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FOREWORD

The 2004 Annual Bird Report is the 12th in a series dating back to 1993. Over this period there has been an escalation in bird watching activity in the Hunter region. HBOC members participate in club outings and camps, organised surveys, individual projects and pelagic trips. All these activities provide information about birds from casual observations to serious ornithological studies. HBOC's ability to capture and collate information from these sources is impressive. Condensing the data into a single publication is a daunting task. Alan Stuart is to be congratulated for the successful production of his twelfth successive annual report.

As usual there are an impressive number of rare sightings. To make an observation which is included in the highlights for the year is a challenge which inspires many members. Equally important is the role of the Committee which reviews these rare records, which is not an enviable task. However, it is the combination of the exciting and the onerous which creates a credible bird report. Each year the species list for the Hunter grows and the optimists press on inspired by the belief that eventually all the birds on the Australian list will find their way to the region. In extending the boundaries of the Hunter offshore to enhance the observation of pelagic species there has been opportunity for a lateral approach. At what angle do local council boundaries radiate offshore?

Arguably the greatest strength of bird reports is the generation of a long term record of the birds which occur regularly in a region. Over the last 12 years the data compiled in the HBOC Bird Report series has allowed the status of the region's more common birds to be categorised according to a set of rules. In recent reports commentary on common species is by exception to these rules (e.g. records involving a new locality or abnormally large numbers). A challenge for the future is to ensure that any declines in the abundance of common species, either locally or throughout the region are identified. Such variations may be associated with climate changes both short and long term. The HBOC reports provide a valuable overview of seasonal conditions for each year which will assist with future analysis of the causes of long term fluctuations in populations.

The tabulated data on the water bird and wader surveys is an exceedingly valuable resource. It is essential information for both those charged with the responsibility of managing the environmental assets of the region as well as those actively involved in arguing for the conservation of this wonderful part of Australia. This report underscores the point that the Hunter has an exceptional avian diversity, perhaps second to none, which must not be lost.

Bird reports provide a measure of the health of a bird club. On the basis of its 12th report HBOC is a dynamic organisation which has successfully inspired and harnessed the multifaceted talents of its members. The degree of team work demonstrated in the generation of this report is exceptional. Congratulations to all concerned.

INTRODUCTION

In this Report, produced by Hunter Bird Observers Club Inc. (HBOC), we present a summary of the status of bird species within the Hunter Region of NSW in 2004. The information is based upon observation records gathered from a variety of sources.

There are two additions to the 2004 species list – Black Noddy and Greater Sand Plover. The official Hunter Region bird list now stands at 412 species. For 2004, 339 of these species were confirmed to have been present in the Region and information about these observations is presented in the Report. In the 10 years from 1995, 222 species are confirmed to have bred within the Hunter Region, and 123 of these species were recorded as breeding in 2004.

There were very few pelagic surveys done in 2004 because of issues about boat availability. The only surveys were in January and February. This may in part account for a slightly lower number of species recorded in 2004 than in recent years. Also, 2004 saw the resumption of a severe drought across most of eastern Australia after moderate rains in the latter half of 2003 had brought some respite. Many ephemeral wetlands had little or no water in 2004.




Figure 1: Number of species recorded each year




Figure 2: Number of breeding records each year

This is now the 12th year of production of Hunter Region Bird Reports. There was some discussion in the 1999 Bird Report about the changes in the capture rate of information about Hunter Region birdlife, and it is interesting to consider this again in the 2004 Report. Figures 1 and 2 show annual reporting rates for species and breeding species in the Region between 1976 and 2004.

From 1976, when HBOC was formed, information about local birdlife was mainly based on the observations made by the club during its organised activities, supplemented by an informal reporting system for other sightings. The number of species reported each year increased steadily between 1976 and 1992, then climbed rapidly in the first two years of the Bird Reports. Then, when semi-regular pelagic surveys commenced in 2000, there was a further increase. In 2003 and 2004, there were fewer pelagic surveys plus perhaps there was an impact from the drought.

Until 1993, breeding information for Hunter Region species was scanty, with reports averaging around 15 species per year. The introduction of the annual Bird Reports has led to a substantial increase in the capture of information, with 121 species reported as breeding in 2004. Moreover, the total number of known breeding species in the Region has increased substantially, and now stands at 236 species (or at 222 species if the count is limited to the breeding reports from the past 10 years). Since 1995, the average has been 117 species recorded as breeding each year.

A map showing the land area of the Hunter Region is provided at the back of this Report. When the Bird Reports were commenced in 1993, HBOC defined the Hunter Region to be the area encompassed by 14 particular local government authorities (plus the ocean to the east of this). Since then however, some of the local authorities in NSW have been amalgamated. The original definition of the Region is no longer valid, but for consistency we have retained the same geographical area. The Hunter Region therefore is defined now as:

- The area managed by local government authorities for Newcastle, Lake Macquarie, Maitland, Cessnock, Muswellbrook, Singleton, Scone, Dungog, Gloucester, Port Stephens, Greater Taree and Great Lakes,
- The ocean to the east of that area, within 100km of the coastline, and
- The land areas that formerly were managed by the Shire Councils of Merriwa and Murrurundi.

The philosophies we use when preparing Reports were described in the 2000 Bird Report. To assist in vetting records, we have classified each species into one of three categories, as described below. The classification reflects, in part, the frequency of reporting.

Category 1: all records for the species generally are accepted.

Category 2: records usually are accepted, but supporting information may be required in the event of unusual numbers, location or season.

Category 3: the species is considered to be of special interest in relation to the Region, and supporting information is required before any record can be accepted for inclusion into the Report.

A Records Appraisal Committee assigns these categories and decides whether each record can be accepted. For 2004, the Records Appraisal Committee members were Sue Hamonet, Ann Lindsey, Wilma Barden, Fred van Gessel, Terry Lindsey and Phil Hansbro.

The value of the Bird Reports is due to the many observers who submit records of their sightings during the year. Whether the records are made as a one-off casual observation or as part of a regular and thorough survey program they all are important in helping to continue to build the picture of birdlife in the Hunter Region. Thanks very much to all the contributors for the 2004 Report.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

The highlights for 2004 included the following:

- Freckled Duck Stictonetta naevosa single birds at TWC 27 Feb-19 Mar and Pambalong NR 4 Apr
- Plumed Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna eytoni the first confirmed breeding records for the Region
- Northern Giant-Petrel Macronectes halli three birds offshore from Newcastle Baths 31 Oct
- White-necked Petrel Pterodroma cervicalis a single bird on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea 1 Feb
- Fluttering Shearwater Puffinus gavia ~10,000 birds off Dudley Bluff 14 Aug and many thousands of birds off Newcastle Beach and further to the south 29 Aug
- Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax varius 458 birds in Port Stephens 8 Feb
- Little Bittern *Ixobrychus minutus* single birds at TWC several times in Feb
- Black Falcon Falco subniger several records from six distinct locations
- Little Button-quail *Turnix velox* a single bird at Barrington House 11 Jan
- Whimbrel Numenius phaeopus 218 birds in Port Stephens 8 Feb, which is ~2% of the Australian migrating population
- Eastern Curlew *Numenius madagascariensis* 649 birds in Port Stephens 8 Feb, which is ~1.7% of the world population
- Broad-billed Sandpiper Limicola falcinellus several summer records of up to four birds, and also a winter record of two birds in Fullerton Cove late June to early July
- Ruff Philomachus pugnax single birds in the Hunter estuary 10 Oct and at Cemetery Swamp Singleton 31 Dec
- Painted Snipe Rostratula benghalensis a pair on Ash Island Nov-Dec
- Bush Stone-curlew Burhinus grallarius nesting at LTP in Sep and Salt Ash in Oct
- Beach Stone-curlew Esacus neglectus 1-2 birds at Mudbishops Point/Farquhar Inlet at times in Feb-Mar and a single bird at Harrington 2 Jul
- Pied Oystercatcher Haematopus longirostris 112 birds in Port Stephens 8 Feb, which is ~1% of the total population
- Banded Stilt Cladorhynchus leucocephalus an immature bird at Stockton Sandspit Nov 20 until early Dec
- Grey Plover Pluvialis squatarola up to 3 birds in the Hunter estuary from mid-Nov onwards
- Double-banded Plover Charadrius bicinctus 180 birds in Fullerton Cove early Jun (largest counts for the Hunter estuary since the 1970s)
- Greater Sand Plover Charadrius leschenaultii a single bird at Mudbishops Point

- Sooty Tern Sterna fuscata 1-2 birds on pelagic surveys SE of Swansea in Jan and 1 Feb
- Black Noddy Anous minutus a single bird on a pelagic survey SE of Swansea in Jan

- Rose-crowned Fruit-Dove *Ptilinopus regina* up to 4 birds at Harrington Nov-Dec
- Musk Lorikeet Glossopsitta concinna numerous records including the first breeding record for the Region since 1839
- Swift Parrot Lathamus discolor 14 birds at Blackalls Park 20 Aug and some birds at three distinct locations Apr-May
- Oriental Cuckoo Cuculus saturatus two birds at Wyee Point 28 Nov
- Little Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx minutillus a single bird at East Seaham 20 Apr
- Barking Owl Ninox connivens a bird heard at Anvil Hill 26 Jun
- Grass Owl Tyto capensis single birds at Crowdy Bay NP 5 Nov and 27 Dec
- Forest Kingfisher *Todiramphus macleayii* a single bird at Brunkerville 5 Oct
- Noisy Pitta *Pitta versicolor* the first confirmed breeding record for the Region
- Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater Acanthagenys rufogularis a single bird at Wingen 9
 Aug
- Little Friarbird *Philemon citreogularis* 6+ birds at Appletree Flat 23-26 Apr and some birds at Harrington 6 Feb
- Regent Honeyeater Xanthomyza phrygia ten birds near Wollar 25 Jul-9 Aug and single birds at Quorrobolong 9-10 Aug
- White-eared Monarch Monarcha leucotis a single bird at Fig Tree Crowdy Bay NP 6 Nov, 21 Nov and 21 Dec
- Barred Cuckoo-shrike Coracina lineata single birds at Harrington 7 Nov and 21 Nov
- Ground Cuckoo-shrike Coracina maxima two birds at Yarrawa 5 Jun
- Singing Bushlark Mirafra javanica a single bird at Yarrawa 25 Sep
- Yellow Wagtail Motacilla flava a single bird at Ash Island 23 Nov as well as the usual Feb-Mar records from there

SYSTEMATIC LIST

Bird species are listed in taxonomic order; the order and nomenclature follows that of Christidis and Boles in the 1994 RAOU publication *The Taxonomy and Species of Birds of Australia and its Territories* (ISBN 0815-2233).

Definitions of the terms used in status descriptions for the listed species in the Report are as follows:

Resident: Recorded in all months;

Migrant: Species that come to an area for a period and then depart;

Bird of passage: Species present in a suitable area for a relatively short period, and equally likely to be observed in any month of the year;

Common: Species that one can **expect** to find on all visits to suitable habitats;

Usual: Equally likely to be found in suitable habitats, but not on all visits;

Uncommon: Species that are recorded infrequently on visits to suitable habitats;

Rare: Species recorded only a few times a year;

Accidental: Species recorded less than once per year, over a 10 year average.

For many of the species, a general statement about typical distribution and count size is provided as part of the Status description. In these cases, only notable exceptions to this overall description of Status are considered for inclusion into the main body of the Report.

Breeding status is also indicated for each species. For species with no confirmed breeding records for 10 or more years, the breeding status is described as **Past records**. Where a species is anticipated to breed in the Region but there are no confirmed records, the description **None recorded** has been used.

A considerable proportion of records received indicate abundance levels for the species observed by using the following categories: A = 1-5 birds present; B = 6-20 birds; C = 21-50 birds; D = 51-100 birds; E = 100+ birds. Commentaries in this Report are mostly based upon abundance levels reported in this way, although many observers report precise numbers (and we encourage this).

