- 1. NOTES FROM THE AUGUST MEETING 8/8/79.
 - a) Bird of the Evening our very knowledgeable Secretary gave us an illustrated talk on the Buff-Breasted Sandpiper (Tryngites subruficollis). This species breeds in the Arctic and during the northern winter (our summer) migrates to the Southern Hemisphere. A rare sighting has been recorded for Kooragang Island.
 - b) Jim Ralston entertained us with some of his collection of coloured slides over 80 species were viewed and our thanks are due to Jim for a very entertaining exhibition some of the 'arrangements' made to get the pictures were, in some respects more interesting than the birds themselves.
- Atlas outing to BLACK HILL Sunday August 26. An additional Atlas outing was hastily arranged when we gained access to a private property at Black Hill. Some ten members participated and were all very impressed with the rugged scenery in this area. All told some 45 species were recorded, the most interesting being the Brown Pigeon (Macropygia amboinenensis) and the King Parrots (Alisterus scapularis) the latter being observed feeding on the young wild tobacco plants.
