. In fact, a last minute change occurred and it was instead gazetted as the Pambalong Nature Reserve. This latter name has now been adopted in this and the future Bird Reports.

ESCAPEES

The species below were recorded in the Region during the year, but are considered to be aviary escapees rather than part of a self-sustaining wild population:

Superb Parrot Polytelus swainsonii

ID No: 277 A juvenile was recorded at Toronto (L11) during Apr (HLJ).

Pale-headed Rosella Platycercus adscitus

ID No: 286

A single bird was recorded at TWC Jan 4 (KEM), and a male bird there Jul 30 with a female Eastern Rosella *P. eximius* inspecting hollows (BAW). Two birds were at Jesmond (M10) Dec 5 (HBOC).

Australian Ringneck Barnardius zonarius

ID No: 294

Single birds of race *zonarius* were recorded at Belmont Jul 6 (ANC) and North Arm Cove Jul 30 (WED), and of race *barnardi* at Charlestown Jun 30 (ANC). Single birds were also recorded at Forster Feb 19 and Oct 28 (MVBW).

Red-capped Parrot Purpureicephalus spurius

ID No: 290

A single bird was recorded at North Arm Cove Jul 31 (WED), and a single male bird at Redhead March 9, Nov 26 and Dec 6 & 24 (GJC).

Eurasian Magpie Pica pica

ID No: N/A

A single adult bird was present at Liddell power station (I7) all year until September, scavenging in gardens (HAP). The same or another bird was recorded in Newcastle (the suburb of Carrington) on Oct 20 (SDI). Both birds were photographed and the identification was confirmed. It is suspected that the bird(s) had a ship-assisted passage to Australia.