The format for the reported observations generally includes reference to an observer code and to a location (or a location abbreviation). The relevant grid number (e.g. F7) is also cited, except for the more common locations which are listed later in the Report. Observer codes and location abbreviations are also provided later in the Report.

A semi-quantitative measure of the number of observations of a species for the year is indicated by the progressive terms: **occasionally**; **moderately often**; **often**; **frequently**; **regularly**. Where there are fewer than 12 observations for the year, all of them are reported.

An ID number is provided with each listed species – this is a unique identifier that does not change even though the scientific and/or common name for the species may do so. The ID number corresponds to that assigned to the species under the Australian Bird and Bat Banding Scheme.

BIRDS

Emu Dromaius novaehollandiae

ID No: 001 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Resident in W of Region.

A single bird was recorded at White Box Camp 11-14 Jun (HBOC).

Australian Brush-turkey Alectura lathami

ID No: 008 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were at Barrington House 28 Jan (BRG/MCR), Mount Vincent 12 Feb (FIP), Copeland 14 Mar (FOC), Appletree Flat 23-26 Apr (HBOC) and Copeland SF 24 Oct (LIA). More unusual records were of single birds at Glenrock SRA 4 & 8 Sep and 30 Nov (GOC), two birds in a Rankin Park garden 22 Feb (IJK), and three adults and six immature birds at BbR 13 Aug (GOC).

Stubble Quail Coturnix pectoralis

ID No: 009 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Uncertain, possibly irruptive.

6+ birds were recorded at Mount Arthur 12 Apr (NEG) and Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC). 1-2 birds were at Dungog 13 Feb (JED), Bootawa Dam 15 Feb (MVBW), Fosterton Loop 14 Mar and 3 Oct (HBA, JED) and Bolwarra 7 & 13 Dec (TAH).

Brown Quail Coturnix ypsilophora

ID No: 011 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded, mostly as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

King Quail Coturnix chinensis

ID No: 012 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Rare, possibly overlooked

No confirmed reports received since 2000.

Magpie Goose Anseranas semipalmata

ID No: 199 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Often recorded at TWC and adjacent wetlands (especially NWR and Market Swamp) as counts of up to 50 birds.

Notable records: Birds were regularly recorded at TWC, with the peak count being 74 birds on 22 Jun (MCR). There also were many records from nearby wetlands (NWR, Market Swamp). Elsewhere, 1-5 birds were at SSNR 19 Aug (MCR), and Nulama Ponds (Taree) 31 Jan and 5 Aug (MVBW). There were many breeding records from TWC, NWR and Market Swamp spanning Jan-Mar and Oct-Dec.

Plumed Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna eytoni

ID No: 205 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes (revised)

Status: Bird of passage.

There were high counts sometimes from Doughboy Hollow, a usual location, with 240+ birds present 12 May (GED), ~200 birds 9 Sep (NEG) and ~100 birds 17 May (TAH). Some birds were also present there 31 Oct (MOA). 20+ birds were at Leneghans Flat 20 Oct (MCR) and six birds there 6 Dec (HAP). 1-5 birds were sometimes at TWC during Feb-Mar and Oct-Nov, PNR Jan-Feb and Oct and Leneghans Flat in Mar and Oct-Dec (many reports). A pair was with three ducklings at PNR 18 Feb (BRG), and also there was a pair with a duckling at Leneghans Flat 6 Mar (MOA) – these are the first confirmed breeding records received by HBOC.

Wandering Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna arcuata

ID No: 204 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

10-20+ birds were often recorded at TWC over Jan-Apr and Oct-Dec and also lesser numbers at the nearby Market Swamp and NWR wetlands (many reports). The peak counts at TWC were of 40+ birds 29 Apr and 47 birds 10 Oct (MCR). Some birds were also recorded at TWC and NWR during Jul (BAW, MCR). Up to 10 birds were frequently at Leneghans Flat and/or nearby PNR over Jan-Mar and Oct-Dec but 28 birds in total were present 25 Oct and 40 birds on 4 Dec (HAP, NEM), and also 14 birds were there 1 May (LCP). Two birds were also present at Minmi STP 12 Nov (NEM). There were many records of birds on nests or with ducklings from TWC, Market Swamp and NWR spanning Jan-May and Oct-Dec, and from PNR and Leneghans Flat in Jan-Feb and Oct. This was easily the most prolific breeding year since the Bird Reports commenced.

Blue-billed Duck Oxyura australis

ID No: 216 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Past records

Status: Accidental (Recorded 1989, 2002, 2003).

No reports received for 2004.

Musk Duck Biziura lobata

ID No: 217 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

Up to 11 birds were often recorded at GTD in Jan and over Apr-Nov, and 16 birds were present there 24 Jul (MAM). Two birds were at WWW 18 Jan and 4 May (HBOC) and four birds at Warabrook sometimes during Feb-Mar (MCR). Some birds were at Ellalong Lagoon 10 & 31 May (MOA) and there were six birds there plus a duckling 22 Aug (HBOC).

Freckled Duck Stictonetta naevosa

ID No: 214 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Rare.

Single birds were present at TWC 27 Feb-19 Mar (several records) and at PNR 4 Apr (VEE).

Black Swan Cygnus atratus

ID No: 203 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds at medium to large waters.

Notable records: 1,056 birds were recorded in a water-based survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC). 500+ of these birds were in the Worimi NR/Swan Bay area the previous day and 100-200 birds were often recorded in that area in other months (HAS). Other large counts were 527 birds at Woodberry 6 Nov (MCR), 220 birds at Hexham Swamp 4 Dec (NEM) and 200 birds at Tarro Swamp 22 Nov (MAM). 100+ birds were often recorded at Kooragang/Ash Island and Morpeth STP (see Tables 1 & 3). 90+ birds were at Ash Island 17 Apr (LIN) and 50+ birds at Mudbishops Point 6 Feb (BRG) and regularly at Worimi NR (HAS). There were numerous breeding records throughout the year.

Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides

ID No: 207 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental.

Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata

ID No: 202 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds at or near fresh to brackish waters.

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at Mount Arthur 12 Apr (NEG), Glen Oak 16 May (MAM), Woods Point Morisset 23 May (HBOC) and TWC 10 Oct (MCR). There were many breeding records spanning Jan-Feb and Sep-Dec.

Cotton Pygmy Goose Nettapus coromandelianus

ID No: 200 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 2002).

No reports received for 2004.

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos

ID No: 948 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

1-5 birds were recorded at WWW 18 Jan and 4 May (HBOC), Woodberry Swamp 6 Apr (HBOC), Newline Rd Raymond Terrace 19 Aug (MCR) and Wallbridge Reserve 16 Sep (MAM), and regularly at TWC over May-Oct (BAW, MCR). The bird at WWW 18 Jan was a hybrid with Pacific Black Duck.

Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

ID No: 208 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds at small to large waters.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Morpeth STP most months and the peak count was 245 birds 16 Apr (Table 1). 51-100 birds were at Woodberry Swamp 6 Apr (HBOC), Irrawang Swamp 25 Apr (MAM), Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR), WWW 12 Aug (Table 2) and frequently at TWC (MCR, BAW). 21-50 birds were at WWW 18 Jan and 4 May (HBOC), Tank Paddock Minmi 29 Feb and 12 Jul (LIN, MCR), PNR 6 Jul and 5 Dec (HBOC), Richardsons Swamp 21 May (MAM), Ash Island and Newline Rd 19 Aug (both MCR), and frequently at TWC and WWW (BAW, MCR, Table 2). There were numerous breeding records, spanning Jan-Mar and Oct-Nov.

Australasian Shoveler Anas rhynchotis

Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded at medium to large fresh waters in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as 1-5 birds but with counts of up to 10 birds not uncommon.

Also, 139 birds were at KI Deep Pond 17 Jul (HWS). 21-50 birds were at Ash Island 18 Feb (BRG/LIN), Morpeth STP 22 Jun and 19 Aug (NEM, MCR), TWC 8 May, 22 Jun and 13 Jul (POY, MCR), PNR 13 Jun (VEE), Mount Arthur 25 Jul (NEG) and Muswellbrook STP 11 Sep (MCR). Also, 12 birds were at WWW 6 Jun (TAH).

Northern Shoveler Anas clypeata

Grey Teal Anas gracilis

Notable records: Many hundreds of birds were regularly present at Morpeth STP over Apr-Dec, with the peak count being of 743 birds 16 Aug (Table 1). Several hundred birds were also at ponds on Ash Island often, and peaking at 300-400 birds over May-Jul (Table 3). It is noted that numbers at Ash Island were low in Feb and Aug-Sep, corresponding to very low water levels in the ponds. There was a mixed flock with Chestnut Teal of 1,325 birds in NW corner of Fullerton Cove 29 Jun (RIA). 100+ birds were also recorded at Hexham Swamp 30 Jun and TWC 13 Jul and 24 Nov (all MCR), and 51-100 birds at TWC 5 Jan, 10 Oct and 15 Nov (all MCR), Ash Island 21 Mar (HBOC), Fullerton Cove 17 Jun and 2 Jul (RIA), Ellalong Lagoon 22 Aug (HBOC) and Irrawang Swamp 10 Nov (LIA/MAM). There were numerous breeding records, spanning Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec.

Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

Status: Common resident. Regularly recorded at medium to large waters in E of the Region as counts of up to 50 birds.

Notable records: Many hundreds of birds were regularly present in the Hunter estuary particularly at Ash Island, with the peak count being of 606 birds 16 Aug (Table 3). It is noted that numbers at Ash Island were low in Feb and Aug-Sep, corresponding to very low water levels in the ponds. 50+ birds were regularly present at Morpeth STP, with 100+ birds there often and the peak count being of 246 birds 16 Apr (Table 1). There was a mixed flock with Grey Teal of

1,325 birds in NW corner of Fullerton Cove 29 Jun (RIA). 100+ birds were also at WWW 9 Jun (Table 2), Fullerton Cove 17 Jun and 2 Jul (RIA), TWC 13 Jul, Morpeth STP 19 Aug and TWC 24 Nov (all MCR). 51-100 birds were at TWC 19 Mar, 10 Oct and 15 Nov (all MCR), Woodberry Swamp 6 Apr (HBOC), Worimi NR 5 Jun (HAS) and Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR). There were numerous breeding records, spanning Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec.

Garganey Anas querquedula

Hardhead Aythya australis

Status: Usual resident. Widely and moderately often recorded at medium to large waters as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 200+ birds were recorded at Hexham Swamp 4 Dec (NEM) and 197 birds at Morpeth STP 11 Nov (Table 1). 51-100 birds were at TWC 5 Jan (MCR), GTD 23 Apr, 2 Jul, 24 Sep and 8 Oct (MAM) and Irrawang Swamp 10 Nov (LIA/MAM), and occasionally at Morpeth STP and WWW (Tables 1 and 2). 21-50 birds were occasionally recorded at TWC, Market Swamp, Morpeth STP and WWW.

Australasian Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae

Notable records: 519 birds were recorded at GTD 24 Jul – including a raft of 500 birds, and 180 birds were there 27 Aug and 176 birds 24 Sep in two large rafts (all MAM records). 20+ birds were also at GTD 2 Jul and 22 Oct (MAM), WWW 9 Jun and TWC 22 Jun (MCR). There were widespread breeding records spanning Apr-Jun and Oct-Nov.

Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus

Birds were present at WWW every month with the peak count being of 16 birds 12 May (Table 2). Elsewhere, six birds were recorded at PNR 20 Oct (MCR) and a single bird at Bootawa Dam 21 Apr (MVBW). Birds nested at WWW in Mar and had two chicks there in Apr and early May (several reports).

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded at medium to large waters, mainly as counts of up to 20 birds but with greater numbers not uncommon at large waters.

