## 1. Notes from the May Meeting - 13/5/1981.

- (e) Mr Bob Preissey, commissioned by the National Parks & Wildlife Service to undertake a survey on the coastal wetlands of the Hunter Region addressed members giving an outline of information required.
- (g) <u>Back-benchers Spot</u>: Fred van Gessel reported the sighting of 34 Freckled Duck and 30-40 Shovellers on Kooragang Island. Also a number of Bar-tailed and Black-tailed Godwits and 3 Great Knots in breeding plumage on Stockton Sandspit.
- 2. Bird Call and Bird of the Evening: GILBERT'S WHISTLER (Pachycephala inornata). Delightfully presented by Sue O'Malley who has observed this species in its natural habitat, the mallee and surrounding borders of dry sclerophyll areas. Concern was expressed that with the wholesale clearing of mallee areas and the resultant loss of habitat for the Gilbert's Whistler, the future survival of this species was under considerable threat.
