- 1. Notes from the June meeting 10/6/1981.

- 2. Bird of the Evening Penguins.

  Sue Hamonet entertained us with a very interesting presentation on penguins, with special reference to the Little Blue or Fairy Penguin, which breeds on local off-shore islands. She suggested a 'Designer of the Year' award for penguins when the adaptations to their bodies for a life in the sea were considered. Sue recommended as a useful reference:

  John Sparks and Tony Soper: Penguins. Angus and Robertson, 1968.
- 3. Bird Calls of the Evening Flycatchers.
  Fred played the calls of the Leaden, Spectacled, Black-faced and Boat-billed Flycatchers. He also presented the call of the Rose Robin which is similar to that of the Boat-billed Flycatcher.
- 4. Back-benchers" Spot.

  Wilma Barden reported the sighting of a Franklin's Gull at Greenwich Point, Sydney. John O'Malley described an attack by three magpies on a Grey Goshawk. Ted Felton has seen recently 13 Eastern Golden Plovers in breeding plumage on Kooragang Island, also one Avocet; a Dominican Gull on Stockton breakwater. Also on Kooragang Island Jim Perry observed a Black-tailed Kite. Ed and Sue Hamonet

have a Striated Thornbill nesting in their back garden. (3 eggs). Wilma has recently heard the Cicada Bird calling in Blackbutt Reserve.

- 5. The Hunter Wetlands Group are undertaking a survey of the Hexham Swamp area. Assistance of members requested by Fred who has maps and details.