Notable records: 162 birds were recorded in a survey of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC). 50-100+ birds were regularly present at Hunter estuary sites, with 243 birds being recorded on both 6 Mar and 17 Apr (Table 3). 50+ birds at Swansea Channel 27 Jan (LAK), Tea Gardens 28 Sep (MAM) and Morpeth STP 24 Dec (Table 2). There also were 15 records of 21-50 birds, from nine locations all in the E of the Region.

White-faced Heron Egretta novaehollandiae

ID No: 188 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, in counts of up to 20 birds at some favoured habitats.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at Hunter estuary locations, primarily Ash Island, on 17 Apr and 8 May and 20+ birds were present regularly over Mar-Aug (see Table 3). 20+ birds were also at Morpeth STP 21 Jan and 24 Dec (Table 1). Birds were nesting at TWC 20 Dec (WCR) and a pair was copulating at Mount Arthur 12 Apr (NEG).

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

ID No: 185 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region, mostly as 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Six birds were sometimes recorded at Hunter estuary locations during the year (see Table 3). There were two nests at TWC 8 Jan and three nests there 14 Dec (MAM). Birds also were nesting at Toronto Wetlands 22 Dec (TOM).

Eastern Reef Egret Egretta sacra

ID No: 191 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Rare.

Single birds were at Box Beach Tomaree NP 11 Mar (CLT) and Tuncurry 17 Jul (MVBW).

White-necked Heron Ardea pacifica

ID No: 189 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded as 1-2 birds throughout the Region.

Notable records: There were several reports of 20+ birds at Leneghans Flat for ~2 weeks from late Oct, with the peak count being of ~40 birds there 31 Oct (HAP). Also 22 birds were at Woodberry Swamp 23 Oct (CBOC) and 6+ birds at Milbrodale 10 Jun (NEG).

Great Egret Ardea alba

ID No: 187 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Often recorded at medium to large waters in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as counts of 1-2 birds except when breeding.

Notable records: Seven birds were recorded at Woodville 3 Nov (MAM). There were 16 nests at TWC 8 Jan and 35 nests 14 Dec (MAM) (for comparison, there were 198 pairs nesting at TWC in 1987/88). Birds also were nesting at Toronto Swamp 22 Dec (TOM).

Intermediate Egret Ardea intermedia

ID No: 186 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region, mostly as counts of 1-2 birds except when breeding.

Notable records: 18 birds were recorded at Tenambit Common 7 Nov (BRG) and 12 birds at Leneghans Flat/PNR 5 Dec (STA). There were eight nests at TWC 8 Jan and nine nests 14 Dec (MAM) (these are improvements to the numbers of nesting pairs from 2002 & 2003 although down on the preceding years and a far cry from the counts of 453 pairs nesting at TWC in 1987/88).

Cattle Egret Ardea ibis

ID No: 977 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as counts of 10-50 birds except when breeding.

Notable records: 100-200 birds were recorded at Morpeth STP 19 Feb and 11 Mar (Table 1), Doughboy Hollow 1-6 Apr (WAR1), Phoenix Park 12 & 14 Sep (MAM) and SSNR 16 Oct (MAM). Several hundred birds often were night roosting at SSNR and Wallalong - the peak count at SSNR was ~400 birds 24 Aug and at Wallalong the peak was 100+ birds 20 May (MAM). **Breeding:** At TWC the peak count for the 03/04 season was 215 nests 8 Jan and then 182 nests 14 Dec for the 04/05 season (MAM). There were 381 nests at SSNR 11 Dec (MAM). Birds also were nesting at Toronto Swamp 22 Dec (TOM).

Striated Heron Butorides striatus

ID No: 193 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records

Status: Resident.

1-2 birds were sometimes recorded at locations around the Hunter estuary during the year - at Stockton Sandspit 17 Jan, 7 Feb, 21 Mar and 15 Nov (HWS, VEE, HBOC, MCR), Throsby Creek 17 Feb (HBOC), Moscheto Creek 7 Mar (MOA), Ash Island 19 Aug (MCR) and KI dykes 15 Dec (TOM). 1-2 birds were also at Harrington 6 Feb and 17 Dec (BRG, STA), Myuna Bay 1 Jun (HBOC), Stoney Creek Toronto 1 Jul (DUP/WAR1), Dora Creek 1 Dec (TOM) and Pindimar Bay 17 Dec (STA). Four birds were present in a survey of all Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC). (all records published)

Nankeen Night Heron Nycticorax caledonicus

ID No: 192 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

As in previous years, birds were roosting all year at Wallbridge Reserve Raymond Terrace; the counts generally were of <20 birds and mostly they were of <10 birds. However, the numbers rose sharply over Oct-Dec with peak counts of 64 birds 29 Oct, 85 birds 12 Nov and 73 birds 3 Dec, and then they declined to normal by late Dec (MAM). TWC again was another regular roost site all year (BAW), with the peak count being of 54 birds there 17 Oct (LIA). Records from elsewhere were of 1-5 birds at Boarding House Dam (Watagans NP) 2 Jan and 1 Feb (TOM, MCR/BRG), Green Wattle Creek 7 Jan (NEM), Belmont Swamp 10 Jan (LAK), Belmont South 14 Jan (CJB), Brandy Hill Seaham Jan (MEL), SSNR 3 Feb (MAM), Throsby Creek 17 Feb (HBOC), Newline Rd 19 Aug (MCR), Ash Island 2 Nov (HBOC) and Toronto Swamp 22 Dec (TOM).

Little Bittern *Ixobrychus minutus*

ID No: 195 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Rare (probably overlooked).

A single bird was recorded at TWC on several occasions during Feb (several reports).

Black Bittern Ixobrychus flavicollis

ID No: 196 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records (Revised)

Status: Rare resident (probably overlooked).

Single birds were recorded at Balickera Feb (MUJ) and Tenambit 30 May (BAP).

Australasian Bittern Botaurus poiciloptilus

ID No: 197 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Resident.

Single birds were recorded at Morpeth STP 12 May (NEM/LIA), Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR) and Tenambit 25 Jul (BRG), and a bird was heard at Crowdy Bay NP 27 Dec (FOC).

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus

ID No: 178 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Bird of passage.

32 birds were recorded at Ash Island 15 Nov, with lesser numbers still sometimes there until early Dec (MCR, HAP, STA). 23 birds were at Woodberry 28 Feb (MCR) and 16 birds at Hexham Swamp 24 Jul (HAP). Six birds including a juvenile were recorded at Wyee Point from 24 Feb to 23 Mar (MDV) and 1-5 birds at Stockton Sandspit 22 Jan (CLT), Newline Rd 20 Jan and 6 Dec (MAM, COD) and Irrawang Swamp 28 Nov (MAM), and at Morpeth STP 12 May, 12 Jul, 19 Aug and 11 Nov (LIA, NEM, MCR).

Australian White Ibis Threskiornis molucca

ID No: 179 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Regularly recorded in the E of the Region, mostly as <20 birds but with counts of up to 50 birds not uncommon.

Notable records: There was a mixed flock with *T. spinicollis* of 1000+ birds at Irrawang Swamp 29 Jul (MAM). 1000+ birds were at TWC 27 Feb and 19 Mar (MCR) and there were other reports of several hundred birds at this location. 500+ birds were at Woodberry 28 Feb and 256 birds there 6 Nov (MCR). 100+ birds were at Hunter estuary locations 6 Mar and 17 Apr (Table 3) and also there were several reports of 50+ birds. **Breeding:** Birds had nine nests at TWC 5 Jan and again on 14 Dec (MCR, MAM), and also were nesting at Toronto Swamp 22 Dec (TOM) and at Tomaree NP 20 Mar (HBOC). Nesting at TWC was underway by 31 Oct (MOA).

Straw-necked lbis Threskiornis spinicollis

ID No: 180 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as <20 birds but with counts of up to 100 birds not uncommon.

Notable records: 1000+ birds were recorded at Irrawang Swamp 17 Feb and there was a mixed flock with *T. molucca* of 1000+ birds there 29 Jul (both MAM). 1000+ birds were at TWC 27 Feb and Woodberry 28 Feb (MCR), and 500+ birds at TWC 19 Mar (MCR). Groups of 100-300 birds were moderately often recorded at wetlands and paddocks in the lower Hunter all year.

Royal Spoonbill Platalea regia

ID No: 181 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the E of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at Irrawang Swamp 2 Jan and Robinson Rd Swamp Raymond Terrace 9 Jan (both MAM), Ash Island 18 Feb (BRG/LIN), TWC 27 Feb and Woodberry 28 Feb (both MCR), also at Morpeth STP Nov-Dec (Table 1) and at Hunter estuary locations over Jan-Mar (Table 3).

Yellow-billed Spoonbill Platalea flavipes

ID No: 182 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Bird of passage. Moderately often recorded throughout the Region as counts of 1-3 birds.

Notable records: There was a congregation occurred in the Raymond Terrace area in late Aug, with nine birds recorded at Irrawang Swamp 13 Aug and eight birds there 29 Aug (MAM) and seven birds at Newline Rd 19 Aug (MCR). Five birds were at Woodberry 6 Nov (MCR) and four birds at PNR 20 Jan (OCG) and TWC 27 Feb (MCR).

Black-necked Stork Ephippiorhynchus asiaticus

ID No: 183 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Bird of passage.

Pairs were recorded at Leneghans Flat 21 Feb (VEE), Harrington 23 Apr (per MOA) and Nabiac 3 Jun (MVBW). Single birds were at Nelsons Plains 29 Feb (NEM), Leneghans Flat 5 Mar (MOA), Coolongolook 20 May (MVBW), Old Bar 3 Jun (MVBW), Harrington 2 Jul (MVBW) and Williamtown 14 Jul (per CLG), and at PNR 20 Jan, 3 May and 27 Jun (OCG, FOC, HAP). Nil breeding records were received for the Region (CLG).

Osprev Pandion haliaetus

ID No: 241 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded at estuaries and coastal lakes, more frequently in the NE part of the Region, and mostly as counts of 1-2 birds unless with young/juveniles.

Notable records: Single birds were recorded at Ash Island 21 Mar (HBOC), Stockton Sandspit 13 Nov (HAP) and Swansea 7 Dec (HBOC), and two birds were Dudley 10 Nov (CLT). Birds had nests with young at Smiths Beach Manning Point 24 Jan and Tuncurry 17 Jul (both MVBW).

Pacific Baza Aviceda subcristata

ID No: 234 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident. Occasionally recorded as 1-2 birds in the E and central parts of the Region.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Black-shouldered Kite Elanus axillaris

ID No: 232 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of 1-2 birds.

Notable records: Six birds were recorded at Wingen over 15-20 Oct (NEG) and also six birds at Jones Reserve Rd 4 Feb (BRG/MCR). Four birds were at Tenambit 19 Aug and Bureen 28 Aug (MCR, TAH). An adult was feeding a fledged young at Stockton Sandspit 9 Jul (CLT).

Square-tailed Kite Lophoictinia isura

ID No: 230 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

Single birds were sometimes present in the East Maitland/Bolwarra/Woodberry area over Mar-Sep (several reports) and two birds were at Bolwarra 6 Jun (TAH). Single birds were also recorded at Cundletown 20 & 29 Mar (FOC, MVBW), Grahamstown 20 Jul (BEC), Newcastle Uni 4 Aug (TAH), Shortland 9 Nov (TAH) and Coopernook SF 21 Nov (CBOC), and two birds were at Shortland 10 May (BWA). The bird at Cundletown 29 Mar was a juvenile.

Black Kite Milvus migrans

ID No: 229 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Uncommon visitor to W of the Region, elsewhere rare.

Single birds were recorded at Tarro 13 Mar (MCR), Minmi 6 Jul (BRG/LIN) and Old Bar 3 Jun (MVBW). A more normal year after the notable influx of 2002 and 2003.

Whistling Kite Haliastur sphenurus

ID No: 228 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded, mostly as counts of 1-2 birds.

