A CHECKLIST OF THE BIRDS OF KOORAGANG ISLAND

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INTRODUCTION:

Further discoveries and observations make it desirable to present this supplement to the checklist which appeared in August, 1972 (Hunter Natural History, Vol. 4:3).

Opportunity is also taken to update the status of several species and maximum numbers recorded.

The progressive destruction of mangroves in which the egret colony was situated has resulted in the egrets deserting their former breeding grounds confirming our earlier fears. However the loss of mangroves and associated egret colony is not compensated for by the acquisition of a "temporary habitat", caused by man in his continual effort to reclaim these wetlands, to satisfy his ever demanding industrial needs.

An unusually high number of crake sightings has been made during the past 3 months resulting in the addition to the checklist of *Porzana tabuensis* and *Rallus philippensis*.

The new records, which are all based on "sight records" have been numbered in the checklist sequence and a reference to their status, order and family is given to assist in placing of the proper sequence. Change of status and additional information of species will be referred to in the numbered sequence already employed in the checklist with page number shown in brackets.

Records are mainly based on our own observations, but also incorporate information submitted by other observers and visiting ornithologists. Throughout the checklist initials are used to indicate where information has been supplied by the following observers:

with a maximum of 4.

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160. (p.198) Ixobrychus minutus Little Bittern

Casual visitor.

On 29.10.72 a single bird (male) in full breeding plumage was captured, banded and released after full particulars had been taken.

Barn Owl

Irregular non-breeding visitor.

A single bird recorded on 23.9.72 confirming the earlier record by J. and O. Ralston.

Passage migrant.

Introduced.

Former regular non-breeding visitor
