- (d) Toronto Swamp area (see May Newsletter) reported that the F. & F. had referred the matter to the Dept. of Main Roads and to the Lake Macausrie Manicipal Council.
- (e) Literature was tabled from the Cumberland Bird Group; the AustralianRaptors' Association and O'Reilly's Bird Week.
- (f) Bird of the Evening was the bountiful Gouldian Piach (Chlosbia Gouldian) and was very capably presented by Mr. Gary Mainsworth, a local presder of these birds. The speaker dealt, inter alia, with colouration, courtehip behaviour, nest construction and production of young. So that we could see what he was talking about Gary had brought along several of his birds both nature and immature. These birds may have a black, red or yellow head: the ratios in the wild being 3 blacks to 1 red while the yellow only occurs once in every few thousand. We are very much indebted to Gary for his presentation of this bird which has been described by an American amiculturist as "the most perfect and boautiful of nature's prestion."

 Our Chairman introduced this session which began with a recorded talk by Howard Jacobs of the Victorian B.O.C. and a tape of recorded calls. An interesting and informative discussion followed.