Notable records: Four birds were recorded at Hunter estuary 17 Apr (HWS) and three birds at Morpeth STP 19 Feb (LIA), TWC 27 Feb (MCR), Swan Bay/Worimi NR 5 Jun (HAS) and Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR). There were a number of breeding records in Jun-Jul, and also birds had a nest with young at Worimi NR 18 Sep (HAS).

Brahminy Kite Haliastur indus

ID No: 227 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Resident (in coastal north of Region), elsewhere accidental.

Three birds were recorded at Tuncurry 27 Apr (MVBW) and 1-2 birds at Manning River near Taree 1 Apr and 17 Dec (MVBW, STA), Mudbishops Point 7 Nov (HAP), Harrington 20 Nov and 18 Dec (HBOC, STA) and at Hunter estuary locations 21 Nov and 14-15 Dec (HAP, TOM).

White-bellied Sea-Eagle Haliaeetus leucogaster

ID No: 226 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded at or near large waters, mostly as single birds or pairs and occasionally also with a juvenile.

Notable records: Four birds were recorded in the Hunter estuary 11 Dec (HWS) and three birds at Saltwater 5 Feb (MVBW) and Ash Island 21 Mar (HBOC).

Spotted Harrier Circus assimilis

ID No: 218 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Uncommon resident.

Two birds were present at Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR) and single birds at Balickera Apr (MUJ), Yarrawa 28 Aug (TAH) and KI 19 Nov (MCR).

Swamp Harrier Circus approximans

ID No: 219 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded at or near medium to large waters in the E of the Region, mostly as single birds.

Notable records: A total of four birds were recorded at Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR) and three birds around the Hunter estuary 11 Dec (HWS). Two birds were moderately often recorded as utilising the same area, at widespread locations in the E of the Region throughout the year.

Brown Goshawk Accipiter fasciatus

ID No: 221 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded, mostly as single birds.

Notable records: Two birds were recorded at Whitebridge 30 May (CLT), HRBG 5 Jun (MCR) and Laguna 19 Sep (HBOC).

Grey Goshawk Accipiter novaehollandiae

ID No: 220 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the E of the Region, mostly as single, grey phase birds.

Notable records: Two birds were recorded near Jerrys Plains 25 Apr (TAH) and at Newcastle Uni 27 Jul (CLT), TWC 10 Oct (MCR) and Ash Island 5 Dec (CBOC).

Collared Sparrowhawk Accipiter cirrhocephalus

ID No: 222 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

Single birds were recorded at Bulga 16 May (ALP), Gloucester May (DBP), Mandalong 1 May (FOC), TWC 22 Jun (MCR), Anvil Hill (G6) 26 Jun (HBA), HRBG 14 Jul (MCR), Wingen 11 Sep (NEG), Ellalong 20 Nov (MOA) and occasionally at TWC over Aug-Oct (BAW). 1-2 birds were moderately often present at Bucketty over Sep-Dec (HAJ).

Wedge-tailed Eagle Aquila audax

ID No: 224 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region, mostly as 1-2 birds.

Notable records: Nine birds were recorded at Mount Arthur 12 Apr (NEG) and 8+ birds at Gloucester 7 Apr (DUP). Six birds were present along Jones Reserve Rd 4 Feb (BRG/MCR) and four birds were together near Belltrees 3 Apr (TAH). Three birds were at Carmichaels Creek 27 Jan (MAM), Wambo Rd Bulga 16 May (ALP) and Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR). There were several coastal and near-coastal records.

Little Eagle Hieraaetus morphnoides

ID No: 225 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

Single birds were often recorded from widespread locations around the Region, although the only record from the NE was of a bird at Tea Gardens 28 Sep (MAM). Two birds were at Jones Reserve Rd 4 Feb (BRG/MCR) and at Denman 11 Sep (MCR). As for 2003, there were more reports than usual for this species.

Brown Falcon Falco berigora

ID No: 239 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Moderately often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region, as counts of 1-2 birds, and less frequently in the E of the Region.

Notable records: Four birds were recorded at Mount Arthur 12 Apr (NEG), and three birds at Martindale 4 Feb and 25 Apr (BRG/MCR, TAH).

Australian Hobby Falco longipennis

ID No: 235 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded, usually as single birds.

Notable records: Three birds were recorded at Medhurst Bridge Martindale Aug 21 (MCR/BRG). A pair was displaying at WWW 18 Jan (HBOC).

Black Falcon Falco subniger

ID No: 238 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Rare.

Three birds were recorded at Morpeth STP 12 May and 22 Jul (NEM, LIA) and single birds there 22 Jun and 19 Aug (NEM, MCR). 1-2 birds were recorded at Ash Island 14 Feb, 20 Mar, 11 & 14 Oct, Nov and 20 Dec (several reports). Single birds were recorded at Woodville 27 Feb and 4 Dec (NEM), Bureen 10 & 25 Apr (TAH), Yarrawa 10 Apr (TAH), and Gilliston Heights (near Kurri Kurri) 18 Dec (NEM).

Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus

ID No: 237 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Occasionally but widely recorded, mostly as single birds and occasionally as pairs.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Nankeen Kestrel Falco cenchroides

ID No: 240 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Widely and frequently recorded, usually as single birds or pairs.

Notable records: Eight birds were recorded at Mount Arthur 12 Apr (NEG), seven birds at Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR) and five birds at Martindale 24 Jan (TAH). Three birds were at Newline Rd 19 Aug (MCR) and Wingen 11 Sep (NEG). Birds had dependent young at Tenambit 19 Nov (MCR) and also were breeding at Warabrook Sep (MCR).

Buff-banded Rail Gallirallus philippensis

ID No: 046 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

Two birds were present at Johns River 19 Jun (MVBW). Single birds were regularly recorded at TWC (BAW), and also at Wang Wauk 20 Mar (MVBW), WWW 4 May (HBOC), Tenambit 29 Aug (BRG), Ash Island 11 & 21 Nov (TOM, HAP), East Seaham 16 Nov (MAM) and PNR 5 Dec (HBOC). An adult was with six dependent young at Belmont South 14 Jan (CJB).

Lewin's Rail Rallus pectoralis

ID No: 045 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Resident (probably overlooked).

Single birds were recorded at Ash Island 24 Jan (HAP), WWW 25 & 26 Jan (LIN/BRG, LIA) and Harrington 21 Nov (HBOC).

Baillon's Crake Porzana pusilla

ID No: 050 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records

Status: Resident (probably overlooked).

Single birds were recorded at NWR 27 Feb (MCR), TWC May and 22 Jun (BAW, MCR), WWW 4 May (HBOC) and Tenambit 29 Aug & 18 Sep (BRG).

Australian Spotted Crake Porzana fluminea

ID No: 049 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records

Status: Resident (probably overlooked).

A single bird was recorded at NWR 27 Feb (MCR).

Spotless Crake Porzana tabuensis

ID No: 051 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident (probably overlooked).

Single birds were recorded at WWW 25 Jan (LIN/BRG) and Croudace Bay 8 May (GOC), and two birds at Dairy Swamp Gloucester 11 Jun (DBP).

Purple Swamphen Porphyrio porphyrio

ID No: 058 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded at medium to large waters, in counts of up to 20 birds at medium waters and up to 50 birds at large waters.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at TWC several times during Feb and again there 22 Jun, 13 Jul and 24 Nov, and 50+ birds were there several other times (many reports). 50+ birds were also at Market Swamp 5 Jan (MCR) and Ellalong Lagoon 22 Aug (HBOC). There were numerous breeding records spanning the entire year.

Dusky Moorhen Gallinula tenebrosa

ID No: 056 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded, in counts of up to 20 birds at small to medium waters and up to 50 birds at medium to large waters.

Notable records: 100+ birds were at TWC 24 Nov (MCR) and 50+ birds often were there (many reports). There were breeding records for Jan-Mar, Jun-Jul and Oct-Dec - mainly from the Shortland area.

Black-tailed Native-hen Gallinula ventralis

ID No: 055 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Not recorded

Status: Accidental (recorded 2000-2002).

No reports received for 2004.

Eurasian Coot Fulica atra

ID No: 059 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Widely and often recorded at medium to large waters as counts of up to 50 birds.

Notable records: Many hundreds of birds were recorded at GTD over May-Sep, with the peak count being of 380 birds 10 Sep (MAM). 50+ birds often were at TWC and 100+ birds there 5 Jan, 12 Feb and 24 Nov (MCR, others). 100+ birds also were at Mount Arthur 12 Apr (NEG). There were breeding records for every month except Jul-Aug - mainly from the Shortland area.

Red-backed Button-quail Turnix maculosa

ID No: 013 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1999).

No reports received for 2004.

Little Button-quail *Turnix velox*

ID No: 018 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1996).

A single bird was recorded at Barrington House 11 Jan (HAP).

Painted Button-quail Turnix varia

ID No: 014 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

1-2 birds were recorded at Quorrobolong 20 Nov (MOA) and on three occasions at Green Wattle Creek over Oct-Dec (NEM).

Latham's Snipe Gallinago hardwickii

ID No: 168 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Usual summer migrant. Often recorded as counts of up to 5 birds at medium to large wetlands in the E of the Region, from Jan to mid-Mar and from late Aug onwards (text modified: counts of >5 birds are now considered to be notable).

Notable records: 103 birds were recorded in a survey of major lower Hunter wetlands 4-5 Decthe main locations had 36 birds at PNR, 35 birds at Irrawang Swamp and 30 birds at Market Swamp/NWR (HBOC). Shortly afterwards though, 45 birds were recorded in just one part of PNR 10 Dec (BIA). Counts at Irrawang swamp often were much greater over Oct-Dec peaking at 73 birds there 10 Nov (LIA/MAM). Six birds were at WWW 17 Nov (SMJ) and nine birds at TWC 15 Nov (WCR). The latest record was of a single bird at Woodville 11 Apr (NEM).

Black-tailed Godwit Limosa limosa

ID No: 152 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Summer migrant.

Birds were present all year in the Hunter estuary with the peak count being of 319 birds 6 Mar. In the regular surveys of high tide roosting sites (see Table 4) the largest winter count was 11 birds, however greater numbers were frequently recorded at foraging sites in Fullerton Cove and behind the KI dykes, and the winter peak was 40 birds in Fullerton Cove 30 Jun (RIA). Also, ~100 birds were at Stockton Sandspit 6 Aug (CLT): these perhaps were on migration passage as numbers were much less in the following two months. Elsewhere, 51 birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC) - such numbers are uncommon for this location.

Hudsonian Godwit Limosa haemastica

ID No: 815 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1983, 1984 and 1988).

No reports received for 2004.

Bar-tailed Godwit Limosa Iapponica

ID No: 153 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Common summer migrant. Moderately often recorded at coastal/estuarine mudflats over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec, in counts of up to 20 birds, and with many young birds remaining over winter.

Notable records: In the regular surveys of high tide roosting sites, 1,100-1,200+ birds were recorded in the Hunter estuary most summer months (see Table 4). Winter counts at the roosting sites varied and sometimes were of <140 birds; however 170-200 birds were frequently recorded foraging in Fullerton Cove over Jun-Jul, and the winter peak was 207 birds there 29 Jun (RIA). At Worimi NR the peak count was 55 birds - this is much lower than for recent years, however, 888 birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC) and the lower Worimi counts may reflect some localised effect. Elsewhere, 97 birds were at Mudbishops Point 17 Dec (STA) and 50+ birds there 6 Feb (MCR), and 20+ birds at Swansea Channel 27 Jan (LAK).

Little Curlew Numenius minutus

ID No: 151 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental.

No confirmed reports received since 2001.

Whimbrel Numenius phaeopus

ID No: 150 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Usual summer migrant. Occasionally recorded at coastal/estuarine mudflats during Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Birds were recorded every time in monthly surveys of the Hunter estuary, with the peak summer count being of 110 birds 6 Mar. Unusually, the winter numbers peaked at 53 birds 5 Jun - these are the largest known winter counts for the estuary, the previous highest count being of 37 birds over-wintering in 1986. Elsewhere, 218 birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC) - this represents ~2% of the Australian migrating population, a significant record. Also, 16 birds were at Worimi NR 8 Mar and 10 birds there 11 Dec (Table 6).

Eastern Curlew Numenius madagascariensis

ID No: 149 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Common summer migrant. Moderately often recorded at coastal/estuarine mudflats – as counts of up to 20 birds during Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec, and as counts of 1-5 birds during May-Aug.

Notable records: Birds were recorded every month in the Hunter estuary in surveys of high tide roosting sites (see Table 4) with the peak count being 520 birds Dec 11 (HWS). This represents a further decline from the low peak count recorded in 2003. The largest winter estuary count was of 108 birds. 200-300+ birds were usually recorded in summer months at Worimi NR, however, 649 birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC) - this represents around 1.7% of the total world population and Port Stephens continues to be an internationally significant location for this species. The only notable records from elsewhere were of 50+ birds at Mudbishops Point 6 Feb (BRG/MCR) and 20+ birds there 21 Dec (LIN) and at Pindimar Bay 17 Dec (STA).

Marsh Sandpiper Tringa stagnatilis

ID No: 159 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Usual summer migrant.

The peak count for the Hunter estuary during the regular high tide surveys was of 120 birds present 16 Oct (Table 4), however, 140 birds were there 10 Jan (HWS). No birds over-wintered. The only records from outside the Hunter estuary were of two birds at Morpeth STP 10 Sep and three birds at Tarro 23 Oct (HBOC).

Common Greenshank Tringa nebularia

ID No: 158 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Usual summer migrant.

The peak counts for the Hunter estuary were of 251 birds present 7 Feb (Table 4) and 261 birds 15 Dec (TOM). In the regular surveys of high tide roosting sites (see Table 4) the largest winter count was 15 birds, however greater numbers were frequently recorded at foraging sites in Fullerton Cove and behind the KI dykes, and the winter peak was 31 birds in Fullerton Cove 30 Jun (RIA). The only record from elsewhere was of two birds at Morpeth STP 5 Dec (NEM).

Lesser Yellowlegs Tringa flavipes

ID No: 809 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental *(recorded 2001).* No reports received for 2004.

Wood Sandpiper Tringa glareola

ID No: 154 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Rare summer migrant.

Terek Sandpiper Xenus cinereus

ID No: 160 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Summer migrant.

In the regular surveys of the Hunter estuary, the peak count was of 38 birds 11 Dec, but no birds were recorded Jan-Oct. However, 50 birds were present near Fern Bay 4 Feb (CBOC) and 30+ birds there 6 Mar (CLT); there were also several reports of up to 20 birds. Similarly, there were records of 17-19+ birds at Fern Bay during Oct-Nov (CLT). Perhaps there is now a second, as yet unlocated, high tide roost site for this species and it is noted that the late 2003 counts also were often of nil birds. Elsewhere, six birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC).

Common Sandpiper Actitis hypoleucos

ID No: 157 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

Three birds were recorded in the Hunter estuary 6 Mar (Table 4) and 1-2 birds frequently there over Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec (several reports). The only record from elsewhere was of a single bird in all of Port Stephens 8 Feb during a systematic survey (HBOC).

Grey-tailed Tattler Heteroscelus brevipes

ID No: 155 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Summer migrant. Occasionally recorded at coastal/estuarine mudflats during Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec, as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: 75+ birds were recorded around Pindimar Bay Port Stephens 17 Dec (STA) and 44 birds in a water-based survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC). The Port Stephens records are the highest numbers for that area since 1979/80 but they also are the most systematic surveys of the area since that time. The peak count for the Hunter estuary was 37 birds 11 Dec (Table 4). In the monthly surveys of the estuary, no birds were recorded Feb-Mar but 27 birds were at Fern Bay 21 Mar (HBOC) and up to 15 birds at other times over that period. As with the results for Terek Sandpiper, there perhaps now is an as yet unlocated additional high tide roost site for this species. Birds did not utilise Worimi NR in the summer months but up to 16 birds were present there over Jun-Sep (Table 6).

Wandering Tattler Heteroscelus incanus

ID No: 156 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1999).

No reports received for 2004.

Ruddy Turnstone Arenaria interpres

ID No: 129 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

Eight birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC) and also eight birds behind Nobbys Beach 6 Mar (MOA). Six birds were at Newcastle Baths 3 Apr (FIT) and a single bird there 29 Aug (BRG/LIN). 1-3 birds often were roosting on KI dykes over Sep-Dec (Table 4, TOM) and a single bird was at Mudbishops Point 17 Dec (STA). The numbers roosting at Newcastle Baths were down compared to recent years.

Asian Dowitcher Limnodromus semipalmatus

ID No: 939 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1985).

Great Knot Calidris tenuirostris

ID No: 165 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

The peak count for the Hunter estuary was 16 birds on 17 Jan and some birds were present all year (Table 4). Most winter counts were of 2-4 birds but eight birds were recorded at Stockton Sandspit 23 Jul and nine birds in the estuary 14 Aug (Table 4, RIA, CLT). Elsewhere, 1-5 birds were present at Mudbishops Point 6 Feb and 21 & 29 Dec (BRG/MCR, LIN, FOC) and at LTP 16 Mar (FOC).

Red Knot Calidris canutus

ID No: 164 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Summer migrant.

The peak count for the Hunter estuary was 560 birds on 16 Oct during the migration passage and up to 66 birds were present over the summer months (Table 4). In winter, 11 birds were recorded at foraging sites in Fullerton Cove 30 Jun and 2 Jul (RIA) - these were greater numbers than from the regular high tide surveys suggesting an additional roost site might exist. The only record from elsewhere was of a single bird at Harrington 21 Nov (HBOC).

Sanderling Calidris alba

ID No: 166 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Rare.

35 birds were recorded at Mudbishops Point 17 Dec (STA) and 20+ birds often were there over Nov-Dec (several reports). These are good counts for Mudbishops Point which has been a regular location in recent years. At least nine birds also were present there 6 Feb (BRG/MCR). Elsewhere, two birds were recorded along Stockton Beach 17 Oct (LCH).

Red-necked Stint Calidris ruficollis

ID No: 162 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Summer migrant.

200 birds were present at Mudbishops Point 7 Nov (HAP), 54 birds there 17 Dec (STA), 20+ birds 21 Dec (LIN) and 6+ birds 6 Feb (BRG/MCR). 20 birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC). 38+ birds were at Worimi NR 19 Jan but there was only one other record for this location - of a single over-wintering bird 17 Jul (Table 6). The peak count for the Hunter estuary was 93 birds 7 Feb (Table 4); also 75 birds were present 10 Jan and 60 birds 11 Dec (HWS). Unusually for recent years, some birds over-wintered in the Hunter estuary, with 13 birds regularly recorded at foraging sites in Fullerton Cove over Jun-Jul (RIA). These were greater numbers than from the regular high tide surveys suggesting an additional roost site might exist. This is supported by records of up to seven birds feeding around Stockton Sandspit in Sep (CLT) and four birds at Ash Island 19 Aug (MCR) whereas no birds were recorded in the high tide survey for either month.

Long-toed Stint Calidris subminuta

ID No: 965 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (amended) (recorded 2003).

No reports were received for 2004. The 2003 record was accepted by the NSW Ornithological Records Appraisal Committee.

Pectoral Sandpiper Calidris melanotos

ID No: 978 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Rare.

Sharp-tailed Sandpiper Calidris acuminata

ID No: 163 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Usual summer migrant. Moderately often recorded at shallow or drying wetlands near to the coast over Jan-Apr and Oct-Dec, mostly as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 1,500+ birds were recorded at Hexham Swamp 23 Oct (CBOC). In the monthly high tide surveys of the Hunter estuary, the peak count was 562 birds 7 Feb (Table 4) but ~600 birds were present 14 Jan (CLT). 300+ birds were at Morpeth STP 5 Dec (NEM) and several hundred birds were present there over Nov-Dec (Table 5). 60+ birds were at Ellalong 20 Nov (MOA) and 41 birds at Cemetery Swamp Singleton 31 Dec (STA). There was one winter record - of a single bird at Ash Island 1 Aug (HAP).

Curlew Sandpiper Calidris ferruginea

ID No: 161 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Common summer migrant.

The peak count for the Hunter estuary was 420 birds 16 Oct (Table 4). Although birds were not recorded in winter at the high tide roosting sites, there were several records of two birds at foraging sites in Fullerton Cove in late June and early July (RIA). The only records from outside the Hunter estuary were of single birds at Mudbishops Point 17 & 21 Dec (STA, LIN).

Cox's Sandpiper Calidris paramelanotos

ID No: HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1988).

No reports received for 2004.

Buff-breasted Sandpiper Tryngites subruficollis

ID No: 887 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1979).

A single bird was first recorded on Ash Island 13 Feb (WAB/LIA) and thereafter by many observers until 18 Feb after which the bird was not found again. The report was accepted by BARC as only the 7th confirmed Australian record for this species.

Broad-billed Sandpiper Limicola falcinellus

ID No: 167 HBOC Category: 2 (Revised) Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1994, 1995 and 2003).

1-4 birds were often recorded at or near Stockton Sandspit over Jan-early April and then a single bird there again from mid-Nov onwards (many reports). A single bird was at Ash Island 9 Jan (CBOC) and two birds there 29 Feb (NEM). Remarkably, there also were several records of two birds at foraging sites in Fullerton Cove in late June and early July (RIA). *This is the first known winter record since 1983*.

Ruff Philomachus pugnax

ID No: 934 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1995, 1996, 1998, 2001).

A male bird in full breeding plumage was recorded at Stockton Sandspit 10 Oct (G Richards per MOA), and then later that day at Ash Island (MCN). Also, a single bird in non-breeding plumage was present at Cemetery Swamp Singleton 31 Dec (STA).

Painted Snipe Rostratula benghalensis

ID No: 170 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Past records

Status: Rare (probably overlooked).

A pair was first recorded near a flooded paddock on Ash Island 10 Nov (MCN) and then frequently in the same vicinity for the remainder of the year (many reports). They were observed copulating there 10 Dec (BIA).

Comb-crested Jacana Irediparra gallinacea

ID No: 171 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Past records (Revised)

Status: Resident, more usual in N of Region.

Single birds were recorded near Laguna 27 Mar (FOC) and at Ryhope crematorium Maitland 3 May (MCR), and a number of times at Leneghans Flat from late Oct to early Dec (several reports). No birds were found at John Browns Lagoon 13 Jun (VEE) - previously this was a regular location and with birds breeding there.

Bush Stone-curlew Burhinus grallarius

ID No: 174 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

Birds nested at LTP from late Sep, successfully raising two chicks which were banded 3 Dec (MOA). Another pair was reported to be nesting at Salt Ash Oct (per FRN). 1-2 birds were sometimes recorded at a property near Pindimar (per ECR). Two birds were heard at Warners Bay 13 Nov (CHB).

Beach Stone-curlew Esacus neglectus

ID No: 175 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

Two birds were at Mudbishops Point/Farquhar Inlet sometimes in Feb (BRG/MCR, MVBW) and on 16 Mar (CBOC) and 21 Dec (LIN), and a single bird at Harrington 2 Jul (MVBW).

Pied Oystercatcher Haematopus longirostris

ID No: 130 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

112 birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC). This represents 1% of the estimated total population of this species thus making Port Stephens a significant national location. Up to 16 birds were regularly present in the Hunter estuary all year, mainly at Stockton Sandspit (many reports), and 10-13 birds were at Mudbishops Point 6 Feb (BRG/MCR), Pindimar Bay 17 Dec and Harrington 18 Dec (both STA). Eight birds were at Worimi NR 18 Sep and six birds at Swansea Channel 7 Apr (CLT). 1-5 birds were at Worimi NR several times (Table 6, AIM) and at Swansea Channel 27 Jan (LAK), Manning Point 23 Apr (per MOA), Tuncurry 17 Jul (MVBW), Seven Mile Beach BBNP 21 Aug (MVBW), Nine Mile Beach 16-17 Oct (ADJ) and Mudbishops Point 17 Dec (STA). Breeding: Pairs with very young birds were present at KI dykes 4 Feb, 16 Mar, 8 Apr and 15 Sep (LIA) - the detail of the reports indicate this to have been three separate breeding events. Two pairs were found nesting in a survey along Stockton beach 16-17 Oct (HLC).

Sooty Oystercatcher Haematopus fuliginosus

ID No: 131 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

21 birds were at Newcastle Baths 10 Feb and 3 Apr (BRG, FIT), and 18 birds there later in Apr (POJ); also 13 birds were near Nobbys Beach Newcastle 6 Mar (MOA). 18 birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC) Seven birds were at Merewether Baths 4 Apr (HAA) and six birds at Smiths Beach Manning Point 24 Jan (MVBW), while 1-5 birds were often recorded at Hunter estuary locations (several reports) and also at Tuncurry 1 Mar (MVBW) and Manning Point 23 Apr (per MOA).

Black-winged Stilt Himantopus himantopus

ID No: 146 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded at medium to large waters in the E of the Region as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: 743 birds were recorded at Woodberry 6 Nov (MCR). The peak count for the Hunter estuary was 546 birds 11 Dec and many hundreds of birds were present there most of the year (Table 4, other reports). Numbers rose at Morpeth STP in the second half of the year peaking at 504 birds 11 Nov (Table 5). 100 birds were at Hexham Swamp 12 Nov (NEM) and 21-50 birds at TWC 5 Jan (MCR), Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR), Tenambit 19 Nov (MCR) and Irrawang Swamp 5 Dec (MAM). Four birds were on nests at Ash Island during Nov (MCR) and two pairs nested at Stockton Sandspit in Oct but later abandoned the nests (CLT).

Banded Stilt Cladorhynchus leucocephalus

ID No: 147 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 1995/6, 2000, 2001).

An immature bird was first recorded at Stockton Sandspit Nov 20 (HAP) and then regularly there until early Dec (several reports).

Red-necked Avocet Recurvirostra novaehollandiae

ID No: 148 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Bird of passage.

The peak count for the Hunter estuary was 4,503 birds 18 Sep (Table 4). From mid-Jan, birds had begun to depart the estuary and very few remained over Feb-Apr. In May they started to return, and many thousands were then in the estuary from June onwards (Table 4). The only records from elsewhere were of 30 birds at Morpeth STP 5 Dec (NEM) and three birds at both Woodberry 23 Oct (CBOC) and Morpeth STP 24 Dec (Table 5).

Pacific Golden Plover Pluvialis fulva

ID No: 8006 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Summer migrant.

The peak count for the Hunter estuary was 206 birds, which were roosting at KI dykes 18 Nov (SPJ); also, 99 birds were present in the estuary 11 Dec (Table 4). Very few birds were found in the 7 Feb survey but 37 birds were at Ash Island 18 Feb (BRG/LIN). 113 birds were at Mudbishops Point 17 Dec (STA), and 65+ birds there 21 Dec (LIN), 50 birds 7 Nov (HAP) and 20+ birds 6 Feb (BRG/MCR). Elsewhere, two birds were at Oyster Cove 20 May (MCN).

Grev Plover Pluvialis squatarola

ID No: 136 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Rare (recorded 2001, 2002, 2003). (Revised from: Accidental)

Three birds were recorded at KI dykes 18 Nov (SPJ per LIA) and single birds often at Stockton Sandspit from mid-Nov onwards (several reports).

Kentish Plover Charadrius alexandrinus

ID No: 770 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Accidental (recorded 2002).

There were no reports received for 2004.

Red-capped Plover Charadrius ruficapillus

ID No: 143 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded along the coast, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 50+ birds were regularly recorded at Fullerton Cove over Jun-Jul, with the peak count being 64 birds 29 Jun (RIA). 51 birds were also in the Hunter estuary 17 Jan and 35+ birds several other times (Table 4). 18 birds were at Mudbishops Point 17 Dec (STA) and 6+ birds there 6 Feb and 21 Dec (BRG/MCR, LIN). **Breeding:** There were at least 10 nesting events at Stockton Sandspit over Aug-Dec, involving several pairs and with many clutches successfully hatched (CLT). Also, a bird was on nest at Ash Island 18 Feb (BRG/LIN) and a runner was at Mudbishops Point 17 Dec (STA).

Double-banded Plover Charadrius bicinctus

ID No: 140 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Winter migrant.

180 birds were recorded in Fullerton Cove on both 2 & 5 Jun, and 80-100 birds often in the remainder of the month and in early Jul (RIA), and there were occasional sightings of <5 birds at other estuary locations around that time. 28 birds were at Worimi NR 8 May and 10-15 birds were regularly there over Apr-Jul (Table 6). 12 birds were present at Wallis Lake 14 Apr (MVBW). Early records were of single birds at Ash Island 14 & 28 Feb (VEE, LIA, OCG) and eight birds there 21 Feb (VEE), and three birds at Mudbishops Point 9 Feb (MCR). Also, three birds were at Worimi NR 8 Mar (Table 6). From mid March, records were frequent at Worimi NR, through until mid August. The Fullerton Cove records represent by far the largest known counts for the Hunter estuary since the 1970s.

Lesser Sand Plover Charadrius mongolus

ID No: 139 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: No

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

Five birds were recorded in a survey of all of Port Stephens 8 Feb (HBOC) and then seven birds at Worimi NR in Port Stephens on 8 Mar (Table 6). There was also an uncommon winter record of five birds at Worimi NR 17 Jul. Three birds were at Stockton Sandspit 17 Jan (Table 4) and two birds at Worimi NR 16 Apr and Mudbishops Point 17 Dec (HAS, STA). Single birds were often recorded at Stockton Sandspit over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec (many reports).

Greater Sand Plover Charadrius leschenaultii

Black-fronted Dotterel Elseyornis melanops

Notable records: 48 birds were in the Hunter estuary 17 Jul and 33 birds 17 Apr (Table 4). Most of the birds were at Ash Island, from where there were occasional other records of 6+ birds. 28 birds were at Mount Arthur 25 Jul (NEG) and 20+ birds at Morpeth STP 12 May and 12 Jul (Table 5). 6+ birds were recorded at TWC 12 Feb and 20 Jun (MCR, HBOC). Birds were nesting at TWC 5 Jan and Ash Island 1 Dec (MCR, MCN).

A bird at Tenambit 19 Aug was inspecting hollows.

Little Corella Cacatua sanguinea

Status: Resident.

Flocks of ~200 birds were recorded at Birmingham Gardens 11 May (MCR) and occasionally at New Lambton (STA). 50+ birds were at NWR 6 Apr (HBOC) and SSNR 19 Aug (MCR) and 20+ birds at Cessnock 13 Oct (BAV) and Wingen 15-20 Oct (NEG). Groups of up to 20 birds were widely and often recorded in the Region all year.

Sulphur-crested Cockatoo Cacatua galerita

Notable records: 300+ birds were recorded at Appletree Flat 23-26 Apr (HBOC) and 50+ birds at East Seaham 29 Aug (MAM) and Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC). 21-50 birds were at Jones Reserve Rd 4 Feb (BRG/MCR), Mount Arthur 12 Apr (NEG) and Wingen 9 May and 15-20 Oct (NEG).

Cockatiel Nymphicus hollandicus

ID No: 274 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Uncertain.

See Escapees.

Rainbow Lorikeet Trichoglossus haematodus

ID No: 254 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the E of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 21-50 birds were recorded at Tomaree NP (P9) 20 Mar (HBA), Worimi NR 8 May and 5 Jun (HAS), Woods Point Morisset 23 May (HBOC), Blackalls Park Reserve 20 Aug (OCG) and Swansea 7 Dec (HBOC). Birds had nests with eggs & young in the Mandalong area 2 Mar (HBOC) and were nesting at Mambo Swamp near Salamander Bay mid Sep (LIG).

Scaly-breasted Lorikeet Trichoglossus chlorolepidotus

ID No: 256 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded near to the coast, mostly as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at Wangi Point Reserve 1 Jun (HBOC).

Musk Lorikeet Glossopsitta concinna

ID No: 258 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes (Revised)

Status: Bird of passage.

6-10 birds were recorded at East Seaham 1 Aug (CAR), Blackalls Park Reserve 20 Aug and 3 Sep (OCG, LIN) and Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC). 1-5 birds were often at Blackalls Park Reserve over Aug-Oct (many reports) and also 1-5 birds were present at Moonan Flat 14 Jan (TAH), Toronto 25 Feb and 3 Dec (TOM, CJB), Buttaba 6 & 9 Feb (CHG), Appletree Flat 23-26 Apr (HBOC), Wingen 9 May and 15-20 Oct (NEG), Galgabba Point 31 May (MOA), White Box Camp 11-14 Jun (HBOC) and Rankin Park Aug (STJ). **Breeding:** A pair nested at Blackalls Park 3 Aug to 5 Oct but the fate of any young is uncertain. A second pair was found nesting there early Nov and regularly monitored until seen feeding a fledged young on 11 Dec (GOA). This is the first confirmed breeding record for the Region for a very long time. However, it is to be noted that the first breeding record for the Hunter Region was made by John Gould on 24 Oct 1839 - the two eggs he collected are in the British Museum (information per COD).

Little Lorikeet Glossopsitta pusilla

Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded, mostly as counts of <10 birds but with greater numbers being not uncommon.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at Woods Point Morisset 23 May (HBOC) and 20 birds near Moonan Flat 3 Apr (TAH). Two birds were at The Hill Newcastle 12 Jan (HAP) - an unusual urban location.

Australian King-Parrot Alisterus scapularis

Status: Usual resident. Widely and frequently recorded in the E and central parts of the Region, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Gloucester Tops 30 Jan (BRG/MCR). Birds had some dependent young there and also at Wingen late in the year (NEG). A bird was inspecting a hollow at Glen Oak 28 Nov (MAM).

Red-winged Parrot Aprosmictus erythropterus

Status: Accidental.

No reports received since 1999.

Crimson Rosella Platycercus elegans

ID No: 282 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded in the central and E parts of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at Gloucester Tops 30 Jan (BRG/MCR) and 20+ birds at Warakeila 31 Jan (NEM) and Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC). A pair had a nest with young at the latter location.

Eastern Rosella Platycercus eximius

ID No: 288 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at Green Wattle Creek 7 Jan (NEM), WWW 18 Jan (HBOC), Hunter estuary 17 Apr (HWS) and Woodville 3 Jul (BRG). There were many breeding records spanning Jan and Sep-Dec.

Swift Parrot Lathamus discolor

14 birds were recorded at Blackalls Park Reserve 20 Aug (OCG), nine birds at Woods Point Morisset 23 May (HBOC) and 8+ birds at Belmont Swamp (flying over) 12 Apr (LAK). Three birds were present near Quorrobolong 23 May (MOA) and a single bird at Morisset 23 May (RIA).

Red-rumped Parrot Psephotus haematonotus

Turquoise Parrot Neophema pulchella

Single birds were recorded at TWC 5 Jan (MCR), Bulga 2 Feb (MCR/BRG), Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC), Yarrawa 2 Oct, Denman 2 Oct (both TAH), Ash Island 2 Nov (HBOC), Bolwarra 7 Nov (TAH), Harrington 21 Nov (HBOC), Glenrock SRA 30 Nov (MCR), PNR 5 Dec (HBOC) and Tenambit 5 Dec (BRG).

Brush Cuckoo Cacomantis variolosus

ID No: 339 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Summer migrant.

1-2 birds were moderately often recorded until late Feb and then again from early Oct. 3+ birds were at Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC).

Fan-tailed Cuckoo Cacomantis flabelliformis

ID No: 338 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded, mainly as <5 birds.

Notable records: Six birds were at TWC 13 Jul (MCR). A young bird was being fed by Brown Thornbill at Fig Tree Crowdy Bay NP 21 Nov (HBOC).

Black-eared Cuckoo Chrysococcyx osculans

Status: Accidental (recorded 1994, 1995, 1998, 2000-2003).

Single birds were heard at Yarrawa 25 Sep (TAH) and seen at Pine Grove Rd (H8) 31 Oct (HTH).

Horsfield's Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx basalis

ID No: 342 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Summer migrant, some birds are present all year.

Single birds were occasionally but widely recorded, with no reports after 27 Feb, when a bird was heard at NWR (MCR), until 29 Sep when a bird was at WWW (TAH).

Shining Bronze-Cuckoo Chrysococcyx lucidus

Status: Usual summer migrant, some birds are present all year.

Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded in the E of the Region, usually as counts of 1-2 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Powerful Owl Ninox strenua

A pair and a juvenile were at Glenrock SRA 30 Nov (MCR). Single birds were seen or heard at Gloucester Tops 8 Jan (HAP), Rankin Park 9 Jan (HAP), Toronto 2 & 28 Feb and 3 Mar (TOM), Clarencetown 13 Feb (TOM), Carey Bay 26-27 Feb (HCL), Balickera Mar and May (MUJ), Anvil Hill (G6) 26 Jun and 11-12 Oct (BRG, MCR), Stockton sand dunes 6 Sep (MCR), and Salamander Bay mid Sep and 6 Oct (LIG, CLT). Also, a dead bird was found by the roadside at Hawks Nest turn-off 19 Jul (MOT). *An above average year*.

Barking Owl Ninox connivens

Status: Accidental.

A bird was heard at Anvil Hill (G6) 26 Jun (BRG).

Southern Boobook Ninox novaeseelandiae

Notable records: Four birds were recorded at Toronto 25 Dec and birds were with dependent young in that area 8 Dec (both TOM).

Sooty Owl Tyto tenebricosa

Masked Owl Tyto novaehollandiae

Birds were heard at Gloucester Tops 8 Jan (HAP), Appletree Flat 23-26 Apr (HBOC) and Anvil Hill (G6) 26 Jun (BRG).

Grass Owl Tyto capensis

Single birds were recorded at Crowdy Bay NP 5 Nov and 27 Dec (HAP, FOC).

Tawny Frogmouth Podargus strigoides

Status: Resident. Widely and moderately often recorded, usually as single birds or pairs.

Notable records: There were several breeding records, spanning Feb and Oct-Dec, and three birds were at Cardiff 14 Apr (WEJ).

Status: Summer migrant

Three birds (one heard) were recorded at Gloucester Tops 8 Jan (HAP) and two birds were heard in the Watagans area 9 Jan (HAP). Single birds were recorded at Watagans SF 2 Jan and Clarencetown 13 Feb (both TOM) and Balickera Mar (MUJ).

Spotted Nightjar Eurostopodus argus

Status: Accidental (recorded 1989).

No reports received for 2004.

Australian Owlet-nightjar Aegotheles cristatus

ID No: 317 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

Five birds (four heard) were present at Boarding House Dam Watagans NP 1 Feb (MCR/BRG). Single birds were recorded at Watagans SF 2 Jan (TOM), Boarding House Dam 2 Jan and 25 Sep (TOM, HBA), GRNP 9-12 Apr (QUT), Laguna 24-26 Apr (RDB), Anvil Hill (G6) 2 Oct and 11-12 Oct (HBA, MCR) and Stockyard Creek Awaba SF 26 Nov (TOM).

White-throated Needletail Hirundapus caudacutus

Status: Summer migrant. Moderately often recorded in the E and central parts of the Region over Jan-Mar and Oct-Dec as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 100 birds were recorded at Taree in mid Jan (MVBW) and 20+ birds at Wallaroo SF 3 Mar (HUF), Chatham 4 May (MVBW) and Seaham 23 Oct (AMT).

Fork-tailed Swift Apus pacificus

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

Six birds were recorded at Saltwater 5 Feb (MVBW) and a single bird at TWC 22 Apr (MCR). Some birds were also at Wingham 19 Mar (MVBW) - numbers were not noted.

Azure Kingfisher Alcedo azurea

Forest Kingfisher Todiramphus macleayii

Status: Accidental (recorded 1998, 2001, 2002).

A single bird was recorded at Brunkerville 5 Oct (MCR).

No reports received for 2004.

Sacred Kingfisher Todiramphus sanctus

Rainbow Bee-eater Merops ornatus

Status: Summer migrant. Occasionally but widely recorded over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec, mostly as counts of <10 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Dollarbird Eurystomus orientalis

Status: Summer migrant. Widely and frequently recorded over Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec, mostly as counts of 1-5 birds.

Noisy Pitta Pitta versicolor

Status: Uncommon summer migrant.

A bird was with dependent young at Main Creek (M6) 25 Jan (NEM) – *this is the first confirmed breeding record by HBOC for the Region*. A pair was at Copeland Reserve 8 Feb (DBP), and single birds at Barrington House 28 Jan (BRG/MCR), Brunkerville 22 Feb (HBOC), Main Creek 25 Feb (NEM) and Crowdy Head NP 19 May (FOC).

Superb Lyrebird Menura novaehollandiae

Rufous Scrub-bird Atrichornis rufescens

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of <10 birds and predominantly as 1-5

birds.

Notable records: Birds had a nest with young at Greta River Reserve 31 Oct (TAH) and were feeding dependent young at Wingen late in the year (NEG).

Red-browed Treecreeper Climacteris erythrops

Status: Uncommon resident.

Six birds were recorded at Kerrapit Road Gloucester Tops 19 Sep (JED) and 1-5 birds there 30 Jan and 22 May (BRG/MCR). 1-5 birds were also at various locations in Watagans 13-14 Jan (MOA), Boarding House Dam Watagans 1 Feb (MCR/BRG), Gloucester Falls 31 May (FOC), Gap Creek Watagans 31 Oct (MOA) and Pheasants Creek Rd 30 Dec (STA).

Brown Treecreeper Climacteris picumnus

HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Moderately often recorded in the W and central parts of the Region, mostly as 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 20+ birds were recorded at White Box Camp 11-14 Jun (HBOC) and 5+ birds at Anvil Hill (G6) 2 Oct (HBA).

Superb Fairy-wren Malurus cyaneus

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and often as counts of 21-50 birds.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at TWC 20 Jun (HBOC), Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR) and Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC). There were breeding records for all months except May-Aug.

Variegated Fairy-wren Malurus lamberti

Status: Usual resident. Regularly recorded in the E and central parts of the Region as counts of up to 1-5 birds and frequently as up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 50+ birds were recorded at HRBG 14 Jul (MCR) and 21-50 birds at Tank Paddock 12 Jul (MCR) and HRBG Sep 7 (HBOC). Birds had dependent young/nests with young at TWC 5 Jan, 19 Mar and 27 Oct (MCR, LIA).

Red-backed Fairy-wren Malurus melanocephalus

Status: Uncommon resident, in north of Region.

Four birds were recorded at Fosterton Loop 14 Mar (HBA) and three birds there 3 Oct (JED).

Southern Emu-wren Stipiturus malachurus

Status: Resident, locally common.

Spotted Pardalote Pardalotus punctatus

Birds were on nest at TWC 22 Jun and 13 Jul (MCR), Laguna 11-12 Sep (RDB) and Teralba 8 Nov (CLT), and were nest building at Wingen 24 Aug (NEG). There also were breeding records for TWC over Sep-Oct (BAW).

Striated Pardalote Pardalotus striatus

Yellow-throated Scrubwren Sericornis citreogularis

Weebill Smicrornis brevirostris

Brown Gerygone Mouki

Golden Whistler Pachycephala pectoralis

Notable records: Birds were with dependent young at Worimi NR 11 Dec (HAS).

Magpie-lark Grallina cyanoleuca

There were many breeding records spanning Jan-Apr and Aug-Dec.

Rufous Fantail Rhipidura rufifrons

Spangled Drongo Dicrurus bracteatus

1-2 birds were recorded at Woodville 20 Feb (NEM), Green Wattle Creek 20 Feb, 1 & 10 Apr and 11 Sep (NEM), WWW 4 May (HBOC), Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR), Quorrobolong 31 Jul (FOC), Muswellbrook 11 Sep (MCR), Yarrawa 25 Sep (TAH), Harrington 21 Dec (LIN). The bird at Green Wattle Creek 1 Apr was a dark phase bird.

Cicadabird Coracina tenuirostris

Status: Summer migrant. Moderately often recorded in the central and E parts of the Region from Jan to mid-Mar and from mid-Sep onwards, as counts of 1-2 birds.

Ground Cuckoo-shrike Coracina maxima

Status: Accidental (recorded 1993, 1994, 2000).

Two birds were recorded at Yarrawa 5 Jun (TAH).

White-winged Triller Lalage sueurii

Varied Triller Lalage leucomela

Olive-backed Oriole Oriolus sagittatus

White-breasted Woodswallow Artamus leucorynchus

Status: Common summer migrant. Frequently recorded at or near medium to large fresh waters in the E of the Region over Jan-Apr and from mid-Aug onwards as counts of up to 20 birds.

Masked Woodswallow Artamus personatus

No reports received for 2004.

White-browed Woodswallow Artamus superciliosus

Dusky Woodswallow Artamus cyanopterus

Pied Currawong Strepera graculina

Grey Currawong Strepera versicolor

Paradise Riflebird Ptiloris paradiseus

Australian Raven Corvus coronoides

There were some breeding records spanning Jan-Mar and Aug-Oct; also birds were nesting at Minmi 6 Jul and TWC 13 Jul (HBOC, MCR).

Forest Raven Corvus tasmanicus

Green Catbird Ailuroedus crassirostris

Regent Bowerbird Sericulus chrysocephalus

Satin Bowerbird Ptilonorhynchus violaceus

Plum-headed Finch Neochmia modesta

6-20 birds were at Martindale 4 Feb (BRG/MCR), Kings Gap 4 Feb and 26 Apr (MCR/BRG, LIN), White Box Camp 11-14 Jun (HBOC) and Jones Reserve Road 28 Aug (TAH). 1-5 birds were often recorded in the W of the Region, while two birds were at WWW 13 Apr (MCN) – an unusual easterly record. Birds were nest building at Kings Gap 4 Feb.

Nutmeg Mannikin Lonchura punctulata

ID No: 983 HBOC Category: 3 Regional Breeding Status: Past records

Status: Accidental (last recorded 1991)

No reports received for 2004.

Chestnut-breasted Mannikin Lonchura castaneothorax

ID No: 657 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncommon resident.

70 birds were recorded at Leneghans Flat 6 Mar (MOA) and 20+ birds there 16 Apr (BRG) and also at NWR 6 Apr (HBOC) and Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR). 6-20 birds were at Tank Paddock Minmi 26 Jan (LIA), Shortland STP 3 Feb (HBOC), Gloucester 13 Mar (FOC), WWW 26 Apr (TAH), NWR 13 Jul (MCR), Tenambit 25 Jul (BRG) and Speers Point 21 Aug (MAC). 1-5 birds were frequently present at TWC/NWR (several reports) and birds were on nests and nest building at TWC 27 Feb and 19 Mar (MCR).

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis

ID No: 996 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

14 birds were recorded at Hexham Swamp 24 Jul (HAP) and 1-5 birds there 30 Jun (MCR) and at NWR 13 Jul (MCR), KI 20 Jul (CLT), Ash Island 19 Aug and 31 Oct (MCR, BRG), East Maitland 23 Aug and 25 Sep (BRG), TWC 31 Oct and 15 Nov (BRG, MCR) and Hunter estuary 11 Dec (HWS). There also were records for NWR Apr, Jun, Sep and Nov-Dec (BAW).

Mistletoebird Dicaeum hirundinaceum

ID No: 564 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Usual resident. Widely and frequently recorded as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: Birds were with dependent young at Tank Paddock Minmi 29 Feb (LIN).

White-backed Swallow Cheramoeca leucosternus

ID No: 358 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Past records

Status: Summer migrant.

12 birds were recorded feeding together near Lees Pinch GRNP 11 Apr (QUT) and 1-3 birds at Jones Reserve Rd 24 Jun, 21 Aug and 25 Sep (NEM MCR/BRG, TAH), Muswellbrook 11 Sep (MCR), Laguna 19 Sep (HBOC) and Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC).

Welcome Swallow Hirundo neoxena

ID No: 357 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and regularly recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and as counts of up to 50 birds near medium to large waters.

Notable records: 413 birds were recorded at Hunter estuary 6 Mar and 140 birds there 11 Dec (HWS). Many hundreds of birds were present at Ash Island 6 Mar (MOA) and 100+ birds there 18 Feb (BRG/LIN). 150 birds were at Morpeth STP 11 Mar (LIA) and 51-100 birds at Morpeth STP 21 Jan (LIA), Ash Island 21 Mar (HBOC) and Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR). Birds were on nest at TWC 5 Jan (MCR) and had nests with young at Ellalong Lagoon 22 Aug (HBOC) and Whitebridge 5 Nov (GOC), and also nested at Warabrook Feb-Mar and Sep-Dec (BAW).

Tree Martin Hirundo nigricans

ID No: 359 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes Status: Resident. Occasionally but widely recorded as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 100+ birds were recorded at Glen Oak 15 Aug (MAM), 76 birds at Morpeth STP 11 Mar (LIA), 50 birds at Hunter estuary 17 Jan (HWS) and 21 birds at Green Wattle Creek 12 Aug (NEM).

Fairy Martin Hirundo ariel

ID No: 360 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Summer migrant; some birds appear to be resident. Frequently recorded at medium to large waters in the E and central parts of the Region from Jan to mid-Mar and from early Aug onwards, as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: 50 birds were recorded at Hunter estuary 17 Jan (HWS). There were breeding records for Warabrook Feb-Mar and Oct-Dec and at TWC Feb (MCR).

Red-whiskered Bulbul Pycnonotus jocosus

ID No: 990 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Resident.

Three birds were recorded at Belmont Swamp 12 Apr (LAK) and single birds at Caves Beach 29 Apr (CLT) and Belmont Swamp 14 Jul (LAK).

Clamorous Reed-Warbler Acrocephalus stentoreus

ID No: 524 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual summer migrant; some birds are resident. Widely and often recorded near medium to large waters during Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec as counts of up to 10 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Tawny Grassbird Megalurus timoriensis

ID No: 523 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded near medium to large waters in the E of the Region as counts of 1-5 birds.

Notable records: 6-10 birds were recorded at TWC 22 Jun and 24 Nov (MCR) and Ash Island 25 Oct (HAP). Birds were with dependent young at TWC 27 Feb (MCR) and were carrying nesting material at Stockton Sandspit 24 Sep (CLT).

Little Grassbird *Megalurus gramineus*

ID No: 522 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident. Occasionally recorded near medium to large waters in the E of the Region as counts of 1-2 birds.

Notable records: There were no exceptions to the general description of status.

Rufous Songlark Cincloramphus mathewsi

ID No: 509 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Summer migrant in central/west of Region.

1-5 birds were recorded at Kings Gap and Martindale 4 Feb (BRG/MCR), Jones Reserve Rd 25 Sep (TAH), Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC), Wingen 13-20 Oct (NEG), Mount Arthur 16 Oct (NEG), Fosterton Loop 18 Oct - 2 Nov (JED) and Dungog 7 Nov (JED). Also, a single bird was at Stockton Sandspit 13 Nov (several reports) - an unusual location.

Brown Songlark Cincloramphus cruralis

ID No: 508 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Uncertain.

Single birds were recorded at Wallabadah Rock (H2) 1-4 Oct (HBOC) and Mount Arthur 16 Oct (NEG).

Golden-headed Cisticola Cisticola exilis

ID No: 525 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Often recorded in the E of the Region as counts of up to 20 birds.

Notable records: A bird was displaying at NWR 27 Feb (MCR).

Silvereye Zosterops lateralis

ID No: 574 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident and winter migrant. Widely and regularly recorded all year as counts of up to 50 birds, and as counts of up to 100 birds in the E of the Region during Apr – mid-May and mid-Jun – Jul.

Notable records: Several hundred birds were recorded at Belmont Swamp 12 Apr and 100+birds there 14 Jun and 14 Jul (all LAK).

THRUSH SPECIES

Both *Zoothera* species occur in the Hunter Region, but field identification is difficult. In addition to the reports detailed below, a single unidentified bird was recorded at Green Point Belmont 23 May (WAR2) and two unidentified birds at Kerrapit Road 19 Sep (JED).

Bassian Thrush Zoothera lunulata

ID No: 779 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: None recorded

Status: Resident.

Five birds were recorded at Sharpes Creek 22 May (MCR), three birds at Brunkerville 22 Feb (HBOC) and also birds were seen at several locations in the Watagans 13-14 Jan (MOA). 1-2 birds were at Barrington House 28 Jan (BRG/MCR), Boarding House Dam Watagans 1 Feb and 25 Sep (MCR/BRG, HBA), Laguna 19 Sep (HBOC), Brunkerville 5 Oct (HBOC) and Gloucester Falls 28 Dec (STA). A dead bird was found at TWC early May (WCR) - an unusual location.

Russet-tailed Thrush Zoothera heinei

ID No: 780 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Resident.

Single birds were recorded at Allyn River 28 Jan and Gloucester Tops 30 Jan (BRG/MCR), and at Copeland NR 3 Jul (per DBP).

Common Blackbird Turdus merula

ID No: 991 HBOC Category: 2 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Rare.

Single birds were recorded at Cessnock 19 Sep (BRG), East Maitland 3 Oct (BRG) and Telarah 4 Dec (BRG), and at two separate locations in Maitland 9 Nov (TAH). Two birds were heard at East Maitland 10 Nov (BRG).

Common Starling Sturnus vulgaris

ID No: 999 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Common resident. Widely and frequently recorded as counts of up to 100 birds.

Notable records: 100-200 birds were recorded at Morpeth STP 11 Mar, 22 Jun and 12 May (LIA), Hexham Swamp 30 Jun (MCR), Wallalong 9 Jul (MAM) and Morpeth 15 Sep (MAM). There were several breeding records spanning Jan-Feb and Oct-Dec.

Common Myna Acridotheres tristis

ID No: 998 HBOC Category: 1 Regional Breeding Status: Yes

Status: Usual resident. Widely and often recorded as counts of up to 20 birds, and as counts of up to 50 birds in the E of the Region

Notable records: Birds had dependent young at WWW 18 Jan (HBOC) and Woodberry 28 Feb (MCR) and also were nesting at PNR 5 Dec (HBOC).

SUPPLEMENTARY RECORDS

Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

Birds bred at Toronto Wetlands in late 2003 (per MOA).

Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax varius

Birds bred at Toronto Wetlands in late 2003 (per MOA).

Great Egret Ardea alba

Nine birds were at Woodberry Swamp 13 Dec 2003 (CBOC). Birds bred at Toronto Wetlands in late 2003 (per MOA).

Intermediate Egret Ardea intermedia

Five birds were at Woodberry Swamp 13 Dec 2003 (CBOC).

Cattle Egret Ardea ibis

Birds bred at Toronto Wetlands in late 2003 (per MOA).

Nankeen Night Heron Nycticorax caledonicus

Birds bred at Toronto Wetlands in late 2003 (per MOA).

Australian White Ibis Threskiornis molucca

Birds bred at Toronto Wetlands in late 2003 (per MOA).

Black-necked Stork Ephippiorhynchus asiaticus

A bird flew over Gloucester 13 Nov 2002 (per DBP).

Wedge-tailed Eagle Aquila audax

A pair with 2 fledged young was at Stockrington Nov 2003 (SIM).

Black Falcon Falco subniger

Two birds were recorded near Morpeth 3 Jul 2003 (NEM).

Bush Stone-curlew Burhinus grallarius

A pair nested at Lemon Tree Passage in Nov 2003 and successfully raised one chick (MOA). A pair nested at Pindimar in 1998 and 1999 and successfully raised young, and in 1999 and 2002 they nested unsuccessfully (per ECR).

Banded Lapwing Vanellus tricolor

15 birds were recorded at Bolwarra 18 Oct 2003 and three birds there 20 Nov (both BRG).

Barking Owl Ninox connivens

A bird was heard near Gloucester 10 Oct 2003 (DBP).

Southern Boobook Ninox novaeseelandiae

An adult and a fledgling were recorded at Glen Oak 13 Dec 2003 (MAM).

Barn Owl Tyto alba

A single bird was recorded at Hinton 16 June 2003 and then on several occasions in the following month (NEM).

Rufous Scrub-bird Atrichornis rufescens

At least four birds were present at Gloucester Tops 30 Dec 2003 (FOC).

Southern Emu-wren Stipiturus malachurus

Some birds were present at Harrington 15 Oct 2003 (MVBW).

Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater Acanthagenys rufogularis

Six birds were recorded at Stairs Rd Giants Creek 18 June 2003 (NEM).

Olive Whistler Pachycephala olivacea

An adult male bird was recorded at Gloucester Tops 30 Dec 2003 (FOC).

Rufous Whistler Pachycephala rufiventris

There was a winter record of a male bird at Giants Creek 18 June 2003 (NEM).

Rufous Fantail Rhipidura rufifrons

Birds had a nest with young at Old Bar 6 Nov 2003 (MVBW).

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis

A single bird was recorded near Hinton 10 July 2003 (NEM).

UNCONFIRMED RECORDS

Some reports were not accepted by HBOC's Records Appraisal Committee – either because of inadequate description or insufficient information having been provided by the time of printing. The information presented below is for completeness; future Reports will advise of any records that have been accepted as a result of supplementary details being provided.

King Quail Coturnix chinensis

About six birds were reported to have been present along the Pinney Beach track 7 Mar.

Little Curlew Numenius minutus

A single bird was reported to have been at Stockton Sandspit 19 Nov.

Stint spp Calidris spp

A single bird with a different jizz to the Red-necked Stint that were present was reported at Stockton Sandspit several times in the first part of the year including 30 Jan, 17 Apr and 8 May.

South Island Pied Oystercatcher Haematopus finschi

ID No: 744

A single bird was reported by two experienced observers to have been at Stockton Sandspit 3 Feb. A good description was provided; however in view of the rarity of this species in Australia the results of an appraisal by the Birds Australia Records Committee are awaited.

Kelp Gull Larus dominicanus

ID No: 981

A single bird was reported to have been at Newcastle Beach 22 Dec 2003.

Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater Acanthagenys rufogularis

ID No: 640

Single birds were reported to have been at Kings Gap 4 Feb and Appletree Flat 23-26 Apr.

Satin Flycatcher Myiagra cyanoleuca

ID No: 366

Two birds were reported to have been at Vacy 9 Jan.

Paradise Riflebird Ptiloris paradiseus

ID No: 686

Two birds were reported to have been at Vacy 24 Oct.

Skylark Alauda arvensis

ID No: 993

Two birds were reported to have been at Hexham Swamp 30 Jun and a single bird near GTD 16 Jun.

ESCAPEES

The species below were recorded in the Region during the year, but are considered probably to be escapees rather than part of a self-sustaining wild population. Note that records of feral geese have been ignored – these often do not identify the species involved, also it is considered that the birds often are semi-domesticated (e.g. deliberately or opportunistically fed by visitors).

Cockatiel Nymphicus hollandicus

Single birds were recorded at Eleebana Feb/Mar (GOA) and East Maitland 8 Sep (BRG).

Diamond Dove Geopelia cuneata

A single bird was recorded at TWC 13 Jul (MCR).
